**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the White Sox, 6-2, at Citi Field yesterday...The Mets finished their first homestand of the second-half going 3-3 against the Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2) and the Chicago White Sox (2-1)...Tonight, the Mets hit the road for a five-game, six-day road trip to Boston (three games) and The Bronx (two games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to yesterday's game, the Mets placed outfielder Starling Marte on the 10-Day IL, retroactive to July 17, due to migraines...INF Mark Vientos was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse today.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Last night, RHP Blade Tidwell tossed 6.1 innings and allowed one run on four hits, walked three and struck out four in Brooklyn Cyclones 4-3 victory over Hudson Valley...The 22-year old is 7-3 with a 3.29 ERA (28 ER/76.2 IP) with 43 walks and 107 strikeouts in 16 starts this season...Over his last 11 games, Tidwell is 7-0 with a 1.70 ERA (11 ER/58.1 IP) with 30 walks and 80 strikeouts...Tidwell is a second round selection in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Tennessee...He is rated as the fifth-best prospect in the Mets organization according to MLB.com.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga has recorded 122 strikeouts, the third-most by a Met through the first 17 starts of their career...He is behind only Dwight Gooden (133) and Nolan Ryan (128)...It is also the third-most by a Japanese-Born pitcher through the first 17 starts of their career trailing only Hideo Nomo (150) and Masahiro Tanaka (130).

**25 OR 6 TO 5:** Senga has struck out at least six batters while also allowing no more than five hits in each of his last six starts...That matches Sid Fernandez (1990) and Pedro Martinez (2006) for the third-longest single-season streak by any pitcher in Mets history...The only longer single-season streaks were both compiled by Jacob deGrom, with stretches of 12 such starts in 2021 and nine in 2022...Courtesy of Sportradar.

**THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga has a 11.48 SO/9 rate, the sixth-highest mark in the majors among qualified starters...Is 10th in the NL and tied for 19th in the majors in strikeouts...Is ninth in the NL among qualifiers with a 3.20 ERA (34 ER/95.2 IP)...Senga leads all major league rookies in strikeouts, second among rookies in SO/9 (Min 50.0 IP) and tied for second among rookies with seven quality starts.

**KAMPAI KODAI:** Senga is set to make his eighth start of the road today...He is 4-3 with a 3.97 ERA (20 ER/45.1 IP) with 25 walks and 56 strikeouts in that span...However, Senga is 2-1 with a 1.33 ERA (3 ER/20.1 IP) with 24 strikeouts in his last three road starts.

**SHIPPING UP TO BOSTON:** The Mets face the Red Sox for the first time since 2021, when the they played a pair of home and away games from April 27-28 at Citi Field and September 21-22 at Fenway Park...The Mets have dropped six straight to the Red Sox and eight of the last 10...Overall, New York is 8-11 at Fenway Park (during the regular season. The Mets went 2-1 at Fenway during the 1986 World Series)...Omar Narvaez has hit .346 (9-26) with three runs, one double, three home run and three RBI in nine career games at the yard...Pete Alonso has homered thrice in four career games in Boston.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets hit the road for the first time in the second-half...New York is 22-29 on the road this season...The team's 51 road games as tied for the most in the National League and are tied for second in the majors.

**DOING THE SPLITS:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .290 (58-236) with 27 runs, eight doubles, three triples, five home runs, 26 RBI, 29 walks, a .383 OBP, .435 SLG and an .818 OPS on the road...This compares to a .226/.332/.451 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .256 (51-199) with 35 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 42 RBI, 20 walks, a .322 OBP, a .528 SLG and an .859 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .195/.301/.371 with 14 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year...Lindor has reached base safely in 11 of his last 12 road games, batting .391 (18-46) with 12 runs, three doubles, two triples, four home runs, 12 RBI, seven walks, six steals, a .473 OBP, an .804 SLG and a 1.277 OPS.

