THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (1-1), the only division with three 60-win clubs thus far...Overall, the Mets are 38-15 East (1-1), the only division with three 60-win clubs thus far...Overali, the Mets are 38-15 against the East this year...Their .717 division winning percentage is the best in baseball... They have not lost a series in the division all season long and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win two of its seven remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 15 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a caseon fines the MI simplemented divisions in 1969. It's the longest cince the Braves season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 25-8 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.05 ERA against the East, while hitting .261/.338/.416...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 267-170.

**JUST SHORT:** Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)... Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016... He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He has recorded 81 RBI in 113 games this season (79 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He is sixth the majors and fourth in the NL with 81 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the ajors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

**30 FOR 20:** Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Plazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons with 30 of more home nome nome nome nome nome and plaze Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 97 RBI...He is ninth in the majors and fifth is the Number 528 SIC. fifth in the NL with a .538 SLG.

**THE ROAD TO 100:** Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 94 strikeouts...That is 23 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.2% of batters faced (94/180), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 47 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.87 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 27 saves, a 1.33 ERA (seven earned runs/47.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 41-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 20 outings dating back to June 22, covering 20.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak...40 of Díaz last 56 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.34 ERA (one earned runs/26.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 56 strikeouts...He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

HUNDREDS AND HUNDRED: Díaz converted his 200th career save last night...His 200 saves are 53rd in major league history. He is one six active players who have recorded 200 saves in his career...He recorded his 200th career save in his 390th career game.... Only Craig Kimbrel (318 games), Jonathan Papelbon (359 games) and Mariano Rivera (382 games) reached the 200 save mark in fewer games...Overall, he has struck out 94 batters in 47 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in Franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019...Díaz is eighth on the Mets all-time strikeouts list for relievers...The late Pedro Feliciano is seventh with 350 strikeouts with the Mets

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 78 times this year...It's tied for their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha (14), Brandon Nimmo (13) and Pete Alonso (10) all rank in the top 10 in hit by pitches this season.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets are second in the majors with 1,093 strikeouts this season...It's a franchise record for most strikeouts through 114 games in a season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 59 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 860 times this season... That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets are batting .274/.349/.414 in the first inning this season... They have recorded 17 doubles, a triple, 15 home runs and scored 72 runs...The team ranks second in the majors in first inning hits (125) and in OBP (.348)...They are tied for fourth in runs and fifth in average...Starling Marte is batting ...386/.427/.651 in the first inning this season...Six of his 12 home runs this season have come in the first inning, tied for third-most in the NL.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.52 ERA (151 earned runs/386.1 innings) this season...That places them third in the National League...Their 444 strikeouts a third in the Senior Circuit and tied for fifth in the majors.

ONE, SINGULAR SENSATION: The Mets picked up their first 1-0 win of the seas was New York's first 1-0 win in a nine-inning game since July 24 (Opening Day), 2020 vs. Atlanta...The Mets also had two 1-0 wins in seven-inning doubleheader contests last season...It was the Mets 16th-ever 1-0 win over the Phillies and their first since R.A. Dickey tossed a one-hitter exactly 12 years prior, August 13, 2010, at Citi Field.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Phillies 1-0 last night...The Mets are in a

New York is 26-6-3 in 35 series this year...The Mets are 58-11 when scoring first this season... New York is 26-6-3 in 35 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (8-2), their longest of the year, against the Braves (4-1), Reds (3-0) and Phillies (1-1)... Following this series, the Mets head out on a 10-game, nine-day road trip to Atlanta (four games), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

**RUBBERBAND MAN:** The Mets are 13-3 in rubber games this season...According to Elias, that's the best winning percentage (.813) in such games this season.

