METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to play last night and fell to the Reds, 7-6...New York is 4-6 in one-run games this year...The Mets have dropped 12 of their last 15 and dropped three straight...New York continues a seven-game road trip (0-1) to Cincinnati (0-1) and Washington D.C. (four games).

YOU'RE THE LAST TEAM ON THE LIST: In his career, Justin Verlander has earned at least one win against every major league team except for the Cincinnati Reds...In two career starts against the Reds, Verlander is 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP)...With a win against Cincinnati, Verlander would become the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams and would join Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

FOREVER YOUNG: Francisco Álvarez recorded his first career multi-home run game yesterday..According to Sarah Langs, he is the fifth-youngest player since 1900 with a multi-homer game as a catcher...He is the sixth Met age 21 or younger with a multi-homer game and the first since David Wright on June 2, 2004 vs. Florida.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: Over the last 14 games, Francisco Álvarez is hitting .308 (12-39) with seven runs, two doubles, three home run, five RBI, three walks with a .357 OBP and a .590 SLG...He is now slashing .241/.281/.444 in 19 games this season.

BRIGHAM UP, BRIGHAM UP: Jeff Brigham tossed 1.0 scoreless frame yesterday...He has now allowed a run in eight of his 10 appearances this season, posting a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP)...He has struck out 14 and allowed five hits and four walks in 11.0 innings this year.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 12 errors in 36 games this season...That is tied for the second-fewest in the major leagues...The Padres lead the big leagues, committing only 10 errors this year...New York's .990 fielding percentage is fifth in the majors and third in the National League.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York will play their 22nd road game today, tied for the second-most in the majors...New York is 10-11 on the road this season...They are 3-2-1 in road series in 2023.

TRUE AMERICAN: The Mets play the Reds for the first time in 2023...Last season, the Mets took five out of six games with the club, outscoring them 36-13 in the process...New York went 2-1 at Great American Ball Park in 2023...Francisco Lindor has hit .321 (26-81) with 17 runs, three doubles, seven home runs, 12 RBI and seven walks in 18 contests in Cincy...Pete Alonso has played 10 games at the ballpark and has hit .302 (13-43) with seven runs, three doubles, four home runs, seven RBI and five walks.

HIGH FIVE: Pete Alonso has 12 home runs and 30 RBI this year...He is one of only five MLB players this season with at least 10 homers and 25 RBI , joining Rafael Devers (11 HR/34 RBI), Max Muncy (12 HR/29 RBI), Matt Olson (12 HR/29 RBI) and Brent Rooker (10 HR/26 RBI)...Courtesy of Sportradar.

INVADER NIM: Over the last 23 games, Nimmo is batting .323 (30-93) with 15 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, nine RBI, seven walks with an .890 OPS...He ranks 14th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a 1.6 fWAR.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 13 games and has allowed one run in 14.1 innings of work, good for a 0.63 ERA... He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 18 in that span... He is holding left-handed hitters to a .154 (4-265) batting average this season...He has converted all seven save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 19 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 14-47 (.298) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks with a .411 OBP and a .489 SLG...He has posted a .402 OBP in 29 games this season, which leads the team.

AND THEY'RE OFF: The Mets are second in the National League with a 83.9% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are tied for sixth the NL with 26 steals this season...Starling Marte is tied for 12th in the majors and tied for seventh in the NL with nine steals...He ranks third among active players with 323 career steals...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more.

BRETT THE MET: In 18 games this year, Brett Baty is batting .271 (16-59) with six runs, three doubles, two home runs, six RBI, six walks with a .338 OBP and a .424 SLG.

JEFF MCHITS: Jeff McNeil is batting .329 (24-73) with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .402 OBP and an .868 OPS over his last 21 games...Overall, he is batting .280/.384/.392 in 36 games this season.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded 10 multi-hit games this season... He has 173 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 63 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is tied for the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette (70) and Freddie Freeman (68).

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 40 infield hits this season, which is the fourth-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been outscored 29-9 in the first inning this year.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 22 times this season...That is tied for the third-most in the majors and the most in the National League... Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 134 times, the most in the majors...The Giants are second at 116.

VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

METS DEBUT: On May 4, Verlander made his Mets debut against his former team, the Detroit Tigers at Comerica Park. After surrendering back-to-back home runs to Riley Greene and Javy Báez in the first, Verlander threw 4.0 scoreless innings...All told, the right-hander allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on five hits, one walk and five strikeouts...At 40 years and 73 days, Verlander was the oldest pitcher to debut for the Mets since Rich Hill, who debuted with the club at 41 years and 136 days on July 25, 2021.

YOU'RE THE LAST TEAM ON THE LIST: In his career, Verlander has earned at least one win against every major league team except for the Cincinnati Reds...In two career starts against the Reds, Verlander is 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP)...With a win against Cincinnati, Verlander would become the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams and would join Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

3K AND COUNTING: Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 10 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

LIKE A FINE WINE: Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF: Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

A STORY ABOUT NOTHING: Last season, Verlander had three starts of 5.0 or more innings and no hits allowed...On August 23 vs. Minnesota, Verlander did not allow a hit over 6.0 innings and had 10 strikeouts without issuing a walk...In his return from the IL on September 16, Verlander tossed 5.0 hitless innings with nine strikeouts vs. Oakland...In his final start of the season, October 4 vs. Philadelphia, the right-hander tossed 5.0 hitless innings with 10 punchouts...Verlander is the only pitcher in major league history to have three hitless starts of 5.0 or more innings in a season...Verlander is also one of six pitchers in major league history with three career no-hitters joining Nolan Ryan (seven), Sandy Koufax (four), Bob Feller (three), Cy Young (three) and Larry Corcoran (three).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (4-1, 3.38)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win of the season on May 5 vs. Colorado...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings on two hits, four walks and four strikeouts...Became the fourth pitcher in franchise history to earn four wins through their first six career major league starts joining Steven Matz, David Peterson and Jason Jacome.

STRIKE EM OUT: Senga has 36 strikeouts through his first six career major league games, the fifth-most in franchise history behind Matt Harvey (43), Nolan Ryan (42), Dwight Gooden (40) and Bill Pulsipher (39).
