RAY MATTER—The Rays are coming off a series split with the Blue Jays but have won seven of their last 9 games overall...they are in sole possession of first place in the AL East by 0.5 games over the Yankees, but have a lower winning pct. (.633) than New York (.640)...tonight the Rays are attempting to avoid losing back-to-back games for the first time since their 0-5 road trip from July 29–Aug 2 at ATL/BAL...at 19-11, the Rays are 1 GB of the Athletics and Twins for the best record in the AL...the Rays are 13-3 in their last 16 games since Aug 8 (G2), the best mark in the majors over that stretch, and 15-5 in their last 20 games since Aug 4, best in the AL.

- + The Rays have won five straight games against lefty starters.
- + Since Aug 8 (G2), the Rays are 4-3 against the Blue Jays and 9-0 against all other opponents...last night was the first time the Rays lost when leading after 6 innings, falling to 11-1 in those games.
- + Tonight is the eighth game in a stretch of 16 in 16 days, their longest stretch of the season without a scheduled off day...this stretch is bookended by two series at Yankee Stadium: Aug 18-20 (3-0) and Aug 31-Sep 2...the Rays enjoy four off days in the final 25 days.
- + If all games are played as currently scheduled today, it will be the first time all 30 clubs have played on the same day since July 26.

<u>60-GAME SPRINT</u>—Their 19-11 record is tied for the 2nd-best 30-game start in club history behind 2010 (22-8)...their 17-9 record vs. the AL East includes a combined 11-2 against the Yankees (6-1) and Red Sox (5-1).

- + The Rays have completed 50.0 pct. (30 of 60) of their overall schedule, 50.0 pct. (15 of 30) of their home schedule and 50.0 pct. (15 of 30) of their road schedule...their 19-11 start is the rough equivalent to a 51-30 record in a 162-game schedule and results in a 162-game pace of 103-59—the club record for wins in a season is 97 (2008).
- + The Rays were a season-high 4.5 GB of the Yankees through games of Aug 5, but since then they have gained 5 games in the last 19 days...this marks the latest date on the calendar the Rays have been alone in first place since winning the division in 2010...said differently, the only two previous times the Rays were alone in first place at any point after the calendar flipped to August were in 2008 and 2010, and the Rays won the AL East in both seasons.

**DOME SWEET DOME**—Tonight the Rays continue a 7-game homestand against the Blue Jays (2-2) and Orioles (3)...the end of this homestand will conclude a stretch of 26 consecutive games against AL East opponents (15-6 so far)...the Rays are 10-5 (.667) at home this season, 5th in the AL... they have three walk-off wins, tied with the Braves for 2nd in the majors behind the Athletics (4)...since the start of last season, the Rays have won in walk-off fashion 13 times, tied with the Dodgers for 2nd in the majors behind the A's (14)...the Rays have won via walk-off in six of their last 21 home games since Sep 20, 2019 and 11 of their last 39 since Aug 6, 2019.

+ The Rays are 25-7 (.781) in their last 32 home games since Aug 21, 2019, the best home winning pct. in the majors over that stretch... this excludes wins over Houston in Games 3-4 of the 2019 ALDS.

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—Tonight the Rays begin a 3-game series against the Orioles, the only series between the two clubs at Tropicana Field this season...the Rays were swept (0-3) from July 31–Aug 2 at Camden Yards, the first time they were swept by the Orioles since June 24-26, 2016 at BAL (0-4)...the two clubs meet for 4 games from Sep 17-20 in Baltimore to conclude the season series...the Rays have lost six of their last 8 games against the Orioles, dating back to Aug 24, 2019 at BAL...last season the Rays went 12-7 against the Orioles (6-3 at home, 6-4 on the road), winning the season series for a third consecutive year (11-8 in 2018, 11-8 in 2017).

