TONIGHT’S STARTERS: RHP TYLER PHILLIPS (3-6, 3.59) vs. RHP RANDY DOBNAK (2-2, 1.92)

SUNDAY IN CLEVELAND: The Royals suffered an 11-1 loss at Progressive Field on Sunday, settling for a 5th straight series win and a 4-2 road trip to Toronto (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1).

- + **Seth Lugo** fell to 6-8 and allowed a career-high 9 earned runs on 9 hits and 2 walks in 3.2 innings (93 pitches).
- + The Royals jumped out to a 1st-inning lead on 3 straight 2-out hits, but had just 4 knocks the rest of the game as the Guardians scored 11 unanswered runs.

ROSTER EXPANSION: The Royals today announced a flurry of transactions as rosters expand to 28 for the month of September...right-handed pitchers **Nolan Hoffman** (No. 35) and **Easton McGee** were recalled from Triple-A Omaha and outfielder **Drew Waters** was selected from Triple-A Omaha.

- + Hoffman, 29, was acquired from the Phillies on Aug. 3 and has since made 9 appearances in the Royals organization, all with Triple-A Omaha, where he allowed 5 runs but had 14 strikeouts in 8.2 innings (14.5 K/9)...he made his Major League debut with Philadelphia on Aug. 18, 2025 and made 3 appearances with the Phillies earlier this season.
- + This marks the second stint with the Royals for McGee, who was with the club from July 28-Aug. 10 after being acquired from Milwaukee on July 14...since returning to Omaha, he's allowed 12 runs (11 ER) in 7 outings (8.0 IP).
- + Waters, 27, has spent parts of the last four seasons in the Majors with the Royals...in 98 games this season with Triple-A Omaha, he slashed .251/.312/.420 (92-for-198) with 36 extra-base hits (.732 OPS) and 17 stolen bases.
- + The Yankees yesterday claimed right-handed pitcher **John Schreiber** off waivers from the Royals...Schreiber, 32, is due to become a free agent after the season...in three seasons with the Royals, he had a 3.71 ERA (68 ER in 165.0 IP) in 188 appearances, 8th most in the American League.

TRIP TRACKER: The Royals went 4-2 on last week’s trip to Toronto (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) to mark their second trip with a winning record and the first since a 4-2 run through Sacramento (1-2) and Seattle (3-0) from April 28-May 3.

- + The Royals outscored opponents last week 30-22 (+8), but half of the 22 runs allowed came in Sunday’s 11-1 loss in Cleveland...in the 1st 5 games of the trip, the Royals pitched to a 2.25 ERA (11 ER in 44.0 IP).
- + The Royals scored a total of 1 run in their 2 losses on the trip, and went 4-0 when scoring at least 3 runs.

SERIES STREAKING: The Royals have won each of their last 5 sets since their series at Angel Stadium from Aug. 14-16...it’s tied with the Brewers for the longest active streak in the Majors, and only the Red Sox (9), Rays (8) and Yankees (6) have had longer streaks among American League teams this season...it’s the Royals longest series win streak since April 22-May 8 of last season (5 straight series).

THE HOTTEST TEAM IN AL: The Royals have won 13 of their last 16 games since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, a stretch in which they have the best record in the American League and the best run differential (+31).

- + The Royals lead American League teams since Aug. 14 in runs per game (5.4), batting average (.281), on-base percentage (.355), slugging pct. (.449) and OPS (.802).
- + Royals starting pitchers rank 6th in the American League since Aug. 14 with a 3.31 ERA (35 ER in 86.2 IP) and Royals relievers rank 4th with a 3.31 ERA (20 ER in 54.1 IP).

WHERE WE STAND: After being swept at Dodger Stadium, the Royals emerged from an off day in Anaheim on Aug. 13 with a 49-73 record, a season-high-tying 24 games under .500 and 11.5 games out of a playoff spot...but they have won 13 of 16 games since, improving to 62-76 and are now only 7.5 games out of the final Wild Card spot with 24 games left.

- + The Guardians currently hold the last Wild Card position at 69-68 and are on pace for 81 wins...for the Royals to get 81 wins, they would have to go 19-5 in the final 24 games.
- + Last season, Cleveland entered the month of September 10.5 games behind Detroit before finishing 20-7 to steal the American League Central Division title.

