METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 8-1, yesterday at Citi Field to secure a series victory...The Mets have won three of their last four... They are 10-6 over their last 16 games and 22-18 over their last 40 games... Today, the team hits the road for a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - RHP Christian Scott placed on the 15-Day Injured List, retroactive to 6/12, with right hip impingement...RHP Daniel Duarte was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse following yesterday's game...RHP Tobias Myers and RHP Jonathan Pintaro have been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...INF Zack Short has been claimed off waivers from the Detroit Tigers...INF Jorge Polanco has been transferred to the 60-day IL.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets have scored five or more runs in each of their last nine wins dating back to May 29 vs. Miami...Their nine games with five or more runs during that span are tied for the fifth-most in the majors...Held the opposition to one or zero runs for the 11th time this season and for the fifth time since May 30...Are tied with Milwaukee for the most such games in the majors since May 30.

DINGERS: Mets batters have combined for 29 home runs since May 26, tied with Pittsburgh and Colorado for the second-most in the NL during that span...Their 11 multi-homer games during that span are tied with the Pirates for the most in the majors.

YOUNG HEARTS BREAK FREE: Yesterday, Jared Young put the Mets on the board with an RBI single in the first...He has an .801 OPS with four home runs, two doubles, eight RBI six runs and a .510 SLG over his last 14 games dating back to May 30...He is four for his last 10 with runners in scoring position.

A.J. STYLES: Yesterday, A.J. Ewing roped an RBI double in the first...He hit a solo homer to lead off the fifth...It was his the second home run of his career (also: 5/14 vs. Detroit, 96 at-bats since last)...He recorded his second career three-hit game (also: 6/3 at Seattle) and his first career game with multiple extra-base hits...He is batting .342/.381/.526 with one home run four doubles, three RBI, six runs over and a .907 OPS over his last 11 games dating back to June 2.

HANG 10: Over the last 10 games, Bo Bichette is batting .390 (16-41) with eight runs, three doubles, one triple, three homers, 12 RBI, a .372 OBP and a .732 SLG.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 259 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 259 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265...On Sunday, Soto reached base four times in a game for the third time this season and the 99th time in his career...His 99 such games for his career are the most in the majors since 2018...Has reached base in 12 of 21 plate appearances over his last four games.

METS-REDS NOTES: The Mets are 42-27 all-time at GABP... The team has hit .264/.333/.451 all-time since the yard opened up in 2003.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 14-21 on the road in 2026...They have won three of their last four road games...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 3.42 ERA on the road, which is third in the Majors and second in the National League.

THE HUSASCAR GOES TO: As a relief pitcher, Huascar Brazobán has pitched to a 1.26 ERA (4 ER/28.2 IP) across 24 appearances...He ranks eighth in Majors and sixth the NL in relief pitcher ERA (min. 20.0 IP).

POWER OF THE PEN: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.30 ERA (113 ER/308.0 IP) as a group...That ranks fourth in the majors and third in the National League...They have struck out 311 this season, the most in the NL and the second-most in The Show.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 644 strikeouts this season, that is the fourth-most in the National League and the fifth-most in the majors... Their 644 punchouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through the team's first 71 games of a season.

WILL I AM: On Friday, Devin Williams picked his sixth career save of four or more outs and his first since May 28, 2023...He is unscored upon in 15 of his last 17 appearances dating back to April 26 and has 24 strikeouts during that span...His 37 strikeouts this season are seventh-most among NL relief pitchers.

THE TONIGHT SHOW: In 40 games since the start of May, Carson Benge is batting .297/.363/.452 with 28 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five homers, 20 RBI and 12 walks...His .297 average is 14th in the NL in that span, while his 46 hits are tied for the seventh-most.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 16 appearances...He has tossed 18.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 19 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.40 ERA (8 ER/30.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in 27 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

BACK UP: Tobias Myers was recalled for his second stint in the majors after being optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on May 30...Before being optioned, he pitched to a 4.05 ERA (15 ER/33.1 IP) with a 0-1 record, one save, and three holds over 20 appearances (two starts)...Made three appearances (one start) with Triple-A Syracuse and didn't allow an earned run over 6.0 innings...His last appearance came on June 11 as a starter, and he threw 2.2 scoreless innings while striking out two...He threw 36 pitches in that appearance.

