Sept. 29, 1987: Don Mattingly hits his sixth grand slam of the season in a 6-0 win vs. Boston (off Bruce Hurst), setting a Major League record (since tied in 2006 by Travis Hafner).

Sept. 29, 1975: Former Yankees manager Casey Stengel passes away. Stengel managed the club for 12 seasons (1949-60), winning seven World Series titles.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 30, 1984: Don Mattingly goes 4-for-5 in a 9-2 win vs. the Tigers, as he finishes the season with a .343 batting average and wins the American League batting title.

Sept. 30, 1973: The Yankees play their final game in Yankee Stadium before it gets remodeled, losing 8-5 vs. Detroit. Tigers pitcher John Hiller gets Yankees first baseman Mike Hegan to fly out to centerfield for the game's final out.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final road trip of the season tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Kansas City (through Sun.)...are 2-1 on the road trip after winning two-of-three games at Toronto.

- Have won three of their last four games and five of their last seven games (since 9/21)...are 11-6 in their last 17 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a 19-10 (.655) record since 8/28, tied with Baltimore for the best record in the Majors over that span**...are 21-13 in their last 34 games (since 8/23).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Blue Jays, 6-0, on Thursday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Luke Weaver** (4.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 1BB, 6K, 2HR) started and took the loss...**Yankees batters** were shutout for the 10th time this year...**3B Oswaldo Cabrera** (2-for-4) was the only Yankee to reach base twice...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-4, 1 double) and **DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4, 1 double) were the only Yankees to record extra-base hits...**RHP Greg Weissert** (1.0IP, 3H, 1ER) allowed 1ER in 1.0IP...**RHP Zach McAllister** (1.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 1BB, 1HR) allowed 3ER in 1.0IP...**RHP Yoendrys Gómez** (2.0IP, 1H, 4K, 1HP) made his Major League debut and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings.

WINNING WAYS: With an 81-78 record, the Yankees need one win to clinch their 31st consecutive winning season (since 1993)...their current 30-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

- Their current 30-season streak is the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 10-1 in their last 11 games vs. Kansas City (since 8/11/21), 13-2 in their last 15 games vs. the Royals (since 6/23/21) and 18-4 in their last 22 games against Kansas City (since 4/19/19).

- **Have won each of their last 15 series vs. the Royals since 5/25/15, going 36-11 in that span...according to STATS, their 15-series winning streak vs. the Royals is tied for their second-longest such streak vs. an opponent in franchise history**, trailing only a 21-series streak vs. the Boston Red Sox from 1930-33...also recorded a 15-series winning streak vs. the Kansas City Athletics from 1955-57.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.79 ERA (196.2IP, 61ER) in their last 36 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 33 of those 36 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 27 of those starts.

- Have posted a 1.63 ERA (49.2IP, 9ER) and 48K in their last eight games (since 9/20).

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.43 PA/BB ratio and a 4.03 pitches per plate appearance ratio...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

GO WITH THE FLO: **OF Estevan Florial** has reached base in 13 of his last 14 games (since 9/12-G2), batting .277 (13-for-47) with 4R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7RBI, 6BB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.

RARE OCCURRENCE: The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on Sunday for the first time since 2016...the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch.

HIGH VOLTAGE: **INF Anthony Volpe** has had six of his last 10 hits, 18 of his last 30 hits, 21 of his last 40 hits and 26 of his last 51 hits have gone for extra bases (13 doubles, 2 triples, 11HR).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge is batting .385/.547/.923 (15-for-39) with 10R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 17RBI and 14BB over his last 12 games (since 9/14-G2).

- **Has hit 37HR in 104 games this season...is just the second player in Major League history to hit at least 37HR in a season while playing in 107 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees have three games remaining this season), joining Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland).
- Has reached base in 44-of-93 plate appearances over his last 21 games (since 9/5), posting a .473 OBP in that span (20H, 24BB).
- **Has hit 5HR in his last five games (since 9/22).**
- Has 12RBI in his last six games (since 9/21).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 37HR are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the ninth-most in the Majors...is also tied for fourth in the AL in game-winning RBI (13) and ranks sixth in walks (86).**
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, his 18HR are tied for first in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors...also leads the AL with 51BB and ranks second in the Majors in that span, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (58)...also ranks fourth in the AL in OBP (.407), fifth in OPS (.696) and sixth in SLG (.562) over that stretch.
- Has 6BB in his last four games (since 9/24).
- Has hit .393/.479/.902 (24-for-61) with 17R, 4 doubles, 9HR, 20RBI, 9BB, 1HP and 1SB in his last 16 games vs. the Royals (since 7/26/18).
- Has 7HR in his last six games vs. Kansas City (since 4/29/22)...has 3HR in his last two games at Kauffman Stadium (since 4/29/22).