+ Since the start of the 2018 season, the Rays are 13-5 (.722) against the Orioles at Tropicana Field but 10-13 (.435) at Camden Yards, while all other visiting teams are a combined 112-47 (.704) there... the Rays have outscored the Orioles, 102-60 (+42), at home over that stretch but been outscored, 132-115 (-17) on the road.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays lead the AL with 157 runs scored and rank 3rd in the majors behind the Dodgers (171) and Padres (163)...they have achieved this despite entering their last road trip tied for 18th in the majors in runs...since Aug 10, the Rays lead the majors with 92 runs, ahead of the Nationals (91)...the Rays have scored 5 runs (or more) in nine of their last 14 games, and 8 runs (or more) five times over that stretch.

+ The Rays have hit 14 HR in 15 home games this season and 23 HR in 15 road games...since Aug 11, the Rays rank 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL with 24 HR...before this, they were tied for 24th in

the majors with 13 HR...the Rays have hit *multiple* homers in nine of their last 12 games, compared to twice in the first 18 games.

- + The Rays lead the majors with 131 BB, ahead of the Athletics (127)... they rank 4th in the majors with a .337 OBP and 9th in OPS (.772).
- + The Rays are batting .311/.423/.549 (51-for-164) with RISP in their 19 wins this season and .195/.344/.325 (15-for-77) in their 11 losses.
- + Rays pinch-hitters are batting .360/.500/.480 (9-for-25) with 11 RBI and 8 BB...their pinch-hitters rank among major league leaders in avg. (2nd), on-base pct. (1st), RBI (1st) and walks (1st).

**NEXT MAN UP**—The Rays have used 11 starting pitchers this season, tied with the Red Sox for most in the majors and the most in club history through 30 games...the Rays used five starters through the first 14 games but since Aug 8 (G2) have used 11 in the last 16 games...the Rays have eight pitchers with a save, becoming the first team since saves became an official stat (1969) to have eight pitchers with one in the first 30 games, according to Stats LLC...the eight pitchers with a save are tied for 3rd-most in franchise history over an entire season behind 2019 (11) and 2009 (9).

- + The Rays currently have eight pitchers on the injured list...this includes two-fifths of their season-opening starting rotation and five of 10 relievers from their Opening Day bullpen...they have three pitchers on the 45-day IL and out for the season (RH Yonny Chirinos, RH Andrew Kittredge, LH Colin Poche)...this group of eight does not include top pitching prospect Brendan McKay, who underwent left labrum surgery on Aug 19 and is out for the season.
- + The Rays have trailed in 22 of their 30 games this season...they have 11 come-from-behind wins, tied with the Dodgers for 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (12), and 7 wins in their last at-bat.

**PITCHING IN**—The Rays rank 9th in the majors this season in ERA (4.05), 11th in starter ERA (4.20) and 11th in bullpen ERA (3.92), down from 2nd (3.65), 4th (3.64) and 1st (3.66), respectively, last season...the Rays have allowed 132 runs, compared to 99 runs through 30 games last season...they have yielded 39 HR, including 20 HR in their last 10 games since Aug 14.

- + Rays starters have completed 6 IP only twice in 30 games (both Ryan Yarbrough), tied for 2nd-fewest in the majors (Pirates, 1)...they have completed 5 IP only 11 times, tied for 4th-fewest in the majors.
- + The Rays bullpen leads the majors with 144.2 IP and ranks 3rd with 147 SO behind the Red Sox (152) and Brewers (152)...Rays relievers have covered 54.7 pct. of the team's innings pitched this season... the Rays bullpen led the majors in innings in each of the previous two seasons, including a major league record 824.1 IP in 2018.
- + In the last 9 games, Rays opponents are batting .154 (10-for-65) with RISP, compared to .297 (52-for-175) through the first 21 games.

**UNDER THE LEATHER**—Last night the Rays committed multiple errors for only the second time in 22 games since the start of August, compared to four times in 8 games in July...the Rays have made 9 errors this month, tied for 4th-fewest in the AL, after their 11 errors in July led the AL and were 2nd-most in the majors (Giants, 11)...their .989 fielding pct. in August ranks 3rd in the majors, after their .968 fielding pct. in July tied for 28th.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 7-3 in 1-run games this season and 30-19 (.612) over the last two seasons, 4th-best winning pct. in the majors over that stretch, including a 29-12 record since May 15, 2019 after a 1-7 start last season...similarly, the Rays are 10-5 in games decided by 2 runs or fewer this season and 34-14 (.708) in these games since July 24, 2019.

