TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their first road trip of the 2026 season with the last of 3 contests against the Los Angeles Angels (1-1)...Seattle will also visit the Texas Rangers for a 3-game series on the trip...the Mariners went 3-4 on their opening homestand against the Cleveland Guardians (2-2) and New York Yankees (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game by a 1-0 final.

- **Ouchy!** - **Randy Arozarena** has recorded 99 hit-by-pitches in his career, 1 away from becoming the ninth active player with 100+ career HBP at the plate...Arozarena's 68 HBP since 2023 are tied for the **most in MLB** (also: Ty France).
- **Emerson Extended** - The Mariners signed top prospect **Colt Emerson** to a contract extension through the 2033 season, with a club option through 2034...Emerson was selected to the 40-man roster and optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...Emerson, 20, is ranked as the Mariners #1 prospect, and the #7 overall prospect in the Major Leagues, according to both *MLB Pipeline* and *Baseball America*
- **Cap is Back** - **J.P. Crawford** made his season debut on Friday after being activated from the 10-day Injured List (right shoulder inflammation) on Thursday...through his first two games he is 1-for-6 with 1 double and 2 walks.
- **Coming Soon to a Broadcast Booth Near You** - Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** is set to join the Mariners TV broadcast during the upcoming series against the Texas Rangers.
- **Arm Farm** - Mariners top pitching prospects **Kade Anderson** (Friday) and **Ryan Sloan** (Saturday) impressed in their season debuts with Double-A Arkansas...Anderson tossed 4.0 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts...Sloan struck out 4 over 4.0 IP allowing 3 ER.
- **Steelhead Sundays** - The Mariners debuted their new Steelheads uniforms a week ago today...Seattle will honor the Steelheads, who played in the West Coast Negro Baseball League in 1946, by wearing the Steelheads uniforms at every Sunday homegame...in addition, the Mariners are launching the Steelheads Community Fund with a \$500,000 commitment in support of local Black-led baseball and softball organizations and community initiatives.

PITCHING HAS BEEN NAILS...the Mariners pitching staff has been excellent over their first 9 games of 2026, holding a 2.52 ERA (23 ER, 82.0 IP), 18 walks, 95 strikeouts, 0.88 WHIP and a 5.28 strikeout to walk ratio...among MLB staffs, the Mariners rank 3rd in ERA, 2nd in WHIP, 1st in SO/BB, 6th in SO/9 (10.43), 1st in BB/9 (1.98), 2nd in fWAR (2.0), 2nd in H/9 (6.0) and T-1st in quality starts (6).

COLE BLOODED...**Cole Young**'s career-high tying hitting streak was snapped in last night's game, but he reached base safely for the 8th-consecutive game (3/27-c)...his career-high on-base streak is 10 games, which he achieved from July 5-22, 2025...the 22-year-old second baseman is batting .281 (9x32) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 5 RBI, a .324 OBP and slugging .500 (.824 OPS) in 9 games so far this season...Young's 0.7 bWAR is tied for the 6th in MLB.

DONNIE BALLGAME...**Brendan Donovan** Friday appeared in his 500th career game...he is batting .370 (10x27) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .485 OBP and slugging .667 (1.152 OPS) with a 239 OPS+ in 8 games this season...among MLB hitters so far in 2026 he ranks 7th in OBP.

CALLING ALL ANGELS...several Mariners players have been historically good against the Angels in their careers...**Andrés Muñoz** holds a 16.75 SO/9 and a 0.68 ERA over 26.1 IP, ranking 1st all-time in SO/9 and 5th in ERA (min. 20.0 IP) of any pitcher against the Angels...**Julio Rodríguez** has a 1.062 OPS in 223 plate appearances against the Halos, 2nd highest OPS trailing only José Ramírez-CLE (1.085).

FRIDAY NIGHT FUN...the Mariners pitching staff dominated the Angels in Friday's game, tossing the 1st extra-innings 1-hitter in club history and the 26th 1-hitter overall...**Bryan Woo**, **Matt Brash**, **Andrés Muñoz** and **Gabe Speier** combined to allow just 3 baserunners (1 hit, 1 walk and 1 HBP) and 1 unearned run while striking out 12 and not allowing a runner to reach scoring position until the "ghost runner" in the 10th inning.

T-MOBILE PARK IS THE PLACE TO BE...during the Mariners opening homestand, they drew 239,504 total fans as of the morning of April 3, 3rd-highest total in the big leagues so far behind only the Dodgers and Padres...an average of 34,214 fans watched the Mariners at T-Mobile Park through 7 games.

EXCITEMENT AROUND MARINERS BASEBALL...approximately 450 interviews and media sessions with Mariners players, coaches, and front office personnel were facilitated at 2026 Spring Training, in over 50 unique local, national, and international media outlets that visited Mariners camp in Peoria, Arizona.

