AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set against Detroit (through Sun)...will play the first two games at Comerica Park before facing the Tigers in the Little League Classic in Williamsport, Pa., on Sunday...are 2-1 on the road trip after winning their series at Chicago-AL earlier this week...after this road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand featuring three-game series vs. Cleveland (Tues.-Thurs.) and Colorado (8/23-25).

- ▶ **Are 12-5 in their last 17 games (since 7/27).**
- ▶ **Have won or split seven of their last nine series (since 7/12).**
- ▶ **Their 72-50 record (.590) is tied with Baltimore (72-50, .590) for the second-best record in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (72-49, .595)...their 72 wins are tied with Cleveland and Baltimore for the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ Their +118 run differential is the best in the Majors (next: Los Angeles-NL +102).
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 40-23 (.635) on the road this season.
- ▶ Are 19-3 vs. the AL Central this season...since 2022, are 13-3 vs. Detroit.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees clinched a series win with a 10-2 win over the White Sox on Wednesday at Guaranteed Rate Field...**RHP Will Warren** (5.0IP, 7H, 2R/ER, 0BB, 5K, 1HR) started and did not record a decision despite allowing only 2R/ER in 5.0IP...**RF Juan Soto** (1-for-2, 3R, 1HR, 1RBI, 3BB/1IBB) reached base four times and hit his 34th HR of the year with a solo shot in the first inning...**3B Oswaldo Cabrera** (2-for-5, 2R, 1RBI, 1SB) scored the game-tying run from second base on a sac fly in the seventh and also hit an RBI single in the eighth...**LF Alex Verdugo** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 2RBI, 1SF) hit a sac fly in the seventh inning and an RBI double in the eighth...**C Austin Wells** (3-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) recorded a season-high-tying 3H, including a go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning and a solo HR in the eighth...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) hit his 300th career home run with a three-run shot in the eighth inning...**LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP) earned his fourth win of the year...**RHP Michael Tonkin** (3.0IP, 2H, 2K) recorded his second save of the year.

THE GREAT JUAN: **OF Juan Soto** reached base four times and hit his 34th home run of the year with a solo shot in the first inning on Wednesday at Chicago-AL...**homered in four consecutive at-bats from the third inning on Tuesday to the first inning on Wednesday, becoming the sixth Yankee in franchise history (including the postseason) to homer in four consecutive ABs**, joining Reggie Jackson (10/16-18/77 during the World Series), Bobby Murcer (6/24/70-G1-G2), Mickey Mantle (7/4-6/62), Johnny Blanchard (7/21-26/61) and Lou Gehrig (6/3/32).

- ▶ **His 194 career home runs are the eighth-most by a Major League player prior to his 26th birthday**, trailing only Jimmie Foxx (222), Eddie Mathews (222), Alex Rodriguez (216), Mel Ott (211), Mickey Mantle (207), Albert Pujols (201) and Frank Robinson (200).
- ▶ **Has 6HR in his last four games (since 8/11)**...is just the sixth Yankee (ninth time) to hit at least 6HR in a four-game span, joining Alex Rodriguez (6HR from 9/5-9/2007 and 9/4-8/2007), Mickey Mantle (6HR from 7/3-6/62), Joe DiMaggio (6HR from 5/20-23(G1)/48), Tony Lazzeri (6HR from 5/23(G1)-25/36 and 7HR from 5/21-24/36) and Babe Ruth (6HR from 5/21(G1)-22(G2)/30 and 6HR from 6/11-14/1921)...is the first Major League player to hit 6HR in the four-game span since Anthony Santander from 9/24-27/22.
- ▶ Has reached base safely in 106 of his 118 games this season, the most such games in the Majors...has reached base multiple times in 75 games this year, the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Aaron Judge (78)...has reached base at least three times in 42 games this season, the second-most games in the Majors, trailing only Judge (44).
- ▶ **Is hitting .353/.468/.802 (41-for-116) with 31R, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR, 24RBI, 25BB and 1SB in his last 29 games** (since 7/10)...has reached base multiple times in 20 of those games.
- ▶ **Has recorded at least 100BB in a season for the fifth time in his career (also 2019, '21-23)...is the first Major League player to record five 100BB seasons before turning 26.**
- ▶ Leads the Majors in runs scored (103), is tied for first in walks (102, tied for first in AL), ranks second in times on base (238, second in AL), OBP (.438, second in AL), SLG (.615, second in AL) and OPS (1.052, second in AL), third in WAR among position players (7.5 - FanGraphs, third in AL), fifth in HR (34, third in AL), BA (.307, fifth in AL) and extra-base hits (62, fourth in AL) and sixth in RBI (87, fifth in AL).

