RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a seven-game road trip against the Yankees (2-2) and Blue Jays (1-0, 2 to play) tonight in Toronto...have won six of their last nine games on the heels of a 1-4 stretch (July 5-10)...the Rays 17-11 (.593) mark since June 19 is tied with the Mets for third best in the majors behind the Astros (19-9/.679) and Padres (16-10/.615)...including off days, this marks their 35th consecutive day occupying fourth place in the AL East standings...they are 4.5 games behind the Royals for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...have spent the entire season no more than five games below or three games above .500...a win tonight would send them multiple games above .500 for the first time since entering play on May 20 at 25-23.

The Rays claimed a 4-2 win last night despite being out-hit, 6-4...it marked their first time scoring 4+ runs on four hits or fewer since June 8, 2023 vs. Minnesota (4R, 4H). Tampa Bay drew eight walks, tying its most in a road game this season (July 4 at KC) and one shy of its season high (9BB on May 5 vs. NYM). The Rays went 3-for-8 with runners in scoring position after turning in an MLB-worst 11-for-97 (.113) clip over their previous 13 games. It marked Tampa Bay's 14th straight win when holding a lead after six frames, the club's longest streak within one season since a 21-game run from June 14-Aug. 29, 2023...they have won 25 of their last 26 games when ahead after six, with the only loss coming on June 12 vs. the Cubs (led 2-1, lost 4-3). The Rays have not trailed in six straight and 11 of their last 12 wins dating to June 25...from May 18-June 24, 12 of their 15 victories came in come-from-behind fashion...overall, the Rays have trailed at some point in only three of their last nine games. Despite a 5-3 mark in their last eight, the Rays are 6-13 in their last 19 games against AL East opponents...the Blue Jays are the only division rival the Rays have produced a winning record against (5-3).

SERIES-IV SPEAKING—Tampa Bay is 7-1-1 over its last nine series, with the lone loss being a three-game sweep at Texas from July 5-7...with a win tonight or tomorrow, the Rays would remain undefeated over their last four sets (3-0-1) and improve to 3-0-1 in their last four series against Toronto dating to Sept. 29, 2023...the Rays have won 13 of 14 series in which they claimed the opening contest, winning each of their last 12 since falling from April 29-May 1 at Milwaukee.

Tampa Bay is 9-3-1 in series play against opponents that entered with a sub-.500 record, winning four of its last five...this series marks the start of three straight against below-.500 teams (TOR, CIN, MIA).

B-LOWE BLASTS—After going without an extra-base hit in a season-high seven consecutive games, **Brandon Lowe** has homered three times in his last five games, with all three of his hits in that span leaving the yard (3-for-22/.158)...his 116 career homers are fifth most in Rays history, two shy of **B.J. Upton** (118HR)...third-place **Aubrey Huff** (128HR) could also be within striking distance this season.

20-20 VISION—Following his steal last night, **Randy Arozarena** is 5 HR and 5 SB shy of his fourth consecutive 20-20 season...he and **B.J. Upton** (2011 - 16HR, 23SB) are the only players in Rays history to record 15+ HR and 15+ SB before the end of July...he joins **CLE José Ramírez** and **KC Bobby Witt Jr.** as the only AL hitters to reach those figures...the Rays have 61 games remaining—Arozarena has never recorded fewer than 5 HR and 5 SB over any 61-game span in his career...he is already the first player in MLB history to record a 20-20 season as a rookie and again in each of the next two seasons...Arozarena, Ramírez and **PHI Trea Turner** are the only players to record 20-20 seasons in each of the last three years (2021-23)...among active players, only Ramírez and **LAA Mike Trout** (both 5) have more 20-20 seasons than Arozarena, who is one of nine active hitters with at least three such campaigns...the three 20-20 seasons are tied with Upton for the most in franchise history—**Josh Lowe** (2023) and **Tommy Pham** (2019) are the only other Rays to turn the trick at least once.

Arozarena ranks among the AL's July leaders in steals (T3rd, 5), doubles (T5th, 6) and extra-base hits (T6th, 10).

THE MAGIC NUMBER—The Rays have won 12 consecutive games when plating 4+ runs, their longest single-season streak since a 21-game run to open the 2023 campaign...since the start of June, they are 17-2 in games scoring 4+ times, second best in the majors behind the Padres (20-2/.909)...this, compared to 6-18 with three runs or fewer.

POWER APLENTY—Tampa Bay's 11 HR since the All-Star break lead the majors, outpacing the Athletics and Dodgers (both 10HR)...over the Rays last 31 games since June 15, their 44 HR (1.4 HR/G) are tied for fourth most in the AL—the club entered that stretch with majors-low 53 HR (0.8 HR/G)...despite being out-homered, 7-2, over their last two contests, the Rays have still out-homered opponents, 30-24 (+6) over their last 22 games since June 25...among AL clubs, only the Athletics (+18), Royals and Twins (+7) have better home run margins over that span...on the season, only the Blue Jays (-44) have a worse home run differential than the Rays (-37).

