To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (2-2) and Braves (1-0, two to play) tonight in Atlanta...after going 18-4 between July 20-Aug. 12, they are 12-12 in their last 24 contests (Aug. 14-pres)...they are a combined 30-16 over those spans, which stands as the best record in the majors since July 20...are on a stretch of 14 road games within their final 23 games of the season (Sept. 3-27), going 3-2 thus far...have the second-toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .527 (BAL, .528), with five of their six remaining series (including current set) coming against opponents currently in position to qualify for the postseason...maintain a 4.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings, marking the third latest date in franchise history they have a lead of 4.0 games or more (Oct. 3, 2021 - 8.0GA; Sept. 27, 2020 - 7.0GA)...have spent 114 days leading the division (74 consecutive days, June 27-pres.), 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...have held the AL's best record for 113 days in addition to leading the AL East for 114 days, both of which are franchise records (Stats Perform)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back campaigns from 2020-21.

★ The Rays won the series opener over the Braves, 7-1, their largest margin of victory since Aug. 11 at ATH (12-4)...paired with the series finale of their 2024 set in Atlanta, the Rays have won back-to-back games in the city for the second time in franchise history (also: July 15-16, 2001)...they have never won three straight games in Atlanta.

★ With his 40th stolen base of season, **Chandler Simpson** joined **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Yankees Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

★ Rays hitters launched four homers, their most since a franchise-record-tying six long balls on Aug. 11 at ATH...they have hit nine homers in their last four games (Sept. 4-pres.) after hitting nine in their prior 11 games (Aug. 23-Sept. 3).

★ The lineup also went 1-for-11 with runners in scoring position, marking the 36th time in franchise history the club has won with one or zero hits in 11 AB or more with RISP (last: Sept. 24, 2025 at BAL, 1-for-15).

★ With a win tonight, the Rays will have won or split seven of their last eight road series (6-1-1, July 20-pres.) on the heels of a losing six of seven road sets between May 25-July 19 (1-6-0)...it would mark the third time in franchise history the Rays have won a series in Atlanta (2-1 from July 15-17, 2001 & 2-1 from July 16-18, 2021).

DEADLINE DEALS—Prior to the Aug. 3 trade deadline, the Rays acquired **RHP Freddy Peralta** (Aug. 2), **C Liam Hicks** (Aug. 3), and **RHP Tyler Wells** (Aug. 3)...according to Baseball-Reference, the trio have combined for a 1.7 bWAR in the 33-game span since the deadline closed on Aug. 3.

★ Since Hicks was acquired on Aug. 3, his 1.1 fWAR leads the Rays, is tied for the fourth highest by an AL catcher, and tied for the sixth highest by an AL left-handed hitter...over that span, he has slashed .313/.408/.506 (26-for-83) with 4 2B, 4 HR, 16 RBI, and a .914 OPS with more walks (11) than strikeouts (9)...min. .75 PA over that timeframe, his .914 OPS is the second best in the majors by a primary catcher behind **SEA Cal Raleigh** (.977).

★ Peralta turned in his third consecutive quality start (Aug. 26-pres.) last night, earning the win in all three outings...his four quality starts in seven appearances as a Ray equal his total across 22 starts to begin the year with the Mets...over those three recent starts, the right-hander has spun a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts to one walk and a .156 (10-for-64) opp. average.

★ Through 12 relief appearances, Wells has posted a 2-0 record with two saves, 1.69 ERA (16.0IP, 3ER), a .135 (7-for-52) opp. average, and a 0.69 WHIP...his 0.69 WHIP is the second lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors since Aug. 3, while his .135 opp. average is tied for fourth in the AL and tied for sixth in MLB...he has allowed no runs in 10 of his 12 outings and allowed no hits in seven of 12.

HIT MAKER—**Chandler Simpson** (.307) is four points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.311) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to win an AL batting title...in doing so he would become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons and the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Yankees Robinson Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (138) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs seven singles over the Rays final 18 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

★ Per Baseball Savant, his 57 infield hits are the most across a single season by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) are tied for the fifth-most by any player in a single season over that time frame (see table on the right).

★ Simpson has recorded 51 multi-hit games this season, including eight in his last 15 games (Aug. 23-pres.)...he is eight multi-hit efforts shy of tying **Carl Crawford**'s franchise record from 2006 (59G).

