### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 24, 1960:** The Yankees score eight runs before making their first out of the game during a 15-9 win over Baltimore at Yankee Stadium. The inning is highlighted by a three-run homer from Elston Howard and a solo home run by Tony Kubek.

**April 24, 1923:** The Yankees record the first shutout in Original Yankee Stadium history, a 4-0 win over the Washington Senators. Sad Sam Jones tosses a shutout (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 4K) and Babe Ruth goes 3-for-3 with 1HR, 3RBI and 1BB.

**April 24, 1917:** Yankees left-hander George Mogridge pitches the first no-hitter in franchise history in a 2-1 victory at Boston (3BB, 3K). It will mark the last time the Yankees have a lefty throw a no-hitter until Dave Righetti turns the trick on 7/4/83 vs. Boston.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 25, 1999:** In front of a sold-out Yankee Stadium and many of Joe DiMaggio's former teammates, a monument in honor of the Yankee Clipper is unveiled in Monument Park. Paul Simon sings "Mrs. Robinson" while standing in center field. DiMaggio had passed away prior to the season on March 8.

**April 25, 1967:** Whitey Ford records his 236th and final career victory, an 11-2 win over the White Sox at Yankee Stadium. He remains atop the all-time Yankees wins list.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game series at Houston (through Sun)... are 3-0 on the road trip after sweeping the Red Sox... will also face the Rangers from Mon.-Wed.

- **Their 16-9 (.640) record is the best in the American League and tied for the fourth-best in the Majors.**
- **Have won a season-high six straight games (since 4/17), their longest single-season winning streak since their eight-game winning streak from 9/20-28/25...** is tied for the third-longest winning streak in the Majors this season, trailing only the Cubs' current nine-game streak (since 4/14) and the Padres' eight-game streak from 4/8-16.
- **Have won seven of their last eight games (since 4/15) and eight of their last 10 games (since 4/13).**
- Have won or split six of their eight series this season (5-2-1)... have also won three of their four road series this year.
- The Yankees are 13-3 this season when scoring first.
- Have had 15 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, tied with Baltimore for the most in the Majors.
- The Yankees' +37 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees completed a three-game sweep and won their season-high sixth straight game with a 4-2 victory against the Red Sox on Thursday at Fenway Park... **RHP Cam Schlichter** (8.0IP, 4H, 2R/1ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR) earned his third win of the season after allowing only 2R/1ER over a career-high 8.0 innings... **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his first HR of the season with a game-tying solo shot in the fifth inning... **PH/LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-2, 2RBI) hit a pinch-hit go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning... **RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning... **1B Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 1BB) and **SS José Cabrero** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double) each reached base twice... **RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP) tossed a perfect ninth inning to earn his seventh save of the year.

**HOW SWEEP IT IS:** The Yankees completed their second straight series sweep and third of the season on Thursday at Boston (also 3G at San Francisco from 3/25-28 and 3G vs. Kansas City from 4/17-19)... marked their first sweep of the Red Sox since a four-game sweep from 9/22-25/22 at Yankee Stadium... also marked their first sweep at Fenway Park of at least three games since a three-game sweep from 9/24-26/21.

**SCHLITZ'S CREEK:** RHP Cam Schlichter earned his third win of the season after allowing only 2R/1ER over a regular season career-high 8.0IP (4H, 1BB, 5K, 1HR)... **in six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 1.77 ERA (35.2IP, 7ER) and 41K... has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in four of his six starts...** has held opponents to a .172/.197/.250 (22-for-128) slash line... has allowed only 4BB to 133BF.

► **Over his last 14 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA (79.0IP, 18ER) and 95K...** the Yankees are 12-2 in those starts.

► Owns a Major League-best 1.01 BB/9.0IP ratio and 10.25 K/BB ratio... also ranks third in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.197, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.447, third in AL) and WHIP (0.73, first in AL), fifth in innings pitched (35.2IP fourth in AL) and strikeouts (41, third in AL), sixth in ERA (1.77, fifth in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.172, fourth in AL), tied for eighth in opponents' SLG (.250, tied for sixth in AL) and ninth in HR/9.0IP (0.25, eighth in AL).

