TONIGHT'S STARTERS: RHP EURY PÉREZ (7-10, 3.44) vs. LHP NOAH CAMERON (9-8, 3.98)

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Royals suffered a 6-3 loss to the Marlins last night at Kauffman Stadium, snapping their 7-game home win streak while losing their 2nd straight game overall for the first time since a 4-game skid from Aug. 9-12.

- + The Royals trailed 6-0 in the 8th inning but had the tying run on deck in the 9th, after a 2-run rally in the 8th and a solo home run by **Nick Loftin** in the 9th.
- + **Randy Dobnak** held Miami to 3 runs through 6.0 innings, but allowed hits to the 1st 3 batters he faced in the 7th, all of which scored, charging a season-high 6 runs to his line.

TRANSACTION ACTION: The Royals today reinstated infielder **Michael Massey** from the 7-day Concussion List...he exited the game on Aug. 25 in Toronto after hitting his head on the turf while making a tough throw falling away from first base.

- + In 19 games last month, Massey slashed .338/.362/.554 (22-for-65) with 10 runs, 7 XBH and 8 RBI for a .916 OPS.
- + To make room on the 28-man active roster, outfielder **Drew Waters** was designated for assignment.

ROYAL BIRTHDAYS: **Rex Hudler** is celebrating his 66th birthday at the ballpark today...Hud is in his 15th season as an analyst broadcasting Royals games, following a playing career that spanned 13 seasons in the Majors for six teams.

- + Hud shares a date of birth with Royals Pitching Strategist **Andy Ferguson** (38) and **David Glass**, who was born on this date in 1935 but passed away in 2020...Glass owned the Royals from 2000-19, including during the club's back-to-back AL pennant seasons and its 2015 World Series.

AUGUST HONORS: The Royals announced today outfielder **Jac Caglianone** and left hander **Noah Cameron** were named Royals Player and Pitcher of the month, respectively, for the month of August, as voted on by the local media.

- + **Jac Caglianone** led the AL last month in batting average (.411), slugging pct. (.684), OPS (1.113) and RBI (26).
- + **Noah Cameron** went 4-0 in 5 starts last month and ranked among the American League leaders (min. 5 GS) in IP/GS (6.2, 1st), WHIP (0.80, 1st), opponents' avg. (.155, 2nd), HR/9 (0.27, 2nd), wins (3rd) and ERA (1.87, 4th).
- + Tomorrow, Major League Baseball will announce winners for Player and Pitcher of the Month in each league.
- + The Royals are hoping to have both the American League Player and Pitcher of the Month in the same month for the first time since July 1985, when **George Brett** and **Bret Saberhagen** took the honors.

SERIES STREAKING: The Royals have won each of their last 5 completed sets since their series at Angel Stadium from Aug. 14-16...it's tied with the Brewers for the longest active streak in the Majors, and only the Red Sox (9), Rays (8) and Yankees (6) have had longer streaks among American League teams this season...it's the Royals longest series win streak since April 22-May 8 of last season (5 straight series).

- + The Royals have not lost a series since being swept in 3 games from Aug. 10-12 at Dodger Stadium.
- + The Royals have won 13 of their last 17 games since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, a stretch in which they have the best record in the American League and the 2nd-best run differential (+28).
- + The Royals lead American League teams since Aug. 14 in runs per game (5.3), batting average (.277), on-base percentage (.349) and OPS (.791).
- + Royals starting pitchers rank 7th in the American League since Aug. 14 with a 3.98 ERA (41 ER in 92.2 IP) and Royals relievers rank 4th with a 3.14 ERA (20 ER in 57.1 IP).

THREE BALL: The Royals lost last night despite scoring at least 3 runs for the first time since Aug. 11 at Dodger Stadium, a 5-4 loss in 10 innings, snapping a 13-game win streak when scoring at least 3 runs...they lost only 4 games in between Aug. 11 and last night and they scored a total of 3 runs in those games, including 2 shutout defeats.

