The Brewers are facing the Braves' Chris Sale tonight, who is the reigning National League Cy Young Award winner.....the team also faced the Tigers' Tarik Skubal on April 14. ...this is the first time since 2016 that the Brewers faced both league's reigning Cy Young winners.....the team took on the Cubs' Jake Arrieta (3x) and the Astros' Dallas Keuchel that season.

One and Done

Yesterday's loss to the Padres was the 20th 1-0 defeat in franchise history in which the lone run scored on a home run (Manny Machado).... it was the first such home loss since 4/2/14 vs. Atlanta (Chris Johnson).

Born Again Christian

In his last 15 games, Christian Yelich is batting .386 (22-for-57) with 6 HR and 15 RBI....during this stretch, he has a .462 OBP/.719 SLG/1.181 OPS.

We Sal-ute You!

In his last 20 games, Sal Frelick is batting .347 (26-for-75) with 2 HR and 11 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .388 OBP/.467 SLG/.854 OPS.

Rated Rookie

Caleb Durbin has 22 RBI this season, trailing only the Marlins' Liam Hicks (24) among NL rookies.

U Da Man!

Abner Uribe is unscored upon in 27 of his 31 appearances this season. including 19 of his last 20 outings and 6 in a row.....Uribe ranks among NL relief leaders in strikeouts (T4th, 41) and ERA (T4th, 1.48).

Nick Mears ranks second among NL relievers and fourth in the majors in WHIP (0.69)

IN THE STANDINGS (83 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 10*, SECOND: 19, THIRD: 40, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in third place, trailing the first-place ubs by 5.5 games and second-place Cardinals by 1.5 games (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The team is 11-9-1 in series play. Game 1: 11-10, Game 2: 11-10, Game 3: 11-10, Game 4: 2-1

AT HOME: The team is 19-12 at home, going 7-3-0 in series play.....the Brewers are 7-3 in their last 10 home games

ON THE ROAD: The team is 16-19 on the road, going 4-6-1 in series play.....the Brewers are 6-1 in their last 7 raod games.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role)....first base coach **Julio Borbón**, lead hitting coach **Al** LeBoeuf and hitting coach **Eric Theisen** are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made eight replay challenges this season, going 5-3....their last challenge (won) came on 5/28 vs. Boston as an out call at second base involving Sal Frelick was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24)....this does not include 2020....the Brewers have 701 wins since 2017 (6th in MLB/3rd in National League).

CIVALE AT A GLANCE: Aaron Civale, 29, will be making his fifth start of the season this afternoon.....Civale last started last Monday at Cincinnati and earned a 3-2 victory (5.1ip, 7h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 5k, 86 pitches).....the team is 3-1 in his starts.....he does not have a quality start....opponents are batting .269 (18-for-67, 4hr).....he was on the 15-day injured list from 3/31-5/21 with a strained left hamstring.....Civale was acquired from Tampa Bay last July 3 in exchange for INF Gregory Barrios.....he is signed through the 2025 season.....name is pronounced "sih-VAH-lee."

LAST SEASON: Civale went 8-9 with a 4.38 ERA in a career-high 31 starts between Tampa Bay and Milwaukee last season.....he set career highs for innings pitched (161.0) and strikeouts (149).....his teams went 13-18 in his starts (8-6 with Brewers) and he produced 8 quality starts (5 with Brewers).....he went 6-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 14 starts with Milwaukee after going 2-6 with a 5.07 ERA in 17 starts with Tampa Bay.

CAREER: Has gone 40-36 with a 4.06 ERA in 121 starts (653.2ip, 295er)....is in his seventh Major League season pitching for Cleveland (2019-23), Tampa Bay (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2024-25).....Civale was selected by Cleveland in the third round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: IS 4-2 with a 2.32 ERA in 9 starts (50.1ip, 13er)....is 0-0 with a 1.80 ERA in 1 start this season (5ip, 1er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: IS 19-17 with a 4.14 ERA in 63 starts (332.2ip, 153er)....is 1-1 with a 6.57 ERA in 3 starts this season (12.1ip, 9er).

CAREER vs. BRAVES: Civale has never pitched against the Atlanta, Georgia Braves, one of three teams he has never faced (also Houston and Tampa Bay).
