RED HOTS

Alex Wood this afternoon is making his fifth appearance of the season...began this season on the Reds' injured list because of a **lower back injury**, including a stint on the **60-day IL** beginning **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25 at Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr)...from **7/6-7/22** went **1-1, 3.18** in **4 rehab starts** for Class AAA Louisville (3gs) and Class AA Chattanooga (1gs)...in December was acquired from the Dodgers, along with **C/IF Kyle Farmer, OF Matt Kemp, OF Yasiel Puig** and **cash**, for **RHP Homer Bailey, IF Jeter Downs** and **RHP Josiah Gray**.

Tomorrow vs Padres - #27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tomorrow will make his fourth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**, while SD received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell** (truh-MELL)...leads the Major Leagues **innings pitched** (172.2) and ranks fourth in the majors in **strikeouts** (204)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in **strikeouts** (425), eighth in **ERA** (3.16), and 10th in **innings pitched** (348.0)...in 2018 was an American League **All-Star**, finished fifth in the **Cy Young Award** voting, ranked second in the AL in **ERA** (2.21) and allowed the fewest **HR per 9 innings** in the league (.0462)...in his 5-2 win on 8/9 vs Cubs, in his **Great American Ball Park** debut as a Red recorded **11 strikeouts**, his 26th career **10-strikeout game** and seventh of the season...his 11th strikeout was his **200th strikeout**, the second 200-strikeout season of his career (221 strikeouts in 2018).

REDS BATTERS

REDS BATTERS

2nd Half: 17-18, .288 (347-1204, 56hr, 189r)

- Among the National League team leaders rank ninth in hitting (.251), ninth in slugging percentage (.432) and 11th in on-base percentage (.319).
- Since the All-Star break, lead the National League in hitting (.288) and OPS (.844) while ranking second in slugging percentage (.495), on-base percentage (.349) and runs scored (189, 5.40 r/g).

44 ARISTIDES AQUINO, of 2nd Half: 19-55 (.345), 1 2b, 11hr, 22rbi, 1.354ops

- Is the reigning National League Player of the Week.
- Since his 8/1 promotion, started in RF in 15 of the Reds' 16 games and PH in the other.
- Produced a home run in 9 of his 16 apps and an RBI in 11 of his 16 apps...since his 8/1 promotion, he hit 11 of the team's 27 HR.
- Is hitting .350 with RISP (7-20).
- Hit .517 during a career-high 9-game hitting streak snapped Tue at Wsh (15-29, 1 2b, 8hr, 16rbi, 1.379slg, .563obp)...in that game also snapped a streak of at least 1 RBI in 7 consecutive apps, the longest RBI streak by a Reds batter this season.
- His 4-game HR streak snapped last Sun vs Cubs is the longest by a Reds batter this season...fell 1 game shy of the franchise record for HR in consecutive games.
- His 2-run HR on 8/8 off Chi's Cole Hamels traveled 118.3 miles per hour, the hardest hit ball by a Reds batter in the Statcast Era and tied for the hardest hit home run in the Major Leagues this season (Gary Sánchez, Pete Alonso).
- On 8/3 at Atl, in his third Major League appearance, produced his first career hit (single off Dallas Keuchel), first career HR (3-run off Keuchel) and first career RBI.
- Was an International League All-Star at Louisville (78g, .299, 28hr, 53rbi)...when promoted ranked among the IL leaders in slugging (1st, .636), HR (2nd) and OPS (2nd, .992).
- For the Bats from 5/23-6/19 hit .345 during a 22-game hit streak, the second-longest by a Louisville batter since 1982...from 6/12-6/19 produced an RBI in 7 straight games, the longest RBI streak by a Bats batter since Danny Dorn (7) in 2011.

16 TUCKER BARNHART, c 2nd Half: 19-57 (.333), 2 2b, 4hr, 12rbi

- In his last 8 apps beginning 8/10 is hitting .333 (8-24, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi).
- Since coming off the IL, the Reds are 10-7 in his 17 starts and 7-4 in his last 11 starts.
- Since he came off the injured list on 7/26 has hit safely in 12 of 17 starts and produced at least 1 RBI in 7 of those 17 starts.
- From 6/28-7/25 was on the 10-day IL with a right oblique strain...made 1 rehab appearance for Louisville before he was reinstated on 7/26.
- Thu vs StL made his 500th career appearance as a catcher (466th start).