**REX SOX-METS NOTES:** The Mets have dropped six straight to the Red Sox...The team's six-game losing streak is their longest current losing streak against any opponent.

**IF YOU START ME UP:** The Mets are 29-5 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

**JULY! JULY! JULY!:** The Mets are 9-5 through 14 games in this month...The team's .643 winning percentage is tied for fifth in the majors and is tied for third in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.21 ERA (45 ER/126.0 IP), the lowest ERA in National League in July...Only the Mariners (2.98 ERA) have a lower mark in July...The Mets have hit 21 homers this July, tied for the eighth-most in the majors.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games against American League opponents...They are 2-1 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 12-11 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 247-238 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**ALL-AMERICAN:** Jeff McNeil has batted .315 (105-333) with 43 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs, 41 RBI, 23 walks with a .368 OBP and a .423 SLG in 90 career games against the American League...McNeil's .315 average ranks fifth among active players in Interleague games.

**YOU CAN CALL ME AL:** Francisco Alvarez leads all major league catchers in home runs and is tied for first among all rookies in homers with the Rangers' Josh Jung...He is second in home runs in the majors this month with seven...Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with nine dingers...He is tied for seventh in MLB with 14 RBI this month and is hitting .356 (16-45) in July...Alvarez Francisco Alvarez has a .527 slugging percentage, which would be the highest ever by a Met in his age 21 season or younger...Only two other Mets have had a .500-plus slugging percentage at that age or younger: David Wright (.525 in 2004) and Darryl Strawberry (.512 mark in 1983), both in their age 21 seasons.

**SECOND HALF SQUAD:** The Mets are 273-239 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .533 winning percentage during that span is the fifth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.627), St. Louis (.600), Chicago (.575) and Milwaukee (.535).

**BROOKS WAS HERE:** Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.81 ERA (2 ER/22.1 IP) over 27 games...Raley has 18 holds, tied for the third-most in the NL and tied for the sixth-most in the majors...In 22 games at Citi Field this season, Raley has posted a 1.57 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 15 punchouts.

**STEAL MY SUNSHINE:** New York has been successful in all 15 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 76 steals in 83 attempts...Their 76 steals are tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL...The team's 91.6 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 50 of their last 51 stolen base attempts.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Has recorded 122 strikeouts through his first 17 career major league games, that is the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (133) and Matt Harvey (128) have recorded more in his first 17 career starts...His 122 strikeouts are the third-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 17 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (150), and Masahiro Tanaka (130).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga has won seven games during his rookie campaign, tying Steven Matz for the most first-half wins by a Mets rookie since 2012...The last Mets rookie hurler to win more games was Robert Gsellman (eight wins in 2017)...Senga's seven wins lead all major league rookies this season and his 122 strikeouts are the most by any rookie...Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is second in the majors and first in the NL with a 11.48 SO/9 rate and third in the majors in opponent's average (.203).

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 65 of his 122 strikeouts through 17 starts...The pitch has a 60.1 percent whiff rate and a 28.6 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 11 hits in 93 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .118 batting average.

**SHUT 'EM OUT:** On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irapu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

**MLB DEBUT NOTES:** Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

**NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION:** Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (8-3, 3.99)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched 7.0 scoreless innings on July 16 vs. Los Angeles-NL at Citi Field...Issued three walks and struck out six batters.

**TURNING THINGS AROUND:** After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up six wins over his last 12 starts (since May 14 at Washington) and has pitched to a 3.50 ERA (28 ER/72.0 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 87 strikeouts compared to 16 walks, holding opponents to a .234 average and pitching to a 1.11 WHIP...Since May 14, Scherzer's six wins are tied for sixth-most in the majors and his 87 strikeouts are tied for fourth in the majors...He ranks fourth in the National League with a 10.88 K/9 rate during that span.

- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .400 (10-25) hitter in extra innings with a 1.389 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 172 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 443 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

- Owns the Mets franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Hit a solo home run on July 1 vs. San Francisco, his first since June 10, to tie Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher.
- Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta...Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