BLANK STREET: The Mets recorded their 15th shutout of the season last night...That is

the most in the majors...The team's 15 shutouts are the most since they also recorded 15

in 2018...The Mets have been blanked only five times this season.

deMAN OF THE HOUR: Jacob deGrom tossed 6.0 scoreless innings last night on the way to the victory...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in his last 22 home starts, the longest such streak in major league history...That includes eight scoreless starts during that span...He improved to 9-1 with a 2.18 ERA (29 earned runs/120.0 innings) in 20 career starts against the Phillies, the lowest mark among active pitchers against the Phillies (min. 50.0 IP vs. PHI)...The Mets are 16-4 in games started by deGrom against the Phillies...He recorded his 55th career double-digit strikeout game and is five shy of twing Tom Souver's franchise record. He has completed at least 5.0 inprise in 28 of his tying Tom Seaver's franchise record...He has completed at least 5.0 innings in 28 of his 30 starts since the start of 2020 and recorded a double-digit strikeout game in half of those 28 outings.

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Chris Bassitt has thrown at least 6.0 innings in each of his last nine starts...That is a career-best streak...In eight starts since June 14, Bassitt is 5-3 with a 2.19 ERA (15 earned runs/61.2 innings) with 11 walks and 55 strikeouts...He has not allowed an earned run in his last 19.0 innings...He has posted a 2.72 ERA (22 earned runs/72.2 innings) with 15 walks and 76 strikeouts in 11 starts at home this season.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets are once again a season-high 34 games over .500...Prior to **ON THE RECORD:** The Mets are once again a season-high 34 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 34 games above after they were 92-58 on September 19, 2006...The last time the team was 35 games above .500 was when they were a season-high 35 games over on September 13, 2006...New York has won 74 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .649 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 74-40 record through the team's first 114 games...Only the 1986 (76-38) team posted a better record through the first 114 games of the season.

**HERE COMES THE SUN KING:** The Mets have won five straight day games and nine of their last 11 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 30-15 in day games this season...The team's .667 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.04 ERA with 114 walks and 438 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.04 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 438 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

GO AHEAD AND MAKE MY DAY: Pete Alonso leads the majors leagues with 31 go-GO AHEAD AND MAKE MY DAY: Pere Alonso leads the majors leagues with 31 go-ahead RBI this year...That is 10 more than the next player...Francisco Lindor is tied for second in the majors and in the NL with 21 go-ahead RBI...Alonso's 31 RBI are tied for the eighth most in single-season history...His career-high is 32 go-ahead RBI which he accomplished in 2019...Keith Hernandez owns the both the franchise record and the number two spot with 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985 and 35 in 1984.

HOMESTAND BY ME: The Mets are batting .277/.357/.418 during their current homestand...They have recorded 36 extra-base hits and drew 34 walks...New York is 31-98 (.316) with a .375 OBP with RISP during the current stand...The Mets have posted a 2.67 ERA (27 earned runs/91.0 innings) with 19 walks and 111 strikeouts during the hometand...The Mets have outscored their opponents 54-29 in the 10 games.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 11-2 in their last 13 games in Queens...Overall, the Mets are 39-19 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .672 winning percentage at home...The team's .672 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 (55-26, .679) and 1986 (55-26, 679) teams had a better record at home...The Mets have posted a 3.17 ERA with 164 walks and 572 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 16-5 in the second-half...The team's 16 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .762 winning percentage also ranks second...The team is batting .287/.357/.459 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in OBP, are second in average and third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 109-65 following the break.

**FOR STARTERS:** Since Max Scherzer returned from the IL on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.15 ERA (49 earned runs/205.0 innings) in the team's last 34 games with 223 strikeouts and 48 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.79 ERA, followed by the Phillies with a 2.95 ERA...New Yorks' 223 strikeouts in that span also lead the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.46 in that span... The Mets rank third in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.46 ERA from their starters from their starters.

fWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD fOR ?: Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 5.0 fWAR...He had his 19-game on-base streak snapped last night...It is the second-longest on-base streak in his career...In 38 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .322/.401/.541 with 29 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 25 RBI, 18 walks and a .942 OPS.

## BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his ninth win of the season after throwing a season-high 114 pitches across 8.0 innings in the team's 5-1 victory over Cincinnati on August 8 at Citi Field...Pitched 7.0 or more innings for the sixth time this season...Bassitt allowed one unearned run on eight hits, striking out eight batters and walking only one.

**HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE:** After 11 starts at Citi Field this season, Bassitt is 3-5 with a 2.72 ERA (22 earned runs/72.2 innings)...He has 76 strikeouts and 15 walks at home...Across his last six starts at Citi Field, Bassitt owns a 1.73 ERA (eight earned runs/41.2 innings) with 45 strikeouts and seven walks...In 60 career home games (54 starts), he is 16-19 with a 2.61 ERA (101 earned runs/348.1 innings), 332 punchouts and 86 walks...That is the fourth-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.09), Clayton Kershaw (2.22), and Blake Snell (2.61).

**IT'S NOT ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA:** Bassitt will face the Phillies for the third time this season...His last start against Philadelphia came on May 29 at Citi Field where he went 6.0 innings allowing one run on two hits, while striking out seven batters and walking three...Bassitt owns a 1.54 ERA (two earned runs/11.2 innings) in two starts against the Phils...Having never faced the NL East before this year, Bassitt has fared well going 5-3 with a 2.56 ERA (18 earned runs/63.1 innings), 56 strikeouts and 15 walks in 10 starts.

**CAREER YEAR:** Tied a career-high set in 2021, with his third game of the season going 7.0 innings or longer without allowing an earned run...Those three games are tied with teammate Max Scherzer for the second-most such games this season...The only pitcher on the Mets staff with more such games is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times...Set a career high after working 8.0 innings for the second time this season...Prior to this year, Bassitt had gone at least 8.0 innings one time in three separate seasons 2021, 2019, and 2015.

**COME SWING AWAY:** Bassitt has generated 12 or more swings and misses in a 10 starts this season...His career high in that category was set in 2021 when he had 11 such games with a dozen or more swings and misses.

**2022 SEASON, PART 2:** In four starts since the All-Star Break, Bassitt has pitched to a 1.93 ERA (six earned runs/28.0 innings) going 2-1, with 25 strikeouts and six walks...Last year, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 2.75 post-All-Star Break ERA...He fanned 41 batters and walked 10 in eight games.

**WINNING WITH STYLE:** Earned his ninth win of the season and second straight against the Reds...Bassitt has reached double-digit wins only twice in his career (10, 2019 and 12 in 2021)... Across his eight seasons in the majors, the most quality starts Bassitt has had in a season is 16 in 2021...Currently, Bassitt has 14 quality starts on the season.

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 17 of his 21 starts this year matching a career high set in 2021...Those 17 starts with 6.0 or more innings pitched ranks tied for 10th-most in the majors...He has went 6.0 innings or longer in each of his last nine starts...His nine straight starts going 6.0 innings or more is a career-high and is the fifth-longest active streak in the majors...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 14 of his 21 starts, tied with Max Scherzer for the most such starts among Mets starters.

**LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI:** His 129 strikeouts and 1.123 WHIP are the eighth-most and seventh-lowest in franchise history among starters through their first 21 games as a Met.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (13–4, 3.76 ERA)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win against the Cincinnati Reds at Citi Field on August 9 after 6.2 innings of two-run ball after allowing a two-run home run to Jake Fraley...Carrasco struck out nine batters and walked only one...Has allowed two or fewer runs in six of his last seven starts.

**CALL HIM BUTTER**, '**CAUSE HE'S ON A ROLL**: Carrasco is 5-0 with a 1.69 ERA (eight earned runs/42.2 innings) in his last seven starts...In that span, Carrasco has 42 punchouts and has walked 11 batters...Since the All-Star Game, Carrasco has a 1.78 ERA (five earned runs/25.1 innings) in four starts...He has 23 strikeouts and six walks in that span.
