RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (2-1), Mariners (0-1, two to play), Athletics (3G) and Giants (3G) tonight in Seattle...have split their last six games (3-3), but have lost seven of 10...11 of 15, 17 of 24 and 25 of their last 36...are 4-10 so far on a stretch of 19 road games in a 22-game span (July 25–Aug. 17)...started the season 21-26...went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20–June 26 and are an MLB-worst 11-25 since June 27...are fourth in the AL East for the 29th consecutive day, a season-high-tying 11.0 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 4.5 GB the Yankees for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 59 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays saw a 2-0 lead erased with **Cal Raleigh's** go-ahead, three-run homer in the 8th inning in last night's series-opening loss...it was the 14th time the Rays have allowed a home run to turn a multi-run lead into a deficit in the 8th inning or later and second this season (also: **Daulton Varsho**, 3R HR in 8th off Uceta, May 13 vs. TOR).
- ✦ At two hours, three minutes, it marked the Rays second-shortest game this season, longer than only a two-hour, one-minute affair on May 30 at HOU.
- ✦ Tampa Bay fell to 3-12 in its last 15 road games and 5-17 in its last 22 since June 29, the worst mark in the majors over that span.
- ✦ It was the Rays 21st one-run loss, tied with four other clubs for third most in MLB behind the Braves (28G), White Sox (25G) and Pirates (25G)...they have lost 11 of their last 12 one-run games on the road (4-12 overall).
- ✦ Since the All-Star break, Rays pitchers lead the majors in strikeout rate (25.4%), and their 186 SO are tied for third in MLB behind the Mariners (198SO) and Reds (188SO).
- ✦ Under **Kevin Cash** (2015–pres.), the Rays are 167-112 (.599) in August, second in the majors behind the Dodgers (189-94/.668).
- ✦ The Rays need to win tonight to avoid their fifth loss in their last six series and 10th in their last 12...it would also mark their seventh loss in their last eight road sets.

31 FOR 13—Junior Caminero has homered in back-to-back games for the seventh time in his career and fifth time this season (last: July 9-10)...he has homered in three straight games once previously: earlier this year from April 12-14...Caminero has gone deep three times in his last two games, four times in his last six and eight times in his last 20 games since the All-Star break, tied for third most in the majors...his 31 HR on the season rank third in the AL behind SEA **Cal Raleigh** (43HR) and NYY **Aaron Judge** (37HR) and are tied for fourth most in franchise history before the end of August (see table to the right)...Caminero is the 20th player since 1901 to hit 30 HR in an age-21-or-younger season, the ninth AL hitter and the third primary third baseman (min. 50% of games at 3B) joining ATL **Bob Horner** (33HR) in 1979 and the Milwaukee Braves **Eddie Mathews** (47HR) in 1953...he is the third Dominican-born player to turn the trick, joining WSH **Juan Soto** (34HR) in 2019 and STL **Albert Pujols** (37HR) in 2001.

- ✦ Caminero (20 2B, 31HR) is one of three players in the majors with 20 doubles and 30 home runs, joining Judge (24 2B, 37HR) and SEA **Eugenio Suarez** (20 2B, 37HR).
- ✦ He is on pace for 42 HR, which would mark the second-highest total in Rays history behind **Carlos Peña** (46HR) in 2007...he needs 9 HR in the Rays final 45 games to join ATL **Ronald Acuña Jr.** (41HR, 2019), Mathews (47HR, 1953) and NYY **Mel Ott** (42HR, 1929) as the only players in major league history to record 40 HR in an age 21-or-younger season.

(LOWE)D AND CLEAR—**Brandon Lowe** has hit safely in seven of eight games since returning from the injured list (left foot/ankle tendinitis) on July 30, going 10-for-31 (.323) with 1 2B, 2 HR, 4 RBI and a .912 OPS...three of the 4 RBI have given the Rays a lead...Lowe has tallied a hit in 16 of his last 17 games away from home, batting .413/.471/.683 (.26-for-63) with 2 2B, 5 HR and 12 RBI in that span (since June 11), leading MLB (min. 50PA) in road average while ranking fourth in OPS (1.154), trailing ATH **Shea Langeliers** (1.353), ATH **Nick Kurtz** (1.260) and MIL **Kyle Stowers** (1.177)...the only road game he failed to record a hit in over that timeframe was July 4 at MIN, when he was removed after 1 AB with left side soreness.

