ROSTER MOVE—Last night the Rays optioned RH Chris Mazza to Triple-A Durham...today they reinstated RH Collin McHugh from the COVID-19 Related IL and acquired 1B Mike Ford from the Yankees for a player to be named and cash considerations...Ford, 28, was designated for assignment by New York on Saturday after batting .133 (8-for-60) with 3 HR and 5 RBI in 22 games (18 starts) this season...to make room on the 40-man roster, RH Tyler Glasnow (right elbow sprain) was transferred to the 60-day IL.

+ Ford will report to Triple-A Durham...according to Baseball Reference, this is the fourth time the Rays and Yankees have traded with each other, first since a 3-team trade with Arizona in Feb 2018.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost back-to-back games for the third time since the start of May, and tonight are attempting to avoid a 3-game losing streak for the first time since April 29–May 1 (3)...yesterday the Rays lost a rubber match in Chicago to snap a streak of nine straight unbeaten series, going 7-0-2 in series play over that span...with the loss, the Rays ended a 4-day stretch of holding the best record in the majors and an 11-day stretch with the best record in the AL...the Rays enter tonight's game a ½-game back of the Giants and White Sox for the majors' best record.

- + The Rays have lost back-to-back road games for the first time since June 1-2 at NYY, and haven't had a longer skid since April 3-7 (4).
- + The Rays have been alone in first place in the AL East since the end of play on May 24, and currently have a 1-game lead over Boston.
- + Despite back-to-back losses, the Rays are 7-3 in their last 10 games... the Rays are 24-7 since May 13, 30-11 since May 2 and 38-18 since April 16—each are the best records in the majors over those spans... the Rays were .500 (19-19) as late as the end of play on May 12, but since then their .774 winning pct. is the best in the majors—the highest for any other AL club since then is the White Sox (.647).
- + During this 24-7 stretch the Rays have outscored opponents, 186-101 (+85), and their 7 losses have been by a combined 11 runs...this includes four 1-run losses, two 2-run losses and one 3-run loss...one has been in 10 innings, and two others have come in 11 innings.
- + The Rays have 19 come-from-behind wins this season, tied with the Indians for 2nd-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (24).

KING OF THE ROAD—At 24-12, the Rays are tied for the 2nd-best road record in the majors behind the Red Sox (22-10)...the Rays lead the majors with 209 runs scored on the road, rank 2nd with 122 XBH and 3rd with 52 HR, while their 3.56 ERA ranks 2nd in the AL behind Oakland (3.55)...the Rays are 7-3-1 in road series and 8-3 in road series openers, and their four road sweeps are tied with Boston for 1st in the majors.

COMPARISON OF RAYS

- + The Rays are 22-8 since a 2-4 start and have outscored opponents, 186-110 (+76) in these 30 games... this results in 6.2 runs per game and a 3.11 ERA, while the Rays have made 12 errors vs. their opponents' 33 errors over that span.
- + The Rays have scored 6+ runs in 18 road games, most in the majors...their 11 road games of 8+ runs are tied for 1st in the majors.
- + Five of the 12 losses have been in walk-off fashion...the five walk-off losses are tied for most in the AL and tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (7) and Marlins (7)...said another way, the Rays have been tied or leading in the 9th inn. of 29 of 36 road games.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays rank 5th in the majors with 340 runs scored behind the Astros (372), Dodgers (352), Red Sox (349) and White Sox (341)...the Rays have averaged 4.93 runs per game despite a .231 avg. that ranks 22nd in the majors and 11th in the AL...from 1900–2020, 513 teams averaged 4.93 R/G but none did it with an avg. as low as the Rays—the lowest for a team scoring 4.93 R/G was .244 by the 2017 Rangers.