JUDGE'S RULING: Earlier today, MLB announced that **OF Aaron Judge** had the third-most popular jersey in Major League Baseball this season...the rankings are based on tallied sales from MLBShop.com of Nike player jerseys this season...Judge has been in the top-seven of most popular jerseys in each of the last seven seasons since 2017...has also been ranked in the top-four during six of those seasons and the top-three in five of those seasons.

GOT YOUR NUMBER: **OF Aaron Judge** has hit .375/.444/.875 (6-for-16) with 2 doubles, 2HR and 2BB in his career against Kansas City's RHP Jordan Lyles...**DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** has hit .375/.385/.583 (9-for-24) with 2 doubles, 1HR and 1BB off Lyles...**INF DJ LeMahieu** has hit .321/.345/.357 (9-for-28) with 1 double and 1BB in his career off Lyles.

BOUNCING BACK: **LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his 14th start of the season tonight...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 8/22) and 2ER-or-fewer in four of those starts.

CENTRAL PERK: Since 2022, the Yankees are 42-20 (.677) vs. the AL Central...are 53-24 in their last 77 games vs. the division (since 6/23/21) and 66-30 in their last 96 games (since 9/12/19-G1).

- Have won or split 25 of their last 31 series vs. the AL Central (going 24-6-1 since 9/10/19), 28 of their last 34 series (going 25-6-3 since 6/13/19) and 31 of their last 38 series (going 28-7-3 since 4/18/19).

AUSTIN POWERS: **C Austin Wells** has recorded at least one hit in eight of his last 11 games (since 9/12-G2)...has reached base safely in nine of those 11 games.

- Is hitting .273/.294/.636 (9-for-33) with 5R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 6RBI and 1BB in his last nine games (since 9/16).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: **RHP Yoendrys Gómez** made his Major League debut on Thursday at Toronto and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings (1H, 4K, 1HP)...struck out Kevin Kiermaier in the seventh inning for his first career strikeout.

- Was the eighth Yankee to make his big league debut this season, marking the most Yankees to make their Major League debuts in a single season since 2017 (12)...Gómez joined RHP Jhony Brito, OF Jasson Domínguez, LHP Matt Krook, OF Everson Pereira, RHP Randy Vásquez, INF Anthony Volpe and C Austin Wells.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (3-7, 5.74 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his 14th and final start of the season tonight's series opener at Kansas City...the 30-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Sunday vs. Arizona, recording the loss after allowing 5R/3ER in 6.1IP (5H, 1BB, 4K, 0HR)...**struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning on 9/17 at Pittsburgh for his 1,000th career strikeout...became just the 17th active left-handed pitcher to reach the 1,000K plateau...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 8/22) after doing so just twice in his first six starts of the season from 7/7-8/6**...finished sixth in the NL Cy Young voting in 2022 after going 14-8 with one complete game and a 2.88 ERA (178.0IP, 131H, 59R/57ER, 52BB, 237K, 12HR) over 31 starts with the San Francisco Giants...the two-time All-Star (2021 with Chicago-AL and 2022 with San Francisco) has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...over the previous two seasons (2021-22), went 27-13 with two complete games and a 2.67 ERA (310.2IP, 222H, 98R/92ER, 88BB, 422K, 25HR) in 55 starts...over that span, led the Majors in K/9.0IP (12.23) and opponents' SLG (.307), ranked second in opponents' BA (.196) and opponents' OPS (.567), third in WAR among pitchers (11.1, FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.67), opponents' OBP (.259) and double-digit strikeout games (16), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.72), tied for sixth in wins and seventh in strikeouts...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 13th start of the season on Sunday vs. Arizona, recording the loss after allowing 5R/3ER in 6.1IP (5H, 1BB, 4K, 0HR)...after allowing hits to each of his first two batters faced, retired 17 of his next 18 batters faced (1BB).

VS. KANSAS CITY: Has made 10 career starts vs. the Royals, going 3-5 with a 3.95 ERA (54.2IP, 64H, 26R/24ER, 18BB, 55K, 6HR)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of those starts.

- Last pitched against Kansas City in 2021 with Chicago-AL, going 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA (15.2IP, 8ER) and 17K in three starts.
- In six career starts at Kauffman Stadium (all with Chicago-AL), has gone 1-3 with a 4.45 ERA (30.1IP, 15ER) and 30K...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in four of those starts.

2023: Is 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA (64.1IP, 59H, 43R/41ER, 26BB, 64K, 14HR) in 13 starts this season...**has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 8/22) after doing so just twice in his first six starts of the season from 7/7-8/6**.

- Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in nine of his 13 starts.
- Has tossed at least 6.0IP in back-to-back starts on 9/17 at Pittsburgh (season-high 6.2IP) and Sunday vs. Arizona (6.1IP) after doing so just once in his first 11 starts of the season (6.0IP on 8/22 vs. Washington).
- Recorded a season-high 6.2IP and 10K on 9/17 at Pittsburgh (6H, 3R, 0BB, 1HR)...**struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout**.
- Tossed 6.0IP on 8/22 vs. Washington...was reinstated from the 15-day injured list prior to the game...missed 12 team games from 8/7-22 with a left hamstring strain.
- Earned his first win as a Yankee on 7/26 vs. the Mets after allowing just 1ER over 5.2IP (4H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP).
- Made his Yankees debut on 7/7 vs. Chicago-NL at Yankee Stadium, recording the loss despite allowing 2ER in 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 2K, 1HR, 1WP)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list prior to the game.
- Began the year on the 15-day injured list (retroactive to 3/27) with a left forearm strain and was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/1...missed 88 team games.

MILESTONE MAN: Struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning on Sunday at Pittsburgh for his 1,000th career strikeout...became just the 17th active left-handed pitcher to reach the 1,000K plateau.

- Since his Major League debut in 2015, his 1,011K are the ninth-most among active left-handed pitchers.
- **His 9.98 K/9.0IP since 2015 ranks fifth among left-handed pitchers in the span**, trailing only Boston's Chris Sale (11.82), Seattle's Robbie Ray (11.15), San Diego's Blake Snell (11.09) and Los Angeles-NL's Clayton Kershaw (10.12).

ROAD RULES: Will be making his seventh road start this season...is 2-3 with a 5.28 ERA (30.2IP, 18ER) and 39K in those six starts...has allowed just 8ER total in his last four road starts (since 8/27) after allowing 10ER in his first two road starts of the season.

- Went 6-6 with one complete game and a 3.73 ERA (94.0IP, 70H, 40R/39ER, 26BB, 116K, 7HR) in 16 starts on the road in 2022 with San Francisco...opponents batted .204/.263/.315 (70-for-343).
- Allowed 2R-or-fewer in 10 road starts in 2022, 1R-or-fewer in seven starts and two starts were scoreless.
- His .315 opponents' SLG on the road last season was the sixth-lowest mark in the Majors and his .204 opponents' batting average was the eighth-lowest.

STRIKEOUT MACHINE: Recorded a career-high 237K in 2022 with the Giants, the fourth-most by a Giants left-handed pitcher in a single season since 1883, trailing only Madison Bumgarner (251K in 2016), Cy Seymour (244K in 1898) and Rube Marquard (238K in 1911)...was the fourth Giant (second in the San Francisco-Era) to record at least 200K in his first season with the club, joining Sam Jones (209K in 1959), Amos Rusie (341K in 1890) and Tim Keefe (227K in 1885).

- His 11.98 K/9.0IP ratio last season was the highest by a Giants pitcher in franchise history among pitchers who have tossed at least 130.0 innings in a season.
- His Major League-leading 11 double-digit strikeout games in 2022 were the most in a single season in Giants history (previous high was nine games with at least 10K by Tim Lincecum in 2008 and Jason Schmidt in 2004)...recorded just two double-digit strikeout games over his first 13 starts (4/9-6/17/22) before recording nine such games over his final 18 starts (6/22-9/29/22)...recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games three times: 7/26-31/22, 8/17-23/22 and 9/4-9/22.
- His three games of at least 10K and 0BB in 2022 were tied for the most by a Giants pitcher in a single season since 1901, joining Kevin Gausman (three in 2021) and Madison Bumgarner (three in 2012 and 2016)...accomplished the feat on 7/31/22 vs. Chicago-NL (10K and 0BB), 8/23/22 at Detroit (10K and 0BB) and 9/29/22 vs. Colorado (10K and 0BB).
- **135 of his strikeouts last season ended with a fastball...according to Statcast, that was the third-highest total in the Majors, trailing only teammates Nestor Cortes (144K) and Gerrit Cole (141K).**

KING OF THE HILL: Over the previous two seasons (2021-22), went 27-13 with two complete games and a 2.67 ERA (310.2IP, 222H, 98R/92ER, 88BB, 422K, 25HR) in 55 combined starts with the Chicago White Sox (2021) and San Francisco Giants (2022)...finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting both years (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...was named to his first two All-Star Games.

- In that span, led the Majors in K/9.0IP (12.23) and opponents' SLG (.307), ranked second in opponents' BA (.196) and opponents' OPS (.567), third in WAR among pitchers (11.1, FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.67), opponents' OBP (.259) and double-digit strikeout games (16), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.72), tied for sixth in wins and seventh in strikeouts.
- From 2021-22, recorded at least 10K and 0BB in six games, the fourth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch...trailed only Jacob deGrom (nine), Gerrit Cole (eight) and Corbin Burnes (eight).
- Tossed his first career no-hitter and the 20th no-hitter in Chicago White Sox history on 4/14/21 vs. Cleveland, (9.0IP, 7K, 1HP)...retired his first 25BF before hitting Roberto Pérez in the ninth inning...was just the sixth pitcher to throw a no-hitter with the only baserunner reaching on a HBP...was the first no-hitter by a White Sox left-handed pitcher since Mark Buehrle's perfect game on 7/23/09 vs. Tampa Bay.