- + The Royals have scored at least 3 runs in 31 of 42 games since the All-Star break, tied for 2nd most in the American League behind only the Red Sox (38)...they're 23-8 (.742) in those games since the break with the 5th-best record in the American League during that time.
- + Before the break, the Royals scored at least 3 runs in only 62 of 97 games, tied for 5th fewest in the Majors...they were just 34-28 (.548) in those games with the 2nd worst record.

HEATING UP!: Last night's temperature at 1st pitch was 97°F, marking the 2nd-warmest game in the month of September in the 54-year history of Kauffman Stadium, trailing only a 99°F game on Sept. 8, 2013 vs. the Tigers.

- + High temperatures in Kansas City are expected to be in the mid-to-upper 90s throughout the rest of this homestand.

HOME: The Royals tonight continue their penultimate stay of the season, a 9-game homestand vs. the Marlins (0-1), Blue Jays and Diamondbacks...last night began a stretch in which they will play 15 of their last 24 games at Kauffman Stadium, where they are 36-31 (.537), which is the 6th-best home record in the American League.

- + Last night's loss snapped the Royals 7-game home win streak, and was only their 5th home loss since July 5, a stretch in which they're 17-5 (.773) here, with the best home record in Major League Baseball.
- + The Royals are 11-8-2 in 21 completed series at home but they are 6-1-0 in their last 7 home series, the only loss during that stretch coming to the Cubs from Aug. 7-9.
- + The Royals are 5-3-3 on 11 homestands this season.
- + The Royals rank 2nd in the AL at home in on-base pct. (.333), slugging pct. (.434) and OPS (.767), are tied for 2nd in batting avg. (.266) and 3rd in runs per game (4.9).

AMERICA'S SHORTESTOP: In 26 games since returning from the IL on Aug. 4, **Bobby Witt Jr.** is slashing .307/.393/.455 (31-for-101) and leads the Majors during that time with 26 runs.

- + Witt Jr., who has won the American League *Rawlings* Gold Glove at shortstop each of the last two seasons and won the American League Platinum Glove last year, leads players at all positions with 24 Outs Above Average in 2026.
- + Bobby leads the American League in fWAR (6.4) and is 3rd in the Majors behind **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (9.2) and **Shohei Ohtani** (6.8).
- + Witt Jr. ranks 4th in the Majors this season with 37 stolen bases, and since his 2022 debut, he leads the Majors with 185 steals, which are 21 more than any other player.

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 24-18 (.571) since the All-Star break, which—despite losing their last 2 games—is the 4th-best record in the American League, trailing only the Red Sox (29-16), Rays (27-17) and Yankees (25-18).

- + Their 2nd-half play marks a significant improvement for the Royals, who were 21 games under (38-59) before the break, which tied for the worst record in the Majors.
- + The Royals win pct. has improved from .392 before the break to .571 since, for a difference of +.179, best in MLB.
- + The Royals are 8-4-1 in 13 completed series since the All-Star break after going 9-19-3 in 31 sets in the 1st half...their 8 series wins since the All-Star break are tied for 2nd most in the American League, trailing the Red Sox (9).

NOAH'S ARC: Tonight's starter **Noah Cameron** has been among the best pitchers in Major League Baseball since July 24, a game in Detroit when he started calling his own pitches.

- + In 7 outings (6 starts) since July 24, Cameron leads all Major League qualified pitchers in ERA (1.29), ranks 2nd in opponents' average (.130) to **Dylan Cease** (.125) and leads the American League in innings (48.2).
- + During this stretch, he's allowed 7 runs on 21 hits and 14 walks in 48.2 innings and just 1 home run.
- + Cameron has completed at least 7.0 innings in 4 of his last 7 outings and has tossed at least 8.0 innings in 3 of the last 6...he has 3 starts this season of at least 7.0 innings and 1 hit allowed...no other pitcher in Royals history has more than 1 such start in a single season.