**PITCH PERFECT:** Yankees pitchers have allowed only 3R/2ER over their last four games (since 4/19), posting a 0.50 ERA (36.0IP, 2ER) over that stretch.

- Have allowed only 85R this season, marking only the second time in the last 45 years (since 1982) the Yankees have allowed 85R-or-fewer through their first 25 games of a season (also 70R in 2022).
- **Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of their last four games and five of their last six games (since 4/17), posting a 1.17 ERA (54.0IP, 7ER) over that longer stretch.**
- **Yankees pitchers lead the Majors in ERA (3.07) and opponents' SLG (.334),** rank second in WHIP (1.11, first in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.67, second in AL), K/BB (3.32, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.283, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.617, first in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.219, first in AL) and sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.77, third in AL).

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters rank second in the Majors in PA/BB (8.05, first in AL) and stolen bases (28, first in AL), third in walks (117, second in AL) and stolen base percentage (87.5%, first in AL), fourth in home runs (35, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.02, third in AL), sixth in OPS (.730, second in AL), seventh in SLG (.408, second in AL), tied for seventh in XBH (76, tied for second in AL) and 10th in runs scored (122, fourth in AL).

**HIP HIP JOSÉ:** INF/OF José Cabrero is batting .341/.370/.500 (15-for-44) with 7R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 4SB over his last 12 games (since 4/11).

**PUT TO BED:** RHP David Bednar tossed a perfect ninth inning on Thursday at Boston to earn his AL-best seventh save of the year... is tied for second in the Majors in saves, trailing only San Diego's Mason Miller (nine).

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a Major League-best 2.59 ERA (146.0IP, 42ER) and 149K in 25 starts this season... have allowed only 2R/1ER in their last 29.2 innings (since 4/19)... have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of their last six starts and 2R-or-fewer in each of those starts (since 4/17), posting a 0.63 ERA (42.2IP, 3ER) and 41K over that span.

► **Yankees starters have tossed at least 8.0 innings in a Major League-best four games this season...** the Marlins and the Dodgers are the only other teams that have multiple 8.0 inning starts (two each)... **the Yankees have four of the 14 such starts in the Majors this year.**

► The Yankees' four starts of at least 8.0IP are their most through their first 25 games of a season in the last 13 years (since 2014) and most since recording five in 2013... **the Yankees are one of only two Major League teams in the last 11 seasons (since 2016) to have at least four starts of at least 8.0IP through their first 25 games of a season** (Cleveland also recorded six in 2018).

► Have tossed at least 8.0IP in back-to-back starts for the first time since 5/26-27/22 (Nestor Cortes-8.0IP and Jameson Taillon-8.0IP) and for only the second time in the last 13 seasons (since 2014... have not done so in three straight starts since a four-start streak from 8/5-8/04 (Kevin Brown-8.0IP/Javier Vázquez-8.0IP/Orlando Hernández-8.0IP/Jon Lieber-8.0IP).

► **Yankees starters have tossed at least 7.0 innings in a Major League-best seven games this season...** marks the most by a Yankees starting rotation through their first 25 games of a season in the last nine years (since 2018) and most since recording eight in 2017... **their seven starts of at least 7.0IP match the most by any Major League team through their first 25 games in a season in the last five years since 2022** (also 2024 Phillies and 2023 Astros).

► Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 22 of their 25 starts, matching their third-most through their first 25 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913, trailing only their 24 starts in 2022 and 23 starts in 1919 (also had 22 in 1972 and 2024).

► Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 13 starts this season, tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (16) and Chicago-NL (15)... **their 13 starts of 1ER-or-fewer are their second-most through their first 25 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913,** trailing only their 14 starts in 1958.

