RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Chicago Cubs continue their season-ending three-game series at Wrigley Field today ... St. Louis concluded the first leg of its six-game road trip by taking two-of-three from the Giants at Oracle Park ... This series marks the 13th time that the Cardinals have ended a regular season against the Cubs and 5th time at Wrigley Field (first since 2018).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the NL Central and eliminated from postseason contention ... Yesterday's Cardinals loss clinched a losing season for the second time in the last three years, but only the second time in the last 18 seasons (2008-25), 3rd-fewest by any MLB team over that timespan to the Dodgers (once) and Yankees (none) ... The last time St. Louis experienced two losing seasons over a three-year span was 1997 (73-89) and 1999 (75-86).

COMEBACK CARDS: Over 62 full seasons from 1959-2024 (uninterrupted by work stoppages or COVID), the Cardinals have suffered losing seasons 15 times, but finished above .500 the year after 14 of those seasons.

GAMES THAT MATTER: Since 2011 Opening Day, the Cardinals will have played 2,301 out of a possible 2,326 regular season games (98.9%) during which they still maintained playoff aspirations and had not yet been eliminated.

I WANNA BE LIKE MIKE: Michael McGreevy has 11 wins in his first 20 career games (2024-25), 3rd-most in a player's first 20 games in franchise history behind RHP **Jack Harper** (13 in 1901) and RHP **Jake Thielman** (12 in 1905).

• Over the past two Post All-Star Break seasons, McGreevy is the Major League leader in winning percentage (10-2, .857), while his seven Post All-Star Break wins in 2025 are T-2nd in the National League behind **Cade Horton** (8) and the most by a Cardinals pitcher since **Adam Wainwright** (10 in 2021).

LEFT IS RIGHT: Left-handed batters **Alec Burleson** (.292) and **Brendan Donovan** (.287) are competing for the Cardinals batting title in 2025 ... After Donovan's .278 average led in 2024, this will mark only the 3rd time since 1979 that a qualified left-handed hitter will lead St. Louis in batting average in consecutive seasons, most recently accomplished by 1B **Matt Adams** (.288 in 2014) and OF **Jason Heyward** (.293 in 2015) ... Approximately 45 years ago, 1B **Keith Hernandez** won three consecutive Cardinals batting titles: .344 in 1979; .321 in 1980; and .306 during the strike-shortened 1981 season.

MISSOURI LOVES COMPANY: St. Louis and Kansas City are the only two MLB teams to have not hit a grand slam this season ... In the Expansion Era (1961-present), seasons in which the Cardinals hit zero grand slams include 1988, 1989, 1991, 2005, and 2025 ... The latest into any season that St. Louis hit its only grand slam is Game No. 158 (Sept. 24, 1971), a walk-off bases-loaded blast by **Joe Hague** in the 10th inning of a 10-6 win over the Expos at Busch Memorial Stadium.

• The Cardinals have hit 20 grand slams at Wrigley Field since it opened in 1916, 2nd-most among visitors (Pittsburgh 22) and their most at any road venue in franchise history.

PLAYERS USED: Forty-four different players have appeared for the Cardinals this season, fewest in Major League Baseball (Baltimore & Atlanta co-lead with 70 players) ... The 44 Cardinals match last season's total, while the 52 different Redbirds in 2023 set a franchise record ... Seven Cardinals have been active for every game: catcher **Pedro Pagés** and pitchers **Miles Mikolas**, **Andre Pallante**, **Sonny Gray**, **Matthew Liberatore**, **Kyle Leahy**, and **JoJo Romero**.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (Sept. 27, 1942): The Cardinals establish a new club record with 106 wins thanks to a doubleheader sweep of the Chicago Cubs at Sportsman's Park on the final day of the regular season to finish two games ahead of the Brooklyn Dodgers and claim the National League Pennant.

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Willson Contreras played parts of seven seasons with the Cubs (2016-22)...was a three-time All-Star and member of the 2016 World Series Champions...originally signed as an international free agent with Chicago (July 2, 2009).

Carson Kelly was drafted by St. Louis in 2012 and played three seasons (2016-18) for the Cardinals.

Andrew Kittredge pitched the 2024 season in St. Louis...set the Cardinals single-season holds record (37)...originally traded by Tampa Bay to St. Louis for OF **Richie Palacios** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Sonny Gray was originally selected by the Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Vanderbilt University.

Yohel Pozo's father, also named Yohel, played 36 games for the Rockies/Cubs partner team in the Arizona Rookie League in 1992.

Jon Jay played in 141 games for the Cubs in 2017 and was part of their playoff run to the NLCS.

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Matt Svanson was born in Lake Zurich, Ill...graduated from Luke Zurich (Ill.) High School.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Chris Roycroft was born in Dundee, Ill. and graduated from Willowbrook High School in Villa Park, Ill...played college baseball and basketball at Aurora, Ill. University.

Brant Brown was the Cubs 3rd round draft pick in 1992 and played parts of four seasons (1996-98 & 2000) with the North Siders.

Stubby Clapp (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs.

Cubs Scouting VP **Dan Kantrovitz** previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cards 25th Rd. draft pick from Brown Univ...first MLB job was Cardinals Scouting Coordinator.

Lars Nootbaar and **Shota Imanaga** were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Drew Pomeranz's older brother, **Stu**, was selected by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLB Draft and pitched five minor league seasons with the Cardinals (2003-07).

Nolan Gorman won the 2017 Under Armour High School All-America Game HR Derby at Wrigley Field.

Chip Caray served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Marquee Sports Network Analyst **Rick Sutcliffe** played for St. Louis in 1994.

