HURRICANE FIONA RELIEF: The Mets are saddened by the devastation in Puerto Rico after Hurricane Fiona...Families, children and homes are all without much needed necessities including power, clean water and a safe place to sleep...To show our support, the Amazin Mets Foundation, along with Mets players and coaches, are partnering with Team Rubicon and Global Empowerment Mission to help those in need in Puerto Rico...Please join the Mets in our relief efforts by donating to help the victims of Hurricane Fiona by visiting teamrubiconusa.org and globalempowermentmission.org.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 4-2, last night....New York is 35-$11-4$ in 50 series this year...The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The team's longest losing streak of the season is three games, done three times previously. The last time the Mets were swept by the Braves was August 23-25, 2019 at Citi Field...The last time it occurred in Atlanta was June 19-21, 2015...The Mets finish their penultimate series of the season, a three-game weekend series against the Braves (0-2)...Following these three games, the Mets head back to New York for the final series of the regular season, a three-game set against the Nationals.

A CENTURY: Brandon Nimmo recorded his 100th run of the season last night... His 100 runs are a single-season career-high...It is the 21st time in Mets history that a player recorded at least 100 runs in a season...He became the 13th player in Mets history to record at least 100 runs in a season and the first since Pete Alonso scored 103 runs in 2019.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is second in the majors and in the National League with a . 323 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.329) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded multiple hits in four straight games and in six of his last seven games...It is the sixth time in his career he has recorded multiple hits in at least four consecutive games... His career-high is six straight games with multiple hits, accomplished from April 12-17, 2019...Over his last seven game hitting streak, McNeil is batting 467 (14-30) with six runs, a double, two RBI two walks with a 1000 OPS He has collected 161 multi-hit games in his career, which ies him for 24 th on the Mets all-time list Rey Ordónez is 23 rd with 168 such ies him for 211 is ( 383 ) hitter 11 Or is 23 with 168 such RBI and four walks

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,649-1,577 (.511) career record as a manager... His 1,649 wins place him 20th all-time in major league history... Mike Scioscia ranks 19th with 1,650 career wins...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...With three more victories, Showalter would be the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club... He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 48th road win...The team's 47 wins on the road are tied for the fourth-most all-time...Only the 1986 (53), 1999 (48) and 1969 (49) teams won more games on the road...Their 47 road wins are their highest total since they went 47-34 in 2007...Their . 588 road winning percentage is the third-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) and 1969 (.600) teams had a better winning percentage on the road...Their .588 road winning percentage is third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...Overall they are 47-33 on the road this year.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is batting .264/.334/.423 away from Citi Field... Their . 264 road average is the best in the NL and second in the majors, while their . 334 OBP leads The Show...They rank fourth in MLB with a. 423 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.406), Jeff McNeil (.396) and Mark Canha (.376) rank three through five in road OBP in the National League...Jeff McNeil is batting . 351 (91-261) with 33 runs, 23 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 26 RBI, 16 walks with a .396 OBP and a . 479 SLG in 69 road games this year... His .351 road batting average leads the major leagues...His . 351 road batting average is seventh all-time in Mets history...There have been four Mets to lead the majors in road batting average at the end of the season (min. 200 AB) - Mike Piazza (.377, 200), John Olerud (.373, 1998), Lance Johnson (.369, 1996) and Dave Magadan (.372, 1990).

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,524 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,524 strikeouts is a single-season in franchise history...The previous record was 1,520 set in $2019 \ldots$ Mets pitchers are averaging 9.77 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.2 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .615 winning percentage (40-25) following the All-Star break...The team's 40 wins are the sixth-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting $.266 / .341 / .425$ with 70 home runs in 66 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in OBP, are second in average and are sixth in SLG following the break.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets need to win tonight against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017

ROAD STRIKE: The Mets have struck out 727 batters on the road this year...That is a franchise record, surpassing the previous total of 686 set last season...The team's 727 strikeouts on the road are the most in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 47-25 against the East this year...They have lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and this current series at Atlanta) and have already Washington, September 2-4 and this current series at Atlanta) and have already
clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win tonight against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes must win tonight against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division a 3.43 (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.43
ERA against the East, while hitting $.260 / .333 / .418 \ldots$ The Mets have outscored their ERA against the East, while hittin
divisional opponents, 356-263.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 98 games...The team's 98 wins are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history...That is tied for the third-most in the majo leagues...The last time the team recorded more than 98 wins was in 1988 when they won 100...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 98-60 through 158 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (104-54) posted a better record.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor has recorded a hit in 19 of his last 22 games...Since September 7, Lindor is batting . 323 (30-93) with 16 runs, six doubles a triple, four home runs, 17 RBI, four walks, a steal with a .891 OPS...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .310/.371/.478 with 43 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 37 RBI, 23 walks with an .849 OPS in 65 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR this season.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 116 strikeouts...That is 20 strikeouts more than the second place reliever... He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP... Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.69 ERA (three earned runs/39.1 innings) with 18 hits, eight walks and 78 strikeouts in 38 appearances since the start of June.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 40 home runs this season... He is the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso's 40 home runs are tied for fourth-most in a single season in Mets history....Alonso owns the franchise record with 53 in 2019...Carlos Beltrán (2006) and Todd Hundley (1996) each recorded 41 home runs.