CUBAN SMOKE—Yesterday vs. TOR, Yandy Díaz grounded into a double play to end the 1st inning...this ended a streak of reaching base safely in 10 consecutive plate appearances, which tied the franchise record set by Ji-Man Choi from Sep 11-12, 2019 at TEX...since the start of August, Díaz is batting .360/.455/.480 (27-for-75) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI and 13 BB, leading the AL in both avg. and on-base pct. this month...he has 2 HR in his last 10 AB after beginning the season without one in his first 86 AB.

+ According to StatCast, Díaz's 17 hits to the opposite field are the most in the majors, ahead of NYY DJ LeMahieu (15).

**TWO DISTINCT ERAS**—Since becoming the Rays in 2008, the Rays have seven 90-win seasons, a number matched by only three other teams in baseball: the Dodgers (8), Red Sox (7) and Yankees (7)...since the start of 2008, their five trips to the Division Series have been matched by only five other clubs and their 1,060-915 (.537) record is 5th-best in baseball.

LAST START—On Wed at NYY, made his longest start since May 3, 2019 at BAL... pitched around a pair of walks in his first 2 IP before allowing a Luke Voit solo homer in the 3rd inning...struck out four of his next 7 BF but went triple, walk and sac fly to start the 6th, then got a strikeout and was replaced...his 8 SO were one shy of tving a season high...his line: ND. 5.2 IP. 2 H. 2 R/ER. 3 BB. 8 SO. 1 HR. 88 pit. 51 str.

ROLLIN' AS A RAY-Since his Rays debut on Aug 1, 2018, is 7-7 with a 3.41 ERA (137.1-IP, 52-ER) and 175 SO in 28 starts...has yielded 46 BB (3.01 BB/9 IP), compared to 91 BB in 141.1 IP (5.79 BB/9 IP) with the Pirates...owns a .203 opp avg. since the trade, after a .273 opp avg. with the Pirates...min. 100 IP, since his Rays debut he ranks 9th in the AL in opp avg., 10th in SO/9 IP ratio (11.47) and 11th in WHIP (1.07).

vs. ORIOLES—Is 2-0 with a 1.99 ERA (22.2-IP, 5-ER) in four career starts against the Orioles, his best ERA against an AL East opponent, and has yielded 2 runs (or fewer) in all 4 starts...is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (11-IP, 3-ER) in 2 starts against them at Tropicana  $Field...last\ faced\ them\ on\ Aug\ 1\ at\ Oriole\ Park\ at\ Camden\ Yards,\ holding\ the\ Orioles$ scoreless through 3 IP before allowing a pair of runs in the 4th inning on a Renato Nuñez homer and Rio Ruiz RBI single...faced two batters in the 5th inning, a E6 (subsequently caught stealing) and pop out, then was replaced by Trevor Richards.

Will be facing the Orioles for the first time at home since April 16, 2019, when he recorded the win after allowing 2 ER in a career-high-tying 7 IP.

HARD TO HIT-Ranks 10th in the AL with 35 SO...min. 20 IP. leads the majors with a 15.00 SO/9 IP ratio, ahead of CLE Shane Bieber (14.39), and his 36.8 pct. strikeout rate (35 of 95) ranks 3rd in the majors...13 of his strikeouts have come on a swing-andmiss against his curveball. 2nd in the majors behind HOU Framber Valdez (24).

- + Since the start of last season, has held left-handed batters to a .178 avg. (24for-135) and has struck out 36.1 pct. (53 of 147) of lefties faced, the 7th-highest rate in the AL (min. 100 AB) over that stretch...right-handed batters are hit-
- + In his career, has a .240 opp avg. against lefties (123-for-513) and a .239 opp avg. against righties (128-for-535).
- ting .217 (35-for-161) against him in that span, down from a .255 avg. (83-for-325) during the 2017-18 seasons.

