METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Mariners, 3-1, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets are 3-14 in their last 17 games...Today, the Mets and Mariners head to Williamsport, PA for the MLB Little League Classic...The Mets wrapped up a five-game homestand (2-3) against the Braves (1-2) and Mariners (1-1) for two games.

LITTLE LEAGUE CLASSIC: The Mets and Mariners will play in tonight's Little League Classic at Bowman Field in Williamsport, PA...The Mets will participate in a variety of activities and interact with LLBWS players at the Little League Complex...Today, marks the second time the Mets will participate in the Little League Classic...In 2018, the Mets faced the Phillies in Williamsport and defeated the Phillies, 8-2, at Bowman Field.

HERE COMES THE 27TH MAN: Tonight, INF/OF Luisangel Acuña will serve as the 27th man for the Mets...In 78 games this season with the Mets, Acuña has a .239 (38-159) average with seven doubles, seven RBI, 26 runs and 12 stolen bases...The 23-year-old was named NL Rookie of the Month for March/April.

WILLIAMSPORT METS: From 1964-1967, Williamsport was the Mets Double-A affiliate in the Eastern League...Jerry Koosman, Jon Matlack, Nolan Ryan and Ron Swoboda all played in Williamsport before the Miracle Mets of 1969.

METS-LLBWS CONNECTION: The following former Mets participated in the Little League Baseball World Series: Billy Connors (1954), Gary Sheffield (1980), Derek Bell (1980-81), Jason Bay (1990), Lastings Milledge (1997), Todd Frazier (1998), Ruben Tejada (2001), Michael Conforto (2004) and Gavin Cecchini (2006).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Yesterday, RHP Nolan McLean threw 5.1 scoreless innings, allowed two hits, struck out eight and earned the win in his Major League debut...McLean became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to record eight or more strikeouts in their debut and joined Collin McCugh and Matt Harvey as the only players in franchise history to throw 5.0 or more scoreless innings with eight strikeouts...The right-hander became the 26th pitcher to earn the win in his Major League debut and the first since Kodai Senga (4/2/23 at MIA).

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 14 games this month...He is batting 15-53 (.283) with 12 runs, five homers, eight RBI, nine walks, four steals, a .391 OBP and a .566 SLG...Additionally, Soto has hit safely in a season-high nine straight games and has a 1.126 OPS during that span...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 93 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With seven more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

30 ROCK: On Saturday, Juan Soto hit his 30th home run of the season...Soto joined Frank Thomas, Dave Kingman Gary Carter, Bernard Gilkey, Robin Ventura, Mike Cameron, Carlos Delgado and Pete Alonso as the only players in franchise history to reach the 30-home run mark in their first season with the club...Soto reached the 30-homer mark in 120 games with the team...He joined Alonso (39), Yoenis Céspedes (34), Delgado (34) and Kingman (34) as the only players in franchise history to total 30 homers through their first 120 games with the franchise.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso has reached base three or more times in 27 games this season, tied with Kyle Tucker for the third-most such games in the NL and the fifth-most such games in the majors...Has reached base four or more times in 39 career games, which is the seventh-most such games in franchise history...With runners in scoring position this season, is batting .333 (42-126) with nine doubles, 13 home runs, 73 RBI, 25 walks and a 1.149 OPS...Since August 1, he has gone 7-16 with a 1.359 OPS and 14 RBI with runners in scoring position

100 GRAND BAR: Yesterday, Pete Alonso reached the 100-RBI plateau with an RBI double in the seventh...His four seasons of 100+ RBI are the second-most in Mets history behind David Wright's five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 100 RBI are tied with Cal Raleigh for the second-most in MLB.

OUCH: Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 66 times this season which is tied for the third-most in the majors...Alonso's 98 times being hit by a pitch are the most in franchise history.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Brandon Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees, Angels and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Yesterday, Francisco Lindor recorded his 20th stolen base of the season...He became the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons...On Friday, the shortstop hit his seventh lead-off home run of the season, tied with Curtis Granderson (2015, 2016) for the most in a single season in franchise history...His nine career lead-off home runs as a Met are the fourth-most in franchise history behind Granderson (21), José Reyes (21) and Brandon Nimmo (14)...He also hit a two-run homer in the fourth...Over his last five games, Lindor has hit .550 (11-20) with three home runs, two doubles and six RBI.

ALVY WAY BACK: Since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on July 21, Francisco Alvarez has reached base in 15 of his 17 starts...In 20 games since July 21, has batted .293/388/603 (17-58) with 12 runs, four doubles, one triple, four home runs, 12 RBI and nine walks.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 39 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It is the second-longest such streak since caught stealing was first tracked (AL in 1920 and NL in 1951), trailing only the Red Sox (40, 2013-14)...It is tied with the 2013 Red Sox (39) for the longest single-season streak in Major League history...They lead the majors with a 90.7% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history (previous: 88.7% in 2023) and if it holds, it would be the highest stolen base rate in Major League history (the 2020 Athletics currently hold the record with 89.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...The club's current streak of 50 straight games without getting caught is the fifth-longest such streak Major League history

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a season-high-tying five runs over a season-low-tying 3.2 innings in the Mets' 13-5 victory over Atlanta on August 12 at Citi Field...Issued five walks, one short of his season high and struck out four.

WELCOME BACK TO WILLIAMSPORT: Tonight, Holmes will pitch in the Little League Classic for the second time in his career...Last season, Holmes allowed one run and struck out three over 1.0 inning in relief vs. Detroit with the Yankees.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over his last seven starts, opposing batters are 13-37 with four doubles and 19 RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .200 (20-100) average with runners in scoring position, the seventh-best mark in the NL and tied for the 16th-best mark in the majors (min. 100 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Holmes is one of eight pitchers to allow one or zero runs with runners in scoring position (min. 100 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.3% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.2% clip and Andre Pallante's 64.5% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)...This season, Holmes ranks fifth in the majors with a 57.7% groundball rate (min. 250 BF).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last 17 starts, Holmes has allowed 12 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career...Among qualifiers, Holmes ranks ninth in the NL and 16th in the majors with a 0.88 HR/9 rate.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (126.0), strikeouts (101) and wins (9)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 10-8 with a 4.15 ERA (65 ER/141.0 IP) in 27 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest

streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
