TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand with the 2nd of 3 games against the San Francisco Giants (1-0)...Seattle will also host the Tampa Bay Rays (3 G, Aug. 26-28) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 1-8 road trip at Detroit, Pittsburgh and Los Angeles-NL...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series opener against the Giants, securing managerial win No. 1 for **Dan Wilson**...Seattle is 53-36 (.596) when homering in a game this season...Seattle is 49-25 (.662) when scoring first in a game.

- Lil Papa** - INF **Leo Rivas** recorded his first career walk-off hit in last night's game...he has recorded 4-consecutive multi-hit games including hitting safely in 5-straight (8/17-c)...during his 5-game hitting streak, Rivas is batting .474 (9x19) with 2 runs, 1 double, 3 RBI and a 1.072 OPS.
- Walk It Off** - Last night's game was the 9th walk-off win of the season for Seattle, tied for most in MLB.
- Comeback Kids** - The Mariners rallied from a 5-1 deficit in the 8th inning of last night's game to secure their 23rd comeback win of the season...the 4-run deficit was tied for 2nd-largest overcome in a game for Seattle this season, trailing only a 5-run comeback win on August 3 vs. Philadelphia...last night's win was Seattle's 9th win of the season when entering the 8th inning trailing.
- San Francisco-Seattle Connection** - The Mariners and Giants have made 13 trades involving 23 players since 2016...current Giants that have played for Seattle include LHP Robbie Ray, C Curt Casali and C Tom Murphy (60-day IL), while Giants Manager Bob Melvin helmed the Mariners from 2003-04 and pitching coach Bryan Price spent 6 years as Mariners pitching coach (2000-05)...current Mariners who have also played for San Francisco include OF **Mitch Haniger** and RHP **Gregory Santos** (15-day IL).

6-HIT INNING...the Mariners comeback in last night's game was powered by a 4-run 8th inning in which the Mariners recorded 6 consecutive singles...the 6 hits were tied for the most in an inning this season by the Mariners (also: T-1, 7/26 at CWS, 6 H)...it was the first time the Mariners had recorded 6 consecutive hits in an inning since June 23, 2023 at Baltimore when Seattle used 6 consecutive singles to plate 7 runs in the 8th inning of a 13-1 win against the Orioles at Camden Yards.

POLO SWINGIN' IT...in 28 games since the All-Star Break second baseman **Jorge Polanco** has a .893 OPS, batting .275 (28x102) with 17 runs, 6 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks, getting on base at a .353 clip and slugging .539...his .893 OPS leads American League second basemen (min. 100 PA) in that span, ranking ahead of Brandon Lowe-TB (.805) and Marcus Semien-TEX (.739).

FOR HE'S A RALEIGH GOOD FELLOW...catcher **Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers with 27 home runs, ranking ahead of Salvador Perez-KC (22) and Shea Langeliers-OAK (22 HR)...Raleigh, who led MLB catchers with 27 HR in 2022 and 30 HR in 2023, is trying to become the first catcher to lead his position in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Hall of Famer Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons from 1999-2002...Cal's 3 consecutive 25+ homer campaigns (2022-c) make him the first catcher to accomplish the feat since Piazza did it in 8 consecutive seasons from 1995-2002.

OFF THE RALES...**Luke Raley** went 2-for-3 with 1 run, 1 home run, 2 RBI, 1 walk and 1 hit-by-pitch in last night's game, reaching base 4 times in the contest...in 16 games during the month of August, he is batting .302 (13x43) with 10 runs scored, 1 double, 5 home runs, 12 RBI, 9 walks and 3 hit-by-pitches, while reaching base at a .446 clip and slugging .674 with a 1.121 OPS...among outfielders with at least 50 PA in August, Raley's 1.121 OPS ranks 3rd-best in MLB, trailing only Aaron Judge (1.513) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.127).

QUALITY IN QUANTITY...Seattle's starting rotation leads the Majors in quality starts (78) by a wide margin, with Philadelphia (66) with the next-most...the Mariners are 52-26 (.667) when their starter delivers 6.0+ innings and allows 3-or-fewer earned runs...Seattle has 5 pitchers with 8+ quality starts this season: **Logan Gilbert** (20, most in MLB), **Luis Castillo** (17, T-8th most in MLB), **George Kirby** (16, T-10th most in MLB), **Bryce Miller** (13) and **Bryan Woo** (8), making them 1 of 2 teams with 5 players tallying at least 8 quality starts (also: Atlanta).

SNIDER 101...right-hander **Collin Snider** has surrendered only 1 earned run over his last 25 outings dating back to June 7...overall, he has made 28 appearances this season going 3-2 with 3 holds, a 0.98 ERA (3 ER, 27.2 IP), 7 walks and 32 strikeouts...Snider is 1 of 3 pitchers in franchise history to have a sub-1.50 ERA and at least 10.0 SO/9 (min. 25.0 IP), joining J.J. Putz (2007) and Mark Lowe (2015)...Snider's 0.98 ERA ranks 3rd in the Majors among pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched, trailing All-Star closer Emmanuel Clase-CLE (0.61 ERA) and Edwin Uceta-TB (0.86).

