PITTSBURGH PIRATES (45-48) vs. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (27-68)

July 12, 2024 at Guaranteed Rate Field, Chicago, IL - 7:10 CDT - GAME #94/ROAD #48

LHP MARCO GONZALES (0-0, 2.65 ERA) vs. LHP GARRETT CROCHET (6-6, 3.08 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...shut out Milwaukee 1-0 yesterday afternoon to earn a series win at American Family Field...Have won 10 games in their last at-bat, matching their total from all of 2023 (the team won 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 34-3 (.919 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 58 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the Brewers have the second-longest active streak at 45 games)...Have played in 31 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (33)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (45) in MLB behind the Mariners (56), Phillies (53) and Royals (47)...Have the fifth-best ERA (3.55) among all starting rotations in MLB, trailing only the Phillies (3.17), Mariners (3.38), Royals (3.50) and Orioles (3.54)...Rank second in all of MLB in stolen base percentage (84.5 percent), trailing only the Brewers (84.8 percent)...Are 6-7-2 in their first 15 series on the road...Come into today with an errorless streak of 59.0 innings dating back to 7/5 (their season-high is 67.0 innings)...Rank second in MLB with a .995 fielding percentage this month.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Earlier today National League All-Star manager Torey Lovullo named Paul Skenes the starting pitcher for Tuesday night's All-Star Game...Skenes will become the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

THE STORY OF BASEBALL: Paul Skenes struck out 11 batters in 7.0 scoreless, no-hit innings to improve to 6-0 this season yesterday at Milwaukee...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Skenes joined Russ Swan in 1990 as the only two pitchers to have two no-hit bids of 6.0-plus innings in his first 11 career outings in the last 40 seasons...Skenes is now one of just two pitchers since 1901 to have 80-plus strikeouts and fewer than 15 walks in the first 11 appearances of his big league career along with Masahiro Tanaka in 2014 (88 strikeouts and 12 walks).

AND THE WHIFF: Paul Skenes has eight consecutive games with seven-plus strikeouts...According to MLB Network, the only two rookies with more consecutive games of at least seven-plus strikeouts are Brandon Beachy with nine in 2011 and Dwight Gooden with nine in 1984...According to OptaStats, Skenes and Nolan Ryan (1973) are the only two pitchers to have multiple starts of not allowing a hit with 11-plus strikeouts in a season.

THE SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: The Pirates tossed their first of six shutouts this season on May 4...Since that date, Pittsburgh's six shutouts are the fifth-most in all of MLB...The only four teams to have more shutouts during that time are the Braves (eight), Dodgers (seven), Mariners (seven) and Rangers (seven).

SUMMING UP JULY: Pittsburgh comes into today with the fifth-best ERA (3.36) in all of MLB for the month of July...The only four teams with a lower ERA are the Cubs (2.22), Mariners (2.41), Braves (2.80) and Rangers (3.15)...The pitching staff is tied with the Cubs and Mariners for the second-fewest home runs allowed (seven) in MLB (the Marlins have given up just five long balls this month)...Offensively, the Pirates are tied with the Tigers and Reds for the most home runs in all of MLB (19)...The Bucs are tied for ninth in all of MLB and tied for fourth among all National League teams in runs scored (50) this month...The only NL teams with more runs this month are the Diamondbacks (64), Reds (55) and Mets (53).

TAKING THE LEAD: The Pirates were 17-13 (.567) when scoring first entering June...Only the White Sox (14) and Diamondback (15) had more losses...Since June, the Pirates are 14-2 (.875) when scoring first, tied for the third-best record, with only the Angels (9-1) having fewer losses.

SETTING UP THE SERIES: The final series leading up to this year's All-Star break brings the team to Chicago for this three-game series against the White Sox (the Bucs are 4-3 against the AL Central this year)...This is Pittsburgh's first trip to the south side of Chicago since 2021, but the first three-game series the Pirates will play against the White Sox on the road since 2009...In their most recent game against the White Sox in April of last year, the Pirates earned a 1-0 win despite having just two hits in the game...It is Pittsburgh's only win over an AL opponent while scoring just one run and having two or fewer hits in franchise history...Courtesy of StatsPerform.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 12, 2014: Andrew McCutchen hit a game-tying homer off Jonathon Broxton to lead off the ninth inning and a two-run game-winning shot two innings later off J.J. Hoover to lift the Pirates to a 6-5 win at Cincinnati. In the process, McCutchen became the first player in team history to hit both a game-tying and game-winning homer in the ninth inning or later. It was Pittsburgh's 22nd come-from-win of the year.

STARTING OFF: The 32-year-old lefthander is in his first season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Braves for cash considerations on December 5, 2023... Gonzales is in his 10th Major League season, having played for the Cardinals (2014-17), Mariners (2017-2023) and Pirates (2024)...He was originally selected in the first round (19th overall) of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Gonzaga University by the St. Louis Cardinals.

WELCOME BACK!: Gonzales was reinstated from the 60-day injured list today while recovering from a left forearm muscle strain...He last appeared in a Major League game on April 13 at Philadelphia, allowing just two runs on six hits with five strikeouts.

- Made two rehab starts with Triple-A Indianapolis on July 1 at Louisville and July 6 vs. Louisville, combining to allow five runs on seven hits with six strikeouts in 7.1 innings of work.

AGAINST THE WHITE SOX: Gonzales will be making his fourth career start and appearance against the White Sox, against whom he's 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 ER in 19.1 IP)...He last appeared against Chicago on September 5, 2022 at T-Mobile Park as a member of the Mariners, taking the loss after allowing three runs on four hits over 7.0 innings of work.

- His lone career appearance at Guaranteed Rate Field came on April 24, 2018, earning the win after throwing 6.0-shutout innings with eight strikeouts and one walk.

ROAD DAWG: Gonzales is making his third road start of the season...Has pitched to a 2.45 ERA (3 ER in 11.0 IP) in his road appearances this season.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Gonzales has held left-handed hitters to a .167 average (3-for-18) with just one extra base hit (a home run).

2023 RECAP: Was limited to 10 starts after undergoing season-ending surgery on 8/13 to decompress a nerve in his left forearm...Won each of his first three decisions before allowing a season-high eight runs in 1.2 innings on 5/17 at Boston...Tied a career-high after striking out nine batters in his third start on 4/19 vs. Milwaukee...Had a no-decision (5.2ip/1r) in his final start on 5/28 vs. Pittsburgh...Was placed on the 15-day injured list with a left forearm strain on 6/3...Was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 7/26...Was Seattle's nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award for the second straight season.