- ✦ The Rays are 51-43 in Lowe's appearances this season compared to 6-17 in all other games...this includes a 14-6 record when he homers.

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays have hit 7 HR in their last three games after going homerless in four of their previous five (July 31–Aug. 4)...they have recorded back-to-back multi-homer games on the road for the second time this season, joining a three-game streak from June 26-28 (3G)...each of their last seven runs have been scored via the home run, including five straight on solo homers...conversely, each of the Rays last five runs allowed have come on homers, and nine of 15 allowed on the current road trip were on home runs.

- ✦ After going deep twice last night, the Rays have homered in 11 consecutive games at T-Mobile Park (May 5, 2022–pres.), their longest streak in the ballpark's history and their longest active streak at any current MLB venue. (Stats Perform).
- ✦ In seven matchups with the Mariners since the start of last season, 21 of the 27 runs allowed by the Rays have come on 11 Seattle home runs.

LATE-INNING LETDOWNS—Last night's 3-2 loss marked the Rays fourth after carrying a multi-run lead into the 8th inning (last: July 23 vs. CWS - led 7-5, lost 11-9), the most in the majors and their most since 2017 (4G)...since the start of July, they have recorded an MLB-most nine losses after leading by multiple runs at any point in a game, ahead of the Phillies (7), and their 14 such losses this season are tied for seventh most in the majors (Stats Perform)...the Rays 21 blown saves are tied with the Rangers for third most in the MLB behind the Angels (26) and Red Sox (22) and are one shy of their total from all of last season (22)...their 10 blown saves since the calendar flipped to July lead the majors—they entered the month with 11, sixth fewest in the AL.

PEN PALS—Over the last 12 games since July 27, the Rays bullpen leads the majors in WHIP (0.80), opponent batting average (.173/.27-for-156) and strikeout rate (31.5%) while ranking second with a 2.00 ERA (45.0IP, 10ER) behind the Guardians (1.93 ERA/37.1IP, 8ER)...see below for a rundown of recent notable performances by Tampa Bay relievers:

- ✦ **Pete Fairbanks** (19SV) is one save shy of joining **Roberto Hernandez** (1998–2000) as the only pitchers in Rays history with three 20-save seasons...he is 4-for-4 on save opportunities over his last seven outings, and his 82 career saves are fourth most in franchise history, three shy of third-ranked **Fernando Rodney** (85SV).
- ✦ **Edwin Uceta** has allowed 0 ER over his last nine appearances (13.2IP), striking out nearly half of his batters faced (24 of 49/49.0%)...**Mason Englert** has a 1.23 ERA (14.2IP, 2ER) over his last 10 outings...**Garrett Cleavinger** has an 8.2 scoreless inning streak.
- ✦ **Ian Seymour** (1.20 ERA/15.0IP, 2ER; 16SO) 1.20 ERA (15.0IP, 2ER) is the first pitcher in Rays history with 15 strikeouts or more and a 1.20-or-better ERA through his first nine career appearances.

ICHIRO DAY—The Mariners will retire Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki's** No. 51 tonight in a pregame ceremony...of the 19-year veteran's 2,653 career games, 149 came against the Rays, tied with the Orioles for his fifth most against any opponent behind the Rangers (241G), Athletics (238G), Angels (225G) and Red Sox (150G)...he recorded the first of seven career multi-homer games on July 13, 2002 at Tropicana Field, taking **Tanyon Sturtze** deep on the first pitch of the game, the fourth of his 37 career leadoff home runs, and the third pitch of the 3rd inning...Ichiro also tallied his 53rd and final four-hit game on May 23, 2016 against the Rays in Miami during his stint with the Marlins.