DYNAMIC DUO: **OF Juan Soto** and **OF Aaron Judge** both homered on Wednesday at Chicago-AL, marking the ninth time this year the pair has homered in the same game, with the club going 8-1 in those contests.

- ▶ **Judge** (251TOB) and **Soto** (238TOB) are the only set of teammates in the Majors in the last 87 years (since 1938) to reach base at least 238 times in their club's first 122 games of a season...are the first to do so since Detroit's Hank Greenberg (256) and Charlie Gehringer (239) in 1937.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his 300th career home run on Wednesday at Chicago-AL, **becoming the fastest player in Major League history (in terms of games played and at-bats) to reach 300 career home runs** (see chart on left)...**became the 162nd player in Major League history to accomplish the milestone and was the 17th player to accomplish the feat as a Yankee**...joined Anthony Rizzo, Giancarlo Stanton, Matt Holliday, Mark Teixeira, Jason Giambi, Ruben Sierra, Cecil Fielder, Darryl Strawberry, Dave Winfield, Graig Nettles, Reggie Jackson, Mickey Mantle, Yogi Berra, Joe DiMaggio, Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth...is one of 13 active players to reach 300 career home runs, joining Giancarlo Stanton (422), Mike Trout (378), Paul Goldschmidt (358), Joey Votto (356), Freddie Freeman (338), Nolan Arenado (337), Bryce Harper (332), Manny Machado (331), J.D. Martinez (327), Carlos Santana (317), Andrew McCutchen (315) and Anthony Rizzo (303).

- ▶ Has hit at least 43HR through the Yankees' first 122 games of a season for the second time in his career (also 46HR in 2022)...**is one of four players in franchise history (nine times) to hit at least 43HR through the club's first 122 games of a season**...joins Babe Ruth (48HR in 1921, 45HR in 1928, 44HR in 1930 and 43HR in 1920), Mickey Mantle (45HR in 1961 and 43HR in 1956) and Roger Maris (48HR in 1961)...**is one of five players in Major League history and one of three Yankees to hit at least 43HR through his club's first 122 games of a season multiple times**, joining Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998, '99, '01 and '02), Ruth (4x: 1920, '21, '28 and '30), Mark McGwire (twice: 1998 and '99) and Mantle (twice: 1956 and '61).
- ▶ Is hitting .333/.467/.707 (142-for-426) with 95R, 28 doubles, 1 triple, 43HR, 110RBI, 102BB, 7HP, 25F and 65B in 120 games this season...during his 2022 AL MVP campaign, had hit .297/.394/.663 (133-for-448) with 100R, 20 doubles, 48HR, 105RBI, 69BB, 5HP, 45F and 14SB through his first 120 games.
- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in 15 of his last 18 games (since 7/26), batting .484/.621/.992 (31-for-64) with 19R, 4 doubles, 8HR, 21RBI, 23BB and 1SB...has also reached base multiple times in 22 of his last 27 games (since 7/12).
- ▶ **Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading 78 games this year...has reached base at least three times in 44 games this season, also the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ **Is batting .382/.512/.815 (124-for-325) with 86R, 22 doubles, 1 triple, 39HR, 97RBI, 82BB, 6HP, 1SF and 5SB over his last 93 games (since 4/27)...joins Babe Ruth as the only two Major League players to bat at least .380 and hit at least 39HR over a 93-game span in a single season.**
- ▶ Has 8HR in his last 18 games (since 7/26) and 11HR in his last 27 games (since 7/12).
- ▶ Has recorded multiple hits in a season-high-tying four straight games (since 8/11), one game shy of his career high (5G from 8/23-28/21).
- ▶ Has reached base 251 times this season, the most by a Yankee through the club's first 122 games of a season in the last 67 years (since 1958)...the last Yankee to accomplish the feat was Mickey Mantle (287) in 1957...Judge is the only Major League player in the last 20 years (since 2005) to accomplish the feat and is the first since Barry Bonds (273) in 2004.
- ▶ Is hitting .343/.514/.727 (34-for-99) with 9 doubles, 1 triple, 9HR, 59RBI, 36BB, 1HP and 25F with RISP this year...among Major League hitters with RISP, ranks first in OBP, second in OPS (1.242) and fourth in SLG...since 5/4, is hitting .408/.566/.845 (29-for-71) with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 48RBI, 27BB and 15F with RISP.
- ▶ Leads the Majors in HR (43), RBI (110), OBP (.467), SLG (.707), OPS (1.174), times on base (251), total bases (301), extra-base hits (72), WAR among position players (8.6 - FanGraphs), game-winning RBI (18) and go-ahead RBI (26), tied for first in walks (102, tied for first in AL), ranks second in BA (.333, second in AL), tied for second in multi-hit games (46, second in AL), fourth in runs scored (95, fourth in AL) and sixth in hits (142, fifth in AL).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in OBP (.337), OPS (.779) and walks (505), rank second in runs scored (630, first in AL), runs per game (5.16, first in AL), home runs (186, second in AL) and SLG (.442, second in AL), and fifth in pitches per plate appearance (3.96, third in AL).