FISH BITES: The Royals are hosting the Marlins this week at Kauffman Stadium for only the fifth time and first since 2024...these teams have completed 9 series but 4 of the last 5 dating back to 2016 have been in Miami...the Royals are 13-15 in 28 games vs. the Marlins, but have won 5 of the 9 series.

- + The Royals lost 2 of 3 in Miami last season in the 1st series after the All-Star break, but they won 2 of 3 in their last meeting at Kauffman Stadium from June 24-26, 2024.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: This series begins a stretch in which the Royals will play 3 of their next 6 sets vs. National League teams, which will wrap their Interleague schedule...they are 17-23 vs. NL teams this season but have lost 9 of their last 10 games and each of the last 5.

- + In Interleague play, the Royals lead AL teams in batting average (.261) and on-base pct. (.333), are T-1st in OPS (.765), and rank 2nd in slugging pct. (.432) and R/G (4.8).
- + **Salvador Perez** has 222 RBI in Interleague play, 6 better than **Alex Rodriguez** (216) for the most all-time among AL players...if you include those who played in the NL, his 222 RBI are 6 shy of **Miguel Cabrera** (228) for 4th most.
- + Perez's 346 Interleague hits rank 3rd among AL players, trailing only **Jose Altuve** (373) and **Derek Jeter** (364).
- + Salvy's 75 home runs in Interleague play are 2nd most among American League players to **Aaron Judge** (86).
- + Nine of Salvy's 17 HR this season have come vs. NL teams.

TOMORROW NIGHT’S STARTER: RHP MICHAEL WACHA (8-8, 3.32)

- + **Michael Wacha** will make his 28th start of the season and the 316th of his career (337th appearance) in tomorrow night’s series finale vs. the Marlins.

+ In his most recent start last Friday night in Cleveland, Wacha earned the win in the Royals 3-0 victory after he allowed just 4 hits in 8.0 scoreless innings with a season-high 10 strikeouts...he put runners on first and second with 1 out in the 3rd, but escaped the inning with a fielder’s choice and a strikeout...from that point on, he allowed only 2 singles, and did not allow either runner to reach second base...he caught **Steven Kwan** looking in the 8th inning on his 103rd and final pitch to notch his 10th strikeout and end his spotless outing.

+ His last start was his 11th this season of at least 7.0 innings, the most by any American League pitcher and 2nd most in MLB, trailing only **Sandy Alcantara** (13).

+ Wacha has recorded a quality start in 6 of his last 8 outings, bringing his season total to 18, which ranks 1st in the AL and 4th in MLB...he is 1 quality outing shy of tying his career-best mark of 19 set with the Cardinals in 2015.

+ In 7 starts vs. the Marlins in his career, Michael is 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (14 ER in 38.0 IP) and 36 strikeouts...his last game against Miami came on July 19, 2025, when he did not factor into the decision after he allowed 1 run on 3 hits and 1 walk in 6.0 innings, with 1 strikeout as the Royals lost 3-1...it was his 3rd career QS vs. the Fish.

+ Across 50 games (45 starts) vs. the National League East in his career, he is 19-16 with a 3.96 ERA (116 ER in 263.2 IP) and 257 strikeouts...his last game against an NL East foe came against the Mets at Citi Field on July 9, when he was charged with the loss after allowing 6 runs on 6 hits and 3 walks in 4.2 innings with 5 strikeouts as the Royals lost 7-3.

+ In 12 starts at The K this season, Wacha is 5-3 with a 3.04 ERA (26 ER in 77.0 IP) and 58 strikeouts...his last game at Kauffman Stadium came on Aug. 22 vs. the Tigers, when he earned the win after allowing 1 run on 3 hits and 1 walk in 7.0 innings, with 6 strikeouts, in the Royals 3-1 victory.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

+ **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost’s** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 286 wins are tied with **Hal McRae** for the 6th most in club history, 1 shy of **John Wathan** (287) for 5th...he’s 14 wins shy of becoming the fifth Royals Manager to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.

+ Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash’s** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona’s** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

+ **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.

+ Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