THE LONG BALL RACE—Last night, **Junior Caminero** surpassed **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for sole possession of the AL lead in home runs for the second time this season, joining Sept. 5 (38HR)...he trails only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (43) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (41) across all of MLB...he is one homer shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025)...he has registered 91 career home runs thus far, making him the 12th player in the modern era (since 1900) to reach that mark before his age-23 season (as of June 30)...the only other players to turn the trick are **Mel Ott** (115), **Eddie Mathews** (112), **Alex Rodriguez** (106), **Tony Conigliaro** (104), **Juan Soto** (98), **Mike Trout** (98), **Frank Robinson** (98), **Bryce Harper** (97), **Giancarlo Stanton** (93), **Bob Horner** (91), and **Ted Williams** (91).

300; THIS IS SPARTA—Since Aug. 1, **Yandy Diaz** has collected multiple hits in 17 of his 34 games—in all of MLB, only teammate **Chandler Simpson** (18) has more multi-hit efforts...he (.306/.169-for-553) is looking to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...only **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays have opened September 4-3 and need to win nine of their final 18 games to clinch their six straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the franchise record for consecutive months going .500 or better (also: July 2019-Sept./Oct. 2020)...they have secured their 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...their 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (18), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

PLAYOFFS? DON'T TALK ABOUT PLAYOFFS!—Per MLB, the earliest possible date the Rays can clinch a spot in the postseason is tomorrow with either of the following scenarios:

★ The Rays win today and tomorrow over the Braves AND the Mariners win today and tomorrow over the Rangers AND the Athletics win today over the Blue Jays.

★ The Rays win today and tomorrow over the Braves AND the Pirates win today and tomorrow over the White Sox AND the Orioles win today over the Guardians.

Class-A Bowling Green and Class-A Charleston both began their postseasons last night:

★ **BG**: In game one of the South Atlantic League Division Series (best-of-3), Bowling Green lost 9-8 in 10 innings to Winston-Salem...**INF Tony Santa Maria** finished the game 2-for-5, 1 HR, 3 RBI, 1 R, and 1 SB...combined with the regular season, he has launched 16 home runs and swiped 59 SB.

★ **CHS**: Charleston came from behind to win, 9-8, over Hickory in game one of the Carolina League Division Series (best-of-3)...**OF Slater de Brun** [TB No. 14] went 4-for-5 with 3 RBI, 1 BB, 2 R, and 1 SO in the contest...his 4 H and 3 RBI are both the most of any game in his professional career.

LET 'EM KNOW, BRING 'EM OUT—The Rays continue their visit to Truist Park tonight...prior to **Kevin Cash** becoming manager in 2015, they were 7-17 against the Braves, including a 4-11 record at Tropicana Field and a 3-5 record in Atlanta...since the appointment of Cash, the Rays are 13-12 overall with a 7-5 record at home and 6-7 on the road...this marks the second-closest geographical matchup for both clubs, with Tropicana Field and Truist separated by only 437 miles (TB: 204mi to MIA, ATL: 360mi to CIN).

★ In nine career games at Truist Park, **Liam Hicks** has slashed .419/.472/.645 (13-for-31) with 1 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI, and a 1.117 OPS and has homered in back-to-back games at the ballpark (April 15, 2026-pres.).

★ **Yandy Diaz** has hit .309 (267-for-863) in his career against the NL, the second-best average against Senior Circuit clubs among current AL hitter, trailing **Chandler Simpson**'s .324 (83-for-256) average (min. 250AB; see table on the right).