EMERALD CITY SHOWDOWN—The Rays and Mariners continue the first of two sets in 2025 tonight and will reconvene Sept. 1-3 at Steinbrenner Field...the Rays are 3-1-1 in the last five season series since 2019 (clubs did not meet in 2020) after losing five straight from 2014-18...the clubs split 3-3 last season, and the home team has won the last four series (2023–pres)...the Rays are 6-4 in the last 10 matchups and 12-8 in the last 20...they have dropped five of their last six games at T-Mobile Park and are 8-19 (.296) here since 2016, their second-worst record at any AL venue in that span behind Texas' Globe Life Field (4-12/.250)...they have lost six of eight series in Seattle over that timeframe, with the wins coming from May 5-8, 2022 (3-1) and Aug. 9-11, 2019 (3-0).

- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** has multiple hits in six of his last seven games vs. the Mariners, going 11-for-28 (.393) with 1 2B, 3 HR and 8 RBI in that span.
- ✦ Mariners pitching coach **Pete Woodworth** is a St. Pete, Fla. native...pitching strategist/asst. pitching coach **Danny Farquhar** a Pembroke Pines, Fla. product, made 72 relief appearances with the Rays from 2016-17.
- ✦ **Randy Arozarena** (2019-24), **Miles Mastrobuoni** (2022) and **Luke Raley** (2022-23) are all former Rays.

TONIGHT'S START—Joe Boyle will make his fourth start as a Ray, his third since joining the starting rotation on a full-time basis and his eighth appearance of the campaign...marks his second start on the road (fourth appearance)...is three strikeouts shy of 100 for his career...min. 25.0 IP, ranks third in the AL in opp. batting average (.137)...is in his second stint with the Rays, joining April 13-14...acquired from the Athletics along with **INF Will Simpson**, **RHP Jacob Watters** and a Competitive Balance Round A selection for **LHP Jeffrey Springs** and **LHP Jacob Lopez**, Dec. 14, 2024.

LAST TIME OUT—Boyle tossed five scoreless frames of three-hit ball, but had to settle for a no-decision in the Rays 3-0 loss on Aug. 3 vs. LAD (5.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB-1IBB, 2SO, HBP)...worked around a leadoff walk and a two-out double to toss a scoreless opening frame...set down eight of 10 BF in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th innings, permitting only a hit-by-pitch and a single...intentionally walked **Shohei Ohtani** with two outs and a man in scoring position in the 5th before escaping the inning with a **Mookie Betts** fly out...departed after throwing 71 pitches (43 strikes).

- Boyle's 5.0 IP matched a season high (3x, last: July 6 at MIN)...it was his third career scoreless appearance of 5.0 IP or more, joining Aug. 19, 2024 vs. TB (6.0IP) and April 7, 2024 at DET (5.0IP).
- He registered a career-low three whiffs in the outing, but held Dodgers hitters to a combined 1-for-9 (.111) in at-bats ending with his slider (1-for-6) and split-finger (1-for-3)...opponents recorded an average exit velocity of 75.9 mph against the slider.

MARINER MATCHUP—Boyle is set for his first career start opposite Seattle...he has made one relief appearance against the Mariners, working 1.2 scoreless frames on Sept. 29, 2024 at T-Mobile Park as a member of the Athletics (1.2IP, H, OR, 2BB, 2SO, HBP)...in three career appearances (1GS) against AL West teams, Boyle is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA (11.2IP, 3ER) and a 0.94 WHIP, holding opposing hitters to a .135/.267/.243 (5-for-37) clip with 13 strikeouts (10.03 SO/9.0IP)...he tossed a quality start in his lone start against the division on Sept. 30, 2023 at LAA (W, 7.0IP, 2H, 3ER, 2BB, 6SO).

