RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Mariners (1-0, 2 to play) and Nationals (3 to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...the Rays have won six of their last eight games and eight of their last 13...are 14-12 in their last 26 contests on the heels of a season-high six-game losing streak from May 19-25...prior to that stretch, Tampa Bay posted an 11-4 mark in their previous 15 contests from May 3-18...the Rays are 8-9 so far during a stretch of 19 games in 20 days from June 7-26.

- ★ Tampa Bay has allowed three hits or fewer in back-to-back games for the first time since a franchise-record-tying three straight games from April 8-10, 2023...the three hits also tied a season low (4x).
- ★ Five of the Rays last eight games have been decided in the final at-bat...they have won three straight and seven of their last eight such contests...their 12-6 (.667) record in games decided in the final at-bat is tied with the Mariners (12-6) and Guardians (8-4) for the best mark in the majors.
- ★ Tampa Bay has out-hit its opponent in four of its last five games (53-26, +27)...prior to that stretch, the Rays were out-hit in 10 of their previous 11 games (109-73, -36). Prior to last night, the Rays had scored the first run in nine straight games before **Cal Raleigh's** solo homer in the 4th inning.
- ★ The Rays have not committed an error in a season-high-tying six consecutive games (also April 2-8).
- ★ With a win tonight, Tampa Bay can reach the .500 mark for the first time since entering play on June 7 vs. BAL (31-31).
- ★ Per Elias, Tampa Bay's remaining opponents have a combined .537 winning pct., the highest mark in the majors, with the next closest being Miami (.515).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, the Rays recalled RHP **Edwin Uceta** from Triple-A Durham and designated RHP **Chris Devenski** for assignment.

THE CHAMP IS HERE—**Yandy Díaz** has hit safely in a career-high 17 straight games, batting .368/.385/.487 (28-for-76) with 3 2B, 2 HR and 9 RBI during the streak...it marks the second-longest active streak in MLB behind **PIT Bryan Reynolds** (21G)...the 17-game run is tied with **Tommy Pham** (Aug. 21-Sept. 14, 2018) and **Aubrey Huff** (Aug. 23-Sept. 10, 2002) for the fourth-longest hitting streak in franchise history...with a hit tonight, he can tie **Wilson Ramos** (18G: April 14-May 12-G2, 2018) and **Quinton McCracken** (18G: Aug. 18-Sept. 9, 1998) for the second-longest streak in club history behind **Jason Bartlett** (19G: May 15-June 25, 2009).

Díaz also owns a career-high 26-game on-base streak, the second-longest active streak in MLB behind **BAL Gunnar Henderson** (31G)...he is the first Ray to reach base safely in 26 straight games since **Wander Franco** (43G: July 25-Sept. 29, 2021). He has recorded an RBI in a career-high-tying six straight games (3x, last: June 12-27, 2019)...it is the third-longest active streak in MLB behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (8G) and **STL Brendan Donovan** (7G)...the last Ray with an RBI in seven straight games was **Austin Meadows** (7G, Aug. 28-Sept. 6, 2021).

AROZARENA ANSWERS—**Randy Arozarena** is batting .292 (19-for-65) with 5 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 11 BB, 16 SO, 3 SB and 6 HBP over 21 games in June...his .434 on-base pct. this month is fifth in the AL behind **CLE Steven Kwan** (.507), **NY Yankees Juan Soto** (.494), **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (.481) and **BOS Jarren Duran** (.451).

He has reached base safely in a season-high 10 straight games, his longest run since Sept. 6-16, 2023 (10G)...his last on-base streak of 11 straight games came during a career-best 20-game run from April 17-May 9, 2023.

He has been hit by four pitches during the on-base streak...his 56 HBP with the Rays are two shy of **Brandon Guyer** (58HBP) for the franchise record.

RED-HOT RAYS—**Ben Rortvedt** is batting .333 (12-for-36) with 4 2B, 2 HR and 10 RBI over his last 11 games...has 1+ RBI in a career-high three straight games and is 4-for-6 (.667) with RISP over his last six contests...is one game shy of matching his career-long five-game hitting streak set earlier this season (April 3-10).

Jose Siri is batting .311 (14-for-45) with 4 2B, 3 HR and 4 RBI over his last 12 games, tallying six multi-hit efforts during that stretch.