STARTING PART II: Today will mark Myers third start of the season and his first since May 22 at Miami (1.1 IP, H, ER, BB)...Over two starts this season he has allowed one earned run over 3.1 innings...His first start of the season came on April 22 at Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, H, BB) and he fired 2.0 scoreless innings and threw 28 pitches...That is his season high as a starter this season...Overall, his season-high in pitches came on April 23 vs. Minnesota when he tossed 40 pitches in relief...Last season, six of his 22 appearances were starts, and over his career 33 of his 69 appearances have come as a starter...As a starter, he is 8-7 lifetime with a 3.46 ERA (61 ER/158.1 IP) and 140 strikeouts.

VS. CINCINNATI: He has made six appearances (two starts) against the Reds in his career...He has pitched to a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP) with 23 strikeouts while holding Cincinnati batters to a .181 (13-72) batting average...Over his two starts, he allowed just two earned runs over 13.0 innings...In his first start against Cincinnati, he threw 7.1 scoreless innings while recording nine strikeouts on August 10, 2024.

ROAD WARRIOR: In 11 appearances (two starts) on the road this season he is 0-1 with one save and one hold while pitching to a 3.71 ERA (7 ER/17.0 IP)...Over 36 career road appearances (18 starts) he has posted a 3.12 ERA (38 ER/109.2 IP) with 89 strikeouts.

NEW YORK NEW YORK: Was acquired from Milwaukee along with RHP Freddy Peralta in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams this offseason....Had made all 52 of his career appearances (31 starts) to that point with Milwaukee, and he went 10-9 with a 3.10 ERA (67 ER/194.2 IP) and 170 strikeouts.

2025 RECAP: Appeared in 22 games (six starts) for Milwaukee last season and overall, he went 1-2 with a 3.55 ERA (20 ER/50.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts...As a starter, he finished 1-1 with a 5.64 ERA (14 ER/22.1 IP)...As a reliever, he recorded a 1.91 ERA (6 ER/28.1 IP) with 20 strikeouts.

CAREER YEAR: He was named the Brewers' Most Valuable Pitcher as voted on by members of the Milwaukee Chapter of the BBWAA following the 2024 season...In 2024, he went 9-6 with a 3.00 ERA (46 ER/138.0 IP) in 27 games (25 starts)...In the Postseason he started Game 3 of the 2024 NL Wild Card Series against the Mets (5.0 IP, 2 H, 5 K, HBP) and he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings while only allowing two hits.

- Threw a scoreless ninth inning on June 14 vs. Atlanta (1.0 IP)...As a relief pitcher, has pitched to a 1.26 ERA (4 ER/28.2 IP) across 24 appearances...Ranks ninth in the majors and sixth in the NL in relief pitcher ERA (min. 20.0 IP)...Overall, he has pitched to a 2.02 ERA (8 ER/35.2 IP) this season.
- Retired all five batters he faced, four via strikeout on June 12 vs. Atlanta (1.2 IP, 4 K)...His four strikeouts on the night were his most in an outing since May 21, 2025 at Boston.
- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 23 relief appearances, which is fifth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Has made 42 appearances against NL Central opponents...In those contests, he is 6-0 with eight holds and a 1.70 ERA (8 ER/42.1 IP)...Against Cincinnati, he has thrown 9.1 scoreless innings over seven relief appearances and one start.
- He hasn't surrendered an earned run in 24 of 30 appearances this season.
- Fired 2.0 innings and earned the win without allowing an earned run in extra innings on May 18 at Washington (2.0 IP, H, R, K, 2 BB)...Since the beginning of last season, he has had 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 innings in which he hasn't surrendered an earned run...His 12 such games are tied for the ninth-most in the NL over that span.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 28 of his last 34 appearances...He is 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA (8 ER/42.0 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .152 batting average (22-145) over that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