FIRST THING’S FIRST: The Royals scored a 1st-inning run in 3 of 6 games on last week’s road trip, and in 79 games since June 1, they lead the Majors in the 1st inning in batting average (.281), rank 3rd in slugging pct. (.479) and OPS (.822), are tied for 3rd in runs (52) and are 4th in HR (17).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: The Royals are 21-23 (.477) in series-opening games, but they’re 14-11 since June 1 and have won each of their last 5 dating back to their series in Anaheim.

- + The Royals are 15-4-2 in series when they win the 1st game.
- + They are 2-19-2 in series when they lose the 1st game.

HOME: The Royals return to Kansas City tonight to begin a 9-game homestand, which is the penultimate stay of the 2026 season...starting tonight, the Royals will play 15 of their remaining 24 games at Kauffman Stadium...they are 36-30 (.545) at home with the 4th-best home record in the AL.

- + The Royals went 7-0 on the last homestand vs. the A’s and Tigers to mark the fourth unbeaten stay (min. 7 games) in franchise history...the 7 straight home wins marks their longest such win streak since May 8-22, 2024 (7) and their last longer streak was from March 31-April 19, 2024 (9).
- + They’re 17-4 in their last 21 games at Kauffman Stadium since July 5, the best home record in the Majors.
- + The Royals are 11-8-2 in 21 series at Kauffman Stadium but they are 6-1-0 in their last 7 home series.
- + The Royals are 5-3-3 on 11 homestands this season.
- + The Royals rank 1st in the AL at home in batting average (.267) and are 2nd in on-base pct. (.334), slugging pct. (.436) and OPS (.770) and 3rd in runs per game (4.9).

DAILY DOUBLE: The Royals rank 2nd in the Majors with 249 doubles, 1 shy of the Red Sox (250)...they are attempting to lead the Majors in doubles for just the sixth time in franchise history, following 1977 (299), 1978 (305), 1982 (295), 1990 (316) and 1992 (284).

- + The Royals boast a Majors-most seven players who have recorded at least 20 doubles this season, led by **Bobby Witt Jr.’s** 28 doubles, which rank T-6th in the AL.
- + **Carter Jensen** has 25 doubles, which are tied for the 3rd most among Major League rookies.

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 24-17 (.585) since the All-Star break, which is the 3rd-best record in the American League, trailing only the Red Sox (29-15) and Rays (26-17).

- + Their 2nd-half play marks a significant improvement for the Royals, who were 21 games under (38-59) before the break, which tied for the worst record in the Majors.
- + The Royals win pct. has improved from .392 before the break to .585 since, for a difference of +.193, best in MLB.
- + The Royals are 8-4-1 in 13 series since the All-Star break after going 9-19-3 in 31 sets in the 1st half...their 8 series wins since the All-Star break are tied for 2nd most in the American League, trailing only the Red Sox (9).

AUGUST RECAP: The Royals won 13 of their last 16 games in August—after losing 8 of their 1st 11—to finish 16-11 and mark their best calendar month since August 2025 (16-12).

- + The Royals in August ranked 2nd in the AL in slugging pct. (.420) and OPS (.747) and 3rd in runs per game (4.8).
- + Today, baseball writers and broadcasters will vote for Player and Pitcher of the Month for August in each league, and there’s a good chance the Royals will be well represented on the American League ballot.
- + **Jac Caglianone** led the AL last month in batting average (.411), slugging pct. (.684), OPS (1.113) and RBI (26).
- + **Noah Cameron** went 4-0 in 5 starts last month and ranked among the American League leaders (min. 5 GS) in IP/GS (6.2, 1st), WHIP (0.80, 1st), opponents’ avg. (.155, 2nd), HR/9 (0.27, 2nd), wins (3rd) and ERA (1.87, 4th).

FISH BITES: The Royals are hosting the Marlins this week at Kauffman Stadium for only the fifth time and first since 2024...these teams have played 9 series but 4 of the last 5 dating back to 2016 have been in Miami...the Royals are 13-14 in 27 games vs. the Marlins, but have won 5 of the 9 series.

- + The Royals lost 2 of 3 in Miami last season in the 1st series after the All-Star break, but they won 2 of 3 in their last meeting at Kauffman Stadium from June 24-26, 2024.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: Tonight begins a stretch in which the Royals will play 3 of their next 6 series vs. National League teams, which will wrap their Interleague schedule...they are 17-22 vs. NL teams this season but have lost 8 of their last 9 games and each of the last 4.

