METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Phillies, 5-1...New York has lost three straight and five of their last six games... The Mets continue their seven-day, six-game road trip (1-3) to Houston (1-2) and Philadelphia (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets return to New York for the start of a seven-game homestand against the Brewers (four games) and Giants (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Happy Birthday to Mets Hall-of-Famer Cleon Jones who turns 81 years young today...Jones spent 12 years with the Mets from 1963-1975 and hit .281/.339/.404 with 183 doubles, 33 triples, 93 home runs and 524 RBI in 1,213 games...Jones is best remembered for catching the final out of the 1969 World Series...In 1969, Jones was named to the All-Star team and hit .340/.422/.482 with 25 doubles, four triples, 12 home runs and 75 RBI...He was inducted into the Mets Hall-of-Fame in 1991.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 56-21 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 6.12 ERA (51 ER/75.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the fifth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

TRADING PLACES: Yesterday, the Mets acquired minor league RHPs Coleman Crow and Landon Marceaux from the Angels in exchange for INF Eduardo Escobar and cash considerations...Crow, 22, ranked as the Angels No. 17 prospect, according to Baseball America, while Marceaux, 23, was the Angels No. 20-ranked prospect...Crow has made four starts for Double-A Rocket City in 2023, going 2-0 with a 1.88 ERA (5 ER/24.0 IP), six walks and 31 strikeouts...In three seasons in the Angels organization, he has gone 15-6 with a 4.33 ERA (103 ER/214.1 IP)...Marceaux was a third-round pick out of LSU in the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, he has made 32 starts over the last three seasons in the Los Angeles-AL organization, going 7-13 with a 3.99 ERA (68 ER/153.1 IP), 35 walks and 124 strikeouts.

DAY MAN: Max Scherzer is set to make his sixth daytime start of the season ...In 2023, Scherzer is 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (5 ER/27.0 IP) with eight walks and 29 strikeouts...For his career, Scherzer is 71-42 with a 2.94 ERA with 254 walks and 1,210 strikeouts.

I'M PHIL-IN IT: Scherzer owns a 17-5 lifetime record with a 2.56 ERA (54 ER/189.2 IP) in 30 career starts against the Phillies...He has walked 44 and struck out 239...He has made 14 career starts at Citizens Bank Park and has not allowed more than three runs in any appearance...The righty has posted a 9-2 record with a 2.36 ERA (23 ER/87.2 IP) with 21 walks and 104 strikeouts at the yard...His nine wins are the most by any visiting pitcher since the ballpark opened in 2004...He owns the the second-lowest ERA among pitchers with at least 10 starts...Stephen Strasburg is first with a 2.11 mark...Scherzer has gone 4-1 with a 1.91 ERA (7 ER/33.0 IP) with 10 walks and 42 punchouts in his last six starts at the ballpark.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo recorded his eighth home run yesterday and his fourth on the road...The Wyoming native has recorded at least eight home runs in each of the last six seasons...Nimmo hit a career-best 16 in 2022...He is batting .310 (52-168) with 23 runs, eight doubles, three triples, four home runs, 23 RBI, 23 walks with a .396 OBP and a .464 SLG OPS in 43 road games this year...That compares to a .233/.336/.388 slashline with nine extra-base hits and 10 RBI in 30 games at Citi Field in 2023.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stole a franchise-record 31 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 90.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 20 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 334 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Despite missing 10 games, Pete Alonso's 23 home runs this year, are tied for the lead in the National League and rank second in the majors to Shohei Ohtani (24)...Matt Olson has also hit 23 home runs... Alonso has 51 RBI, tying for him with Francisco Lindor for third in the National League.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 93-82 all-time at Citizens Bank Park.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Starling Marte has appeared in 36 career games at Citizens Bank Park and has hit .387 (55-142) with 28 runs, 17 doubles, five home runs, 18 RBI with a .442 OBP and a .613 SLG...Prior to last night, he hadreached base safely in 15 straight games at the ballpark, batting .452 (28-62) with 17 runs, eight doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a 1.170 OPS in the streak that dated to June 30, 2021.

KEEP THE CAR RUNNING: The Mets are 5-10 when both teams score six or more runs this year...They are 3-6 when both score seven or more runs and 2-3 when they both score 8 or more runs.

NIFTY FIFTY: Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor have each recorded 51 RBI this year, which is tied for the third most in the National League...The Mets are one of four teams in the majors with two players who have each recorded at least 50 RBI...They join the Braves (Ozzie Albies - 53 and Matt Olson - 55) as the only other team in the National League.

CANHA I GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha is hitting .296/.435/.463 over his last 21 games, going 16-54 with three doubles, two homers, 12 RBI, eight runs scored and 11 walks...Canha's .435 OBP ranks fifth among the 259 players with 65 or more PA since May 21.

MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two home runs away from 200 for his career.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 20-2 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 8-1 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 12-12 against the NL East this season.... They have posted a 4.22 ERA and are hitting .235/.318/.378.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last 16 games, Francisco Lindor has posted a .962 OPS, going 12-49 with 11 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 11 RBI, 12 walks, five steals with a .391 OBP and a .571 SLG...He has posted a 2.3 fWAR this year, which ranks 13th in the National League...His 33 extra-base hits are tied for the ninth most in the National League.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The team has played 43 games on the road this year, the second-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League...New York is 17-26 away from Citi Field in 2023...After starting the year 10-5 on the road, the Mets have gone 7-21.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has safely hit in 12 of his last 14 games...Over the last 14 games, Pham is batting .296 (16-54) with nine runs, six doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, five walks, three steals with an .869 OPS...Since May 17, Pham is batting .313 (25-80) with 13 runs, eight doubles, one triple, four home runs, 19 RBI, nine walks, six steals with a .965 OPS in 25 games.

WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY: Tommy Pham leads the Mets with a .324 (12-37) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, has 10 hits in 19 at-bats with RISP...He leads the NL in average (.476), slugging percentage (1.000) and OPS (1.538) with RISP over that timeframe.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 21-8 (.724) when scoring first this season... On the other hand, the Mets are 13-33 (.282) when their opponent scores first.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.72 ERA (6 ER/31.1 IP) in 28 appearances this season...He has walked eight, while striking out 40...He ranks fifth in the NL in ERA among relievers and tied for 16th with 40 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .161 (10-62) average this year.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched a season-high 8.0 innings against Houston at Minute Maid Park on June 19...Allowed one run on four hits...Struck out eight and walked just one to earn the win in the Mets' 11-1 victory.

PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM: Scherzer has made 30 starts against the Phillies in his career... In those starts, he is 17-5 with a 2.56 ERA (54 ER/189.2 IP)...When facing the Phillies on the road, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.36 ERA (23 ER/87.2 IP) in 14 starts, with a 9-2 record...His last win against the Phillies came earlier this month on June 1, during which he threw 7.0 innings, allowed one earned run on five hits and one walk while striking out nine...His 2.56 ERA (54 earned runs/189.2 innings) against the Phillies is the third-best mark in the divisional era (1969-present, min. 140.0 innings)...His 17 wins and 239 strikeouts against the Phils since his debut in 2008 are the most in the majors.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season in his last outing, June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met...Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.

TURNING THINGS AROUND: After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up four wins over his last seven starts (since May 14 at Washington) and has pitched to a 3.21 ERA (15 ER/42.0 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 48 strikeouts compared to five walks, holding opponents to a .238 average and pitching to a 1.02 WHIP.

TERRIFIC TEN: Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season on June 7 at Atlanta...Marked his first double-digit strikeout game since striking out 11 on August 28, 2022 vs. Colorado...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: With his start on June 13, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 19 punchouts separating the two...With 110 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (2-3, 6.69)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.0 innings against St. Louis at Citi Field on June 18...Allowed six runs (five earned) on five hits, walked three and struck out four.

FIGHTIN' THE PHILS: Carrasco will face Philadelphia for the second time this season and at Citizens Bank Park for the first time in his career...In his last start against the Phillies on May 31 at Citi Field, he earned the win after allowing one earned run on six hits and one walk while striking out four batters...Throughout his career against Philadelphia, Carrasco has pitched to a 3.32 ERA (8 ER/21.2 IP) and holds a 3-1 record...Has held Phillies batters to a .225 average throughout his career.

- Tied for first the NL and tied for second in the majors with 23 home runs...Tied for 11th in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 51 RBI...Tied for 16th in the NL with 43 runs...Is eighth in the majors and sixth in the league in SLG (.534).
- Has 10 long balls and 20 RBI in his last 25 appearances...12 of his last 25 hits have been home runs and 16 of his last 25 have gone for extra bases.
- Hit a solo homer on June 4 vs. Toronto to set a Citi Field record with his 72nd career blast at the venue.
- Belted an opposite-field, game-tying grand slam on May 19 vs. Cleveland...Was his third career grand slam and the third game-tying slam in Mets history.
- Tied a Mets record with his fourth career walk-off blast on May 17 vs. Tampa Bay, a three-run shot to ice an 8-7, extra-inning victory... Five other hitters have hit four walk-off home runs with the Mets: Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds, Cleon Jones, Mike Piazza and Wilmer Flores.
- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .417 (10-24) hitter in extra innings with a 1.442 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 169 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next. Ranks 12th in franchise history with 431 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

- Had seven extra-base hits, 13 RBI and seven runs scored during a career-best eight-game hitting streak from May 17-28.
- Has three three-run home runs...Only five players have more this season...Hit a game-tying, three-run home run on May 27 at Coors Field.
