METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the team defeated the Padres, 8-5...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day homestand (1-2) against the Padres (1-2) and the Yankees (two games)...The Mets are 46-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 21-6-3 in 30 series this year...Following this series, the Mets will have Thursday off before beginning a six-game road trip against Miami (three games) and Washington (three games).

HOW SWEEP IT ISN'T: The Mets snapped a three-game losing streak with an 8-5 victory over the Padres on Sunday...The Mets have yet to be swept in a series of three-or-more games this year...According to Elias, the Mets have gone 103 games since they were last swept in a series of three or more games...It's their longest stretch avoiding a sweep since they went 120 games spanning the 2018-2019 season...This includes the final 87 games of 2018 and first 33 games of 2019...The franchise record is 167 games avoiding a sweep, spanning the 1987 and 1988 seasons...The single season record is the final 134 games of 1987 season.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME! With anticipated high attendance figures for the Subway Series, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays...Gates will open at 5:10 p.m., while parking lots open will open at 4:10 p.m...The Mets will offer \$5 Nathan's Hot Dogs at concession stands between 5:10 - 6:10 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees last season, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020...Last year, the Mets earned their first season Subway Series victory since 2013, when they went 4-0 against the Yankees...The Mets and Yankees had gone .500 against one another from 2018-20.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: According to Elias, the only time that the Mets and Yankees met in the regular season, with both teams in first place in their respective divisions was in April of 2015...The Mets entered that three-game series at Yankee Stadium with a record of 13-3 and the Yankees were 9-7.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue Interleague play today against the Yankees...The Mets are 5-8 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .508 winning percentage (231-224) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

SUBWAY CARDS: The Mets are 13-19 vs. the Yankees at Citi Field and 29-36 vs. the Bronx Bombers at home since 1997...The Amazin's are 58-76 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 106-144-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 149 players who have played for both clubs, including three current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, LHP Joely Rodriguez and RHP Miguel Castro...Rodriguez and Castro were traded for each other on April 3 earlier this year in what marked the 18th trade between the two clubs.

THREE'S COMPANY: On September 12, 2021 vs. Yankees, Francisco Lindor became the 14th player (15th time) in Mets history to hit three home runs in a game...It was the fourth three-homer game by a Met at home in club history and the first three-HR game in Subway Series history...Lindor is the second Mets shortstop to do so (also, José Reyes, August 15, 2006)...Only two other Mets shortstops have had multiple multi-homer games in one season: José Reyes in 2017 and Asdrúbal Cabrera in 2016.

THE ROAD TO RECOVERY: Jacob deGrom is set to make a rehab start tomorrow with the Syracuse Mets...This will mark his four minor league rehab appearance...He has tossed 8.2 scoreless innings, allowing an unearned run on five hits with a walk and 15 strikeouts between St. Lucie and Syracuse...deGrom has been on the injured list since April 7 with a stress reaction on his right scapula.

SQUIRRELS ON THE POND: Jeff McNeil recorded an RBI on a bunt base hit with the bases loaded in the third inning in the September 10 game vs. the Yankees...According to Elias, that was the third bunt single with no outs and the bases loaded in the last 30 seasons...It was the second in Mets history, joining Bill Pulsipher who had one on September 6, 1995.

EAT FRESH: Jeff McNeil has hit safely in 14 of his 16 career games vs. the Yankees, going 23-59 (.390) with a .989 OPS...That .390 average ranks fifth all-time against the Yankees among players with at least 50 AB against the club and is the highest mark in the history of the Subway Series (Derek Jeter leads all Yankees hitters with a .364 lifetime average against the Mets).

QUALITY EATS: Taijuan Walker has made seven straight quality starts...That is tied for the longest stretch of his career...He also recorded seven straight quality starts from May 29 - July 1, 2015...In seven starts since June 12, Walker has gone 4-0 and posted a 1.80 ERA (nine earned runs/45.0 innings) with 10 walks and 48 strikeouts...He has allowed just one home run in that span...That is the fifth-lowest ERA in the majors in that span and the third-lowest in the Senior Circuit.

HOME COOKING: Walker has posted a 2-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (six earned runs/36.0 innings) with 11 walks and 25 strikeouts in six starts at home this season...That is the second-lowest home ERA in the majors (min. 30.0 innings)...Since the start of the 2021 season, Walker has gone 6-4 with a 2.91 ERA (41 earned runs/127.0 innings) with 39 walks and 113 strikeouts in 21 starts (22 games) at Citi Field.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won five of their last seven matchups against the Yankees.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 46 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the fifth-fewest in the majors and tied for the third-fewest in the Senior Circuit...By comparison, the Braves have played 54 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 29-17 at home...They are fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a .630 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.31 ERA with 140 walks and 444 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 10 saves, a 0.44 ERA (one earned run/20.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 43 strikeouts over his last 21 appearances since May 27...He has recorded 21 saves this season, tied for the fourth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 77 strikeouts...His 17.62 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 77 of the 151 batters he faced, good for 51.0%...He is 2-1 with 21 saves, a 1.60 ERA (seven earned runs/39.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 35-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Edwin Díaz has converted 85 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him seventh on the team's all-time list...Tug McGraw is next...He converted 86 saves with the Mets from 1965-74...Díaz has struck out 315 batters as a member of the Mets...That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