► **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.59), opponents' BA (.194), opponents' OBP (.252), opponents' SLG (.311), opponents' OPS (.563), WHIP (0.95) and K/BB (4.14),** rank second in strikeouts (149, second in AL) and BB/9.0IP (2.22, second in AL), third in strikeout rate (25.9%, third in AL), seventh in HR/9.0IP (0.80, fourth in AL) and eighth in K/9.0IP (9.18, fifth in AL).

**FOUR SCORE:** Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last eight games (since 4/15) and 11 of their last 12 games (since 4/11)... their eight-game streak with at least 4R is their longest since a 12-game streak from 6/29-7/11/25... the Yankees are 14-4 this season when scoring at least 4R.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU:** Today is **C J.C. Escarra's** 31st birthday (DOB: 4/24/95).

**ALL THAT JAZZ:** INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. hit his first home run of the season with a game-tying solo shot in the fifth inning on Thursday at Boston... has recorded multiple hits in two of his last three games.

**SAVED BY THE BELL:** INF/OF Cody Bellinger hit a pinch-hit go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning on Thursday at Boston... **has hit .325/.413/.525 (13-for-40) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI, 6BB and 1SB over his last 11 games (since 4/11).**

**GOOD WILL WARREN:** RHP Will Warren will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's series opener at Houston... **has gone 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA (25.1IP, 7ER) and 31K in five starts this season...** has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts... the Yankees are 4-1 in his starts this year.

► Since 2025, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 27 of his 38 starts, tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors over that span.

**ALL RISE:** OF Aaron Judge reached base twice and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning on Thursday at Boston... has reached base multiple times in each of his last three games and five of his last six games (since 4/17)... has reached base in 18 of his last 19 games (since 4/3), batting .284/.422/.642 (19-for-67) with 19R, 3 doubles, 7HR, 14RBI, 15BB, 1HP and 5SB over that span.

► **Ranks fourth in the Majors with 9HR this year,** trailing only Yordan Alvarez (11HR), Munetaka Murakami (10HR) and James Wood (10HR).

**RICE RICE BABY:** C/INF Ben Rice has hit .311/.453/.716 (23-for-74) with 21R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 18RBI, 19BB/2IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB in 24 games this season... has reached base safely in 18-of-20 starts.

► **Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.453, second in AL), SLG (.716, second in AL) and OPS (1.169, second in AL),** fourth in PA/BB (5.00, third in AL), is tied for fourth in XBH (14, tied for second in AL), and tied for fifth in HR (eight, tied for fourth in AL), walks (19, tied for fourth in AL) and runs scored (21, tied for second in AL).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (2-0, 2.49 ERA)

**RHP Will Warren** will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's series opener at Houston...the 26-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year on Saturday vs. Kansas City after allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0 innings (5H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR, 1PO)...**his 11K tied his career high (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)**...marked his third career double-digit strikeout game (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 10K on 5/20/25 vs. Texas)...**is 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA (25.1IP, 22H, 11R/7ER, 6BB, 31K, 3HR) in five starts this season...his 27 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 21 wins in his starts since 2025 are tied for the fourth-most in the AL and the 10th-most in the Majors**...last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to Elias, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968)...according to *Elias*, **his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910)...his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)... was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year on Saturday vs. Kansas City after allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0 innings (5H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR, 1PO)...**his 11K tied his career high (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)**...marked his third career double-digit strikeout game (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 10K on 5/20/25 vs. Texas).

- ✦ Marked the second time in his career he has recorded at least 10K without surrendering a walk (also 11K and 0BB 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...no other Yankee has done so since Warren last accomplished the feat on 6/17/25...became one of only four Yankees since 2019 with multiple games of at least 10K and 0BB (also Gerrit Cole-9, Carlos Rodón-3 and James Paxton-2).
- ✦ His 7.0 innings marked the second-longest start of his career (7.1IP on 5/9/25 at the Athletics).
- ✦ Also marked his sixth career start with 0BB and his second this season (last on 4/3 vs. Miami).

**2026: Is 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA (25.1IP, 22H, 11R/7ER, 6BB, 31K, 3HR) in five starts this season**...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his five starts.

