To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (0-1, three to play) and Braves (three to play) tonight in Arlington...are on a stretch of 14 road games within their final 23 games of the season (Sept. 3-27), going 0-1 thus far...are 9-11 in their last 20 contests (Aug. 14–pres.) in the wake of an 18-4 run between July 20–Aug. 12...despite the 9-11 stretch, they are still an MLB-best 27-15 since July 20...have the toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .526...in their seven remaining series (including current set), the Rays will face five opponents that are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 3-0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings, their smallest since Aug. 23 (3-0)...have spent 109 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 69 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record outright for 108 days, the most in franchise history, according to Stats Perform...can clinch a postseason berth as early as

- ✦ The Rays lost the series opener, 6-0, to the Rangers last night...they were shut out for the eighth time this season and only the second time since the All-Star break (also: July 17 [G1] at BOS, 10-0).
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** (2H) and **Nick Fortes** (1H) accounted for the team's three hits in the contest...the three hits matched a season low (5x), and it was the fourth time they have been held to that mark in the second half (last: July 29 vs. TEX).
- ✦ With 3 SO last night, **Shane McClellan** (2021-26) has recorded 562 strikeouts in his career, tying **Chris Archer** (2012-15) for the fourth most by a Rays pitcher in his first four big-league seasons.
- ✦ The Rays have lost back-to-back games by six runs or more for the first time since July 12-17 [G1], 2026 (2G) in a pair of games sandwiched around the All-Star break...it falls one game shy of the franchise record (3G), which has happened on six occasions (last: July 27-29, 2018).
- ✦ The loss marked their 10th straight loss against the Rangers at Globe Life Field (July 17, 2023–pres.), tied for their fourth-longest road losing streak against a single opponent in franchise history (see table on the right).
- ✦ Of the Rays 57 losses on the season, 23 have come with a deficit of five runs or more...those 23 games are tied for the fourth most in the AL and tied for eighth most in the majors...since becoming the Rays in 2008, only the 2017 Rays (24) have lost more such games in a single season.
- ✦ Since returning home from the nine-game sweep of their West Coast road trip (Aug. 14–pres.), the Rays have provided three runs of support or fewer to their starting pitcher in 16 of 20 games and one or zero runs of support in 10 of those 20...the rotation's 3.92 runs of support per 9.0 IP in that span ranks 12th in the AL/24th in the majors.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed **LHP Shane McClellan** (left forearm tightness) on the 15-day IL and recalled **RHP Alex Cook** from Triple-A Durham...this marks Cook's third stint with the Rays, joining July 31–Aug. 3 & Sept. 1-2

- ✦ **NICK, NICK, NICKELODEON**—Tonight's probable starter, **Nick Martinez**, is slated to make his first career start opposite the team that selected him in the 18th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...following tonight's outing, he will have made at least one start against each of the 30 major league franchises...he made his MLB debut with the Rangers on April 5, 2014 at Tropicana Field opposite the Rays (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 3BB, 3SO, 2HR)...the start would also mark his 27th of the season, a career high that surpasses his total from last season with the Reds...he has already registered a career high in wins (13) and is just shy of career marks in innings pitched (2026, 153.2IP; 2025, 165.2IP) and strikeouts (2026, 91SO; 2024 & 2025, 116SO)...his 2.99 ERA (153.2IP, 51ER) is on pace to be a career best...if he were to register his 14th quality start tonight, he would surpass his previous career high from 2015 with Texas (13).
- ✦ The Rangers are the only AL club and one of four teams overall Martinez has yet to record a win against, joining the Brewers, Nationals, and Phillies.
- ✦ His 196 ERA (73.1IP, 16ER) on the road ranks third among AL qualifiers to **NY Yankees Cam Schlichter** (1.14) and **TOR Dylan Cease** (1.54)...he is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell** in 2018 (2.45) for the best single-season road ERA in franchise history...teammate **Drew Rasmussen** (2.69) currently ranks third on that list.
- ✦ Martinez (2.99) is attempting to become the third AL pitcher since 2002 to register a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older season (age as of June 30)...he would join **TEX Jacob deGrom** (2025, 2.97), **HOU Justin Verlander** (3x, last: 2022, 1.75), and **OAK Bartolo Colon** (2013, 2.65).

