**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!:** With anticipated high attendance figures this week due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Dodgers, 4-3, last night...New York will play 12 of their next 18 games at home...The Mets are 65-13 when scoring first this season... New York is now 29-8-3 in 40 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (3-2), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (0-1) and Nationals (three games).

**QUEENS PUBLIC LIBRARY BACKPACK DISTRIBUTION:** Earlier today, Mr. and Mrs. Met visited the Queens Public Library at Elmhurst as part of the QPL Back to School Fair... The Mets Wives, along with Owner and President of the Amazin' Mets Foundation, Alex Cohen and wife of Manager Buck Showalter, Angela Showalter, helped distribute backpacks filled with brand-new school supplies provided by the Amazin' Mets Foundation, as well as ticket vouchers to a future Mets game to all of the students in attendance.

**QUEENS DELEGATION PROCLAMATION:** As part of the pre-game ceremonies ahead of tonight's game, elected officials including members of the City Council representing districts in Queens presented a Council of New York City Proclamation to Mets President, Sandy Alderson, to celebrate the Club's 60th Anniversary.

**DON'T LOSE THRICE, IT'S ALRIGHT:** The Mets are 35-12 (.745) in the game following a loss...Their 35-12 record is the best in the majors...Since 1920, only the 1929 Philadelphia Athletics (37-9, .804) and the 2005 St. Louis Cardinals (49-13, .790) had better records immediately following a loss...Courtesy of *Sportradar*.

**LET'S NOT GO STREAKING:** The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The team is seeking to avoid a three-game losing streak, which would match the longest of the season...They lost three games from June 26-29 and from July 17-23...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games...The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

**TOTAL deGROMINATION:** In his first month back in over a year, Jacob deGrom is among the MLB leaders in several categories...He is tied for first with 46 strikeouts and leads the majors with a 0.55 WHIP and .383 opponent OPS...Ranks second with a .139 opponent's batting average and a 14.11 K/9 rate in August...He also joins Corbin Burnes (2021) as the only pitcher ever with 40 or more strikeouts and a WHIP of 0.55 or lower through a his first five starts of any season.

**HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY:** Nearly three-quarters of deGrom's starts have lasted at least 6.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer allowed...He has recorded 150 quality starts in 203 career outings (74 percent)...Tom Seaver (155) is the only pitcher with more QS through 203 starts since the ER was first tracked in 1913...Additionally, deGrom has allowed one or no runs in 99 of his 203 starts (49 percent)...No pitcher in the history of the game has more starts like that through 203 career games.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha socked his 100th career home run last night...Over his last 14 games, Canha is batting .386 (17-44) with nine runs, eight doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, two walks with a .449 OBP and an .841 SLG...He is batting .298/.400/.436 with 20 extra-base hits against right-handed pitching this year.

**MARTE PARTY:** Starling Marte is 17-50 (.340) with eight runs, four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, three walks, three steals with a .411 OBP and a .640 SLG over his last 13 games...He is batting .308 (66-214) with 38 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, nine home runs, 29 RBI, 12 walks with a .359 OBO, a .528 SLG and a .887 OPS in 56 games at home... This compares to a .279/.336/.416 slashline with a .752 OPS in 56 road contests.

**AUGUSTUS BLOOM:** The Mets are 18-11 in August...Their 18 wins this month are the third-most in the majors...The team's 18 wins this month are the most since they recorded 20 in 2015...The franchise record for wins in August is 21 accomplished by the 1969 and 1986 teams...Jeff McNeil has recorded 42 hits this month, which is the most in the majors...His 42 hits are the most in a calendar month for his career, passing his previous high set in June, 2019...Additionally, his 42 hits in August are tied for third-most in Mets history...Edgardo Alfonzo in 1998 and Keith Hernandez in 1986 also recorded 42 hits in August...John Olerud holds the franchise record with 45 hits in August of 1998, Wilson Ramos is second with 43 in August of 2019.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded 137 home runs in his career in 499 career games...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games...He is tied for fifth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons...This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

**EL JEFF-E:** McNeil is third in the majors in batting average this season with a .320 (133-415) mark...He is batting .396 (42-106) in August, which is the second-best average in the majors...In 28 games this month, he is batting .396/.425/.575 with 14 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and four walks...It's his highest average in any month of his career... In 35 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .363 (49-135) with 17 runs, 15 doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, five walks, a .392 OBP and a .541 SLG...His .363 batting average is fifth in the majors and fourth in the NL.

**CITI SLICKERS:** New York has lost consecutive games at home for the first time since they lost three straight on July 10 and July 23-24...New York has won 11 of their last 14 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 43-21 at Citi Field...They are fourth in the majors and second in National League with a .672 winning percentage at home...The team's .672 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.06 ERA with 181 walks and 627 strikeouts at Citi Field... The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

**STARTING OFF:** Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a 2.84 ERA (98 earned runs/310.1 innings) in 54 games with 333 strikeouts and 74 walks...The Dodgers are the only team with a better ERA (2.52) in that time frame...New York's 333 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.52 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.52 ERA from their starters.