- + In Interleague play, the Royals lead AL teams in batting average (.262), on-base pct. (.334) and OPS (.769), and rank 2nd in slugging pct. (.435) and runs per game (4.9).
- + **Salvador Perez** has 222 RBI in Interleague play, 6 better than **Alex Rodriguez** (216) for the most all-time among AL players...if you include those who played in the NL, his 222 RBI are 6 shy of **Miguel Cabrera** (228) for 4th most.
- + Perez’s 346 Interleague hits rank 3rd among AL players, trailing only **Jose Altuve** (373) and **Derek Jeter** (364).
- + Salvy’s 75 HR in Interleague play are also 2nd most among AL players behind **Aaron Judge** (86).
- + Nine of Salvy’s 17 HR this season have come vs. NL teams.

RANDY DOBNAK is making his 30th career start (50th appearance) tonight in the series opener of this 3-game set here at Kauffman Stadium vs. the Marlins, who he is faping for the first time in his career...he was acquired by the Royals from the Mariners on June 17 in exchange for cash considerations.

- + On July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak joined the Royals rotation, filling the void of **Stephen Kolek**, who was placed on the Injured List with a right flexor strain...the outing marked his 1st MLB start since Sept. 3, 2021, with 1,779 days in between.
- + Randy’s 1.93 starter ERA (9 ER in 42.0 IP) is the 5th-lowest mark through a pitcher’s 1st 8 starts with the club in Royals history, trailing leader **Cole Ragans**, who posted a 1.51 ERA (8 ER in 47.2 IP) across his 1st 8 starts to begin his Royals tenure in 2023.
- + Across 13 starts with Triple-A Tacoma to begin the season, Dobnak went 5-5 with a 4.24 ERA (33 ER in 70.0 IP), and at the time of the deal on June 17, his 6 quality starts ranked 3rd in Minor League Baseball...as part of the trade, Randy had his contract selected, but was optioned to Triple-A Omaha, where he made 2 starts (June 19 and June 25) before being recalled on July 1.

LAST TIME OUT: Dobnak suffered his 2nd loss of the season in the Royals 3-0 defeat last Wednesday night in Toronto despite yielding just 3 runs on 6 hits over 6.0 innings...worked around traffic in each of his 1st 3 innings, but in the 4th, **Nathan Lukes** tagged him for a 3-run homer to open the scoring, the lone blemish of his night...went 1-2-3 in the 5th before striking out Lukes in the 6th to strand a 2-out walk and end his outing, posting his 2nd quality start of the season and 1st since July 29 at Minnesota.

- + The HR by Lukes snapped Dobnak’s homerless streak at a season-high 36.0 innings, just 0.1 inning shy of matching his career best...the homer simultaneously snapped his 27.1-inning road scoreless streak, and 26.1 of those innings came as a Royal, marking the longest road scoreless streak to begin a tenure in club history, per *Elías*.

STORY OF THE SEASON: After each of Dobnak’s 1st 15 appearances to open this season came in Triple-A with Tacoma (13) and Omaha (2), he was recalled by Kansas City on July 1, and he initially pitched out of the bullpen, making 2 bulk relief appearances on July 2 vs. the Rays and July 8 at the Mets...across 10 games (8 starts) with the Royals, Randy’s 1.92 ERA (11 ER in 51.2 IP) since his club debut on July 2 is tied for the 4th-best mark in the Majors, trailing only Toronto’s **Dylan Cease** (1.48), Detroit’s **Troy Melton** (1.70) and Cleveland’s **Parker Messick** (1.80).

- + Despite not joining the Royals rotation until the 2nd half of the year, Randy is set to make his 9th start tonight, already 1 shy of his career high that he set in 2020 (10).

SECOND-HALF SURGE: Randy joined the Royals rotation to begin the 2nd half of the season, and has been one of the best pitchers in the Majors since, posting a 1.93 ERA (9 ER in 42.0 IP), the 5th-best mark in the AL and 8th best in MLB, behind leader **Reid Detmers** of the Los Angeles Angels (1.55)...Randy has surrendered just 1 home run in this 8-start stretch, posting a 0.4 HR/9 rate that ranks 5th in the American League, behind **Drew Rasmussen**, whose 0.2 HR/9 mark leads the AL.

