METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Reds, 6-2, last night...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (11-2), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 56-11 when scoring first this season...New York is now 26-6-3 in 35 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (6-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (2-0) and Phillies (three games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won five straight, seven of their last eight, 14 of their last 16 and 18 of their last 23 games...This marks the third time this year the Mets have had a winning streak of at least five games...New York has posted a 2.20 ERA (11 earned runs/45.0 innings) in the streak with 10 walks and 63 strikeouts...They are batting .287/.376/.409 in the stretch...The team is outscoring opponents 30-12 and have not trailed at any point during the five-game winning streak.

WOMEN'S DAY AT CITI FIELD: Today, the New York Mets will host their first Women's Day at Citi Field...Led by the Mets female driven employee resource group, "She-Unit," Women's Day at Citi Field will be a celebration of women in sports with female focused pregame and in-game programming in honor of Women's Equality Day...Prior to the start of the game, there will be a panel with the women of the Mets front office, who will speak to other female industry contacts and female-driven community groups...A ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Queens native Olivia Pichardo...Pichardo participated in the MLB's Girls Baseball Breakthrough Series last fall and was recently named to the 2022 Women's National Baseball Team...The Mets will also be remembering Shannon Forde with a tribute video on Citi Vision.

WHY SO SERIESOUS?: New York is 24-7 (.774) in the third game of a series this season...That is the second-best record in the NL since 1960 (min. 20 games)...The 1975 Reds went 31-9 (.775)...Rounding out the top five are the 1994 Expos (26-8, .765), 1977 Dodgers (32-11, .744) and 1988 Giants (34-12, .739)...Courtesy of *Sportradar*.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are seeking their fifth sweep of the season today...It will mark their first sweep over the Reds since April 25-27, 2016 at Citi Field and September 5-7, 2016 in Cincinnati...On the other side, the Mets have yet to be swept in a series of three-or-more games this year...According to Elias, dating back to last season, the Mets have gone 33 straight series of at least three games without getting swept...This includes 31 series this year without getting swept...The team's streak of 31 series without getting swept in 2022 is tied for the second-longest single-season streak in franchise history with the 2011 squad...The team's overlapping streak of 33 series dating to 2021 without getting swept is the longest since they went 37 series without getting swept from July 17, 1988 to June 25, 1989.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Francisco Lindor is one of four players to record 10 or more steals and 20 or more home runs this year...He joins José Ramírez, Shohei Ohtani and Aaron Judge as the only players to so...Lindor and Judge are the only players in MLB with 20 homers, 10 steals, 70 runs and 70 RBI...It is the fifth season in which Lindor has recorded at least 10 steals and at least 20 home runs...He is one of only seven active players to accomplish that feat joining Mike Trout (8 times), Andrew McCutchen (7 times), Bryce Harper and Paul Goldschmidt (6 times each) and José Ramírez and Mookie Betts (five times each).

QUICK REFLEXES: New York allowed two runs last night, both in the seventh inning, then immediately responded with a pair in the bottom half of the frame...According to Elias, it was the 65th time in 209 chances this season that the Mets scored in the half-inning after allowing their opponent to score...That 31.1 percent rate of punching back is the best in the NL and second-best in the majors behind only the Yankees (32.5 percent)...Since the All-Star break, the Mets have scored in the subsequent half inning following a foe's score in 11 of 27 opportunities (40.7 percent).

DAY MAN: The Mets have won four straight day games and eight of their last 10 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 29-15 in day games this season...The team's .659 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.06 ERA with 110 walks and 431 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.06 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 431 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets have scored five or more runs in each of their last eight games...That is tied for the longest streak in the majors this year...The Padres went eight games with five or more runs scored from April 26-May 4...The Mets are hitting .298/.378/.484 in that span with 51 runs scored...The last time the team had a longer streak was a nine-game streak from April 27-May 6, 2017...The franchise record is 12 games from August 11-24, 2007...Overall, the Mets are 53-5 this season when they score five or more runs.

THE CLOCK STRIKES MIDNIGHT: Jeff McNeil is on a 12-game hitting streak, batting .412 (21-51) with nine runs, six doubles, three home runs, eight RBI with a .434 OBP and a .706 SLG in that span...This is the second longest of his career...He owned a 16-game stretch between July 7-30, 2021...He leads the NL with 20 hits and a .435 average (minimum 30 PA) over his last 11 games, while his .761 slugging percentage ranks fifth...He has recorded seven multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 141 multi-hit games in his career...That places him tied for 32nd in franchise history with John Milner.

REDS-METS NOTES: Since the start of the 2014 season, the Mets have gone 18-7 against the Reds at Citi Field...The Mets have not lost a season series since 2013.

