CHICAGO CUBS (87-64) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (65-87) September 17, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #153/Home #78 LHP Matthew Boyd (13-8, 3.05 ERA) vs. RHP Johan Oviedo (2-0, 2.81 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have lost 10 of their last 11 games (since September 5 vs. Milwaukee), including a 4-1 loss on Tuesday vs. Chicago (NL)...Will host the Cubs for one more game before welcoming the Athletics to PNC Park for three games (Friday-Sunday) to round out the home portion of the 2025 schedule...Are 42-35 at PNC Park...Are 53-61 since Don

Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have at least one extra-base hit in 51 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 68 games, rank first) and their longest singleseason streak since June 1-August 14, 2019 (64 games)...Have played in an MLB-high 57 one-run games, their most since 2014 (60).

MATINEE DAY: Today marks Pittsburgh's final weekday matinee game here at PNC Park this year...The Pirates have won seven of their first nine such games, coming on April 9 vs. St. Louis, April 17 vs. Washington, May 21 vs. Cincinnati, June 11 vs. Miami, July 2 vs. St. Louis, July 23 vs. Detroit and August 20 vs. Toronto (their only losses came on May 1 vs. Chicago-NL and August 6 vs. San Francisco)...Their 16-6 (.727) record on Wednesdays is the third-best mark in Major League Baseball on any day of the week (minimum 10 games), trailing only New York (AL) on Thursdays (12-2, .857) and Chicago (NL) on Saturdays (19-6, .760)...The 16-6 record is their best mark on any day of the week (minimum 10 games) in a season since going 19-7 (.731) on Sundays in 2015.

SEE YOU NEXT YEAR: Pittsburgh will welcome the Athletics to PNC Park for three games from Friday-Sunday to conclude the home portion of the 2025 schedule...The only other time the Pirates played their last home series of a season vs. an American League team (since interleague play began in 1997) came from September 26-27, 2017, when they swept a two-game series vs.

Baltimore...This will be the fifth time they play the Athletics in Pittsburgh since interleague began (also 2002, 2013, 2019 and 2023).

SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: Today will be the 34th time the Pirates are opposed by a starting left-handed pitcher, the fewest in the National League and the sixth-fewest in Major League Baseball...Andrew McCutchen is 4-for-12 (.333) with two career home runs vs. Cubs starter Matthew Boyd, coming on August 8, 2017 at PNC Park (when Boyd was with Detroit) and June 14 at Wrigley Field.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz singled, walked and scored a run on Tuesday vs. Chicago (NL)...He has hit safely in seven consecutive starts (since September 7 vs. Milwaukee), going 8-for-26 (.308) in those starts...Over his last 17 games (since August 29 at Boston), Horwitz is 14-for-47 (.298) with four doubles, two home runs, four RBI, eight walks, eight runs scored and a .922 OPS.

CURVE COUNTRY: Double-A Altoona won the first game of its best-of-three division series in the Eastern League playoffs vs. Erie (Detroit), 11-5, on Tuesday at Peoples Natural Gas Field...Esmerlyn Valdez finished a triple shy of the cycle, going 3-for-4 with a

double, a home run, five RBI and three runs...The Curve would advance to the best-of-three championship series, where they would play the winner of the league's other division series between Binghamton (New York-NL) and Somerset (New York-AL), with a win at Erie's UPMC Park on Thursday or Friday.

TAKE A WALK: The Pirates have drawn at least one walk in 61 straight games (since July 7 at Kansas City)...That is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and their longest streak since a 72-gamer from May 6-July 30, 2024.

THIS JUSTIN: Justin Lawrence pitched 1.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday vs. Chicago (NL) and has now made 12 straight scoreless appearances (12.2ip), dating back to March 30 at Miami...The 12.2-inning scoreless streak is the longest of Lawrence's career and the longest active streak by a Pirates pitcher.

AGE: 27 **SIGNED:** Thru 2025 **HOW ACQUIRED:** From St. Louis in a four-player trade on August 1, 2022.