- + Last night the Rays came back from 4-0 and 7-2 deficits to tie it at 7-7 before losing on a **Yasmani Grandal** single in the 10th inning, their fifth walk-off loss of the season and sixth extra-inning loss (3-6)...the 5-run deficit would have matched May 19 at BAL (trailed 5-0, won 9-7) for their largest overcome in a victory this season.
- + The Rays rank 5th in the AL with a .317 OBP, 6th with 211 XBH and 8th with 83 HR...their .231 avg.—which would be the lowest in club history (.238, 2020)—includes .232 with RISP and .221 with RISP and 2 outs, which rank 25th and 19th in the majors, respectively.

- + The Rays have struck out a major-league-most 724 times, ahead of the Tigers (690)...the Rays are on pace for 1,699 SO, which would be a major league record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...the Rays have a majors-most 47 games of reaching double-digit strikeouts.
- + The Rays are 38-13 (.745) when hitting a homer and 16-4 (.800) when hitting multiple homers...54.2 pct. (45 of 83) of their homers have come with runner(s) on base, which would pass 2005 (47.1) for the highest rate in franchise history...this is the highest rate in the majors this season, ahead of the Giants (52.5) and Nationals (49.2).

RAYS SINCE MAY—Since the start of May, the Rays are a majors-best 30-12 (.714), a 1½-game cushion over the White Sox (29-14) over that stretch... the Rays lead the majors since then with a 2.74 ERA (White Sox, 2.90) and are rank 2nd in the majors with 227 runs scored and are tied for 1st with 34 SB...over this stretch, Rays starters rank among major league leaders in WHIP (1.08, 2nd), ERA (3.28, 4th) and opp avg. (212, 4th), and the bullpen leads the majors with 19 wins and leads the AL with a 2.12 ERA.

**PITCHING PROPERLY**—The Rays have pitched to a 3.27 ERA (628-IP, 228-ER) this season, which ranks 6th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (3.16)...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 41 times, tied with the Padres for most in the majors, and are 32-9 when doing so.

- + Rays pitching had a 4.85 ERA through the first 13 games of the season but since then have a 2.90 ERA (509.1-IP, 164-ER) in 56 games since April 16, best in the majors over that stretch (NYM: 3.16).
- + Rays starters have pitched to a 3.56 ERA (334-IP, 132-ER), 9th in the majors and 3rd in the AL behind CHW (2.95) and HOU (3.51).

WHAT A RELIEF—The bullpen has an AL-best 2.94 ERA (294-IP, 96-ER) this season, 3rd in the majors behind the Cubs (2.55) and Padres (2.66)... they have a 0.70 ERA (51.1-IP, 4-ER) in 13 games since June 2 and a 1.37 ERA (79-IP, 12-ER) in 20 games since May 25, both the best in the majors over those stretches...the bullpen has a 1.77 ERA (142-IP, 28-ER) in 34 games since May 9, 2nd in the majors since then behind the Cubs (1.33).

- + The Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA thru April 21, but since April 22 their 2.12 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.
- + Last night's walk-off single to score the automatic runner snapped the bullpen's scoreless streak at 25 IP, but they enter tonight's game on a streak of 25.1 IP without an *earned* run...the bullpen hasn't allowed a run in regulation since June 9 vs. WSH (5th inning).

FASHIONABLY LATE—In the 8th inning and later, the Rays have outscored their opponents, 100-58 (+42), and 82-37 (+45) when excluding extra innings...the +42 run differential over these frames is the highest in the majors, ahead of the Padres (30) and Cubs (26)...the 100 runs scored in the 8th inning or later lead the majors, ahead of the Astros (93)...their 50 runs in the 8th inning lead the majors, 32 runs in the 9th rank 2nd behind the Astros (33) and 18 runs in extras are tied for 2nd behind the Reds (21).

WEB GEMS—According to Sports Info Solutions, the Rays lead the majors with 54 Def. Runs Saved, a significant lead over the 2nd-place Astros (41)... their outfield leads the majors with 18 Runs Saved, ahead of MIL (15), and the infield (1B, 2B, 3B, SS) ranks 1st with 32 Runs Saved ahead of SD (26)... the Rays have saved 14 runs on infield shifts, T-1st in the majors...according to StatCast, the Rays also lead the majors at 26 Outs Above Average.

