SAN DIEGO PADRES (5-6) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (7-4) April 8, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #12/Home #6 RHP Michael King (0-1, 3.38 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (1-0, 1.50 ERA)

THE PIRATES: picked up their sixth win in their last seven games with Tuesday's 7-1 victory vs. San Diego...Will wrap up this season-opening, six-game homestand with this afternoon's series finale against the Padres (they swept Baltimore from April 3-5) before departing for a three-game, weekend series against the Cubs at Wrigley Field.

SIGN HERE, PLEASE: Pittsburgh signed infielder Konnor Griffin to a nine-year contract extension this morning...The 19-year-old Griffin, who is rated by Baseball America and MLB Pipeline as the No. 1 prospect in baseball, is the third member of the current roster to sign a long-term contract extension, joining Bryan Reynolds in 2023 (eight years) and Mitch Keller in 2024 (five years).

GOING ANOTHER DIRECTION: Pittsburgh had 12 hits on Tuesday vs. San Diego, 10 of which were opposite-field hits...The only two hits that were not to the opposite field were singles by Konnor Griffin to third base (fifth inning) and left field (eighth inning).

KELLER ME GOOD: Mitch Keller will start for Pittsburgh in today's series/homestand finale vs. San Diego...His 84 career starts at PNC Park entering today are the second-most in stadium history, trailing Paul Maholm (100)...The 30-year-old Keller enters the start with 844 strikeouts, three shy of tying Sam Leever for 11th place on the franchise's all-time strikeouts list...His 844 strikeouts are the ninth-most among right-handed pitchers in team history.

AND WHEN I'M BACK IN CHICAGO: Pittsburgh will head to Chicago for a three-game series against the Cubs (Friday-Sunday) following today's game vs. San Diego...Six of the Pirates' seven games at Wrigley Field in 2025 were decided by one run (Pittsburgh picked up a 2-1, 10-inning win on June 13, as well as a 3-2 victory on August 15)...The Pirates will return to Chicago for a six-game road trip against the White Sox (Sept. 8-10) & Cubs (Sept. 11-13).

INSTANT IMPACT: Ryan O'Hearn reached base safely three times on Tuesday vs. San Diego after walking in the fourth inning and recording singles in both the sixth and eighth innings...He has reached base safely in each of his first 10 games with Pittsburgh, which includes hitting safely in nine of the 10 games and reaching base safely multiple times in nine of the 10 games...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, O'Hearn joined Ed Mensor (1912, 10 games), Possum Whitted (1919, nine games), Gus Suhr (1930, nine games) and Brian Giles (1999, nine games) as the only Pirates since at least 1900 to reach base safely multiple times in at least nine of their first 10 games with the organization.

SO(TO) COOL: Gregory Soto had a strikeout in a perfect eighth inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego and has 13 strikeouts (two hits allowed) through his first seven games (7.1ip) with the team...He and Angel Perdomo (2023) are the only Pirates relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 13 strikeouts and two or fewer hits allowed through their first seven games with the team.

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz extended his hitting streak to seven straight games with his two-run double off Nick Pivetta in the fifth inning on Tuesday vs. San Diego...He last hit safely in at least eight straight games from August 20-31, 2024, when he had a career-high, 11-game hitting streak...Cruz, who has four home runs and 12 RBI through his first 11 games of 2026, joined Gregory Polanco (2018) and Bryan Reynolds (2023) as the only Pirates during the 21st century to do that in their first 11 games of a year.

HE GETS ON BASE: Ryan O'Hearn has reached base safely in 19 straight games, dating back to last season on September 19 with San Diego at Chicago (AL), which trails only Los Angeles (NL)'s Shohei Ohtani (42 games) for the longest-active streak in Major League Baseball...It also matches his career-high on-base streak, which he set last season from May 14 [G2]-June 3 with Baltimore...O'Hearn, who has reached base safely 22 times in his first 10 games with the club, joined Brian Giles (1999, 23 times), Gregory Polanco (2014, 22 times) and John Nogowski (2021, 22 times) as the only Pirates during the Expansion Era (since 1961) to reach base safely at least 22 times through their first 10 games with the team...His 22 times reaching base safely are tied with Ohtani and Cincinnati's Sal Stewart for the most in the National League (also tied for the fourth-most in Major League Baseball).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 8, 2024: Pittsburgh defeated Detroit, 7-4, at PNC Park and improved to 9-2, marking its best 11-game start to a season since also starting 9-2 in 1992. Mitch Keller started and earned the win after allowing two runs and striking out nine Tigers in 6.0 innings. Bryan Reynolds hit a solo home run off Tyler Holton in the sixth inning and added a single off future teammate Joey Wentz in the eighth inning.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller earned his first win of the season in Pittsburgh's Home Opener on April 3 vs. Baltimore...He allowed two runs and struck out four batters over 6.0 innings, while Gregory Soto closed out the 5-4 win by earning his first save as a Pirate.

THE OPENING ACT: Keller started Pittsburgh's Home Opener for the second straight season, after also doing so last season on April 4 vs. New York (AL)...He became the first Pirates pitcher to start back-to-back Home Openers since Zach Duke in 2009 and 2010.

AGAINST THE PADRES: Keller is 2-5 with a 5.84 ERA (37.0ip/24er) in seven career starts against San Diego, including a 5.75 ERA (20.1ip/13er) in four starts here at PNC Park...He has lost three straight starts since last defeating the Padres on June 28, 2023.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half... Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller enters today with 844 career strikeouts...He is nine strikeouts shy of passing Rick Rhoden (852) for 10th place on Pittsburgh's all-time strikeouts list.

HOME SWEET HOME: Keller is currently PNC Park's all-time strikeouts leader (413)... He surpassed Paul Maholm (383) in a start last season on July 2 vs. St. Louis...His 84 games started at PNC Park are second in stadium history, behind Maholm (100 starts).

2025 IN REVIEW: Keller made his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster last season (he was the team's Opening Day starter during the 2023 and 2024 seasons)...He went 6-15 with a 4.19 ERA (176.1ip/82er) while making a career-high-tying 32 starts (also 2023)...His 32 starts were tied for the sixth-most among all National League pitchers.

COUNTING ON KELLER: Keller entered this year having pitched at least 150.0 innings in four straight seasons (since 2022)...The only other Pittsburgh pitcher in the 21st century to accomplish that was Paul Maholm (six consecutive seasons) from 2006-11.

CLOSE CALLS: Keller pitched in 15 one-run games during the 2025 season...The 15 such starts were the most by any Pirates pitcher since Paul Maholm (16 starts) in 2010.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: Keller had 17 quality starts in 2025, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (he had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it from 2012-13 and in 2015, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...Keller made his 30th start of 2025 on September 12 at Washington, marking his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts...He joined Maholm (2008-10) and Ian Snell (2006-08) as the only Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to accomplish that.

THIS AND THAT: The Pirates selected Keller out of Xavier (IA) High School in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...He was tabbed by Baseball America as the organization's No. 1 prospect prior to three consecutive seasons from 2018-20.