CIERRA LA PUERTA: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 18 outings dating back to June 22, covering 18.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...37 of Díaz last 50 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.36 ERA (one earned runs/24.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 53 strikeouts...He has converted all 15 saves in that period.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is on a 17-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .397 (25-63) with 17 runs, five doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 10 walks with a .473 OBP and a .667 SLG...It is tied for the third-longest on-base streak in his career...It is his longest as a Met...In 35 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .324/.400/.559 with 26 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 23 RBI, 17 walks and a .959 OPS...He ranks tied for second in the majors with 21 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (29)...He ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 4.8 fWAR.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He has recorded 79 RBI in 110 games this season (77 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He is tied for sixth in the majors and tied for fourth in the NL with 79 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

RUNNIN' DOWN A DREAM: Francisco Lindor has scored at least one run in each of his last 12 games...It is tied for the longest streak in the majors this year...Mookie Betts recorded a 12-game streak from May 13-24...He is the seventh Met in franchise history to accomplish that feat...It is the longest by a Mets shortstop in franchise history...It is tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history with Carlos Beltrán (12 games, August 17-30, 2006)...Only David Wright, who owns the franchise record with a 13-game streak (July 13-29, 2008) had a longer streak.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets are tied for the lead in the majors with 1,061 strikeouts this season...It's a franchise record for most strikeouts through 111 games in a season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 57 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 837 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

FOR STARTERS: Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.23 ERA (46 earned runs/186.0 innings) in the team's last 31 games with 202 strikeouts and 45 walks...That Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.65 ERA, followed by the Phillies with a 3.10 ERA...New York's 202 strikeouts in that span also lead the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.52 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.52 ERA from their starters.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 33 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 34 games above after they were 92-58 on September 19, 2006...New York has won 72 games this season, second-most in the NL and in the majors...Their .649 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 72-39 record through the team's first 111 games...Only the 1986 (75-36) team posted a better record through the first 111 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 14-4 in the second-half...The team's 17 wins are the second-most in the majors, as is their .778 winning percentage...The team is batting .294/.364/.478 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 97-61 following the break.

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: Daniel Vogelbach is the first Met to reach base in at least 12 straight starts to begin his Mets tenure since Norichika Aoki (15 starts) in 2017...Since he made his Mets debut on July 24, the Mets are first in MLB in each of the triple-slash categories (.306/.377/.508) and winning percentage (.875) and second in runs per game (5.94) and extra-base hits (65)...He is batting .333 (13-39) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, 10 walks with a .480 OBP and a .564 SLG in 14 games with the Mets.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 37-18 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .673 winning percentage at home...The team's .673 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, .679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.29 ERA with 158 walks and 540 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 95 RBI...He is ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL with a .541 SLG.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Saw his career-best six game winning streak come to an end on August 5 vs. ATL...Allowed a season-high eight runs over 1.0+ innings, the most he has allowed in an outing since he surrendered nine runs on April 10, 2015 as a member of the Mariners...Had pitched at least 5.2 innings in each of his previous 11 starts dating back to June 2...Had tossed at least 6.0 innings in nine straight starts from June 7 - July 26, a career-best.

SHINE BRIGHT IN THE DAYLIGHT: In nine day game starts this season, Walker is 5-0 with a 1.40 ERA (nine earned runs/57.3 innings)...Walker's day game ERA is the second-best in the majors among pitchers with at least six daytime starts...Walker also ranks ninth in opponent's OPS (.533) and 14th in WHIP (0.95) among starting pitchers with at least six day game starts...Walker is one of eight starters to allow one or fewer home runs in a day game (Min. six daytime starts).

BECOMING HOME RUN HAPPY: Prior to the All-Star break, Walker had a HR/9 rate of 0.39, the fourth best marking among pitchers with at least 90.0 innings prior to the break...Since the All-Star break, Walker has a HR/9 rate of 3.55, the fourth highest rate among pitchers with at least 10.0 innings in the second half.

FEW Ks, THAT'S OK: Through 19 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.90 and an ERA of 3.45...Cole Irvin (2.92 ERA, 6.13 K/9) is the only other pitcher with an ERA under 3.50 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 19 starts).

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

VS. CINCINNATI: Today, Walker will make his third career start against the Reds, second this season...On July 4, Walker earned the win at Great American Ball Park after allowing three earned runs over 6.0 innings on four hits, one walk and nine strikeouts...Allowed a three-run home run to Brandon Drury in the third inning ending a season high streak of 32.2 innings without surrendering a home run, spanning five starts.

SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS: In 19 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just over 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .187 (28-150) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...40 of Walker's 80 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

NICE TRY: Walker is tied for the major-league with Robbie Ray with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (8-2, 1.98)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 shutout innings and matched a season-high with 11 strikeouts on August 6 (G2) vs. ATL... Is the fourth Mets pitcher age 38 or older with a double-digit strikeout game...Tom Glavine (three times), Al Leiter and Orlando Hernández are the others.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Has a 1.37 ERA (7 ER/46.0 IP) since his return from the IL on July 5, the third-best mark during that span...His 61 strikeouts are the tied with Gerrit Cole for the most during that span.

- Drove in the winning run in three of the Mets last five games...Has eight go-ahead RBI and seven game-winning RBI in 18 games since the break...Leads the majors with 21 game-winning RBI and 29 go-ahead RBI this season...The Mets record for game-winning RBI is 24 (Keith Hernandez, 1985).
- Hitting .348 (23-66) with six doubles, five homers, 17 RBI, 14 runs and a 1.115 OPS since the All-Star break...He ranks 10th in the NL in OPS since the break.
- Ranks fifth in MLB and tied for second in the NL with 29 homers...Leads the NL and is second in MLB with 95 RBI...Tied for 15th in the NL with 64 runs.
- Ranks ninth in MLB and fourth in the NL with a .541 SLG...Is 10th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a .899 OPS...Is 15th in the NL in OBP (.357).