Amed Rosario is batting .400 (16-for-40) in June, second in the AL (min. 35AB) behind **CLE Steven Kwan** (.439)...with a season average of .301, Rosario is one of 10 AL hitters with 200+ at-bats batting .300 or better.

CARDIAC KIDS—The Rays 22 comeback wins are tied for the MLB lead with the Nationals...Tampa Bay's 17 wins when allowing the opponent to score first are tied with New York-NL for second most in the majors behind New York-AL (19) and Washington (18)...the Rays five walk-off victories are tied for fourth most in MLB behind the Marlins (8) and Giants/Mets (both 6)...the Rays rank among MLB leaders in wins when trailing after six (1st, 10), seven (1st, 8) and eight (T2nd, 4) innings.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays 16-7 (.696) record in one-run games leads MLB, ahead of the Red Sox (10-5/.667)...their 28-12 (.700) mark in games decided by two runs or fewer also paces the majors, ahead of Philadelphia (20-11/.645)...since April 29, they are 19-6 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 7-18 in all other contests...Tampa Bay is 12-5 in its last 17 one-run games...the 2023 Rays went 35-35 (.500) in games decided by two runs or fewer, including 22-25 (.468) in one-run affairs.

MANY WAYS TO WIN—Last night, the Rays recorded their 14th win of the season without the assistance of a home run...the 14 such victories lead the AL and rank second in the majors behind the Brewers (15).

PECKING ORDER—In 21 games, this month, Tampa Bay's 1-3 hitters have hit .291 with 12 2B, 1 3B, 6 HR and 28 RBI...they entered the month batting a collective .231, the fourth-lowest average in the AL up to that point.

Rays 7-9 hole hitters have hit 7 HR in June, tied for fifth most in MLB...they hit only 2 HR in May, tied for the fewest in the majors with the Guardians and Tigers.

GOING, GOING, GONE!—Tampa Bay pitching has allowed an MLB-high 110 HR, with the next closest team being the Blue Jays (106HR)...the Rays have allowed 1+ HR in a season-high 10 straight games, the longest active streak in MLB...it marks Tampa Bay's most consecutive games allowing 1+ HR since Sept. 11-22, 2023 (11G).

Of the 110 HR allowed, 44 have been permitted by Tampa Bay relievers (40.0%).

STUCK IN NEUTRAL—In 33 games since May 18, only two wins have been credited to a Rays starter: **Ryan Pepiot** (June 4 at MIA) and **Taj Bradley** (June 13 vs. CHC)...tonight's starter, **Zack Littell**, is seeking his first victory since May 11 vs. NYY, going 0-3 in seven starts since the victory.

Tampa Bay starters have a combined 14 wins on the season, third fewest in the majors, ahead of only Colorado and Miami (both 13)...in comparison, Rays relievers have 25 victories, second most in MLB behind Milwaukee (28).

MARINERS ON THE BAY—Tampa Bay and Seattle continue a three-game set tonight at Tropicana Field...the Rays took four of seven games from the Mariners last season, including three straight from Sept. 8-10 at Tropicana Field...since a six-game losing skid to Seattle from June 17-Aug. 3, 2021, the Rays are 11-5 against the Mariners, including a 7-2 mark at home.