WILSON TAKES THE HELM...on Thursday it was announced that **Dan Wilson** (#6) was named the 21st manager in franchise history (18th fulltime), replacing Scott Servais...Wilson has previously served in a variety of roles within the Baseball Operations group over the past 11 seasons...he was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012 after his 14-year Major League career, including 12 with the Mariners (1994-2005)...Wilson caught more games (1,237) than any other player in franchise history, while also ranking in the top-10 in Mariners history in hits, extra-base hits, total bases, doubles, RBI and runs scored...he has appeared in 30 Postseason games with Seattle in the 1995, 1997, 2000 and 2001 playoff runs.

MARTINEZ JOINS THE COACHING STAFF...it was announced yesterday that Hall of Fame designated hitter **Edgar Martínez** was named Hitting Coach for the remainder of the 2024 season...Martinez was the Mariners hitting coach from 2015-2018, and has been an organizational hitting advisor for each of the last 6 seasons...Martinez spent his entire 18-year MLB career with the Mariners (1987-2004), including sharing 11 of those with Manager **Dan Wilson** (1994-2004) and reaching the Postseason in 4 separate seasons.

THE HOMESTAND...Seattle continues its 6-game homestand against the Giants (3 G, Aug. 23-25) and Rays (3 G, Aug. 26-28)...upcoming promotions are highlighted by **Native American Heritage Night** (Aug. 26) and 3 **Mariners Value Games** with tickets starting as low as \$10 (Aug. 26-28).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Mariners pitchers tallied 18 strikeouts in last night's game, with every pitcher who entered the game recording multiple strikeouts: **Luis Castillo** (9 K), **Troy Taylor** (2 K), **Gabe Speier** (2 K), **Andrés Muñoz** (3 K) and **Collin Snider** (2 K), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...last night's game was only the 5th time in franchise history that the Mariners have used 5+ pitchers in a game with each of them recording multiple strikeouts (also: 7/29/2011 vs. TB, 7/15/2005 vs. BAL, 7/29/2000 vs. TOR and 7/16/1995 vs. TOR)?...the 18 total strikeouts by Mariners pitchers in last night's game were their most in a game this season, and most since 7/25/23 at MIN (18 K)...overall, it was just the 14th time in franchise history that Seattle has tallied 18+ strikeouts in a game and only the 9th time in 10 innings or less.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 27th start of the season and his 1st against San Francisco...he is also making his 83rd career start and 1st against the Giants.
• Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started.
• Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.

LAST TIME OUT...W#9 on 8/18 at PIT...he pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs (2 ER) with 12 hits (1 home run), 2 walk and 5 strikeouts...his 18th time this season pitching in 6.0-or-more innings.

SEASON FORM...over his last 15 starts (5/29-c), he is 5-4 with a 2.75 ERA (27 ER, 88.1 IP) and 91 strikeouts to 13 walks...over that span, he has a 9.27 SO/9 with a 1.12 WHIP, 7.00 SO/BB and 11 quality starts.

HOME WARRIOR...In his last 9 outings in T-Mobile Park, he is 4-2 with a 1.95 ERA (12 ER, 55.1 IP) and a 0.90 WHIP...in those outings, he has 8 quality starts and has produced a SO/9 of 10.41 to a BB/9 0.98.

NO FREE RIDES...is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed (82 starts, 60 walks).

TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 1st in SO/BB (7.79) and 2nd in BB/9 (1.13) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with 1.15 BB/9 (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a 1.65 BB/9 mark.

THE NATIONAL GAME...he has made 6 starts against National League opposition this season with a 3-1 record and a 2.68 ERA (11 ER, 37.0 IP) in those outings...NL hitters are slashing .199/.227/.397 against Kirby with 38 strikeouts and 8 walks.

WALK THE WALK...among pitchers with at least 125.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby has the 2nd-fewest walks in the Majors with 19 (Zach Eflin-BAL/TB, 15)...his BB% is 3.1%, trailing Eflin (2.7%) for the best in MLB and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.

UNDER CONTROL...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 82 career starts, the 3rd-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher...he is 14 starts behind Chris Bosio for 2nd-best...has a 57-start streak with 2-or-less walks, the longest active streak in the Majors by a starting pitcher.

NO JUNE GLOOM...in his 5 starts in June, he held a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...the 1.74 ERA in June is his lowest in a month during his career...his ERA was the 2nd lowest on the Mariners (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.

A LOT OF 0s...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on 4/15 vs. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4th inning against the Astros on 5/3.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on 5/8/22, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 7.55), WHIP (3rd, 1.06), ERA (3rd, 3.38), innings pitched (4th, 471.1), wins (5th, 30) and strikeouts (8th, 453).

END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting .212 (39x184) with 6 doubles, 2 triples and 7 home runs and 44 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .222 (14x63) with 14 strikeouts.

QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 16th quality start of the season in his start at Pittsburgh on 8/18...in 2023, had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.

GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on 4/27 with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked a career-high...19 of his whiffs were fastballs.

MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a 33-19 record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 11-19.

MARINERS HISTORY...Kirby has made 82 starts in his career and tallied 453 strikeouts...even prior to today's start, he ranks 5th in Mariners franchise history for most strikeouts through a pitchers first 82 starts with the franchise.

STRIKE 24...began his outing on 8/24/22 vs. Washington by throwing 24 consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-c), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on 8/30/18 vs. STL with PIT.