THE LEADING CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** (.309) is seven points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.316) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could also become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Yankees Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (133) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs 12 singles over the Rays final 22 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

- ✦ Over his last 63 games (June 19–pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.363/87-for-240), hits, and stolen bases (24).
- ✦ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Yankees Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

HOME RUN DERBY—With 37 HR, **Junior Caminero** is tied with **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (40) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (39) across all of MLB...the 37 HR marked the third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is three long balls shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 22 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in nine of the last 12 games (Aug. 22–pres.), turning in a 3.00 ERA (108.0IP, 36ER) while holding opponents to a .203/.251/.316 (81-for-399) line—they lead the AL in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, opp. SLG, WHIP (0.97), hits per 9.0 IP (6.75), walks per 9.0 IP (2.00), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.04) over that stretch...entering that stretch, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.86 ERA during the 12-game span, going 5-3 with 55 SO against 8 BB...seven of their last 11 starts have been quality.

- ✦ **THE RAY WAY**—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998–2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the **Braves** and **Brewers** for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the **Dodgers** (18), **Yankees** (17), and **Cardinals** (16)...the **Astros**, **Guardians**, and **Red Sox** (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.
- ✦ This marks the fourth time the Rays entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including World Series appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.
- ✦ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the **Dodgers** (7), **Astros** (6), **Braves** (6), **Brewers** (6), and **Yankees** (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the **Astros** and **Brewers** for fifth most in MLB behind the **Dodgers** (15), **Yankees** (13), **Braves** (10), and **Cardinals** (10).

CLOSING TIME—**Bryan Baker** has converted a franchise-record 28 consecutive save opportunities (May 17–pres.), pushing his season-long total to an MLB-leading 39 saves, most by a Ray since **Alex Colomé** paced the majors with 47 in 2017...he has as many or more saves than 21 clubs have as a team this season...Baker's 28-save streak ties **SD Mason Miller** (March 28–July 29) for MLB's longest this season and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20–Sept. 25, 2024...he is attempting to join Colomé as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS—The Rays continue their four-game set in Texas against the Rangers tonight...they took two of three contests in their home series against the Rangers this season (July 28-30) and need to win two of the remaining three games to claim their first season series against Texas since 2022 (4-3)...have dropped 10 straight games at Globe Life Field dating back to July 17, 2023 and are 6-17 overall in their last 23 contests vs. the club in that span...went 12-7 in their 19 previous contests in Arlington from 2016-22.

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 27th start of the season and 13th on the road tonight against his former club...marks his 156th career start (307th appearance)...ranks second among qualified AL arms in winning pct. (.765/13-4) to BOS **Sonny Gray** (.800/16-4), is tied for third in wins (career-high 13), and owns the sixth-best ERA (2.99)...the Rays are 20-6 in his starts, including 10-2 on the road...has yielded three runs or fewer in 21 of 26 starts and two runs or fewer in 18 of 26...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...was originally drafted by the Rangers in the 18th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft and began his major league career with the club from 2014-17.

- With a win tonight, he would become the only pitcher in the majors with four wins or more and zero losses against the AL West this year...with a quality start, he will set a career high with 14 QS in a season, surpassing his total from 2015 (13QS).
- When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has posted a 1.73 ERA (26.0IP, 5ER) with 17 strikeouts and a .191 (18-for-94) opp. average...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 25G) in the 1st frame in ERA (4th), WHIP (4th, 0.88), opp. OBP (T4th, .248), and opp. AVG (5th).
- Boasts the fourth-highest left-on-base percentage in the majors (82.4%), the third-highest mark in the AL behind BOS **Sonny Gray** (83.7%) and NYY **Cam Schlitler** (82.9%)...he has fashioned a 0.95 WHIP with runners on in 2026.
- His 14 starts with one or zero runs allowed are tied for the third most in the majors with six others behind NYY **Cam Schlitler** (19) and PHI **Jesús Luzardo** (15).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 13th quality start of the year and did not factor into the decision in a 7-6 win on Aug. 29 vs. SD (6.0IP, 7H, 3ER, 4SO, HR)...logged a 1-2-3 1st inning and allowed one baserunner through the 2nd frame...yielded a **Jake Cronenworth** RBI-double in the 3rd inning...retired eight of his next nine batters faced through the 5th inning before allowing a leadoff single to **Manny Machado** and a **Ty France** home run in the following at-bat in the 6th...set down his final three batters faced before handing the ball to **Garrett Cleavinger** to start the 7th inning.