RAYS vs. MARINERS—Tonight is the first meeting between the two clubs since the Rays won in walk-off fashion on Aug 21, 2019, going 665 days in between...the Rays went 4-2 against them in 2019, winning the season series for the first time since 2012 (6-4)...the road team won the first 5 games, including a Rays sweep from Aug 9-11 at T-Mobile Park—the third in franchise history in Seattle (2010, 2004)...tonight is the first of 7 games in the season series, with three games at Tropicana Field from Aug 2-4.

- + During the 2018-19 seasons, 10 of the 13 games between the clubs were decided by 2 runs (or fewer), including eight 1-run games.
- + The Rays are 79-101 (.439) all-time against the Mariners (38-49 at home, 41-52 on the road) and are 3-9 at T-Mobile Park since 2016.

SCORING CHANGE—MLB has made a scoring change to the 3rd inning from the Fri vs. BAL game...Pat Valaika reached on what was originally scored an error by Ryan Yarbrough for failing to touch first base...this was changed to a base hit, making both runs that scored in the inning earned...the play was challenged by the Rays and upheld after review.

**LAST START**—On Sat vs. BAL, took no decision after yielding a season-high-tying 4 runs in 4.2 IP...faced the minimum through 4 IP, including ground ball double plays in the 1st and 4th innings that eliminated a walk and a single, respectively...loaded the bases with 2 BB and a single in the 5th, then allowed a 2-out grand slam to No. 9 hitter **Austin Wynns**...his line: ND, 4.2 IP, 4 H, 4 R/ER, 3 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 1 WP, 70 pitches, 42 strikes.

- + The grand slam was the fifth allowed in his career and first since the 4th inning on Sep 15, 2018 at STL (with LAD, Patrick Wisdom).
- + His 4 runs allowed passed his total from his previous 7 starts combined (3 runs from May 2–June 5)...it snapped a streak of eight consecutive starts yielding 2 runs (or fewer), and snapped a scoreless streak of 16 IP that began in the 7th inning on May 25 vs. KC.

**ROLLIN' RICH**—Is 4-2 with a 1.61 ERA (50.1-IP, 9-ER) and 54 SO in his last 9 starts, including an 8-start streak of 2 runs (or fewer) from April 26–June 5...was the 2nd-longest streak of his career as a starter behind May 18–Sep 10, 2016 (9)...his 0.99 ERA over those 8 starts was the lowest *single-season* ERA over an 8-game stretch by a traditional starter in club history...has posted scoreless innings streaks of 20.2 IP and 16 IP this season.

- + Since April 26, he leads the AL with a 1.61 ERA and ranks 3rd in the majors behind SF Kevin Gausman (0.94) and MIL Brandon Woodruff (1.50)...leads the AL with a .149 opp avg. over that stretch.
- + His streak allowing 2 runs (or fewer) tied for the 5th-longest by a Rays traditional starter in franchise history...it was the longest stretch since Blake Snell (8) from June 30, 2019–July 26, 2020.

**CRAZY CURVE**—Hill has used his curveball on 39.5 pct. of his pitches this season, the highest rate in the majors (min. 400 pitches)...min. 50 IP, its pitch value of 8.5, according to FanGraphs, ranks as the 2nd-best curveball in the majors behind LAD **Julio Urías** (11.4)...his 25.0 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is his highest since 2017 (25.1 pct.)...has recorded 23 SO on curveballs thrown 75 mph (or slower) this season, most in the majors.

+ His hard-hit rate on the pitch this season is 37.5 pct., compared to 18.2 pct. last season, which was the 9th-best rate in the majors.