- + Dobnak has allowed 1 run or fewer in 6 of his 8 starts since joining the Royals rotation, tied with **Sandy Alcantara**, **Cam Schlittler**, **Kyle Leahy** and Detmers for the most such starts in the Majors since the All-Star break...additionally, Randy has surrendered just 4 hits or fewer in 5 of those starts, 1 shy of matching the leaders.
- + Randy has recorded 5 outings of at least 4.0 scoreless innings since making his Royals debut on July 2, which are the most such games in MLB in that span.

WALK THIS WAY: In 10 Major League appearances (8 starts) this season, Dobnak has struggled at times with his command, issuing 21 walks over 51.2 innings (3.7 BB/9), including a career-high-tying 4 walks in his start on July 18 vs. San Diego and on Aug. 20 vs. the A’s...this year’s rate is more than 1 walk higher than his 2.4 BB/9 rate that he posted over 39 career appearances (21 starts) prior to the start of the season...across his 15 Triple-A starts this year, he yielded just 25 walks in 80.2 innings, recording a 2.8 BB/9 rate, which is much more in line with what he has posted in his career.

- + Randy issued just 1 walk last Wednesday night in Toronto, which came with 2 outs in the 6th inning to his 2nd to final batter (**Kazuma Okamoto**), but he has still allowed at least 1 walk in each of his 10 outings (8 starts) this season.
- + Dobnak has yielded a walk in a career-high 11 straight appearances since last season.
- + Despite surrendering 21 walks, none of them have scored, and in fact, 4 of them have been stranded as inherited runners thanks to Kansas City’s bullpen.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 20 lifetime appearances (11 starts) in his home ballpark, Randy has gone 5-5 with a 4.84 ERA (40 ER in 74.1 IP), more than a full run higher than his 3.58 ERA (47 ER in 118.0 IP) across 29 road outings (18 starts)...tonight, he is making his 7th career appearance (6th start) here at Kauffman Stadium, where he owns a 2-1 record and a 3.29 ERA (10 ER in 27.1 IP).

- + Over 5 outings (4 starts) at The K this year, Dobnak has posted a 3.22 ERA (8 ER in 22.1 IP) with a .319 opponents’ average (29-for-91), while he’s owns a 0.92 ERA (3 ER in 29.1 IP) with a .198 opponents’ average (21-for-106) in 5 road games (4 starts).

HOME RUN REPORT: Six of the 11 runs that Randy has surrendered this season have come on 3 home runs: a 2-run shot by **Cedric Mullins** on July 2, a solo homer by **Fernando Tatis Jr.** on July 18 and a 3-run HR by **Nathan Lukes** last Wednesday night in Toronto...in 39 games over his first five Major League seasons, he yielded 17 home runs, which accounted for 26 of his 81 runs allowed (32.1%).

- + After yielding a solo home run to Tatis Jr. in the 3rd inning on July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak rode a season-high 36.0-inning homerless streak that he carried into the 4th innng of his start last Wednesday night before Lukes connected on a 3-run HR...despite home runs accounting for a high percentage of his runs allowed, his 0.5 HR/9 rate since his Royals debut on July 2 ranks T-8th in Major League Baseball, trailing leader **Eury Pérez** of the Marlins (0.2).

TOMORROW NIGHT’S STARTER: LHP NOAH CAMERON (9-8, 3.98)

- + **Noah Cameron** will make his 26th start of the season and the 50th of his career (51st appearance) in tomorrow night’s matchup vs. Miami.
- + In his most recent start last Thursday night in Toronto, Cameron earned his 4th consecutive winning decision after tossing 6.0 innings, allowing 2 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks with 3 strikeouts...worked around a leadoff single and 2-out walk in the 1st...stranded a 2-out double in the 2nd and got **Alejandro Kirk** to line out to second for a 4-3 double play in the 3rd...went 1-2-3 in the 4th and 5th...allowed 4 consecutive 2-out hits in the 6th, with the damage coming on a 2-run homer by **George Springer**, but stranded runners on the corners to end his night.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost's** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 286 wins are tied with **Hal McRae** for the 6th most in club history, 1 shy of **John Wathan** (287) for 5th...he's 14 wins shy of becoming the fifth Royals Manager to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash's** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona's** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