CONNECTIONS

- ★ Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** and Mariners Manager **Scott Servais** are two of the three longest-tenured skipper in MLB...Cash is in his 10th full season, while Servais and **LAD Dave Roberts** are each in their ninth full seasons at the helm.
- ★ Mariners SS **J.P. Crawford** is the cousin of Rays Hall of Famer **Carl Crawford**.
- ★ Seattle C **Cal Raleigh** and Tampa Bay INF **Taylor Walls** were teammates at Florida State University (2016-17)...both were selected in the third round of MLB's First-Year Player Draft (Walls-2017, Raleigh-2018).
- ★ **David Lowe**, the father of Rays OF **Josh Lowe**, was drafted by the Mariners in the fifth round in 1986 out of Satellite Beach (Fla.) High School, but instead accepted an appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy.
- ★ Seattle Assistant General Manager, Baseball Operations **Andy McKay** spent one season as a Player/Coach at the University of Tampa and won the 1993 Division II National Championship.
- ★ Tampa Bay RHP **Shawn Armstrong** spent parts of two seasons (2018-19) with Seattle, going 0-2 with a 3.93 ERA (18.1IP, 8ER) and one save in 18 relief appearances.
- ★ **Lou Piniella**, who managed the Mariners (1993-2002) and Devil Rays (2003-05), was born in Tampa...was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2014.
- ★ Mariners Pitching Coach **Pete Woodworth** was born in St. Pete and attended Saint Petersburg Catholic High School...was signed by the Rays as a non-drafted free agent in 2010 following his collegiate career at Florida Gulf Coast University.
- ★ Rays RHP **Zack Littell** was selected by Seattle in the 11th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...pitched four seasons (2013-16) in the Mariners minor league system before being dealt to the Yankees on Nov. 18, 2016 for LHP **James Pazos**.
- ★ Seattle RHP **George Kirby** made his MLB debut on May 8, 2022 vs. Tampa Bay (ND, 6.0IP, 4H, 0R, 0BB, 7SO).
- ★ **Jacob Maton**, the younger brother of Rays RHP **Phile Maton**, was originally selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.

TONIGHT'S START--The right-hander will take the mound for his 16th start of the season, including his ninth at Tropicana Field...has recorded a 10.29 ERA (7.0IP, 8ER) in his last two starts compared to a 3.80 ERA (47.1IP, 20ER) in his previous eight...has thrown 5.0+ IP in 12 of his 14 starts...is looking to snap a career-high three-decision losing streak, seeking his first victory since May 11 vs. New York-AL...has recorded 12 SO in his last four starts (13.8% SO rate) since tallying a career-high 9 SO on May 28 vs. OAK.

LAST TIME OUT--Departed in a 2-2 tie and did not factor into the decision of the Rays 7-6, 10-inning win at Minnesota on June 20 (5.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 2BB, 5SO, HR)...permitted a Kyle Farmer RBI-double in the 2nd and a 3rd-inning solo homer by Royce Lewis...both run-scoring hits came with two outs...stranded a one-out double in the 4th and worked around a pair of baserunners in the 5th...fanned Lewis looking to conclude the outing.

BACK TO HIS ROOTS--The 2013 Mariners draftee (11th round) makes his third career appearance (2nd start) against Seattle tonight...he was traded to the Yankees in 2016 after four seasons in Mariners farm system...this marks Littell's second consecutive start against a former organization, coming off a June 20 outing at Minnesota after pitching for the Twins from 2018-20 to open his major league career...in his only career start vs. the Mariners on Sept. 8, 2023, Littell suffered the loss despite working a career-best 8.0 IP (L, 8.OIP, 5H, ER, BB, 4SO)...he was opposed by tonight's Mariners starter, RHP Luis Castillo, in the contest...in that outing, he became the second Rays pitcher (3rd instance) to take a loss despite allowing one run over 8.0+ innings, joining James Shields (2x, last: Oct. 2, 2012 vs. BAL - 9.OIP, 1R). Littell is 1-3 with a 2.88 ERA (34.1IP, 11ER) in seven career starts against AL West opponents...overall, his 2.91 ERA (52.2IP, 17ER) in 23 career games (7GS) vs. the AL West is his lowest against any division.

HOME COOKING--He has allowed 3 ER or fewer in five consecutive home starts, pitching to a 3.26 ERA (30.1IP, 11ER) with a .228 opp. average during that stretch...over the same timeframe (since May 4), Littell has produced a 7.50 ERA (18.OIP, 15ER) and .365 (31-for-85) opp. average in four road starts.

A LITTELL HELP?--He has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 15 starts, including six straight...his 2.56 run support average during the streak (since May 21) is fourth lowest in the AL (min. 25.OIP)...the Rays are 2-4 in his last six starts since winning three straight from May 4-16...he has exited a start in line for the win just twice in his last 12 outings, earning a win on May 11 vs. NYY and settling for a no-decision on May 16 at BOS.

SUMMERTIME BLUES--Littell has allowed opponents to hit .356/.391/.632 (31-for-87) over four June starts...min. 15.0 IP, it marks the highest opp. slugging pct. in the AL this month and the second-highest opp. average behind OAK J.P. Sears (.384)...entering June, those figures stood at .267/.304/.389 (66-for-247) for the season...min. 15.0 IP, his 6.63 ERA (19.OIP, 14ER) in June is fifth highest in the AL...the highest ERA he has produced in a calendar month in his career (min. 10.OIP) is an 8.49 ERA (11.2IP, 11ER) in May 2022 with San Francisco.

