TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3 -game series vs Mike Leake's Diamondbacks and Game 7 (2-4) of a 7-game homestand that included a 2-2 series split vs the Phillies...immediately following this afternoon's game, the Redlegs will fly to Seattle and will spend tomorrow's off day there...Tue night will begin their second consecutive 3 -city road trip ( 3 g at Sea, 3 g at Ari, 3 g at Chi) and the fourth of their 4 scheduled visits to the West Coast ( $0-3$ at LAD \& 3-1 at SD, 1-2 at Oak \& 2-1 at SF, 0-2 at LAA).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...this afternoon will wear replica uniforms of the 1995 NL Central Division championship team... the Reds are $4-9$ wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976 and 1990 ...as part of the season-long celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than 20 anniversary park benches, featuring Reds mascots wearing the 15 throwback uniforms, are on display at locations across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky

SERIES NOTES: This afternoon the Diamondbacks are looking for their first series sweep of the Redlegs since a 4-game sweep from 8/20-8/23, 2015, also here at Great American Ball Park....at Ari's Bank One Ballpark, the Reds are 32-18 with the roof closed and 6-12 with the roof open...Cin won its first 7 games there until a 9-6 loss on $7 / 1 / 00$.

MARINERS UP NEXT: Tuesday night, the Reds and Mariners will meet for the first time since 2016 and for the first time in Seattle since 2010...the Redlegs are 2-13 all-time vs Sea, including 0-3 in 2016 at Great American Ball Park, 1-2 in 2013 at GABP, 0-3 in 2010 at Safeco Field, 1-2 in 2007 at Safeco and $0-\mathbf{3}$ in 2002 in the final season of Cinergy Field...the Reds won their first game at the ballpark then known as Safeco Field 16-1 on 6/22/07, but since then have lost 5 straight games at what is now named T-Mobile Park.

GOOD CHANCE FOR A HOME RUN TODAY...: Neither team homered in yesterday's 2-0 Diamondbacks win...was the 116th homerless game in the 17 -year history of Great American Ball Park, the eighth this season...only 5 times in the ballpark's 1,368 -game history were there streaks of at least 2 straight games without a home run by either team: 8/6-8/7, 2005 vs Fla (2g), 4/5-4/6, 2011 vs Hou (2g), 9/12/12 vs Pit \& 9/21/12 vs LAD ( 2 g ), 7/25-7/27, 2014 vs Wsh ( 3 g ) and 3/31/19 vs Pit \& 4/1/19 vs Mil ( 2 g ).
FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (118), HR (43), RBI (115) and slugging percentage (.581) while ranking second in the NL in batting average (.299, Wsh .303) and on-base percentage (.362, Wsh .364)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 118-76, and are 33-13 (.717) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first inning.

PLAYER \& ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Aristides Aquino was the National League's Player of the Month and Rookie of the Month for August...led the Major Leagues in HR (14) and RBI (33) and led the National League in slugging percentage (.767)...established a new National League record for HR by a rookie in a calendar month and tied the franchise record for HR by any player in any calendar month (Frank Robinson, August 1962 \& Greg Vaughn, September 1999).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 15 HR in his first 38 career games and 147 plate apps, including a 3 -homer game on $8 / 10$ vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th).
Holds modern Major League records for fewest career apps to 14 HR ( 28 g ) and fewest career plate apps to 15 HR (122pa). Is the only player in modern Major League history with 13 HR in his first 100 career plate apps, the only player with $\mathbf{1 4}$ HR in his first 108 career plate apps and the only player with 15 HR in his first 122 career plate apps....Phi's Rhys Hoskins (98th PA) and LAD's Will Smith (100th PA) are the only other players, since 1900, to produce as many as 12 HR in their first $\mathbf{1 0 0}$ career plate apps... Hoskins holds the record since 1900 for fewest plate apps to 16 HR (137).
Holds modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10), first 17 career games (11), first 22 career games (12), first 27 career games (13) and first 28 career games (14)...Rhys Hoskins holds the record since 1900 for fewest career games to 15 HR and 16 HR (32).

RUTHIAN: Per @EliasSports, in Wed's $8-5$ win vs Phi Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth ( $6 / 13 / 1921$ vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...Lorenzen is a career .260 hitter (27-104) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, $7 \mathrm{HR}, 22$ RBI and .260 hitter (27-104) with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 22 RBI and
an .800 OPS...he has 3 career pinch-hit HR, on $4 / 6 / 17$ off Phi's Adam Morgan, $6 / 24 / 18$ off Chi's Mike Montgomery and $6 / 30 / 18$ off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)... has appeared in 90 of the Reds' 141 games ( 67 g at $\mathrm{P}, 8 \mathrm{~g}$ in LF, 8 g in CF, 4 g in RF, 13 g as PR)...played CF in the ninth inning of Wed's $8-5$ win vs Phi and then the next day made his first career start at that position... 9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season ( $P R / C F, P, P R, P, P R, P$ ).

## RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...in his last 4 starts is 2-1, $\mathbf{2 . 1 6}$ (25ip, 6er)...has allowed $\mathbf{3}$ leadoff HR (Pit's Adam Frazier, Chi's Kyle Schwarber, Cle's Francisco Lindor)...in the 7-5 loss on $6 / 23$ at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record 9 strikeouts through the first $\mathbf{3}$ innings of a game (Mil's Corbin Burnes, $3 / 31$ vs StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available... retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the franchise record for strikeouts to begin a game (Robert Stephenson, $8 / 25 / 17$ vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by Travis Shaw's HR leading off the third inning...missed the entire 2017 season with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 48 starts since he returned from those injuries is 16-16, 4.47.

## RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer on Tue at Sea will make his eighth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...in Wed's $8-5$ win vs Phi made his first start on 3 days' rest since September 2018...took a 2-hitter and a 5-0 lead into the fifth inning but then allowed a pair of 2-run HR, to pinch hitter Logan Morrison and to J.T. Realmuto...became the victim of a blown save when pinch hitter Jay Bruce homered off Michael Lorenzen in the seventh inning tied it at 5-5...has recorded 191.2 innings and 228 strikeouts, both career highs...is his second consecutive 200-strikeout season and his third career 30-start season...ranks among the Major League leaders in innings pitched (191.2, 2nd; Justin Verlander 200.00) and strikeouts (228, fourth)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in strikeouts (449), 13th in ERA (3.46), and ninth in innings pitched (367.0)...in 2018 was an American League All-Star, finished fifth in the Cy Young Award voting, ranked second in the AL in ERA (2.21) and allowed the fewest HR per 9 innings in the league (.0462)...in his $5-2$ win on $8 / 9$ vs Cubs, in his Great American Ball Park debut as a Red recorded 11 strikeouts...in his career has 27 apps with at least 10 strikeouts, including 8 this season.

When he went on the injured list had a 6 -game hitting streak ( $8-22, .364,32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 3rbi, . 636slg, . 440obp) and a 13 -game on-base streak (.261ba, . 386 obp)...both streaks were snapped in his first appearance after he was reinstated ( $0-5,8 / 27$ at Mia). Beginning $5 / 8$ made his last 89 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, $5 / 7$ at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on $8 / 9$ off Yu Darvish. From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
His first-inning double on $8 / 10$ off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865 th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864).