- Fifteen of his 26 starts have been 6.0 innings or more, tied for the ninth-most such starts among AL arms with six other pitchers.
- Marked the 18th time in 26 starts he has yielded two extra-base hits or fewer.

BIGGER & BETTER—Martinez is set for his third career appearance (first start) against the Rangers...owns a 9.00 ERA (2.0IP, 2ER) with four strikeouts in two career appearances in 2023...marks his first outing against Texas since July 30, 2023 with San Diego at Petco Park (1.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 2O)...was with the Rangers from 2014-17.

- Marks his first career appearance at Globe Life Field since the ballpark opened in 2020...in Arlington, he has gone 7-12 with a 4.99 ERA (176.2IP, 98ER) in 38 career appearances (28 starts).
- He is set to make his fifth start of the season against an AL West club, going 3-0 with a 3.04 ERA (26.2IP, 9ER) and 14 strikeouts in those starts...across 60 career outings (40 starts) opposite AL West foes, he boasts a 3.40 ERA (272.1IP, 103ER) with 170 strikeouts.
- The AL West is one of two divisions against which he has multiple victories and zero losses (also: NL West, 2-0).
- When facing AL opponents this year, Martinez is 10-3 with a 3.25 ERA (99.2IP, 36ER), 53 strikeouts, and a .250 (95-for-380) opp. average...owns the second-most victories against the AL this season (10) behind rotation-mate **Drew Rasmussen** (11).

HITTING THE ROAD—In 12 road starts this season, Martinez has produced a 6-1 record with a 1.96 ERA (73.1IP, 16ER), 40 strikeouts, a 0.98 WHIP, and .230 (63-for-274) opp. average...his road ERA ranks third in the AL behind Cy Young frontrunners NYY **Cam Schlitler** (1.14) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (1.54) and is fifth best in the majors...he is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell's** franchise-record 2.45 road ERA (95.2IP, 26ER) from 2018...the right-hander is 5-0 with a 1.59 ERA (51.0IP, 9ER) when pitching on the road in AL ballparks this year (8GS).

- He has earned the win in each of his last three road starts, tying the longest streak of his career (also: July 2–Aug. 9, 2025), and is one win shy of tying **Drew Rasmussen** (July 21–pres.) for the longest streak by a Ray this season (4G).
- With a win tonight, he would have the most road wins on the club with seven.

TURNING BACK THE CLOCK—Martinez has a chance to become the fifth AL pitcher (6x) in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to make 30 starts or more and record a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older campaign (age as of June 30)...he would join TEX **Jacob deGrom** (30GS/2.97 ERA, 2025), HOU **Justin Verlander** (2018-19), OAK **Bartolo Colon** (30/2.65, 2013), and TOR **Roger Clemens** (33/2.65, 1998)...the right-hander's 13 wins are second most in franchise history during such a season behind **Corey Kluber** (16) in 2022 (age 35), and his 153.2 IP are fourth most, trailing **Charlie Morton** (2019, 194.2IP), **Bobby Witt** (180.1IP, 1999), and Kluber (180.1IP, 2022).

- This season, Martinez became the fifth player in Rays history to earn an All-Star selection in an age-35-or-older season, joining Morton (2019, 35), RHP **Fernando Rodney** (2012, 35), OF **Greg Vaughn**, and INF **Fred McGriff** (2000, 36)...since 2020, the only AL pitchers to turn the trick are Martinez, Verlander (2026, 2022), and deGrom (2025).