6 PHILLIP ERVIN, of 2nd Half: 26-71 (.366), 5 2b, 3 3b, 2hr, 8rbi

- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, is hitting .346 in 47 apps since he was promoted on 6/15 (36-104, 6 2b, 4 3b, 3hr, 12rbi).
- Made 24 starts (20gs in LF, 3gs in CF, 1gs in RF), including each of the last 3g (LF).
- In the 17-9 win on 7/13 at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on 7/6/1949 vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- Has 2 career pinch-hit HR, both this season (7/21 vs StL off Andrew Miller, 8/12 at Wsh off Sean Doolittle).
- In 40 apps for Louisville hit .290 (8 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10g in LF, 25g in CF).
- Was the International League's Batter of the Week for 5/27-6/2 (.423, 2 2b, 5hr, 10rbi, .516obp, 1.593ops).

52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c 2nd Half: 10-35 (.286), 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi

- Has 7 HR and 24 RBI...are the first home runs of his career...entered the season with 11 career RBI in 59 apps.
- Is hitting .269 (7-26, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi) in 5 starts (4gs at C, 1gs at 2B) and 12 apps since he came off the concussion list on 7/28...missed 9 games while on the concussion list (7/18-7/27).
- This season has made 11 apps and 8 starts at C...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at C (3g in 2017, 1g in 2018)...this spring training caught 36.0 innings.
- Has made 27 starts (11gs at 2B, 8gs at C, 5gs at 1B, 3gs at 3B).
- In his career has played 1B (13g, 6gs), 2B (33g, 11gs), 3B (33g, 17gs) & C (16g, 8gs).
- Leads Reds pinch hitters in at bats, hits, doubles and RBI (9-33, .273, 3 2b, 1hr, 6rbi)...hit his only career pinch-hit HR on 5/5 vs SF (solo off Will Smith).
- In the 12-5 loss on 8/8 vs Cubs started at C, moved to 2B in the seventh inning and then with 2 outs in the eighth inning made his only Major League pitching appearance...retired 4 of the 5 batters (1.1ip, 1h)...retired Jason Heyward on a groundout to end the eighth inning and strand 2 inherited runners, then threw a scoreless ninth...became the first Reds player to pitch and catch in the same game since Dee Moore in 1936...2 days earlier, on 8/6, Taylor Davis of Cubs did it vs Oak.

3 FREDDY GALVIS, inf Blue Jays: 115g, .267, 24 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 54rbi, 4sb

- Monday was claimed off waivers from the Blue Jays...joined the team Tue at Wsh.
- Has hit safely in each of his first 5 apps for the Reds, including 4 hits and a 2-run HR off Javy Guerra in Wed's 17-7 loss at Wsh.
- For Toronto played SS (103g, 102gs) and 2B (5g, 4gs)...has made all 4 of his starts for the Reds at 2B.
- Did not play on 4/24, snapping his streak of 349 consecutive games played...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Freddie Freeman 2nd, 194g).
- In each of the 2017 and 2018 seasons played in 162 games...his 1,441.0 innings in the field in 2018 were the most by any player in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 53 apps for the Blue Jays hit .300, raising his season BA from .236 to .267.

4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss 2nd Half: 34-105 (.324), 6 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 14rbi, 3sb

- After missing the previous 3 games with soreness in his right biceps, returned to the lineup Mon at Wsh and in the last 6g produced 9 hits, 2 doubles, a triple and 4 RBI.
- Leads the National League in hitting in the first inning (.455) and leads the Reds in overall hitting with RISP (.312, 29-93), T20th-best in the National League.
- Has a 12-game hitting streak, the longest by a Reds batter this season and tied with Wilson Ramos of the Mets for the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (19-46, .413, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi)...the longest hitting streak of his career is 18 games (5/27-6/18, 2013)...has an RBI in 6 of his last 9 apps (7rbi).
- With 112 hits is just 2 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
- With 8 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...his career high for RBI in a season is 54 (2017).
- After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving to 2B.
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF/OF Derek Dietrich).
- Is the Reds' recipient of the 2019 Heart and Hustle Award, given to each team's player who best embodies the passion, values, spirit and traditions of the game.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf

2nd Half: 22-79 (.278), 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 12rbi

- In 60 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .277 (41-148, 8 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 20rbi, 1sb), raising his season BA from .199.
- Leads the team with 42 starts at 2B (last, 8/8 vs Cubs)...made 18 starts at SS, second-most on the team behind José Iglesias (104gs) and most recently in 3 straight games from 8/9-8/11 while Iglesias recovered from soreness in his right biceps.
- Made 1 start at 3B (8/17 vs StL), his only career start at that position, and 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- Made the first 2 pitching apps of his career...with 2 outs in the ninth inning of the 11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit, in a game that featured 9 ejections, threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8...in the 13-4 loss on 8/16 vs StL threw a scoreless ninth inning, allowed only an infield single to Kolten Wong.
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...overall this season has made 5 apps at 3B, including 1 start (8/17 vs StL).
- Because of Scooter Gennett's injury in spring training, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the team's starting SS.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf

2nd Half: 31-112 (.277), 7 2b, 2 3b, 2hr, 11rbi, 2sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- His .285 batting average through the game of 8/2 is a season high...in 13 apps since then is hitting .182 (10-55).
- Has 3 leadoff HR (5/6 vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, 6/12 at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping his season-high 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak that ties Joey Votto's for the longest by a Reds hitter (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp).
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).
- In the eighth inning of the 12-5 loss on 8/8 vs Cubs, as a part of a double switch made his only Major League appearance at 2B.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

2nd Half: 34-118 (.288), 13hr, 22rbi, 1.034ops

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Left Fri's game in the sixth inning with a left thumb sprain...x-rays were negative.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League leaders in HR (13, 2nd), slugging percentage (.653, 5th) and on-base percentage (.381, 17th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR, ranks T4th in the majors in RBI (21) and ranks 12th in the National League in batting average (.330).
- In his last 18 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .302 (19-63, 1 2b, 5hr, 7rbi, .961ops).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 15 of his last 41 apps (17hr), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of

2nd Half: 26-78 (.333), 7 2b, 4hr, 9rbi

- With Joey Votto recovering from low back tightness, started the Reds' last 3 games at 1B (4-10, .400, 1 2b, 1rbi, 2bb)...are his first career starts at that position.
- Started each of the last 6 games (2B, 2B, LF, 1B, 1B, 1B) and hit safely in each (8-22, .364, 2 2b, 1rbi)...the 6-game hitting streak is a career high.
- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, has made 28 apps and 18 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Has made 25 starts (13gs/24g in LF, 6gs/13g at 2B, 2gs/6g at 3B, 3gs/5g at 1B, 1gs at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez 3 times, Aristides Aquino 4g).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

2nd Half: 31-125 (.248), 8 2b, 4hr, 17rbi, .331obp

- Missed the last 3 games with low back tightness.
- Has a 6-game hitting streak (8-22, .364, 3 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .636slg, .440obp), 1 game shy of his season high (7g, 5/21-5/31).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak, beginning 8/1, is at 13 games (.261ba, .386obp).
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 77 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish.
- His first-inning double on 8/10 off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864).
- For the fifth straight season, per *Baseball America* was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.

33 JESSE WINKER, of

2nd Half: 28-86 (.326), 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 12rbi, .943ops

- Missed the last 3 games with tightness in his back.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among National League leaders in on-base percentage (.431, 5th) and batting average (.326, 8th).
- In his last 16 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .364 (16-44, 2 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, .996ops).
- In his last 26 apps beginning 7/18 is hitting .342 (25-73, 5 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, .976ops).
- Has 4 career leadoff HR, including 3 this season (6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander, 7/31 vs Pit off Dario Agrazal, 8/12 at Wsh off Erick Fedde)...the leadoff HR off Fedde came on the first pitch of the game.
- Has 16 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 87 starts, including a team-high 59 starts in LF (16gs in CF, 11gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
