TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Mike Vassallo's Brewers and Game 4 (2-1) of a 6-game homestand that included a 2-1 series win vs the Pirates...the Reds' weekend series vs Pit was their first against a team with a record below .500 since the second game of the season, following an Opening Day win at Atl.

Mon vs Mil: RHP Luis Castillo (2022 debut) vs RHP Brandon Woodruff (3-1, 5.18)

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today returned from a rehabilitation assignment and reinstated from the 10-day injured list RHP Luis Castillo and designated for assignment LHP Phillip Diehl...RHP Buck Farmer, designated for assignment on Friday when RHP Robert Dugger was added to the roster, cleared waivers and was outrighted to Class AAA Louisville.

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The 18 runs scored by the Brewers in Wed's **18-4 win** at **American Family Field** was their highest total ever in a game vs the Reds... the Brewers' 3-game sweep last week was their first series sweep vs the Reds at their home ballpark since 4/24-4/26, 2017...over the last 4 seasons, the Brewers' .688 winning percentage (22-10) at Great American Ball Park is the best of any NL Central Division team in that span.

ROAD TRIPPIN': Following this series the Redlegs will hit the road again for 11-day, 9-game, 3-city jaunt to Pit's PNC Park (4g), Cle's Progressive Field (off day, 2g) and Tor's Rogers Centre (off day, 3g)...the active 13-game road losing streak is the Reds' longest in a single season since an 0-19 road stretch from 7/5-8/24, 1933...are coming off their second consecutive winless road trip (0-3 at Col, 0-3 at Mil) that included their first series sweep loss at Coors Field since 9/6-9/10, 2010 and their first series sweep loss at American Family Field since 4/24-4/26, 2017.

- Class A Daytona RHP Sam Benschoter has been named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week after throwing 5.0 hitless innings in Sat's 5-0 win vs Jupiter (3bb, 6k)...he was signed as a non-drafted free agent in July 2021 out of Michigan State University.
- The Reds' minor league **Players of the Month for April** are Class A Dayton **LHP Andrew Abbott** (4g, 3gs, 3-0, 0.86, 21ip, 13h, 7bb, 35k) and Class AA Chattanooga **OF T.J. Hopkins** (22g, .259, 6 2b, 6hr, 22rbi, 5sb, .917ops)... Abbott was selected in the second round (53rd overall) of last summer's draft...Hopkins was selected in the ninth round of the 2019 draft.

- Since a 2-2 series split at Atl to open the season the Reds are **3-21**, including an 11-game losing streak (4/12-4/23) and a 9-game losing streak snapped by the $\mbox{\bf 9-2}$ $\mbox{\bf win}$ in the opener of Sat's doubleheader.
- The Reds are 1-7-1 in 9 series this season (1-3 home, 0-4-1 road), their only series win vs the Pirates from 5/7-5/8 (2-1)...have been swept 6 times.
- **41 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds this season...the club record for number of players in a season is **57** (2003).
- The Reds' current injured list includes 13 players...began the season with 8 players on the injured list, their highest total to begin a season since they began the 2014 campaign with 8 players on the disabled list...since 2022 Opening Day have made 13 more additions to the injured list - including Jonathan India, Tylyer Naquin & Nick Senzel twice each - for a season total of 21 IL stints.

THE SKIPPER...: David Bell is in his fourth season as a Major League manager...on 9/22 of last season, the club announced Bell's 2-year contract extension through the 2023 season... was named to the position on 10/22/18 as the 63rd manager in franchise history, the 53rd since 1900...David and his father, Buddy, are the fourth father-son due to serve as Major League managers, joining George & Dick Sisler, Bob & Joel Skinner and **Bob & Aaron Boone...Buddy** managed the Tigers (1996-1998), Rockies (2000-2002) and Royals (2005-2007).