- ▶ **Yankees batters have recorded at least 8H in a season-high 18 straight games (since 7/26), their longest streak since a 22-game streak from 6/20-7/14(G2)/89...marks just the 11th time in franchise history the Yankees have recorded as long of a streak...are one of just two Major League teams to record as long of a streak in the last seven years since 2018**, joining the 2021 Astros (19G from 5/2-22/21)...are hitting .292/.371/.524 (191-for-655) with 117R, 39 doubles, 1 triple, 37HR, 116RBI, 88BB, 2HP, 13SF and 10SB over that span...their 191H over that span are their most in an 18-game stretch since recording 194H in 18 games from 7/23-8/10/19.
- ▶ Have scored at least 4R in 16 of their last 18 games (since 7/26), scoring 117R and averaging 6.50 runs per game in that span...have scored at least 4R in 82 games this season, tied with Philadelphia and Los Angeles-NL for the most in Majors...are 65-17 (.793) in those games.
- ▶ Have scored a Major League-best 90R in the first inning...are a Major League-best 39-9 (.813) when scoring in the first inning.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY
Aug. 16, 2006: The Yankees break ground for a new Yankee Stadium, scheduled to be ready for Opening Day 2009.
Aug. 16, 1974: Down 8-7 with two outs in the bottom of the 13th, Bobby Murcer singles to right to bring up Thurman Munson, who goes deep off Chicago-AL's Terry Forster for a 9-8 win at Shea Stadium, marking the only "walk-off" HR of Munson's career.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY
Aug. 17, 1933: Lou Gehrig breaks the all-time consecutive games played record by appearing in his 1,308th consecutive game, surpassing Everett Scott's previous mark of 1,307.

#17 AARON BOONE—Manager**Career Managerial Record: 581-411 (7th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Joe Girardi, 910)**

- The 2024 season marks his seventh year at the helm for the Yankees (also 2018-23)...guided the Yankees to an 82-80 record in 2023, finishing fourth in the AL East...marked the Yankees 31st consecutive winning season and sixth such season under Boone...has led the Yankees to two division titles (2019 and 2022).
- According to *Elias*, was the first Manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...was the third Manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees (2018-22), joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
- Was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21 to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...was named the 33rd Manager in club history on 12/4/17...is the 18th person to both play for, and manage, the Yankees...is one of eight active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), A.J. Hinch (Detroit), Mark Kotsay (Oakland), Dave Martinez (Washington/Montreal), Bob Melvin (San Francisco) and Dave Roberts (Los Angeles-NL).
- Has 39 career managerial ejections (six in 2024: 8/4 vs. TOR, 7/21 vs. TB, 6/22 vs. ATL, 5/28 at LAA, 4/22 vs. OAK, 4/10 vs. MIA; seven in 2023; nine in 2022; six in 2021; two in 2020; five in 2019; four in 2018).

- Five of his 8HR have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (three) this season...his 8HR are a career high.
- Is batting .327/.377/.527 (18-for-55) with 13R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI, 5BB, 1SF and 2SB in his last 22 games (since 7/6).
- Has hit safely in a season-high five straight games (since 8/7-G1), batting .400/.438/.867 (6-for-15) with 4R, 1 double, 2HR, 3RBI, 1BB and 1SB.
- Was 2-for-5 with 2R, 1RBI and 1SB on Wednesday at Chicago-AL...scored the game-tying run in the seventh inning, scoring from second on a sac fly...also hit an RBI single in the eighth.
- Appeared defensively at all three outfield positions (LF - 51G/34GS, RF - 49G/25GS, CF - 1G), 3B (15G/13GS), 2B (6G/3GS), SS (5G/5GS) and 1B (1G) in 2023...according to *Elias*, was just the third player in franchise history to play all three outfield positions and all four infield positions in a single season, joining Clay Bellinger (2000) and Wid Conroy (1905).