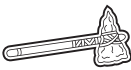

★ Ranks among AL leaders in RBI (T5th, 86), multi-RBI games (T5th, 23), hits (6th, 148), and multi-hit games (7th, 40). ★ On Sat. at TEX, recorded his second career go-ahead homer in extras off Jacob Latz, joining a 10th-inning walk-off on April 19, 2025 vs. NYY...was the fourth such homer by a Rays LHB vs. a LHP, first since Jake Bauers on June 24, 2018 vs. NYY (Chasen Shreve)...was the fourth time he homered in back-to-back games, the first since Sept. 26-27, 2024...has 4 HR in his last 13G. ★ Has been thrown 1,544 fastballs, third in the AL behind CLE Steven Kwan (1,558) and LAA Mike Trout (1,554)...23 of 42 XBH (16 2B, 7HR) have come on fastballs. ★ Across his last 76 games (June 12-pres.), he has multiple hits in 24 contests, tied for fifth-most multi-hit efforts in the AL over that span...produced a career-high-tying four-game multi-hit streak (4x, last: May 25-29) from July 8-11...was the third time he's turned the trick this season, and the only other Rays to do so this season are Yandy Diaz (June 17-21) and Chandler Simpson (Aug. 8-11). ★ Launched the second-farthest HR of his career Aug. 29 vs. SD, a 453-ft. shot that was the second-farthest by a Ray at Tropicana Field this season...marked his 100th career XBH...hit two long balls in a five-game span (Aug. 24-29) after hitting just four from June 1-Aug. 23 (71G). ★ In May, he led the majors in average (.374/34-for-91) and on-base pct. (.464)...he also ranked highly in OPS (2nd, 1.025) and hits (T2nd)...was the first Ray to lead MLB in average over a month since Diaz in June 2024 (.400)...his 43 RBI were second most in team history through May (Evan Longoria - 2019, 55RBI).

★	Following his solo home run in the 1st inning last night at ATL, he is one homer shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-homer seasons, the second player in the modern era with back-to-back 40-homer-run seasons in age-22-or-younger campaigns, and the first primary third baseman to have back-to-back 40-homer seasons since COL Nolan Arenado (2015-16)...with his solo shot in the 1st inning on Sat. at TEX, became the 12th player in the modern era with 90 home runs before his age-23 season.					
★	With an RBI-single in the 9th inning on Fri. at TEX, reached the 90-RBI mark for the second straight season...is the sixth player since 2000 to reach 90 RBI or more in multiple seasons by his age-22-or-younger season, and is the first since Juan Soto (2019, 2021).					
★	He has an RBI in 13 of his last 19 games (Aug. 19-pres.) and 18 of his last 27 (Aug. 10-pres.)...has four home runs in his last 10 games after a career-high-tying 15-game drought (Aug. 12-28) without a long ball.					
★	Ranks among AL leaders in home runs (1st, 39), total bases (2nd, 295), SLG (2nd, .536), XBH (T2nd, 61), RBI (3rd, 93), hits (4th, 155), runs (T6th, 89), and walks (T8th, 73).					
★	Had his 15-game hitting streak snapped on Sept. 2 vs. NYM...went 21-for-59 (.356) with 2 B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, and 8 R during the streak...became the youngest Ray (23.058) to produce a 15-game hitting streak or longer...was the longest streak by a Ray this season.					
★	Through 144 team games, Caminero is on pace to finish the season with 44 homers and 105 RBI...he would become the 15th player in the modern era (since 1900) to have triple-digit RBI in multiple age-22-or-younger seasons, the first since FLA Miguel Cabrera (2004-05)...he has started every game this season and could join Evan Longoria (2014) and Aubrey Huff (2003) as the only Rays to appear in each of the club's games during a single season.					
★	His 38 hits of 110 mph or faster this year are the most in the majors...also leads the majors with 179 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster and paces MLB with an average bat speed of 79.6 mph.					
★	Min. 200 AB, his .326 (87-for-267) average vs. fastballs ranks third in the AL...has tallied 32 of his 60 XBH vs. fastballs (11 2B, 21HR).					
★	Launched his 35th home run of the campaign on Aug. 11 at ATH...he became the third player in the modern era with multiple 35-HR seasons before his age-23 season, joining SEA Alex Rodriguez (1998, 1996) and MLN Eddie Mathews (1953-54).

★ Min. 100 AB, his .317 (45-for-142) average on the road leads the AL and ranks fifth in MLB...has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 road starts (July 17 [G1]-pres.).						
★ Has hit safely in 23 of 38 games since the All-Star break, going 35-for-134 (.261) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 18 RBI, and 10 multi-hit efforts in that span.						
★ Has batted .333 (5-for-15) with 7 RBI as a pinch hitter, the most hits as a pinch hitter by a Ray since Harold Ramírez recorded a franchise-record 11 in 2023...his 7 RBI as a pinch hitter are T4th in the majors and his five hits are tied for seventh in the AL.