MARINERS TV...the Mariners announced that Mariners TV will bring Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming will be available on Mariners, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners are set to finish their 2nd turn through their starting rotation today when **Luis Castillo** takes the mound against the Angels, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...that Seattle's starters have been excellent to begin the season, holding a 2.68 ERA (16 ER, 54.1 IP) with 13 walks, 68 strikeouts and a 0.83 WHIP, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that they rank among the MLB leaders in several pitching categories so far this season?...Mariners starters rank T-1st in WHIP, 5th in SO/BB (4.69), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.174) and 1st in fWAR (1.5).

- **2010** - Mariners beat Oakland 5-3 on Opening Day...Ken Griffey Jr. becomes 27th player in Major League history to play in 4 decades.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 2nd start of 2026 and his 244th career start...it will also be his first start of the season against the Angels and the 11th start of his career against the Halos.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...In his season debut on March 30 vs. Yankees, he threw 6.0 innings of shutout ball, allowing only 2 hits, 2 walks and striking out 7 Yankees batters.

1,500...Collected his 1,500th career strikeout on a swinging strikeout to Yankees batter Aaron Judge in the 6th inning of his March 30 start vs. Yankees...he is the 14th active player with 1500+ career strikeouts.

IN COMMAND...With his 6.0 innings of work in his March 30 start, Castillo ties **Logan Gilbert** for 6th most games in MLB with 6+ IP and fewer than 2 walks (66 G) since 2022...the Mariners duo trails Logan Webb (83), Zack Wheeler (72), Kevin Gausman (68), **George Kirby** (68), and Aaron Nola (68).

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...Is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole, Aaron Nola, Max Scherzer, and Zack Wheeler...leads the league in swing and misses with 3,403 in the last 10 years (2017-c)...also ranks 4th in the league in swinging strikeouts since 2017 trailing Max Scherzer (1,313), Kevin Gausman (1,286), and Gerrit Cole (1,262)

SEASONED TRAVELER...Has thrown 5.0+ innings in 97 career road starts, 6.0+ in 63 starts, and 7.0+ in 18 starts...his 256 strikeouts are 6th-most for a pitcher's first 50 road games with the Mariners in franchise history.

DEMOM ON THE MOUND...In 11 career starts against the Angels, he owns a 2.84 ERA with a 1.05 WHIP and 80 strikeouts...he is 1-of-4 starting pitchers to have a sub-3.00 ERA over 10+ games started against the Angels since his debut in 2017, joining Gerrit Cole (2.27), Frankie Montas (2.61), and Cole Irvin (2.76)...with a 1.05 WHIP he ranks 4th in the MLB against the Angels since 2017 (min. 10 GS)...his .714 win-loss % against the Angels is rank 6 of opponents he has faced in his career.

OUT WEST...In 10 starts during the 2025 season against AL West teams, he is 2-2 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) with 47 strikeouts and 14 walks...in 37 career starts against AL West opponents, he is 15-10 with a 3.03 ERA (74 ER, 220.0 IP), 227 strikeouts, and 59 walks.

FOR THE M'S RECORD BOOKS...With a win in today's game Castillo will join John Halama, James Paxton and Bill Swift, tied for the 17th most wins in a Mariners uniform (41)

WHO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...His 3.43 ERA (238 ER, 624.1 IP) with Seattle is the 2nd-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), and ranking ahead of teammates **George Kirby** (3.59) and **Logan Gilbert** (3.62).

LA PIEDRA...Since 2017, his debut season, he is 2nd in quality starts (133), 6th in both games started (244) and innings pitched (1416.2), 7th in total strikeouts (1500) and 12th in wins...among pitchers with over 1,100 IP he ranks 5th in ERA (3.54)

STEERING THE SHIP...In a Mariners uniform in the regular season, has gone 5.0+ innings in 99 of his 107 starts, 6.0+ innings in 68 starts, and 7.0+ innings in 22 starts...in his start on Aug. 26, 2025 vs. San Diego, recorded his 600th strikeout with Seattle, becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 600+ strikeouts.

TOP OF CLASS...Held a 3.54 ERA last season, his 7th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA (2019-25), tied for the most in MLB during that span (also: Shane Bieber-CLE/TOR, Jacob deGrom-NYM/TEX and Zack Wheeler-NYM/PHI)...recorded 11-or-more wins in his 3rd consecutive season with the Mariners (2023-25), and the 4th time in his career (also: 15 wins in 2019 w/CIN).

CAREER...Pitched in parts of 10 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)... named to the All-Star Team three times in his career (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.

2025 TOTALS...Went 11-8 with a 3.54 ERA (76 ER, 180.2 IP), 46 walks, 162 strikeouts and a 1.19 WHIP across 32 starts last season.

1-OF-5...is 1 of 5 active pitchers to throw 500.0+ innings for both an AL and NL team (also: Max Scherzer, Charlie Morton, Gerrit Cole, and Yu Darvish).

FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...Ranks among the Dominican Republic-born All-Time leaders (min. 1,100.0 IP) in SO/9 (2nd, 9.5), ERA (7th, 3.54), strikeouts (11th, 1500), and SO/BB (2nd, 3.30)...trails only Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez in SO/9 (10.00) and SO/BB (4.15).
