RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals conclude their three game Easter weekend series in Detroit this evening as they look to prevent a series sweep following 4-0 and 11-6 losses on Friday & Saturday...the Cardinals (4-4) went 4-2 on their season-opening homestand, going 2-1 against both Tampa Bay and the NY Mets...St. Louis is currently on its 1st roadtrip (0-2 at DET, WSH-3) of the season...the Cardinals were 34-47 in road games last season, losing each of their final four road contests...playing their 135th regular season of play in the National League, the Cardinals last winning season on the road came in 2021 (45-36) when they won their final 11 road games.

ROSTER MOVE: The Cardinals announced prior to tonight's game that RHP **Chris Roycroft** has been optioned to Memphis (AAA) and LHP **Jared Shuster** (#68) was selected from the Memphis roster...the team will announce a corresponding roster move to to make room for Shuster on MLB 40-player roster this afternoon.

EASTER SUNDAY: The Cardinals are 31-29 (17-16 on the road) all-time in 60 games played on Easter Sunday... St. Louis has lost its last five Easter Sunday games (2021-15), which have all been played on the road ... The only time the Cardinals have played an Interleague game on Easter was in 2017, a 9-3 loss to the Yankees at Yankee Stadium ... LHP **Bunny Hearn** pitched in seven games for the Cardinals from 1910-11, but he never appeared for the club on Easter.

A CARDINALS EASTER: After sunrise (**Nathan**) **Church** services, the Cardinals celebrate the Easter (**Matt**) **Holliday** today knowing (**Jack**) **Spring** has sprung bringing (**Jake & Ben**) **Flowers**. Marshmallow **Chick** (**Hafey**) are part of the Easter Egg (**Ron/Randy**) **Hunt**, as the Easter **Bunny** (**Hearn**) has left (**Alvin**) **Dark** chocolate **Rabbit** (**Maranville**) on his (**Johnny**) **Hopp** through the ballpark.

COOL CUSTOMER: Colorado native **Kyle Leahy** has two appearances in temperatures 45 degrees and below, both scoreless, both coming at Pittsburgh on consecutive days at PNC Park in 2025. Threw 1.2 innings on 4/9/25 (38 degrees) with three strikeouts and 1.0 inning on 4/10/25 (39 degrees) with two strikeouts. He's allowed only one baserunner on a walk to Jack Suwinski. Leahy and **JoJo Romero** lead all active Cardinals with two appearances in temps of 45 degrees or below. **Adam Wainwright** holds the Cardinals record with eight; Cardinals announcer **Brad Thompson** is T-3rd with five.

BIG FLY GUY: With his 1st career grand slam and a career-high 5 RBI yesterday, **Jordan Walker** hit the longest HR (459 ft) by a Cardinal since **Pedro Pagés'** 462 ft blast against the Dodgers on 8/16/24...Walker's slam matched **Miguel Cabrera** for the 8th longest HR in the history (2000-26) of Comerica Park (Sarah Langs).

TAKING YOUR BASE THE HARD WAY: The Cardinals reached base via HBP five times yesterday, as Pedro Pagés (2), Iván Herrera, JJ Wetherholt and Ramon Urías each were plunked...it was the 1st time the Cardinals were HBP five times in a game since 8/23/17 vs. San Diego.

TOP GUN: **Jordan Walker** nailed Javier Baez at the plate in 3rd inning on Friday with his 100.6 MPH strike from RF - his 2nd throw of 100+ MPH this season to lead all MLB outfielders, including an MLB-best 102.0 MPH throw on 3/29 vs. TB; CF **Oniel Cruz** of PIT has a 101.1 MPH throw...Jordan recorded his 2nd OF assist of the series & season in yesterday's game

DETROIT CONNECTIONS

Lars Nootbaar made his MLB debut vs. Detroit (June 22, 2021)...Tripled off **Matt Manning** for his first MLB hit (June 23, 2021).

Tigers Hitting Coach **Michael Brdar** was originally selected by St. Louis in the 36th round of the 2017 MLB draft...played the 2017 minor league season with the GCL Cardinals.

