CINCINNATI REDS (58-64) vs ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (64-57)

PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Since his promotion on August 1, rookie RHP Aristides Aquino leads the Major Leagues in HR (11) and RBI (22) and leads the National League while ranking second in the majors in slugging percentage (.964).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rookie RF Aristides Aquino is the reigning National League Player of the Week...from 8/5-8/11 he led the Major Leagues in slugging percentage (1.364), tied for the lead in HR (6) and led the National League in batting average (.500) and RBI (11)...he is the first Reds rookie to win a Player of the Week award since RHP Chris Reitsma in April 2001 and the first Reds rookie position player since Hal Morris in July 1990...this week, he ranks T2nd in the National League in HR (4) and T6th in RBI (8).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

In their previous 7 series, the Reds went 4-1-2 (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl, 2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh)...the 4-0-2 stretch was the Redlegs' longest series streak of the season without a loss.

2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs lead the National League in batting average (.288) and OPS (.844) while ranking second in slugging percentage (.495), on-base percentage (.349) and runs scored (189, 5.40 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 13th in ERA (5.31).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (2-1) of a 4-game series vs Jim Jackson's first-place Cardinals and Game 4 (2-1) of a 7-game homestand that includes a 3-game series vs the Padres beginning tomorrow night...is Game 13 (6-6) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh, 2-1 vs StL, 3g vs SD)...Reds went 4-2 on their previous homestand (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...this afternoon are wearing replica uniforms of the 1990 World Series championship team... the Reds are 4-8 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969 and 1976...as part of the season-long celebration, the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 6-8 vs StL this season, including 3-4 at Great American Ball Park...over the last 4 seasons, the Cardinals' .556 winning percentage (20-16) is third-best among opponents at GABP (Wsh .769, LAD .615)...the Reds are 3-2-2 in their last 7 completed series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League... Cin won 6 of its last 11 games at Busch Stadium.

REDS vs CARDINALS:

- Joey Votto has 196 career hits vs the Cardinals (196-625, .314), the most among active players...in the live ball era, his career .437 OBP vs StL ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (Lefty O'Doul 1st, .477; Ralph Kiner 3rd, .424)...in 91 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, **Votto** has produced a **1.034 OPS** (.335ba, .571slg, .463obp)...in his last 60 apps overall vs StL beginning **8/2/16** is hitting .339 (75-221, 16 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 36rbi, .543slg, .449obp)...in his **last 29 apps at Busch** beginning
- **8/9/16** is hitting .348 (39-112, 10 2b, 5hr, 16rbi, .571slg, .435obp). Beginning 8/5/17, **Eugenio Suárez** has reached base safely in **28** of his last 30 apps vs StL (30-106, .283, 5 2b, 9hr, 25rbi, .585slg, .384obp), including a 25-game on-base streak snapped on 7/19.
- Beginning 7/13/18, Jesse Winker has a 14-game hitting streak vs StL (21-53, .396, 5 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, .660sla, .484obp) beginning 9/19/17 has reached base safely in each of his last 24 apps vs StL (35-93, .376, 8 2b, 4hr, 16rbi, .591slg, .453obp)...hit safely in 23 of those 24 apps.
- RHP Raisel Iglesias is 12-for-12 in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining Bill Landrum (10-for-10) and Jeff Brantley (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least 10 perfect save conversions vs StL...in his last 23 apps vs StL beginning 8/4/16, Iglesias has posted a 1.57 ERA (12sv, 28.2ip, 15h, 5er, 19bb, 32k, 1hr)...in that span, Cardinals batters are hitting just .152 against him (15-99).

PADRES UP NEXT: Tomorrow night the Reds will begin their second series of the season vs the Padres...Cin earned a 3-1 series win in April at Petco Park...haven't won a season series vs SD since 2012 (6-2) and since then are 18-25, including 15-22 the last 6 years...over the last 6 seasons. Cin is 8-14 at Petco Park.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 11 HR in his first 17 career games, including a 3-homer game

- on 8/10 vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

 Has established modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10) and first 17 career games (11)...will share, at least, with Rhys Hoskins the modern Major League record for HR in a player's first 18, 19 or 20 career games.
- Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
- Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it.
- Is the third rookie since 1900 to produce at least 10 HR in an 11-game span (8/6-8/17), joining LAD's Cody Bellinger (2017) and Det's **Rudy York** (1937).
 With 11 HR, all in August, is 3 shy of the club record for HR in a calendar month...**Frank Robinson** hit **14 HR** in **August**

1962 and Greg Vaughn had 14 HR in September 1999.

SUSPENDED: LHP Amir Garrett is 6 games into an 8-game suspension...in his absence the Reds are 2-4, while the bullpen's ERA is 5.40 (23.1ip, 14er)...he cannot be replaced on the 25-man roster...Garrett was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell (6g), RHP Jared Hughes (3g) and RF Yasiel Puig (3g) of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle (2g), RHP Keone Kela (10g), José Osuna (5g) and RHP Kyle Crick (3g) of the Pirates...Bell and Hughes already served their suspensions.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (100), HR (35), RBI (97), batting average (.308) and slugging percentage (.592) while ranking second in the majors in on-base percentage (.367)...have outscored opponents in the first frame. 100-67, and are 30-7 (.811) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first.

RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tomorrow will make his fourth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...leads the Major Leagues innings pitched (172.2) and ranks fourth in the majors in strikeouts (204)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in strikeouts (425), eighth in ERA (3.16), and 10th in innings pitched (348.0)...in 2018 was an American League All-Star, finished fifth in the Cy Young Award voting, ranked second in the AL in ERA (2.21) and allowed the fewest HR per 9 innings in the league (.0462)...in his 5-2 win on 8/9 vs Cubs, in his Great American Ball Park debut as a Red recorded 11 strikeouts, his 26th career 10-strikeout game and seventh of the season...his 11th strikeout was his 200th strikeout, the second 200-strikeout season of his career (221 strikeouts in 2018).