AS OF LATE: Oviedo allowed two runs on five hits and three walks (had five strikeouts) over 5.2 innings on September 11 at Baltimore, having a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 3-2 loss...Over his last five starts (since August 20 vs. Toronto), he has gone 2-0 with a 2.19 ERA (24.2ip/6er), 26 strikeouts and a .163 batting average against (14-for-86)... His 2.19 ERA in that span ranks 10th in the National League (minimum 24.0 innings).

THE MORE YOU JO: Oviedo has made five starts with Pittsburgh where he's pitched at least 5.0 innings, allowed two or fewer hits, one or zero runs and struck out at least five batters (last on August 20 vs. Toronto)...His five such starts since making his Pirates debut in 2022 are the second-most during that span, behind only Paul Skenes (seven).

AGAINST THE CUBS: Oviedo has made 10 career appearances (nine starts) against Chicago (his most appearances against any team)...He made his Major League debut in his start with St. Louis on August 19, 2020 (G2) at Wrigley Field, allowing two runs over 5.0 innings (had a no-decision in the Cardinals' 4-2 loss)...Oviedo's last start against the Cubs came on September 21, 2023 at Wrigley Field, when he pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and won an 8-6 decision...In two career starts against Chicago here at PNC Park, Oviedo is 1-1 with a 1.38 ERA (13.0ip/2er) and 10 strikeouts (zero walks issued).

ON THE FARM: Oviedo was optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis following Pittsburgh's win on August 4 vs. San Francisco...In two starts with the Indians (August 9 vs. Omaha and August 15 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre), he allowed four runs (three earned) while striking out 15 batters over his 8.2 innings of work before being recalled on August 20.

THE LONG ROAD BACK: Oviedo missed all of 2024 while recovering from right elbow surgery (December 6, 2023)...ln 2025 spring training, he was placed on the 60-day injured list on March 3 due to surgery recovery/a right lat strain...Oviedo returned to a Major League mound for the first time since September 27, 2023 at Philadelphia with his start on August 4 vs. San Francisco (he threw 43 pitches in his 1.0 inning of work).

ON THE MEND: On his rehab assignment, which was split between the rookie-level Florida Complex League Pirates, Low-A Bradenton, Double-A Altoona and Triple-A Indianapolis, Oviedo posted a 3.12 ERA (17.1ip/6er) and 21 strikeouts across six starts.

2023 IN REVIEW: Oviedo went 9-14 with a 4.31 ERA (177.2ip/85er) while making a team-high-tying 32 starts (also Mitch Keller) during the 2023 season...He had 15 starts where he allowed one or zero runs, tied with Miami's Braxton Garrett and Minnesota's Sonny Gray for the second-most starts in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (17)...Those 15 starts were also the most by any Pittsburgh pitcher in a season since Francisco Liriano in 2013 (Paul Skenes has 17 this year)...Oviedo's .237 batting average against was the eighth-lowest among all qualified pitchers in the National League...He had a career-high, 15.1-inning scoreless streak from April 3-14.

YOU COMPLETE ME: Oviedo tossed his first career complete game on August 28, 2023 at Kansas City, allowing two hits and two walks while striking out five batters and throwing a career-high 112 pitches in Pittsburgh's 5-0 win...The 112 pitches thrown by Oviedo that evening were the most by a Pirates pitcher in a complete game since Edinson Volquez threw 114 pitches in his complete game on July 10, 2014 at St. Louis.

LAND OF THE FREE: Oviedo defected from Cuba at the age of 15, living in Ecuador and the Dominican Republic before settling in Jacksonville, Florida, when he was 18...He brought his family from Cuba to the United States of America in the 2022-23 offseason.

WELCOME TO TOWN: Oviedo was acquired, along with infielder Malcom Nuñez, from St. Louis in a four-player trade that sent left-handed pitcher José Quintana and right-handed pitcher Chris Stratton to the Cardinals on August 1, 2022...He made his team debut on September 2 of that season vs. Toronto, striking out four batters in 3.0 scoreless innings...Oviedo went 2-2 with a 3.23 ERA (30.2ip/11er) in seven starts with the Pirates in 2022...His .198 batting average against (23-for-116) from the time he made his Pittsburgh debut through the end of the season was the 10th-lowest mark among all National League pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched in that stretch.

FRIDAY'S STARTER

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Friday's series opener against the Athletics at PNC Park.
