PITTSBURGH PIRATES (14-11) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (13-11)
April 24, 2026 - American Family Field - Milwaukee, WI - 6:40 CDT - Game #26/Road #13
RHP Paul Skenes (3-1, 3.27 ERA) vs. RHP Brandon Woodruff (2-0, 3.42 ERA)

THE PIRATES: dropped two of three games at Texas to open this six-game road trip (lost, 6-1, on Thursday at Globe Life Field)...Will begin a stretch of 10 straight games against the National League Central with tonight's game at American Family Field (will play three games from Friday-Sunday at Milwaukee, four games from Monday-Thursday vs. St. Louis and three games from May 1-3 vs. Cincinnati)...Are 13-8 in their last 21 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) following a 1-3 start to the year...Have not lost back-to-back games since losing their first two games (March 26-28 at Citi Field).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz connected for his second home run in as many games with his solo blast (off Jacob deGrom) in the fifth inning of Thursday night's game at Texas...He has gone deep in three straight games once in his career (April 16-18, 2025)...Cruz joined Willie Stargell (11 home runs and 27 RBI) in 1971 and Jeff King (nine home runs and 23 RBI) in 1996 as the only Pirates since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 to have at least eight home runs and 23 RBI during March/April of any single season.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE: Pittsburgh has outscored its opponents, 123-103 (+20), over its first 25 games of the season...The only other time during the 21st century where the Pirates had a +20 run differential or better through their first 25 games of a season came in 2023 (+31)...They had not achieved that before 2023 since doing it in three consecutive campaigns from 1990-92.

NO CY OF RELIEF: Paul Skenes, who won the 2025 National League Cy Young Award, will start for Pittsburgh tonight at Milwaukee...The Brewers faced 2025 American League Cy Young Award winner Tarik Skubal on Thursday at Detroit...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the only previous instance of a team facing the reigning Cy Young Award winners (as starters) came last season, when Boston faced Skubal on May 14 at Detroit and Chris Sale on May 16 vs. Atlanta (this will be the first time any team does it during back-to-back days).

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales collected two hits on Thursday at Texas, marking his third multi-hit effort in his last four games (since April 19 vs. Tampa Bay)...He is hitting .357 (10-for-28) with three RBI over his last eight games (since April 15 vs. Washington)...Gonzales' eight multi-hit games lead all Pirates and are tied for the eighth-most among all National League hitters.

BEER BATTER: Bryan Reynolds is hitting .373 (25-for-67) with six doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI and a 1.167 OPS in his last 17 games at American Family Field (since June 18, 2023)...His 114 against Milwaukee since 2019 (debut season) lead all Major Leaguers (Paul Goldschmidt, 90, ranks second).

O'YEAH: Ryan O'Hearn reached base safely twice after singling and walking on Thursday night at Texas...His .325 average (26-for-80) ranks sixth in all of Major League Baseball, while his .417 on-base percentage ranks second in the National League (Milwaukee's Garrett Mitchell, .421, ranks first)...O'Hearn has reached base safely multiple times in 14 of his 23 games.

PICK SIX: Pirates pitchers have recorded at least six strikeouts in 62 consecutive games, a streak that began last year on August 18 vs. Toronto...That marks the fifth-longest streak by any Major League team during the Modern Era (since 1901)...The only Major League teams with longer streaks were New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019), Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023), Cincinnati (71 games, August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021) and New York-AL (66 games, August 22, 2017-April 29, 2018).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 24, 1982: The Pirates overcame an early 5-0 deficit and staged an 8-5, come-from-behind win over the Cubs at Wrigley Field. Don Robinson earned his first win of the season after allowing one run and striking out five batters over his 6.1 innings of relief, while also going 3-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored. Bill Madlock was 3-for-5 with two doubles, and Dale Berra went 2-for-4 with a home run.

TONIGHT'S STARTER **RHP PAUL SKENES** **#30**

2026 RECORD: 3-1, 3.27 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-7/260 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing three hits (zero walks) and striking out five batters in 4.0 scoreless innings in Pittsburgh 8-7, 13-inning loss on April 18 vs. Tampa Bay... He departed with a 4-0 lead, but he did not return after a rain delay of two hours and 27 minutes.

AGAINST THE BREWERS: Skenes is 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA (21.0ip/9er) and 27 strikeouts in four career starts against Milwaukee...He has gone 1-2 with a 4.80 ERA (15.0ip/8er) in three starts here at American Family Field...Skenes earned a win after striking out a career-high-tying 11 batters over 7.0 no-hit/scoreless innings on July 11, 2024...He suffered losses in his two starts last year on June 25 and August 12...Skenes allowed a leadoff home run to Sal Frelick in the August 12 start, ending his streak of 24 straight starts without allowing a first-inning run to begin the season...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest such streak to begin a season in Major League history, trailing only New York (AL)'s Bob Shawkey (27 starts) in 1923.

CENTRAL PERK: This will be Skenes' second start against the National League Central this season...He won an 8-3 decision after allowing one run in 5.0 innings on April 1 at Cincinnati... His 2.28 ERA (126.1ip/32er) career ERA against the division since his debut season of 2024 is the lowest by any pitcher (minimum 100.0 innings pitched against the NL Central) during that time.

STREAKING: Skenes has won each of his last three decisions since allowing five runs in just 0.2 inning of work and losing an 11-7 decision on Opening Day (March 26) at New York (NL)...He has posted a 1.27 ERA (21.1ip/3er), 22 strikeouts and a .125 batting average against (9-for-72) during the streak...He has two career winning streaks of at least four games, which came from May 17-July 11, 2024 (six straight wins) and August 16-September 9, 2024 (four straight wins).

THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT: Skenes has received an average 11.05 runs of support through his first five starts, the best mark among all Major League pitchers (minimum 20.0 innings)...His 3.40 average runs of support last season were the third-fewest among all qualified Major League pitchers, ahead of only Kansas City's Michael Wacha (3.28) and Colorado's Kyle Freeland (3.32).

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.05 ERA (342.2ip/78er) through his first 60 Major League starts is the lowest by any pitcher through his first 60 career starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes took home National League Cy Young Award honors in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) and Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates pitchers to ever win the Cy Young Award.

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy before transferring to LSU (2023), raised \$500,000 for the foundation at a Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, on Veterans Day.

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes started for the National League in last season's All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park after also starting for the National League on July 16, 2024 at Texas' Globe Life Field...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57)...Skenes also joined Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Bob Veale (1965-66) as the only starting pitchers in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in at least two straight seasons (there was no All-Star Game in 1945)...He also became the first player in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in each of his first two Major League seasons.