Cardinals VP/Special Projects **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

TODAY'S STARTER:

- Making his 16th start (17th appearance) of the season (19th career start./21st app) in today's game.
- Has 11 wins in his first 20 games (2024-25) with the Cardinals, 3rd-most in franchise history behind Jack Harper (13 in 1901) and Jake Thielan (12 in 1905).**
- This is his first start at Wrigley Field after two starts vs. the Cubs at Busch Stadium (1-0, 4.22 ERA, 10.2 IP); two Cardinals wins.
- Major League leader in winning percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two seasons (10-2, .857).**
- His 7 Post All-Star Break wins in 2025 are T-2nd in the National League behind Cade Horton (8) and the most by a Cardinals pitcher since Adam Wainwright had 10 in 2021.
- Ranks T-2nd among National League rookies with 8 wins trailing **Cade Horton** (CHI, 11).
- Is 6-0 career in 9 Road starts with a 3.17 ERA; the Cardinals have gone 8-1 in those games and have provided Michael with 6+ runs of support in 6-of-9.**
- Today's start extends his career-high of 13 consecutive starts uninterrupted by option/injury/doubleheader/etc. (July 21-present).
- Since McGreevy's MLB debut (July 31, 2024), sports the 5th-lowest BB/9 IP (1.58) of pitchers with 100.0 or more innings.
- The Cardinals are 11-5 in his 16 appearances this season and 15-5 in his career.
- Sports a 3.09 ERA (41.0 IP) in seven road starts, but 5.22 ERA (50.0 IP) in 9 home games (8 starts) at Busch Stadium.
- Was 8-3 with a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis this season. Ranked 3rd among International League in winning percentage (.727, 8-3), 5th in wins (8) wins and 8th in ERA (3.72) and WHIP (1.24) at time of last recall.

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, Sept. 22 at San Francisco): W, 6-5: 5.0 IP, 6 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 3 BB, 2 K, 2 HR - 90 pitches

- Allowed five runs, but exited with a 6-5 lead as the Cardinals rallied with a four-run 5th inning. Had his 11.0 inning scoreless streak snapped on a lead-off HR by Heliot Ramos.

2025:

- Ran off an 11.0-inning scoreless streak (9/10-16), his 2nd-longest of the season (Aug. 2-13, 12.0 IP).
- Made six straight appearances of 6.0 innings or more (8/2-30); longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher this season.
- Was 4-0 in August, most wins by a Cardinals pitcher in the month of August since Adam Wainwright (5-1) in 2021.
- Struck out a career-high seven batters in a 7-6 win over Pittsburgh (8/25).
- Held the Reds scoreless over a season-high 7.0 innings with just three hits in a 3-0 win on Sept. 16.
- Was the first Cardinals pitcher with 9 or fewer walks and 80.0+ IP in their first 14 career games and only the 2nd in MLB history with Elmer Steele (1907-08) of the Boston Red Sox.
- Had three consecutive Quality Starts (8/8-19), the longest streak of his career,.
- Pitched a season-high 7.0 innings at COL (7/21), the first team he started against a team for the second time in his career.
- Was recalled twice from Memphis (AAA) and optioned back the following day on May 4-5 and June 8-9. Appointed as the 27th player for the June 19 doubleheader. Recalled on June 24 and most recently on July 21.
- Sustained most of his damage from the 5-9 batters in the Dodgers lineup on June 8; as they were 7-for-14 while the Top 5 batters were a combined 1-for-12 which included Shohei Ohtani (1-3, 2B), Mookie Betts (0-3, K), Freddie Freeman (0-3, K) &Teoscar Hernandez (0-3).
- Made his 2025 debut against the New York Mets in Game 2 of a doubleheader on May 4. Earned the win and held the Mets scoreless to one hit over 5.2 innings with a walk and five strikeouts. Held Francisco Lindor (0-2, K), Juan Soto (0-2), Pete Alonso (0-2, K) and Mark Vientos (1-3, K) to 1-for-9 with 3 strikeouts.

CAREER:

- From the start of 2022 until July 2025, led all of Minor League Baseball in wins (39), starts (97), innings pitched (522.1), and complete games (4), and ranked T-1st for first in double plays induced (55), 11th in ERA (4.00), and 3rd in SO/BB ratio (3.59) among qualifiers.
- Made his Major League debut against the Texas Rangers on July 31, 2024, firing 7.0 innings allowing one run on five hits with three strikeouts.
- Scouted the Rangers while watching the game on TV from the hotel bar/restaurant across the street the night before he started.
- Posted a 1.96 ERA in 2024, the best four game start by a Cardinal since **René Arocha** in 1993 (1.52 ERA, 23.2 IP, 4 ER).
- Is the only pitcher in Cards history to earn a win as a starting pitcher (July 31 2024 vs. Texas) and then as a relief pitcher in his second appearance (Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Pittsburgh) in his first two career MLB appearances.
- Originally selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of California-Santa Barbara.
- Entered the 2025 season as the No. 10 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.

McGREEVY vs. CHICAGO CUBS

- Making his 3rd career start vs. the Cubs and his first at Wrigley Field.
- Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings scattering six hits in his last start vs. the Cubs (8/8/25) at Busch Stadium in a 5-0 win.
- Received a no decision in his first career start vs. CHI (6/24/25), allowing five runs over 4.2 innings in a game the Cardinals won 8-7 as he exited at 4.2 innings with an 8-5 lead. All 5 runs came in the 3rd inning on a Kyle Tucker two-run single and Seiya Suzuki 3-R HR.
- Is 4-0 with a 2.76 ERA in five career starts (6 app) against N.L. Central opponents (Cardinals are 6-0). Has yet to face Milwaukee.
- Faced both Chicago clubs in back-to-back starts this season (June 19-G2 at White Sox and June 24 vs. Cubs)