SLOW PLAY—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 88.6 mph, 5th-slowest in the majors (min. 500 pitches)...however, his 24 SO on fastballs 90 mph (or slower) are the most in the AL and rank 2nd in the majors behind MIL Brent Suter (28)...has induced 41 swings-and-misses on fastballs 90 mph (or slower), which ranks 2nd in the majors behind Suter (42).

vs. MARINERS—Is 4-0 with a 2.06 ERA (39.1-IP, 9-ER) in 12 career apps (5 starts) against the Mariners, including all 4 wins and a 1.55 ERA (29-IP, 5-ER) in 7 apps (4 starts) at T-Mobile Park...last faced them Aug 18, 2018 at SEA (with LAD), taking no decision after yielding 4 runs in 6 IP, a singlegame career high for runs allowed against them...all 4 runs came in the 1st inning, going walk, groundout, single, Kyle Seager RBI single and Nelson Cruz 3-run homer to start the game...worked around runners on base in four of his last 5 IP, issuing a walk in every frame except a 1-2-3 3rd.

**ROAD TRIPPIN**:—Is 3-0 with a 0.41 ERA (22-IP, 1-ER) in four road starts since May 7...is the fourth Rays pitcher all-time to go 5 IP (or more) and allow 1 run (or fewer) in at least four consecutive road starts, joining **Chris Archer** (7) from Sep 14, 2014–June 7, 2015, **Blake Snell** (4) from Sep 18, 2018–April 13, 2019 and **Rolando Arrojo** (4) from April 19–May 16, 1998.

- + Min. 25 IP, his 2.89 ERA on the road this year ranks 9th in the AL.
- + Has allowed 2 runs (or fewer) in 12 of his last 14 road starts since May 17, 2019 at CIN, going 5-1 with a 2.15 ERA over that stretch.
- + Since 2018, is 11-2 with a 3.04 ERA (136-IP, 46-ER) in 28 road starts... min. 125 IP on the road since 2018, ranks among major league leaders in opp avg. (.197, 5th), opp SLG (.330, 6th) and ERA (10th).
- + Has lost just once in his last 23 road starts since July 20, 2018.

**TROPHY CASE**—Named AL Pitcher of the Month for May after going 3-1 with a 0.78 ERA (34.2-IP, 3-ER) and 36 SO in 6 starts...it marked his third career monthly honor, joining July 2017 (with LAD) and May 2016 (with OAK), and he became the first Rays pitcher to win it since **Tyler Glasnow** in April 2019...his 0.78 ERA was the 2nd-lowest for a Rays pitcher in a calendar month (min. 25 IP) behind **Chris Archer** (0.73) in July 2013.

+ According to YES Network and Stats LLC, was the fourth pitcher (5th time) since 1947 to lead his league in ERA in a month at age-41 or older (min. 25 IP)...he joined HOU Roger Clemens in May 2005, TEX Nolan Ryan in September 1992 and June 1991, CHW Hoyt Wilhelm in August 1965 and CLE Satchel Paige in August 1948.

**SENIOR LIVING**—At 41 years, 98 days old, is the oldest player to appear in a game in club history...passed **Wade Boggs**, who was 41 years, 73 days old when he played in his last game on Aug 27, 1999 at CLE...is the 2nd-oldest active player in the majors, behind LAD **Albert Pujols** (41.152).

+ Since turning 38, he is 22-10 with a 3.28 ERA (296.2-IP, 108-ER).

**LAST START**—On Sun vs. BAL, opened and took no decision, allowing 1 run in 2 IP of a 7-1 win...escaped a 2-on, 0-out jam in the 1st inning, but yielded a run in the 2nd on a leadoff walk, sacrifice bunt and **Pat Valaika** RBI single...his line: ND, 2 IP, 2 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 0 SO, 1 HBP, 28 pit, 17 str.

- + Since returning from the 10-day IL on May 23, his longest app is 3 IP (May 27 vs. KC, relief)...hasn't gone 5 IP since April 27 vs. OAK.
- **+** Is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (28.1-IP, 10-ER) and 2 HR in his 7 starts...has a 7.94 ERA (11.1-IP, 10-ER) and 4 HR in his four relief apps.