RED HOTS

- Tonight will be reinstated from the 10-day injured list to make his season debut...missed the Reds' first 28 games.
- All season has been on the 10-day IL with a right shoulder strain...did not make an appearance in spring training.
- From 4/24-5/4 made 3 rehabilitation apps (0-0, 0.87) for Class A Dayton (1gs) and Class AAA Louisville (2gs).
- His rehab start on 4/29 for Louisville at Columbus was his first career start at Class AAA...in 2017 went straight from Class AA to the Major Leagues...when he pitched on 4/29 for the Bats, dating back to his professional debut in 2012, he was 1 of just 8 active pitchers with at least 460 innings in the minor leagues and 750 inning in the Major Leagues (Jose Berrios, Zach Davies, Mike Foltynewicz, German Marquez, Eduardo Rodriguez, Dan Straily and Jose Urena)... courtesy Chris Robinson/Louisville Bats PR.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (40), starts (123), innings pitched (707.1) and strikeouts (770).
- Led the Reds in starts in each of the last 4 seasons, in wins and strikeouts in 2 of the last 4 seasons, in innings pitched in 3 of the last 5 seasons and in ERA in 2 of the last 5 seasons.
- In 2019 and 2021 was the Reds' Opening Day starting pitcher.
- In 2019 was a National League All-Star and the NL's Pitcher of the Month for March/April.
- In 2019 averaged 10.67 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched.
- Per Baseball America's Tools Issue, in both 2019 and 2021 his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League
- In 2021 established career highs in losses, starts, hits allowed, runs allowed, earned runs allowed, highest batting average against (.255) and batters faced (803)...fell 3.0 innings shy of his career high.
- Led the National League in walks and GIDPs induced (20), tied for the league lead in starts and losses, ranked third in hits allowed and fifth in runs allowed.
- Castillo and Tyler Mahle were 2 of 7 pitchers, and the only teammates, to lead the Major Leagues in starts (Sandy Alcantara, Walker Buehler, Kevin Gausman, Charlie Morton, Marcus Stroman).
- Went 1-8, 7.22 in 11 starts through May and 7-8, 2.73 in 22 starts the rest of the year.
- In June posted a 1.71 ERA, the fifth-best ERA in the National League (Jacob deGrom 0.67, Max Scherzer 1.42, Zach Wheeler 1.44, Anthony DeSclafani 1.69). In July posted a 2.15 ERA, the third-best in the National League (Walker Buehler 1.67, Freddy Peralta 2.14).
- In September/October posted a 2.35 ERA, the ninth-best in the National League.
- Suffered an 11-6 loss vs StL in the second Opening Day start of his career...was the coldest Opening Day in Reds history (37 degrees).

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow will make his sixth Major League appearance and start, his second straight vs the Brewers.
- In Thu's 10-5 loss at Mil allowed 5 HR, tying the club record (last, Scott Feldman, 8/17/2017 at Cubs)...became the first Reds pitcher to allow home runs to the first 2 batters of a game (Luis Urías, Christian Yelich) since Jimmy Rollins & Wil Nieves homered off Tony Cingrani on 5/18/2014.
- In the 5-2 loss on 4/16 at LAD threw 39 pitches at more than 100 miles per hour, the most recorded in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...his 13 pitches at 101mph were the most ever recorded by a starter in a game...struck out 2 batters on fastballs clocked at 101mph, tied for the most in a game by a starter on a strikeout pitch of that velocity (Jacob deGrom, Justin Verlander)...courtesy @SlangsOnSports.

 Made his Major League debut in the 6-3 win on 4/10 at Atl in the Reds' fourth game of the season.
- At age 22 years, 247 days became the youngest starting pitcher to make his Major League debut for the Reds since Mike Leake received no decision a 3-1 Reds win on 4/11/10 vs the Cubs at 22 years, 150 days old.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft...was rated by MLB.com the best overall prospect and by Baseball America the best high school player in that draft...the Twins selected high school SS Royce Lewis with the No. 1 overall pick. Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.

- Shut out the opponent in 4 of his 5 apps. Retired the first batter in 4 of his 5 apps...stranded all 4 inherited runners.
- Over the previous 8 seasons made 456 apps, second-most by any lefthanded pitcher and eighth-most among all Major League pitchers.
- From 2013-2020 made 8 consecutive Opening Day active rosters...that streak was snapped in 2021, when he began the season on the Yankees' 10-day injured list with left shoulder inflammation. On 7/27 of last season was acquired by the Reds from the Yankees, along with RHP Luis Cessa, for a player to be named (RHP Jason Parker, 8/30).
- In 2021, allowed 8 of his 20 earned runs in 2 apps in which he didn't retire a batter... allowed a career-high 5 runs on 7/3 for NYY vs NYM and 3 runs for Cin on 9/3 vs .his 2021 season ERA in his other 40 apps was 3.18 (34ip, 12er)