CLEANUP ON AISLE 4: Alonso has hit all 40 of his home runs this season in the fourth spot in the batting order... 127 of his 131 RBI have come as the Mets cleanup hitter...Alonso is one of only six players to tally 40 homers and 125 RBI as the No. 4 hitter in a single season since 2000, joining Alex Rodriguez (2007), Carlos Delgado (2000, 2003), Ryan Howard (2007-2009), Prince Fielder (2009) and Andruw Jones (2006).

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso has set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 this season... His 131 RBI tops the majors...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 8.0 innings against his former team in his return to Oakland... Bassitt allowed two runs on six hits walking one and striking out only two...The Mets put up nine runs against the Athletics to secure Bassitt's 15th win of the season.

MIDNIGHT PLANE TO GEORGIA: With nine wins through 13 road starts, Bassitt set a career-high in road wins in a season...Bassitt's nine road wins ranks tied for third in MLB.... His last road start came on September 23 against the Athletics at his old stomping grounds, tossing 8.0 innings of two-run ball...Across his last four road starts, Bassitt owns a 1.61 ERA (five earned runs/28.0 innings) with 20 strikeouts and three walks...In his career, Bassitt is $27-13$ with a 4.19 ERA on the road ( 167 earned runs/358.1 innings) with 317 strikeouts and 129 walks.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Bassitt's 15 wins this season are a career-high, which are tied for fifthmost in the NL and eighth-most in the majors...Since July 23, Bassitt's eight wins in the second half are tied for third-most in the majors...The Mets have won 20 of Bassitt's 29 starts this season, the most team wins among any Mets starter this season...With Chris Bassitt and Carlos Carrasco both having 15 wins apiece this season, the Mets join the Dodgers and Astros as the only teams in MLB with at least two starting pitchers each with 15 or more wins...In Mets history, there have been 13 pairs of Mets pitchers to get 15 or more wins in a season...The last pair to reach that feat were John Maine and Oliver Pérez in 2007.

GAME ON: Bassitt will face the Braves for the third time this season...Through two starts, he owns a 2.77 ERA (four earned runs/ 13.0 innings)...Earned the win in his most recent start against the Braves at Truist Park after going 6.0 innings allowing one run on five hits, striking out six and walking one...In 12 starts against the NL East this season, Bassitt is $7-3$ with a 2.42 ERA ( 20 earned runs/74.1 innings).

EIGHT IS GREAT: Went 8.0 innings for the third time this season, a single season career-high...This was his sixth career outing going 8.0 or longer...He has nine starts this season where he has gone 7.0 innings or longer, his most such starts in a single season is 11 , which he accomplished in 2021...In his last start, he struck out only two batters across 8.0 innings which is his lowest strikeout total in a $8.0+$ inning start... Bassitt joins five pitchers who have thrown $8.0+$ innings and struck out two or fewer batters this season.
INTENTIONAL GROUNDING: Among qualified pitchers, Bassitt's 49.8 ground ball percentage is his highest of his career in a season, ranking fifth-highest in the NL and eighth-highest in the majors....Last year, Bassitt's ground ball percentage was 42.1 the lowest of his career in a season... His highest ground ball rate comes from his sinker which owns a 62.4 percent ground ball rate as opposed to his next-highest ground ball percentage on his fastball at 51.7 percent.

QUALITY PITCHER: Has 22 starts this season where he has allowed three or fewer runs...Of those 22 starts, Bassitt has recorded a quality start in 19 of those games, which is a career-high...His 19 quality starts are the seventh-most among NL pitchers... Through 122 career starts, Bassitt has thrown 64 quality starts...Since 2020, Bassitt owns a 9.6 bWAR, which is the 11th-highest among pitchers (min. 375.0 innings.)

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Has nine games where he has struck out eight or more batters which surpasses his career-high of eight such games in 2021...Has gone 7.0+ innings nine times and 6.0+ innings 23 times this year...His 23 starts of at least 6.0 innings are tied for fourth-most such starts in the NL and the ninth-most such starts in the majors...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 16 of his 29 starts, going 6.0 inning or longer in 14 of those 16 starts... His 14 starts going 6.0+ innings and striking out six or more batters are tied for the eighth-most such starts in the NL.

CAREER YEAR: Bassitt has set career-highs in innings pitched, wins, strikeouts and starts in a season...Has two 10+ strikeout games this season to set a career-high.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO [15-7, 3.95 ERA]

LAST START: Faced the Marlins at home on September 27 going 3.0 innings allowing four runs on six hits before being pulled after 67 pitches...Carrasco struck out two batters and walked one.

VS. NATIONALS: Carrasco is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (four earned runs/20.0 innings) against the Washington Nationals this year through four starts... He has struck out 17 batters and walked seven...In his career, he owns a 3.86 ERA 12 earned runs/28.0 innings) vs. the Nats in seven games (six starts) with a 2-2 record.


## CARRASCO vs. WASHINGTON
