RBI D-BACKS TEAM SECURES A SPOT IN THE RBI WORLD SERIES: The RBI D-backs team won 3 of their 5 games over the weekend to secure the West Regional Championship in Seattle...they will head to Florida for the RBI World Series from Aug. 4-10...the RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner-Cities) program provides opportunities for young athletes to develop their skills and compete at high levels...this year, the D-backs also sponsored their first women's softball team, who went 1-3...the program also offers these young athletes an incredible experience beyond the sport...it was the first time on an airplane for 26 of them as well as their first time to Seattle.


## SNAKEBITIES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 6-2 last night @ Royals.
$\checkmark$ Ketel Marte went 2-for-3, including his 21st home run, with 3 runs scored, 2 RBI and 1 walk.

- Jordan Montgomery, in his first start since coming off the injured list, allowed just 1 run on 3 hits in 5.0 innings to earn his seventh win.

SECOND-HALF MOMENTUM: The D-backs have won 13 of their last 20 games, which are tied for the most wins in the span (also: Tigers).

- Since June 29, the D-backs lead the Majors with a . 347 OBP, and are second with 5.75 runs per game, 115 runs and 81 walks, and third with 174 hits.

JOC PLAYS AT ALL 30: With his first career appearances @ Kauffman Stadium, Joc Pederson has now played in every MLB stadium.

- Pederson is currently in his 11th season in the Majors. - Has homered in 24 of the 30 parks.

KEEP IT UP, KETEL: Ketel Marte has homered in consecutive games for the sixth time this season (last: May 1011 @ Orioles)...homered in 3 consecutive games once this season (April 3 vs. Yankees, April 5-6 @ Braves).

MULTI-HIT MARTE: Ketel Marte's 19 multi-hit games since June 1 are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Heliot Ramos/SF, Aaron Judge/NYY and Jarren Duran/BOS.

MCCARTHY, THE FLASH: Last night, Jake McCarthy recorded a first-to-third time of 11.16 during his triple in the ninth inning, which marked the fastest at Kauffman Stadium by a visiting player this season (previous: Evan Carter/TEX, 11.29 on May 4).

SERIES STRONG: With a victory tonight, the D-backs would mark their third straight series win...they have won or split their last 6 series (5-0-1) and 12 of their last 14 series overall since May 30, going 9-2-3.

VS. ROYALS: The D-backs are 20-16 all-time vs. Royals, in cluding 14-8 on the road.

- This is the third trip to Kansas City since 2017.
$\bullet$ In their last 9 meetings, the D-backs are 6-3 vs. Royals.
FACING THE AL CENTRAL: Since 2022, the D-backs' 24 wins vs AL Central opponents are second most by an NL team, behind the Dodgers (28) while their 5.21 runs per game are second, behind the Brewers (5.42).

LOOKING FOR 200: Joc Pederson is 1 home run shy of 200 in his career.

MARTE'S PART-AY CONTINUES: Ketel Marte's . 349 AVG since June 23 ranks atop the NL, ahead of Jonathan India/CIN (.341) and Bryan Reynolds/PIT (.340).

- Marte has reached base in 21 of his last 23 games (since June 23), batting . 349 (30-for-86)/. 446 OBP/. 593 SLG/1.039 OPS with 3 doubles, 6 homers, 19 RBI and 15 walks (12 K).
- Has not struck out in 52 of his last 60 plate appearances since July 4.

WITH RISP: Among NL players with runners in scoring position since June 10, Ketel Marte's 1.484 OPS is first while Joc Pederson's 1.473 OPS is second...Gabriel Moreno's 1.262 OPS is ninth.

STARTERS STARTING: Since July 7, D-backs' starting pitchers' 8 wins ranks tied for second among NL teams (also: Cubs), behind the Pirates (9) and Mets (9), while their 3.58 ERA is fifth, behind the Padres (2.48), Pirates (2.68), Cubs (2.76) and Mets (3.21).

CARROLL AT 11: Corbin Carroll, since July 7, has reached base in 11 straight games (. 298 OBP, $8 \mathrm{H}, 5 \mathrm{BB}$ )...it is his fifth career streak of 10+-games (last: 13 games, June 5-19)...career-long 15 games was from April 3-19.

The 3 teams combine for a .532-win pct. this season: Guardians (.600), Royals (.549) and Pirates (.505).

TAKING BASES: The D-backs' 131 bases taken [bases advanced on fly balls, passed balls, wild pitches, balks, defensive indifference] are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Cardinals (118), Dodgers (111) and Angels (105).

- This season, Corbin Carroll has added 6 extra runs on the base paths, the most in the Majors, ahead of Jarren Duran/BOS (4) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3).