- Four of his 7HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (three).
- Has reached base in 30 of his last 33 starts (since 6/6)...has hit safely in 22 of those games.
- Was 1-for-4 with 1BB on Wednesday at Chicago-AL.
- Is a two-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020, '22)...was just the fourth player in Padres history to win multiple Gold Gloves, joining Tony Gwynn (five), Steve Finley (two) and Dave Winfield (two).

- Has reached base in 105 of his 120 games this season, batting .333/.467/.707 (142-for-426) with 95R, 28 doubles, 1 triple, 43HR, 110RBI, 102BB, 7HP, 2SF and 6SB...during his 2022 AL MVP campaign, had hit .297/.394/.663 (133-for-448) with 100R, 20 doubles, 48HR, 105RBI, 69BB, 5HP, 4SF and 14SB through his first 120 games.
- His 105 games reaching base this season are tied for the second-most games in the Majors (second in AL)...has reached base multiple times in 78 of those games, the most in the Majors...has reached base at least three times in 44 games this season, the most in the Majors...has reached base at least four times in 19 games this season, the most in the Majors...has recorded multiple walks in 23 games this season, the second-most such games in the Majors behind Juan Soto (28).
- Leads the Majors in HR (43), RBI (110), OBP (.467), SLG (.707), OPS (1.174), times on base (251), total bases (301), extra-base hits (72), WAR among position players (8.6 - FanGraphs), game-winning RBI (18) and go-ahead RBI (26), is tied for first in walks (102, tied for first in AL), ranks second in BA (.333, second in AL), is tied for second in multi-hit games (46, second in AL), fourth in runs scored (95, fourth in AL) and sixth in hits (142, fifth in AL).
- 20 of his 43HR this year have either given the Yankees the lead (19) or tied the game (one).
- Has hit at least 43HR through the Yankees' first 122 games of a season for the second time in his career (also 46HR in 2022)...is one of four players in franchise history (nine times) to hit at least 43HR through the club's first 122 games of a season... joins Babe Ruth (48HR in 1921, 45HR in 1928, 44HR in 1930 and 43HR in 1920), Mickey Mantle (45HR in 1961 and 43HR in 1956) and Roger Maris (48HR in 1961)... is one of five players in Major League history and one of three Yankees to hit at least 43HR through his club's first 122 games of a season *multiple times*, joining Ruth (4x: 1920, '21, '28 and '30), Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998, '99, '01 and '02), Mark McGwire (twice: 1998 and '99) and Mantle (twice: 1956 and '61).

- Is just the third Yankee in the last 63 years (since 1962) to record at least 110RBI in the Yankees' first 122 games of a season, joining Alex Rodriguez (115 in 2007) and Tino Martinez (116 in 1997).
- Is one of three Yankees in the last 67 years (since 1958) and one of four Yankees in the last 88 years (since 1937) to record at least 102BB through the team's first 122 games of a season, joining teammate Juan Soto (102BB in 2024), Jason Giambi (104BB in 2003) and Mickey Mantle (134BB in 1957).
- Has recorded 301 total bases, marking the first time in the last 68 years (since 1957) and the second time in the last 83 years (since 1942) a Yankee has recorded as many total bases through the club's first 122 games of a season, joining Mickey Mantle's 310 total bases in 1956...is just the second Major League player in the last 19 seasons (since 2006) to recorded at least 301 total bases in their team's first 122 games of a season, joining Colorado's Charlie Blackmon (308TB in 2017).
- Has reached base 251 times this season, the most by a Yankee through the club's first 122 games of a season in the last 67 years (since 1958)...the last Yankee to accomplish the feat was Mickey Mantle (287) in 1957...Judge is the only Major League player in the last 20 years (since 2005) to accomplish the feat and is the first since Barry Bonds (273) in 2004.
- Over his last 93 games (since 4/27), is hitting .382/.512/.815 (124-for-325) with 86R, 22 doubles, 1 triple, 39HR, 97RBI, 82BB, 6HP, 1SF and 5SB... joins Babe Ruth as the only two Major League players to bat at least .380 and hit at least 39HR over a 93-game span in a single season...had hit just .178/.317/.356 (18-for-101) with 9R, 6 doubles, 4HR, 13RBI, 20BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB over his first 27 games of the season from 3/28-4/26.
