

ATLANTA BRAVES (29-19) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (24-28) May 25, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - GAME #53/HOME #26 RHP REYNALDO LOPEZ (2-1, 1.54 ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELLER (5-3, 3.84 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...scored a season-high 11 runs last night to snap their brief two-game losing streak...Have gone 4-2 in their last six games...Have played in 13 games decided by one or two runs in their last 20 contests... Have played in 19 one-run games, which are tied with the Cubs for the most in all of MLB... Are tied with the Phillies and Cubs for the most wins (10) in one-run games in all of MLB...Have gone 5-2 in extra innings; the third-most wins in MLB behind the Guardians and Marlins with six apiece...Have hit 19 home runs against left-handed pitchers, which are tied for the third-most in MLB along with the Athletics and Phillies (the Orioles rank first with 24 followed by the Guardians with 20)...Have gone 15-0 this season when Last recording 10-plus hits; the only undefeated team in the Majors in such games and a club record for the longest such streak to start a season, surpassing the 1939 club that started 14-0 when recording Las

10-plus hits to start the season.

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller allowed two runs in 6.0 innings Sunday at Wrigley Field, giving him 41 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today...It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8, 2012, to August 10, 2013.

MITCH IN MAY: Mitch Keller brings a 1.29 ERA (21.0ip/3er) into today in his three starts this month...That's tied for the seventhlowest ERA among all pitchers in MLB with at least 20.0 innings pitched...Atlanta's Chris Sale has the lowest ERA (0.36) among pitchers with at least 20.0 innings.

FROM LAST NIGHT: Bailey Falter had his career-best scoreless streak of 19.2 innings come to an end last night after surrendering a home run to Ronald Acuna Jr. with one out in the eighth inning (it was the longest streak by a Pirates lefthander since Francisco Liriano had a 20.0 inning streak from August 31 to September 17, 2014)....Falter comes into today with the fifth-lowest batting average against (.206) and 10th-best ERA (3.55) among all left-handed pitchers in the National League.

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales recorded a career-high four RBI last night, which was the third straight game for a Pirate to knock in four runs (also Bryan Reynolds and Joey Bart)... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked just the third time since 1920 that the Pirates have had a player record four-plus RBI in three consecutive days...Prior to last night, it also happened in five straight days from September 12-16, 1978 (Dave Parker, Bill Robinson, Phil Garner, Phil Garner, Dave Parker) and in four straight games from August 2-4, 1928 (Glenn Wright, Glenn Wright and George Grantham and Glenn Wright).

OLIVARES ON THE BASES: Edward Olivares extended his on-base streak to 10 games last night after going 3-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored...During his current 10-game streak, Olivares is hitting .353 (12-for-34) with two doubles, two home runs and eight RBI... Connor Joe and Oneil Cruz have the longest on-base streaks by a MOST HITS Pirate this year at 11 games.

Roberto Clemente KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen Honus Wagner comes into today two hits shy of 1600 as a member of the Pirates, Paul Wanei which ranks 12th all-time in team history...His next game will also Max Carey be his 1500th as a member of the Pirates, which ranks 10th in Pie Traynor team history...Since May 11, McCutchen ranks seventh among all Lloyd Waner National League players in batting (.354), third in runs scored (12),

tied for fourth in hits (17), fifth in OBP (.456), tied for fourth in slugging (.625) and third in OPS (1.081).

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Since last Thursday, Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded a 2.55 ERA (49.1ip/14er) and .201 batting average against...The starting rotation's 2.55 ERA since May 16 is the fourth-lowest in MLB during that time behind the Yankees (0.95), Royals (1.81) and Guardians (2.45).

May 25, 1935: The Pirates defeated the Boston Braves 11-7 at Forbes Field behind five RBI by Tommy Thevenow and three RBI by Pep Young. Babe Ruth hit the last three home runs of his career while collecting six RBI. Ruth connected once off Red Lucas and twice off Guy Bush. The third homer – and final one of his career – cleared the roof in right field at Forbes Field.