FLAME THROWING—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.1 mph, according to StatCast, 3rd in the majors (min. 200 4-seam fastballs thrown), and his max velocity this season is 100.1 mph on a strikeout of Ozzie Albies on July 27 vs. ATL...has 33 swings and misses on his fastball this season, tied for 7th-most in the majors...since the start of last season, opponents are batting .225 (42-for-187) in at-bats ending with his fastball.

THE WIN COLUMN—The Rays are 13-4 in his last 17 starts in the regular season...he recorded 6 wins in 12 starts in 2019, compared to 4 wins in 67 apps (28 starts) over his first three seasons in the majors...despite the team success, he is winless in his last 10 starts since May 10, 2019 vs. NYY, going 0-2 with a 4.42 ERA (38.2-IP, 19-ER) over that stretch...this is the 2nd-longest winless streak of his career (as a starter) behind May 23, 2017-Sep 11, 2018 (13).

+ Has received 9.00 R/9 IP of run support this season, 4th-highest in the majors and 2nd in the AL (min, 20 IP).

**DOME SWEET DOME**—Is 2-3 with a 3.84 ERA (58.2-IP, 25-ER) in 13 starts at Tropicana Field since joining the Rays on Aug 1, 2018...took the loss in his last start at home on Aug 8 vs. NYY, allowing 4 ER in 2.2 IP—his shortest start since Sep 8, 2019 vs. TOR (2 IP, return from injury)...has allowed 3 ER (or fewer) in 12 of his 13 apps at Tropicana Field while limiting visiting batters to a .237 avg. (52-for-219) with 6 2B, 11 HR and 4.05 SO/BB ratio (81-SO, 20-BB).

The Rays are 8-5 at Tropicana Field when Glasnow starts, including wins in three of his last 4 starts.

2019 IN REVIEW—Went 6-1 with a 1.78 ERA (60.2-IP, 12-ER) and 76 SO in 12 starts last season, missing nearly four months with a right forearm strain. at the time of his injury, he ranked among AL leaders (min. 40 IP) in ERA (1.86, 1st), WHIP (0.91, 2nd), BB/9 IP ratio (1.68, 3rd), SO/BB ratio (6.11, 3rd) and HR/9 IP ratio (0.56, 7th)...after two rehab starts, returned to the Rays rotation on Sep 8 and pitched to a 1.46 ERA (12.1-IP, 2-ER) with 21 SO in 4 starts.

POSTSEASON—Took the loss in both postseason starts...in his postseason debut in Game 1 of the ALDS at HOU, his only runs allowed in 4.1 IP came on a 2-run homer by José Altuve, his last batter faced, to break a scoreless tie...in the decisive Game 5 at HOU, yielded 4 runs on 5 hits in the 1st inning.

STANDING TALL—Was the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, following Jeff Niemann (6'9"), Adam Russell (6'8"), Mark Hendrickson (6'9") and Billy Taylor (6'8")—and Aaron Slegers (6'10") joined this group in August 2019...Rays pitching coach Kyle Snyder is also 6'8" and spent parts of five seasons in the majors...his Players' Weekend nicknames have stayed true to that theme, opting for "Mini Horse" in 2018 and "Baby Giraffe" in 2019...grew 11 inches between his freshman and senior years in high school and separated a growth plate in his right shoulder in the process.

- Is in his sixth season as Rays manager...is the fifth manager in Rays history and already the 2nd-longest-tenured behind Joe Maddon (2006-14).
- Is baseball's 3rd-longest-tenured manager with his current team behind OAK Bob Melvin (9th full season) and CLE Terry Francona (8th season).
- Last year was his second straight 3rd-place finish in AL Manager of the Year voting...finished behind MIN Rocco Baldelli and NYY Aaron Boone. Has been ejected 10 times as Rays manager (last Aug 23, 2020 vs. TOR), 3rd in club history behind Joe Maddon (37) and Larry Rothschild (15).
- Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, joining Al Lopez (HOF), Tony La Russa (HOF), Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- On Oct 9, 2018, agreed to a contract extension through the 2024 season including a club option for the 2025 season.