- ✦ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in four of his five starts this season, including 1BB-or-fewer in three of those starts...has issued just 6BB to 105 batters faced.
- ✦ The Yankees are 4-1 in his starts.
- ✦ Recorded his first win of the season on 4/3 vs. Miami, allowing 2R/ER in 5.2IP (4H, 0BB, 6K, 2HR).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 3/28 at San Francisco, tossing 4.1IP (5H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 3K, 0HR) without recording a decision.

**GOOD WILL WARREN: His 27 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 21 wins in his starts since 2025 are tied for the fourth-most in the AL and the 10th-most in the Majors.**

- ✦ Is 5-3 with a 3.36 ERA (83.0IP, 79H, 43R/31ER, 21BB, 78K, 13HR) over his last 16 starts (since 7/30/25)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 13 of those 16 starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 28 of his first career 43 starts...among pitchers to debut since 1913 (when ER was first tracked), his 28 such starts are tied with Luis Gil, Ron Guidry and Bill Stafford for the third-most by a Yankee in their first 43 career starts, trailing only Steve Kline (29GS) and Stan Bahnsen (29GS).
- ✦ His 38 starts since the start of 2025 are tied for the second-most in the Majors and tied for the most in AL.

**ROAD TRIPPING:** Is making his second road start of the season tonight...in his first road start of the season, allowed just 1R/ER over 4.1IP on 3/28 at San Francisco (5H, 2BB, 3K, 0HR).

- ✦ Is 1-2 with a 2.88 ERA (34.1IP, 11ER) and 24K over his last seven road starts (since 8/5/25).
- ✦ Went 2-4 with a 5.52 ERA (75.0IP, 87H, 54R/46ER, 31BB, 75K, 10HR) in 17 road starts last season...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those starts, including five of his final six road starts from 8/15-9/19.

**VS. HOUSTON:** Will make his second career start vs. the Astros tonight...in his first career start vs. Houston, allowed 2R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision (5H, 0BB, 4K, 1HR) on 9/3/25 at Daikin Park.

**2025:** In his first full Major League season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR)...opponents batted .250/.320/.418 (158-for-631, 22HR); LH .266/.350/.436 (91-for-342, 12HR); RH .232/.283/.398 (67-for-289, 10HR).

- ✦ Was tied for second in the Majors in starts (33, tied for first in AL)...also ranked eighth in the AL in K/9.0IP (9.48).
- ✦ Was just the third Yankees rookie to make at least 33 starts in a season, joining Stan Bahnsen (34GS in 1968), and Russ Ford (33GS in 1910)...was also the first Major League rookie to make at least 33 starts in a single season since 2009 (Nick Blackburn, 33GS with Minnesota in 2008).
- ✦ Among Major League rookies, ranked first in strikeouts, starts and innings pitched, and was tied for fourth in wins (tied for third in AL).
- ✦ Went 5-5 with a 3.94 ERA (105.0IP, 46ER) over his final 20 starts (6/12-9/26) after going 4-3 with a 5.34 ERA (57.1IP, 34ER) over his first 13 starts of the season (4/1-6/6)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of his final 20 starts and one-or-zero ER in eight of those starts.
- ✦ Surrendered one-or-zero home runs in 29 of his 33 starts and did not allow a home run in 15 of those starts...his 29 starts of one-or-zero home runs allowed were tied for the fourth-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- ✦ Allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 33 starts, including 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...according to *Elias*, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968).
- ✦ According to *Elias*, his 171K were tied with Luis Gil (171K in 2024) for the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford (209K in 1910).
- ✦ Tossed five scoreless starts: 5.2IP on 5/20 vs. Texas, 6/12 at Kansas City and 7/8 vs. Seattle, and 5.0IP on 6/27 vs. the Athletics and 8/5 at Texas...according to *Elias*, his five scoreless starts were tied for the third-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910 and Luis Gil's six such starts in 2024 (Hippo Vaughn also had five such starts in 1910).