FOR STARTERS: Mets starters have posted a 1.58 ERA (15 earned runs/85.2 innings) in the team's last 14 games with 96 strikeouts and 19 walks...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.06 to 3.65 in that span that began on July 7...According to Elias, New York's 14 straight games with two or fewer runs allowed by the starting pitcher is a team record, surpassing a 12-game streak from May 3-16, 1998...It is the longest streak in the majors this season...The last team with a longer streak was Milwaukee, who had 15 straight games with two runs or fewer from their starters from September 14-29, 2019.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York's 2.50 team ERA (51 earned runs/183.1 innings) this month is the best mark in the majors...The club's 218 strikeouts in July are second in the majors and the most in the National League...Mets starters have gone 7-5 with 2.31 ERA (30 earned runs/116.2 innings) with 27 walks and 144 strikeouts in 20 games in July...Their 2.31 ERA is the best in The Show, while their 144 strikeouts from starters in July is the second-most in the majors.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank second in the majors with 919 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 735 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game seven times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 50 times this year, the most in MLB.

LINDORS OPEN ON THE RIGHT: Francisco Lindor had an 11-game hit streak to finish the first half, his longest since joining the Mets, from July 7-17...Adding on his output from the Padres series after the break, he is batting .283 (17-60) with a .828 OPS in his last 14 games...Among the 51 active players with 150 or more AB vs. the Bombers, he ranks third in OBP (.390) and OPS (.965) and fourth in average (.317) and SLG (.575).

DAN IN REAL LIFE: The Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh in exchange for RHP Colin Holderman on July 22...He made his Mets debut on Sunday going 1-3 with a run and a walk in the 8-5 victory over the Padres...In 76 games this year, he has posted a .340 on-base percentage and a .429 slugging percentage...His 11 home runs as a designated hitter are tied for the second-most in the NL behind Bryce Harper...He has an .817 career OPS vs. righties and 55 of his 61 career home runs have come against right-handed pitchers.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 59 games this season, tied for the second-most in the National League...Their .615 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 59-37 record through the team's first 96 games...Only the 1986 (66-30) team posted a better record through the first 96 games of the season...The 1984 team also went 59-37 through the team's first 96 games.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 50-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 50 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .909 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 18 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 28-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 65 times this year...The Mets have been hit 299 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 66 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 49 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 39 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has tied a franchise record with 50 HBP in his career...Michael Conforto was also plunked 50 times...Pete Alonso is one away from tying the record as well.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded a hit in seven of his last eight games...He is batting .288/.353/.554 with 19 home runs and 66 RBI against right-handed pitchers this year...This compares to a .230/.337/.471 slashline with six home runs and 16 RBI against southpaws...He owns a .307/.397/.574 slashline in night games this year...His .307 average under the lights ranks eighth in the majors...He is fifth in the majors with 25 home runs and leads The Show with 82 RBI.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one run over 6.0 innings in game one of July 16's doubleheader against the Cubs against Wrigley Field...Surrendered four hits, issued two walks and struck out five batters...Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last eight starts, tied for the longest such streak in his career (Also: 5/29/15 - 7/7/15).

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just four home runs in 91.2 innings this season, good for a 0.39 HR/9 ratio...That is the lowest rate among pitchers with at least 80.0 innings...Walker allowed a three-run home run to Brandon Drury in third inning on July 4, ending a season-high streak of 32.2 innings, spanning five starts...In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 earned runs/91.2 innings)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

QUALITY EATS: Walker has tossed a quality start in each of his last seven starts, tied for the longest streak of his career...During that span, Walker is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (nine earned runs/45.0 innings) with 48 strikeouts and 10 walks...It is tied with Jacob deGrom (6/1/19 - 7/5/19) for the second longest quality start streak by a Mets pitcher since 2019...Walker also threw seven straight quality starts from May 29, 2015 - July 1, 2015.

BATTLES AGAINST THE BOMBERS: In six career starts against the Yankees, Walker is 1-3 with a 4.06 ERA (14 earned runs/31.0 innings)...In last year's Subway Series, Walker earned the victory on July 3 after allowing two earned runs on two hits with five strikeouts and two walks over 5.2 innings...On September 11 at Citi Field, Walker allowed five runs on six hits with eight strikeouts and one walk over 6.0 innings...In that start, Walker retired the final 13 batters faced after allowing five runs in the second inning.

SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS: In 16 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .161 (20-128) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...36 of Walker's 73 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

CITI SLICKER: In six starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (six earned runs/36.0 innings)...Walker has the second-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least five home starts...In each of the last two seasons, Walker has sported an ERA of 1.50 or lower through his first six home starts of the season (2021: 1.49 ERA)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 6-4 with a 2.91 ERA (41 earned runs/127.0 innings) in 22 games (21 starts).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .198 (73-368) average, the seventh-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 300 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .229 (340-1486) average, 12th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).