TROUBLING TRENDS--Littell has allowed a homer in career-high seven straight starts, tied with BOS Kutter Crawford for the longest active streak in the majors...it marks the longest single-season streak by a Ray since Taj Bradley (7GS) from June 21-July 29, 2023, with Jake Odorizzi (15GS, May 1-July 23, 2017) holding the last longer streak...prior to Littell's streak, he had held opponents homerless in six of his first eight starts, ranking seventh in the AL over that span (thru May 11, min. 40.OIP) with 0.60 HR/9.OIP.

He has also issued a walk in a career-high eight straight outings since May 11, but has still managed a 5.3 pct. walk rate in that span.

PINPOINT PRECISION--Littell's 4.2 pct. walk rate ranks fourth in the AL behind Zach Eflin (1.8%), SEA George Kirby (2.4%) and DET Jack Flaherty (4.0%), and sixth in the majors...according to Elias, his free pass to NYY Anthony Rizzo on May 11 snapped a 123 BF streak without a walk, fourth longest in Rays history behind Zach Eflin (165BF, 2024), Corey Kluber (150BF, 2022) and David Price (124BF, 2013)...from April 17-May 4, he recorded 6+ SO without issuing a walk in a club-record four straight starts.

DAY 'N NITE--In eight day starts, Littell is 2-2 with a 2.86 ERA (44.OIP, 14ER) and has allowed only 3 HR (0.61 HR/9.OIP)...this, compared to 0-3 with a 5.79 ERA (37.1IP, 24ER) and 8 HR (1.93 HR/9.OIP) in seven night starts. Min. 35.0 IP, his 2.86 daytime ERA is ninth lowest in the AL...under the same parameter, his 5.79 night ERA is seventh highest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP RYAN PEPIOT (4-4, 4.61)

LAST START--On June 21 at Pittsburgh, he was unable to escape the 4th inning after allowing five of the first six Pirates to reach base in the frame (ND, 3.1IP, 3H, 2ER, 4BB, 3SO)...matched a season high with four walks (also April 1 vs. TEX), three of which came in the 4th inning.

vs. MARINERS--Pepiot will be making his first career start against the Mariners...he is 1-1 with a 4.67 ERA (17.1IP, 9ER) in three career starts against AL West opponents, all of which came this season at home (April 1 vs. TEX; April 18 vs. LAA; May 29 vs. OAK).

- Has tallied a hit in 9 of his last 10 games since June 14, slashing .333/.465/.606 (11-for-33) with 3 2B, 2 HR and 7 RBI...ranks among AL leaders in that span in OBP (2nd), SB (T7th, 3) and OPS (10th, 1.071).
- Has reached base in 9 of his last 10G vs. Seattle, batting .316/.395/.526 (12-for-38).
- Batting .292 (19-for-65) with 5 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 11 BB and an .895 OPS over 21G in June...his .434 OBP in June ranks 8th in MLB (leader: CLE Kwan, .507)...this month, has raised his season AVG from .158 to .191 and OPS from .558 to .652.
- Batting .317 (13-for-41) vs. fastballs in June...entered the month at .133 (13-for-98).
- Has gone 4-for-11 (.364) with RISP over his last 8 games.
- Is one of six players in the AL and 13 in MLB with 10+ HR and 10+ SB.
- His 36 walks lead the Rays and are T5th among AL OF/T9th among MLB OF.
- From June 18-21, had a 4G XBH streak, T2nd-longest of his career (6G, Aug. 2-13, 2021).
- On June 7 vs. BAL, recorded his 500th career hit with a 3rd-inning double.

- Is 2-for-22 (.091) over his last 8 games, but has gone 2-for-8 (.250) in his last 3... snapped an 0-for-14 skid with a 2nd-inning single on Saturday at Pittsburgh.
- His 24 SB lead the AL and rank 3rd in MLB...has been successful on 7 straight SBA...is tied for the MLB lead in caught stealings (8) and pickoffs (4).
- Is batting .283 (28-for-99) on the road (28G) vs. .203 (25-for-123) at home (38G).