The Rays have homered in six straight games, tying their longest streak this season (4x, last: June 28-July 4)...their last longer single-season streak was eight games to conclude their 2023 schedule (Sept. 22-Oct. 1)...during the current streak, they have scored 18 of their 23 runs (78.3%) via the long ball...on the season, only 38.5 pct. (153) of their 397 runs have come on their 97 HR.

RUNNIN' RAYS—Tampa Bay has stolen a base in 10 of its last 11 games and 15 of 17 in July...the Rays 102 SB overall pace the AL and are tied with the Phillies for fourth in the majors behind the Reds (143), Brewers (138) and Nationals (136)...the Rays have three players with 15+ SB (Arozarena, Caballero, Palacios), tied with the Royals and Nationals for most in MLB.

Despite recording just 1 SB in his last 20 games, **José Caballero's** 25 SB are still tied for the AL lead with **BOS David Hamilton**.

Since his June 5 return from the 10-day IL (right oblique strain), **Josh Lowe's** 9 SB lead the Rays and are tied for fourth most in the AL.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays own MLB's best record in games decided by two runs or fewer at 36-16 (.692), winning each of their last three...in franchise history, only the 2020 Rays (23-10/.697) have produced a better record in such contests...eight of their last 12 games have had a margin of two or fewer runs—the other four games were decided by at least five tallies...Tampa Bay is also an MLB-best 20-10 (.667) in games decided by two runs or fewer on the road, including wins in nine of 13 and 13 of its last 18 such games.

The Rays 17-9 (.654) mark in one-run games ranks second behind the Mets (20-10/.667)...their bullpen has pitched to a 2.24 ERA (104.1IP, 26ER) in one-run contests.

NORTH OF THE BORDER—The Rays and Blue Jays meet for the third of four series in 2024 this week...the clubs split a season-opening four-game set at Tropicana Field from March 28-31 before the Rays took two of three in Toronto from May 17-19...the Rays have won six straight season series over the Jays since 2018, going 65-42 (.607) in that span, the best mark against Toronto by any AL club...currently leading 5-3, they need to win only two of the final five meetings to secure a seventh consecutive season series win...the Rays are 7-3 in their last 10 and 12-7 in their previous 19 games against the Jays.

The Rays have homered in 14 straight games against the Blue Jays, the third-longest streak in club history against a single team, trailing an 18-game run against Toronto (Sept. 25, 2015-Aug. 9, 2016) and 16-game stretch vs. Minnesota (Aug. 25, 2015-Sept. 6, 2017).

Tampa Bay has homered in each of its last 13 games at Rogers Centre, tying the longest streak in club history at this venue (also April 23, 2011-July 29, 2017).

- Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** began his MLB playing career with the Blue Jays from 2002-04...he was also a major league advance scout for Toronto in 2012.
- Blue Jays VP, Baseball Strategy **James Click** spent 14 seasons with the Rays from 2005-19, including three as VP, baseball operations...Click served as the Astros GM from 2020-22 before joining Toronto ahead of last season.
- Rays Asst. GM **Carlos Rodríguez** spent four years as a Blue Jays scout before joining the Rays in 2010...during his time with the Jays, he signed **Yan Gomes**, the first Brazilian-born player to reach the major leagues.
- Rays Hitting Coach **Chad Mottola** held the same position with the Toronto in 2013 after five seasons as a Blue Jays minor league coach...during his playing career, he was signed by the Jays three times and was a teammate of **Kevin Cash** with Triple-A Syracuse in 2002.
- Bally Sports Sun announcer **Brian Anderson** made his MLB debut at Rogers Centre (then SkyDome) on Sept. 10, 1993 in relief for the Angels...the first batter he faced was Hall of Famer **Paul Molitor**.
- Richie Palacios'** brother, **Joshua**, was drafted by Toronto in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his debut with the Blue Jays in 2021 at Rogers Centre.
- Blue Jays OF **Kevin Kiermaier** spent 10 seasons with the Rays from 2013-22, winning three Gold Glove awards and one Platinum Glove...his 31.7 bWAR with the Rays rank fourth club history.
- Blue Jays LHP **Génesis Cabrera** spent nearly five seasons in the Rays system before being dealt to the Cardinals at the 2018 trade deadline as part of a package the Rays used to acquire OF **Tommy Pham**...he was traded to the Blue Jays in mid-July last season.
- Toronto INF **Bo Bichette** (Orlando) and RHP **Nate Pearson** (Odessa) hail from the Sunshine State.
