METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Monday...On Sunday, the team defeated the Mariners, 7-3, in the Little League Classic in Williamsport, PA... The Mets have won back-to-back games after dropping three straight...New York hits the road for a six-game trip against the Nationals (three games) and Braves (three games).

DP VS. D.C.: David Peterson will be making his 14th career appearance (11th start) against Washington tonight...The Mets have gone 12-1 in games Peterson has pitched against the Nationals...The southpaw has pitched to a 6-1 record with a 2.64 ERA (19 ER/64.2 IP) vs. the Nats in his career...He last faced Washington on June 11 at Citi Field where he threw his first career complete game shutout (9.0 IP, 6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Became the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He was the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT).

LIN-SANITY: Congrats to Francisco Lindor who was named the National League Player of the Week presented by Chevrolet...Lindor earned his fifth career honor and third with the Mets following awards on August 26 of last season and May 31, 2022...He is one of 38 players to win multiple awards in each league...It is the second honor for New York this season, with Lindor joining his teammate Pete Alonso, who won on June 9...The 31-year-old hit .560 (14-25) with three homers, seven RBI, three doubles, three walks, seven runs, two stolen bases, a 1.040 SLG and a .607 OBP in six games...The Puerto Rico native led the Majors in batting average, OBP, OPS (1.647), hits and total bases (26)...He was tied for first in extra-base hits (6), ranked second in slugging, tied for third in homers and tied for fifth in runs scored.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: In 15 games this month, the Mets are batting .265/333/462 with 26 doubles, 25 home runs, 79 RBI and 50 walks...They rank fifth in the majors with a .265 AVG and seventh with a .333 OBP...Over the last seven games, the team is batting .327/381/580 with 47 runs, 17 doubles, 15 homers, 47 RBI, 22 walks and a .961 OPS.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 15 games this month...He is batting 15-55 (.273) with 12 runs, five homers, nine RBI, 12 walks, five steals, a .406 OBP and a .545 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 96 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With four more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

OUCH: Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 66 times this season which the fourth-most in the majors...Alonso's 98 times being hit by a pitch are the most in franchise history.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 76-75 all-time at Nationals Park.

30 ROCK: On Saturday, Juan Soto hit his 30th home run this season...Soto joined Frank Thomas, Dave Kingman, Gary Carter, Bernard Gilkey, Robin Ventura, Mike Cameron, Carlos Delgado and Pete Alonso as the only players in franchise history to reach the 30-home run mark in their first season with the club...Soto reached the 30-homer mark in 120 games with the team...He joined Alonso (39), Yoenis Céspedes (34), Delgado (34) and Kingman (34) as the only players in franchise history to total 30 homers through their first 120 games with the franchise.

100 GRAND BAR: Pete Alonso has reached the 100-RBI plateau this season...His four seasons of 100+ RBI are the second-most in Mets history behind David Wright's five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 100 RBI are third in MLB.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Brandon Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees, Angels and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 30 home runs and 20 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 24 home runs and 20 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not record a decision on August 13 vs. Atlanta despite allowing six earned runs for the first time in a game since May 15, 2023 at Washington and for the sixth time in his 124 career outings...His first 3.0 innings were scoreless before allowing six ER in the fourth...Marked his shortest start since August 4, 2023 (3.0 IP)...His 3.1 innings snapped a career-high six game span of 6.0+ IP...Allowed five walks in a game for the second time this season (also: April 6 vs. TOR)...The Mets have lost each of his last three starts at home after winning his first 10 home starts of the season...He has allowed six runs over his last two starts after combining to allow seven runs in his previous five starts (7/3-8/1).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Has pitched 5.0 or more in 19 of his 23 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 15 of those starts...His 19 such starts are the second-most on the team (most: Clay Holmes - 20) and his 15 such starts of 6.0 or more innings is the most on the team (next: Homes - 7)...He is one of nine left-handed starters this season to record at least 15 starts with 6.0+ IP, joining Framber Valdez, Garrett Crochet, Cristopher Sánchez, Robbie Ray, Tarik Skubal, Matthew Boyd, MacKenzie Gore and Max Fried...He joins Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 19 starts of 5.0+ IP and his 15 starts of 6.0+ IP are his most in a single season (previous: 17 starts of 5.0+ IP in 2024 and 12 starts 6.0IP+ in 2024).

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over a career-high 23 starts this season, has gone 7-5 with a 3.30 ERA (50 ER/136.1 IP), 50 walks and 117 strikeouts...His ERA is the lowest by a Mets southpaw through 23 starts of a season since Johan Santana's 3.20 ERA through 23 starts of the 2010 season...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of his 23 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in nine starts...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59, second in NL), tied for sixth in opponent GIDP (16, third in NL) and seventh in groundball percentage (55.7, fifth in NL)...Is also seventh in the NL in opponents' SLG (.343) and 13th in ERA.

DP vs. D.C.: Will be making his 14th career appearance (11th start) against Washington tonight...The Mets have gone 12-1 in games Peterson has pitched against the Nationals...The southpaw has pitched to a 6-1 record with a 2.64 ERA (19 ER/64.2 IP) against the Nationals in his career...Last pitched against Washington on June 11 at Citi Field where he threw his first career complete game shutout (9.0 IP, 6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...In five career starts at Nationals Park, has gone 2-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 ER/29.2 IP), nine walks and 19 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Has made 10 road outings this season, eight being quality starts...Despite his eight total QS, the Mets have gone 2-8 in his road starts compared to a 10-3 record when he starts at home...Has combined to go 2-4 with a 3.77 ERA (25 ER/59.2 IP), 25 walks and 52 strikeouts on the road this year...In 22 road starts since his start to the 2024 season, Peterson has gone 8-5 with a 3.13 ERA (46 ER/132.1 IP), 51 walks and 102 strikeouts...He has recorded quality starts in 16 of those games, including 13 of his last 17 (since August 3, 2024)...Has allowed two runs or less in 16 of those 22 road outings and one or zero earned runs in seven...Had six straight quality starts to open the season on the road, which were the most by a Mets starter since Noah Syndergaard's six such starts from April 5 - June 8, 2016.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 35 of his 44 starts, going 17-8 with a 3.11 ERA (89 ER/257.1 IP), 96 walks and 218 strikeouts...26 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 27-17 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just five runs in the first inning, which is the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is second in HR/9.0 IP (0.59, first in the NL), fifth in groundball percentage (53.2, fourth in NL), sixth in opponents' SLG (.346, third in NL) and 11th in ERA (fourth in NL).

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: Has 581 career strikeouts, the ninth-most by a franchise southpaw...John Franco is next on the list with 592...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .222/.272/.282 slash line (26-117) and has allowed just one home run to 126 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is third in groundball percentage (68.4) and is tied for fifth in strikeouts (38)...Among NL southpaws facing lefties, he is sixth in opponents' SLG and opponents' OPS (.554), eighth in opponents' OBP, and 10th in opponents' BA...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded 14 quality starts in 23 total outings this season, including 12 of his last 17 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from 7/3-8/1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 26 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 24 of them coming in his last 39 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 10 pitchers (one of five in NL) to record at least 24 quality starts and one of four left-handers to do so.

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of seven (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is tied for the best in the NL and the second-best in the majors behind Will Warren (8)...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 31 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen and Max Fried are next on the list at 22...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Has set new career highs in innings pitched and starts this season...Was selected to the All-Star team for the first time in his career in 2025...He was the first Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 35-29 with a 3.90 ERA (256 ER/590.1 IP), 247 walks and 581 strikeouts in 124 games (108 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
