In his last 18 games, **Christian Yelich** is batting .373 [25-for-67] with 6 HR and 16 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .447 OBP/.657 SLG/1.104 OPS.

That's a Fact, Jack!

In his last 14 games, **Jackson Chourio** is batting .322 [19-for-59] with 4 HR and 12 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .333 OBP/.593 SLG/.927 OPS.

Better Call Sal

In his last 25 games, Sal Frelick is batting .344 (32-for-93) with 2 HR and 13 RBI....during this stretch, he has a .384 OBP/.441 SLG/.825 OPS.

I Like Ike

The Brewers are 23-8 (.742) in games started by **Isaac Collins** this season (21-7 in LF, 1-1 at DH, 1-0 at 2B).

U Da Man!

Abner Uribe is unscored upon in 29 of his 33 appearances this season, including 21 of his last 22 outings and 8 games in a row.....he ranks among National League relief leaders in ERA [4th, 1.35] and strikeouts [4th, 43].

TODAY'S GAME: Is game 9 (4-4) of a 10-game homestand vs. San Diego (1-2), Atlanta (1-2) and St. Louis (2-0).....is the team's longest homestand of the season.....after an off day on Monday, the team takes a 6-game trip to Chicago-NL (3g) and Minnesota (3g).

<u>IT WON'T BE THE SAME</u>: This season marks just the second without **Bob Uecker** on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS [88 days]: The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 10*, SECOND: 20, THIRD: 44, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in second place, trailing the first-place Cubs by 4.5 games (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

<u>SERIES-LY SPEAKING</u>: The team is 11-10-1 in series play. <u>Game 1</u>: 12-11, <u>Game 2</u>: 13-10, <u>Game 3</u>: 11-11, <u>Game 4</u>: 2-1 <u>Sweep Wins [2]</u>: vs. BOS (3g, 5/26-5/28) and at PHI (3g, 5/30-6/1) <u>Sweep Losses [1]</u>: at NYY (3g, 3/27-3/30)

 $\underline{\text{AT HDME}}\text{:}$ The team is 22-14 at home, going 7-4-0 in series play.

<u>ON THE ROAD</u>: The team is 16-19 on the road, going 4-6-1 in series play.....the Brewers are 6-1 in their last 7 road games.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

CDACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), litting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role)....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made eight replay challenges this season, going 5-3.....their last challenge (won) came on 5/28 vs. Boston as an out call at second base involving Sal Frelick was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons [2018-24] and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros [7], Braves [7], Dodgers [7] and Yankees [6].....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons [2017-24], missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 704 wins since 2017 (6th in MLB/3rd in National League).

TODAY'S STARTER: #62 - LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (8gs, 4-1, 2.66) 2025 Arsenal: Sinker (47.9%) - Changeup (23.3%) - Curveball (12.1%) - 4-Seam Fastball (8.5%) - Slurve (8.3%)

QUINTANA AT A GLANCE: José Quintana, 36, will make his ninth start of the season and second against the Cardinals.....Quintana last started last Saturday vs. San Diego and had no decision in the 4-3 win (5ip, 5h, 1r, 1er, 3bb, 4k, 101 pitches).....the team is 6-2 in his starts.....he has 2 quality starts.....opponents are batting .242 (40-for-165, 5hr)..... he was on the 15-day injured list from 5/14-5/31 with a left shoulder impingement, retroactive to May 11.....Quintana signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on March 5.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.....name is pronounced "keen-TAH-nuh."

LAST SEASON: Quintana went 10-10 with a 3.75 ERA in 31 starts with New York-NL.....the team went 16-15 in his starts.....he made 12 quality starts.....opponents batted .237 [150-for-634, 22hr].....he was the Mets' Opening Day starter (against the Brewers).

MR. COLOMBIA: Quintana, born in Arjona, Colombia, is his country's all-time leader in nearly every statistical category in the Major Leagues, including games (367), starts (341), wins (106), innings pitched (2013.2) and strikeouts (1,758).....he pitched for Colombia in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

<u>BEEN THERE, DONE THAT</u>: Quintana has made 341 starts since 2012 - his first season - which trails only **Max Scherzer** (357) and **Zack Greinke** (344) during this period..... this includes nine seasons of 30+ starts.

CAREER: Is 106-104 with a 3.72 ERA in 367 games/341 starts (2013.2ip, 832er).....is in his 14th Major League season while pitching for Chicago-AL (2012-17), Chicago-NL (2017-20), Los Angeles-AL (2021), San Francisco (2021), Pittsburgh (2022), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2025).....was an All-Star in 2016 as he finished 10th in American League Cy Young Award voting.....Quintana was originally signed by the Mets as a non-drafted free agent on 4/26/06.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 6-5 with a 4.03 ERA in 15 starts (82.2ip, 37er).....is 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in 3 starts this season (15.2ip, 8er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 53-55 with a 3.74 ERA in 186 games/174 starts (1016.2ip. 422er).....is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA in 5 starts this season (28.1ip. 5er).

CAREER vs. CARDINALS: Is 7-4 with a 3.81 ERA in 15 starts against St. Louis (78ip, 83h, 39r, 33er, 30bb, 72k, 7hr), including a 7-1 win this season on 4/27 at Busch Stadium (5ip, 5h, 1r, 1er, 3bb, 6k).....has gone 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA in his last 3 starts (19ip, 11h, 4r, 4er, 8bb, 14k, 1hr).