TRAVELIN' MAN—Of his 10 career appearances on the road, six have come as a starter—he is 2-3 with a 6.35 ERA (28.1IP, 20ER) in those outings, permitting four runs or more in half of them...in his lone road start this season on July 29 at NYY, he opened the game with a pair of scoreless innings before yielding three runs in both the 3rd and 4th frames (L, 3.1IP, 4H, 6R-4ER, 3BB, 6SO)...he is seeking his first win away from home since April 7, 2024 at DET.

THE ARSENAL—In addition to limiting opponents to a .149 (7-for-47) clip on his fastball, opposing hitters are 6-for-48 (.125) in at-bats ending with Boyle's slider (6-for-35) and split-finger (0-for-13)...he has generated a combined 40.0 pct. whiff rate on his secondary offerings and recorded 21 of his 26 strikeouts on those pitches...his .125 (6-for-48) opp. average against his slider and split-finger is the ninth-lowest combined mark on those two pitches in the majors and sixth-lowest in the AL (min. 40AB ending with sliders or split-fingers).

- With two strikes, opponents are 2-for-24 (.083) with 15 SO, a 46.2 pct. whiff rate and a 40.0 pct. chase rate against his slider.

ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT, ALRIGHT—Boyle has held righties to a .156 batting average (25-for-160) in his career...he has allowed just five extra-base hits, walked 20 batters and struck out 52 right-handed batters...meanwhile, lefties have hit at a .226 clip (38-for-168) against him with 16 extra-base hits, 36 walks and 45 strikeouts...has allowed just five hits (.119/5-for-42) to righties this season.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS—Boyle's first start for the Rays came in a spot start on April 13 vs. ATL...he earned his first and only win of 2025 after tossing 5.0 hitless innings (2R, 0ER) with 2 BB, 1 HBP and 7 SO...the right-hander retired 13 straight batters to open the game before allowing his first baserunner to reach via walk in the 5th inning...put out the next two batters before yielding a hit-by-pitch and a walk to end his outing.

- He became one of 22 players since 1901 to toss five hitless innings (or more) in his debut with a team and the second Ray to turn the trick (**Nathan Eovaldi** - 6.0IP on May 30, 2018 at OAK).

MINOR MATTERS—In his 15 games (14GS) with Triple-A Durham this season, Boyle pitched to a 1.85 ERA (73.0IP, 15ER), posted a 0.99 WHIP and limited opponents to a .160 (41-for-256) batting average.

- He was named International League Pitcher of the Week three times and named IL Pitcher of the Month for June...he went 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (30.0IP, 6ER), a 0.97 WHIP and a .167 (18-for-108) opp. average in six outings (5GS) during the month...was also named Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Month by the club's baseball operations department.

2024 RECAP—He went 3-6 with a 6.42 ERA (47.2IP, 34ER) and 56 SO across 13 appearances (10GS) with the Athletics...was on the 15-day IL (low back strain) from May 6-June 5...optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas following his reinstatement and recalled on Aug. 13...optioned back to Las Vegas on Sept. 4 and finished the season there.

- Limited opponents to a .164 (11-for-67) average with 26 SO against his slider compared to a .270 (27-for-100) clip with 25 SO against his fastball.
- Held opponents to a combined .200 (30-for-150) average the first and second times through the lineup compared to .414 (12-for-29) the third time through.
- On Aug. 19 vs. TB, turned in the longest scoreless outing of his career (6.0IP, 2H, OR, 3BB, 6SO) in the Rays final trip to Oakland Coliseum.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP ADRIAN HOUSER (6-3, 2.54)

LAST START—Making his Rays debut on Aug.4 at LAA, he was tagged for a season-high five runs on a career-high-tying 11 hits (2x, also: May 30, 2023 at TOR) in a 5-1 loss to the Angels (L, 5.2IP, 11H, 5ER, BB, 3SO, HR)...marked his most runs allowed since May 21, 2024 at CLE (6R) as a member of the Mets.

vs. MARINERS—Houser has made two previous starts opposite Seattle, going 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (8.0IP, 3ER), holding Mariners hitters to a .214 (6-for-28) clip with 6 SO...he has never started at T-Mobile Park.
