## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (43-44) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (49-38) July 2, 2026 - Citizens Bank Park - Philadelphia, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #88/Road #43 RHP Jared Jones (1-1, 5.76 ERA) vs. RHP Alan Rangel (0-1, 4.50 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** have dropped two of the first three games on this seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (Monday-Thursday) and Washington (Friday-Sunday), including a 10-6 loss on Wednesday night here at Citizens Bank Park...Won three of six games on their recent homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, June 23-25) and Cincinnati (1-2, June 26-28)...Have scored the fourth-most runs (446) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (470), Los Angeles-NL (462) and Chicago-NL (448)...Have struck out the third-most batters (802) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (837) and Milwaukee (830)...Are 20-22 on the road this season (went 27-54 on the road in the 2025 season).

**EAST COAST BIAS:** Pittsburgh is in the 10th game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone (the stretch began on June 23 vs. Seattle and will end on August 2 at Cincinnati)...The Pirates' next game outside of the Eastern Time Zone will be played on August 3 at Milwaukee...Pittsburgh is also in the fourth game of a stretch of 10 straight games against the National League East...The stretch will continue with three games at Washington (Friday-Sunday) and three games vs. Atlanta (July 7-9).

**NATIONAL MATTER:** Pittsburgh will depart for a three-game series at Washington (Friday-Sunday) following today's game at Citizens Bank Park...The Pirates and Nationals split a four-game series from April 13-16 at PNC Park...Pittsburgh has gone 19-13 (.594) against Washington since the beginning of the 2022 campaign, winning each of the four season series during that stretch.

**EXTRA! EXTRA!** Henry Davis hit a solo homer in the third inning on Wednesday at Philadelphia, extending Pittsburgh's streak of games with at least one extra-base hit to 60 straight games (since April 26 at Milwaukee)...That is tied with another 60-game streak from May 26-August 1, 2001 for the Pirates' sixth-longest such streak (within a single season) during the 21st century, trailing only a 97-game streak (May 23-September 7, 2007), a 75-game streak (June 21-September 15 [G1], 2015), a 71-game streak (April 4-June 23, 2005), a 64-game streak (June 1-August 14, 2019) and a 61-game streak (last year from July 22-Sept. 28).

**GOOD AS GONZO:** Nick Gonzales reached base safely four times after going 3-for-4 with an RBI, a walk and a run on Wednesday at Philadelphia...It was the 11th time in his career he reached base safely four times in a game and the fifth this season (also May 1 vs. Cincinnati, May 9 at San Francisco, June 2 at Houston and Sunday vs. Cincinnati)...It was his second career game with at least three hits, a walk, an RBI and a run (also July 4, 2023 at Los Angeles-NL)...His 30 multi-hit games are the third-most in MLB, behind Miami's Otto Lopez (35) and San Francisco's Luis Arraez (32)...Bryan Reynolds led Pittsburgh with 41 multi-hit games in 2025...Gonzales' seven three-hit games are tied with Ryan O'Hearn for the most on the Pirates (Reynolds led with 10 last season).

**BE LIKE TRI:** Jared Triolo recorded a career-high-tying three RBI after being hit by a pitch with the bases loaded (fifth inning) and posting a two-run double (seventh inning) on Wednesday at Philadelphia...He also recorded three RBI on August 13 (G1), 2023 vs. Cincinnati, May 17, 2024 at Chicago (NL), August 19, 2024 at Texas, September 3, 2024 at Chicago (NL), last year on August 24 vs. Colorado and last year on September 21 vs. the Athletics...Triolo is 11-for-38 (.289) with four doubles, a home run, seven RBI, three walks, two stolen bases, an .846 OPS and seven runs scored across his last 13 contests (since June 17 at the Athletics).

**THE MAGICIAN:** Esmerlyn Valdez singled and scored a run in the fifth inning on Wednesday at Philadelphia, extending his hitting streak to six straight games (since June 26 vs. Cincinnati)...He has hit safely in eight of his last nine games (since June 19 at Colorado), going 14-for-29 (.483) with four doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, four walks, a 1.579 OPS & nine runs in that time.

**WELCOME TO THE YO:** Yohan Ramirez struck out four batters over 1.1 scoreless innings on Wednesday at Philadelphia...He has allowed seven hits in 44 at-bats (.159) while pitching a career-best 13.0 straight scoreless innings in his last 10 games, dating back to June 6 at Atlanta (he has lowered his ERA from 4.93 to 3.59 in that time)...His 55 strikeouts are the seventh-most among Major League relievers, behind Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (66), San Diego's Mason Miller (66), Toronto's Louis Varland (64), Toronto's Jeff Hoffman (60), Cleveland's Cade Smith (57) & Chicago (AL)'s Grant Taylor (57).

July 2, 2010: Ross Ohlendorf earned his first win of the season after allowing five hits and striking out eight batters over 7.0 scoreless innings of work in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win over Philadelphia at PNC Park. Andy LaRoche brought home Andrew McCutchen with an RBI single in the fourth inning, while Ryan Doumit also scored on an error by Jamie Moyer. Octavio Dotel earned his 18th save of the season.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Jones had a no-decision after allowing four runs (three earned) across his 4.2 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 9-7, last at-bat defeat on June 27 vs. Cincinnati.

**AGAINST THE PHILLIES:** Jones lost a 5-1 decision after giving up three runs and striking out eight batters (no walks issued) over 6.1 innings of work during his only career start against Philadelphia (it came on April 11, 2024 here at Citizens Bank Park).

**RIGHT ON:** Jones has held right-handed hitters to a .186 batting average against (8-for-43) and a .557 OPS...The only righthander to hit a home run off him this season was Cincinnati's Sal Stewart, who did that in the first inning of his last start (June 27).

**BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN:** Jones won a 5-1 decision after allowing four hits and two walks (he had four strikeouts) in 5.0 scoreless innings on June 4 at Houston...It was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2024 vs. Washington (it was a total of 634 days).

**WE WENT TO JARED:** The Pirates have won eight of Jones' last 11 starts, dating back to September 2, 2024 at Chicago (NL)...The team's only three losses during that stretch came on September 21, 2024 at Cincinnati, June 15 at the A's & June 27 vs. Cincinnati.

**2026 DEBUT:** Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

**MAKING A COMEBACK:** Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

**ON THE MEND:** Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakeland), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

**2024 IN REVIEW:** Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).

**STRIKE 'EM OUT:** Jones' 98 strikeouts prior to the 2024 All-Star break were the most by any Pirates rookie prior to the break, surpassing Cy Blanton (79) in 1935...He led the South Atlantic League in strikeouts (142) while he was w/High-A Greensboro (2022).

**HISTORIC OUTING:** Jones allowed just one baserunner (it was a fifth-inning double to Elias Díaz) while striking out 10 batters over 7.0 scoreless innings on May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado...He became the first and only Pittsburgh pitcher to have an outing of at least 7.0 scoreless innings, one/zero hits allowed, zero walks surrendered and 10 strikeouts.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Jones struck out at least seven batters in each of his first five Major League starts (March 30-April 22, 2024)...He joined Pittsburgh's Jose DeLeon (July 23-August 10, 1983), Washington's Stephen Strasburg (June 8-28, 2010) and New York (AL)'s Masahiro Tanaka (April 4-27, 2014) as the only pitchers to accomplish that.