**ON THE RECORD:** New York has won 82 games this season, second-most in the NL and third-most in the majors...Their .631 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 82-48 record through the team's first 130 games...Only the 1986 (87-43) team posted a better record through the first 129 games of the season.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets are 24-13 in the second-half...The team's 24 wins are tied for the third-most in the majors and their .649 winning percentage is third overall...The team is batting .269/.340/.433 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and in average and rank fourth in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 173-130 following the break.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 141 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

**PUTTING UP LUG-O'S:** Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 appearances... He has tossed 10.0 innings in that span, allowed seven hits, four walks, struck out 13 and posted a 0.90 ERA (one earned run/10.0 innings)...In 16 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.65 ERA (three earned runs/16.1 innings) with seven walks and 18 strikeouts.

**ONE AWAY:** Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 99 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 51.1 innings... He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history... Armando Benitez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.59 ERA (two earned runs/30.2 innings) with 15 hits, six walks and 61 strikeouts in 30 appearances since the start of June.

**BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS:** Díaz has struck out 50.0% of batters faced (99/198), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 51 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.36 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 28 saves, a 1.40 ERA (8 ER/51.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 16 walks...The Mets are 45-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG:** Díaz has only two runs in his last 32 outings dating back to June 22...He is 2-0 with 18 saves with a 0.55 ERA (two earned runs/32.2 innings) in that span, allowing 16 hits, seven walks and striking out 65...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards.

**M-V-PETE:** Pete Alonso has collected 25 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 11 of the Mets' 24 second-half wins.

### deGROM NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 87 pitches in 6.0 innings, recording his 150th career quality start, sixth-most in Mets history as New York defeated Colorado, 3-1...Allowed just one run on three hits with nine strikeouts and one walk, earning his third win of the season...Retired the first 13 batters faced...Has eight perfect bids 4.0 or more innings since 2014 tied with Madison Bumgarner and Justin Verlander for second most during that span...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

**HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY:** Nearly three-quarters of deGrom's starts have lasted at least 6.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer allowed...He has recorded 150 quality starts in 203 career outings (74 percent)...Tom Seaver (155) is the only pitcher with more QS through 203 starts since the ER was first tracked in 1913...Additionally, deGrom has allowed one or no runs in 99 of his 203 starts (49 percent)...No pitcher in the history of the game has more starts like that through 203 career games.

**AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH:** In his first month back in over a year, deGrom is among the MLB leaders in several categories...He is tied for first with 46 strikeouts and leads the majors with a 0.55 WHIP and .383 opponent OPS...Ranks second with a .139 opponent's batting average and a 14.11 K/9 rate in August.

**AGAINST THE DODGERS:** deGrom has a lifetime 2.87 ERA (20 ER/62.2 IP) against the Dodgers over 10 starts...The Dodgers are the only team in the NL that deGrom hasn't recorded a win against in the regular season (besides the Mets)...DeGrom did defeat the Dodgers twice in the 2015 NLDS (Games 1 and 5).

**I CAN ONLY COUNT TO THREE:** Enters tonight's start riding a 36-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer...Only two starters (plus Ryne Stanek, an opener) have had longer a streak...Jim Scott (1913-1914) had 39 straight starts with 3 ER or fewer allowed...Ray Washburn (1968-1970) had a 38-start streak...DeGrom can take sole possession of third place, passing Claude Osteen's 36-start streak (1965-1966) tonight.

**LIGHTS OUT:** Through his first five starts of 2022, deGrom struck out 46 batters and owns a 0.55 WHIP...Corbin Burnes (49 strikeouts, 0.55 WHIP last season) is the only other pitcher to have 46+ strikeouts and 0.55 WHIP through his first five starts of a season.

**SINCE 2020:** Has a 1.71 ERA (36 ER/189.1 IP) in 32 starts over the last three seasons...Has 296 strikeouts and 31 walks in that span...His ERA is the best in MLB (min. 162.0 IP) in that span by more than half a run...He also leads the majors in WHIP (0.70), K/9 (14.07) and K/BB ratio (9.55).

**IN deCITI:** Has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 35 starts in Queens, posting a 1.59 ERA (39 ER/220.2 IP) at home since May 1, 2019...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in his last 23 home starts dating back to 9/9/19...Has allowed one or zero runs in 17 of those starts...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.08 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

**THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE:** Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.95 ERA in 96 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.37 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.67 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only three other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.95 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.

**200 CLUB:** On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (11-7, 3.34)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched into the eighth inning for the third time this season (also, August 8 and June 14) going 7.1 innings...Allowed four runs on eight hits walking a season-low one batter and walking only one...Bassitt joins Taijuan Walker as the only Met with a start of 7.0 or more innings and one strikeout this season.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Bassitt has won four of his last five decisions...Prior to his last start, Bassitt had won four consecutive starts for the first time in his career...The last Met to win earn a win in four straight starts and allow two runs or fewer was Jacob deGrom (9/21/18 - 4/3/19)...A win in tomorrow's start would tie Bassitt with Carlos Carrasco for the longest win streak by a Mets starter this season with five wins in a six-game span.