Jack Flaherty was selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#34) of the 2014 MLB Draft...pitched seven seasons with the Cardinals (2017-23)...traded to Baltimore at the 2023 MLB Trade deadline for INF **César Prieto**, RHP **Zack Showalter**, and LHP **Drew Rom** (Aug 1, 2023).

Matt Vierling was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College High School in St. Louis...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 30th round of the 2015 MLB draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Notre Dame...attended the 2013 World Series at Busch Stadium.

Cardinals Hall of Famers **Vince Coleman** (1997) and **Édgar Rentería** (2008) each played parts of one season in Detroit.

Cardinals Sr. Director of Communications **Brian Bartow** is a native of Battle Creek Mich...graduated from Ferris State University in Big Rapids, Mich.

Tigers Special Asst. **Jim Leyland** spent six seasons (2000-05) as a scout for the Cardinals, scouting NL clubs from Pittsburgh and AL clubs from Cleveland.

2006 World Series: The Cardinals secured a play-off berth on the final day of the regular season by winning the NL Central and later capturing the 10th World Championship in history, topping the Tigers, 4-1...the Cardinals won the Fall Classic with the fewest regular-season wins during a full season in MLB history (83)...**David Eckstein** was named MVP...**Tony La Russa** joined **Sparky Anderson** (Reds & Tigers) as only the second manager to win the World Series with teams in both leagues.

1968 World Series: The Tigers overcame a 3-1 deficit and defeated the defending World Series champion Cardinals, 4-3, for their first championship since 1945...LHP **Mickey Lolich** hurled three complete-game victories (1.67 ERA) to earn MVP...Gibson won two games and set World Series records by striking out 17 in Game 1 and 35 in the Series...**Lou Brock** batted .464 and stole seven bases...**Tim McCarver** and **Mike Shannon** each homered and played all seven games.

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** was born in Highland Park, Mich...originally selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#10) of the 1967 MLB Draft from Southfield (Mich.) High School...attended the University of Michigan and Wayne State in his offseasons.

Tigers Bullpen Catcher **Chris Chinea** was drafted by St. Louis in the 17th round in 2015...played five seasons in the Cardinals organization (2015-19).

1934 World Series: The "Gas House Gang" won the NL pennant on the final day of the season, then defeated Detroit in the World Series, 4-3, for their third championship in eight years...**Dizzy** and **Paul Dean** each won two games over the Tigers...The final game of the Series, won 11-0 by the Cardinals, was marked by **Commissioner Kenesaw Landis'** order to eject **Ducky Medwick** from the game; Medwick slid hard into Tigers 3B **Marv Owen** in the 6th inn., infuriating Detroit fans that they bombarded Medwick with empty bottles, fruit, vegetables, and debris when he took his position in left field in the bottom of the inning. Landis removed Medwick to halt the disturbance...1934 was the last World Series in which both teams were led by player-managers (**Frankie Frisch & Mickey Cochrane**).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Tonight marks his 2nd start of the season (3rd career) and 100th career appearance. First career start in a National Televised Primetime Game.
- His first 97 appearances were as a relief pitcher following his Major League debut on July 7, 2023. First start came at Chicago (NL) on Sept. 28, 2025.
- Started 72-of-89 games over his first four professional seasons (2018-19, 2021-22).
- Has allowed 10 home runs in his 99 career outings, the fewest by a Cardinal through his first 99 career games since **Génesis Cabrera** allowed eight homers from 2019-21 and fewest by a St. Louis right-hander since **Jordan Hicks** gave up three HRs from 2018-19.
- Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinals pitcher since Jordan Hicks (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.**

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, March 30 vs. Mets): L, 4-2: 5.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 2 BB, 1 SO; 79 pitches.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED...: Took the loss in his first career home start vs. NYM (3/30) allowing four runs over a career-high 5.0 innings and 79 pitches.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

NL Reliever Ranks: Innings Pitched (85.0, 1st), Batters Faced (354, 1st), Strikeouts (79, 8th).

MULTI-INNING MAGIC: Spent the entire season with St. Louis and led MLB with 32 relief appearances of at least 1.1 innings, the most by a Cardinals reliever since **John Frascatore** had 32 such appearances in 1998.

INNINGS EATER: Pitched an NL-high 85.0 innings as a reliever, the most by a Cardinals relief pitcher since **Manny Aybar** tossed 93.1 innings of relief in 1999. His 61 relief appearances were also the most among Cardinals right-handed pitchers.

TAKE A WHIFF: Became the first Cardinals reliever since **Tyler Lyons** (2017) to strike out at least seven batters in 3.2 IP or fewer on 7/22 at Colorado and the 6th to do so in franchise history, along with **Dave LaPoint** (1983), **Doug Bair** (1982), **Bobby Shantz** (1963) and **Dizzy Dean** (1934). His seven K's were tied for the third most among NL relievers in 2025, behind only CHC's Ben Brown and ATL's Chris Sale, who both had nine.

SPECIAL TRIBUTE: His career-high 7 strikeout performance on 7/22 at Coors Field came on the same day he learned of the passing of his grandmother. Kyle often-times attended Rockies games as a child with his grandparents.

LET'S GET STARTED: Made his first career MLB start in the season finale on 9/28 at CHC, working 3.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, no walks and one strikeout, his first start since 7/29/23 with Triple-A Memphis vs. Iowa (Cubs).

VERSATILITY: Became the first Cardinals pitcher to make at least 62 appearances and at least one start since **Jeff Fassero** (62 G, 6 GS) in 2003 and the first Cardinals right-hander to do so since **Manny Aybar** (65 G, 1 GS) in 1999.

OUT OF THE GATE: Allowed a combined three runs through his first 15 appearances across March/April for a 1.47 ERA (3 ER/18.1 IP) that led the team (min. 10.0 IP) and led all NL relievers with a .086 opp. batting average (5-58) in March/April that was the lowest by a Cardinals pitcher since **Todd Worrell** posted a .059 mark (2-34) in 1992.

STREAKING: Compiled a career-high, 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 21-May 20 that was the second-longest streak of the year by a Cardinals reliever, trailing only **Matt Svanson** (15.2 IP, 7/29-8/21).

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: Generated eight double plays as a relief pitcher (9 total) to lead the St. Louis relief corps. and T-8th among NL relievers.

UNDER THE HOOD: Ranked in the 96th percentile in extension at 7.2 ft., and in the 93rd percentile with 9 runs prevented via breaking ball run value, which measures the effectiveness of a pitch by calculating the run impact of every event, factoring in count, runners on base, and outs.

CAREER:

- Graduated from Erie (Colo.) High School. Named Boulder County Player of the Year and was selected to play at the High School Futures Game at Coors Field.
- Played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction, Colo., going 22-2 with a 3.13 ERA (204.1 IP), 188 strikeouts and six complete games.
- Allowed nine home runs to 852 total batters faced while pitching in high altitude (Grand Junction is 4,583 ft above sea level).
- Posted a 13-0 record with a 1.41 ERA during his sophomore season, earning First Team All-American, First Team Academic All-American, and was the South Central Regional Tournament MVP.
- Pitched two summers for the Waterloo Bucks of the collegiate summer Northwoods League (2016-17).
- His father, Tim Leahy, played college basketball at Kansas State University.
- His uncle, Thomas Leahy, pitched in the Braves organization (1991-93) advancing to Durham (High-A).

LEAHY VS. DETROIT:

- Has taken the loss in relief in both of his two career relief appearances vs. the Tigers; one in 2024 and one in 2025.
- Allowed a run in the top of the 9th at Busch Stadium in his last outing on May 20, 2025, as **Riley Greene** doubled in **Zach McKinstry** to give the Tigers the lead and 5-4 win.
- In his only appearance at Comerica Park, allowed a run in relief of starting pitcher **Steven Matz** in Game 2 of a doubleheader (4/30/24), as the Tigers turned a 5-4 deficit into a 7-5 lead and 11-6 win.
