**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Yankees, 4-2, in The Bronx yesterday...New York will play 18 of its next 24 games in New York City, including tonight's game against the Yankees...Tonight, the Mets conclude a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (18-8)...The Mets are 62-12 when scoring first this season...New York is 28-7-3 in 38 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, nine-day road trip (4-5) to Atlanta (1-3), Philadelphia (3-1) and New York-AL (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets are off on Wednesday...They return home on Thursday for an 11-day, 10-game homestand, the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (four games), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

**RIGHT THE SHIP:** The Mets own a 55-27 record when facing a right-handed starting pitcher this season...As a team, the Mets are batting .266/.334/.422 against righties... Their .266 average is the best in the majors, while their .334 OBP ranks second and their .422 SLG ranks fifth...Jeff McNeil is batting .321/.370/.482 against righties this year...His .321 average is fourth in MLB.

**WALKER, NEW YORK MET:** Taijuan Walker is set to make his 22nd start of the year tonight...He is 10-3 with a 3.36 ERA (42 earned runs/112.1 innings) with 33 walks and 85 strikeouts...He has posted a 6-2 record with a 3.27 ERA (23 earned runs/63.1 innings) with 18 walks and 52 strikeouts in 12 starts on the road this year...This will be his fourth start against the American League this season...He is 2-0 with a 1.86 ERA (four earned runs/19.1 innings) with four walks and 16 strikeouts in Interleague play in 2022.

**NO MINOR THING:** Yesterday, Minor League Baseball announced that Mark Vientos of Syracuse was named Player of the Week for the International League and RHP Jesús Vargas of Binghamton was named Pitcher of the Week for the Eastern League...In the period of August 15-21, Vientos hit .448 (13-29) with nine runs, two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, a walk with a 1.294 OPS...He is on an eight-game hitting streak and has recorded a hit in 19 of his last 21 games, batting .390 (32-82) in that span with 12 extra-base hits and 20 RBI...He is ranked as the seventh-best prospect in the Mets system according to *MLB.com*...In 87 games at Triple-A this year, Vientos is batting .289/.363/.545 with 58 runs, 15 doubles, a triple, 22 home runs and 66 RBI...Vargas, 24, made one start last week and allowed a hit, a walk and struck out five in 4.0 innings...He has appeared in 22 games (12 stars) between Brooklyn and Binghamton this year and struck out 79, while walking 19 in 87.2 innings.

**PLAYOFFS?!?:** The Mets Florida Complex League team is 33-21 this season and clinched a spot in the playoffs...The team will play a one game semifinal on Thursday against a team that has yet to be determined...Should they prevail, the best-of-three games final will begin on Friday.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded 136 home runs thus far in his career... He ranks sixth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons... This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** The Mets are batting .273 with runners in scoring position this season...Their .273 average is third in the majors, while their 292 hits and 425 RBI with RISP are second...Jeff McNeil ranks fourth in the National League with a .345 (39-113) average with RISP this season...Pete Alonso has slashed .310/.424/.659 SLG with RISP this year, hitting 12 home runs and 74 RBI in those situations...His 12 home runs with RISP are the most in the majors, while his 74 RBI ranks second in the majors and tops the National League...The single-season franchise record for home runs with RISP is 15 by Todd Hundley in 1996...Three players have recorded 13 home runs with RISP - Carlos Beltran (2006), George Foster (1983) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...The single-season franchise record for RBI with RISP set by David Wright with 91 in 2006.

**SUBWAY SERIES:** The Mets are looking to win the Subway Series in back-to-back seasons for the first time...The Mets are 2-1 against the Yankees this year...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees last season, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020...Last year, the Mets earned their first season Subway Series victory since 2013, when they went 4-0 against the Yankees...The Mets and Yankees had gone .500 against one another from 2018-20.

**STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS, PLEASE:** The Mets recorded a two-game sweep of the Yankees at Citi Field from July 26-27...It marked their first two-game Subway Series sweep since May 12-13, 2014 at Yankee Stadium and the first one at Citi Field since May 27-28, 2013...The last time the Mets were swept in a two-game series by the Yankees was August 16-17, 2017 at Citi Field.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** The Mets continue Interleague play today against the Yankees...The Mets are 7-9 this year against the American League...The Mets went 9-11 in Interleague play in 2021...The team's .509 winning percentage (233-225) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

**SUBWAY CARDS:** The Mets are 29-41 in The Bronx and 16-21 since 2009...The Amazin's are 60-77 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 108-145-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

**YANKEES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won seven of their last 10 matchups against the Yankees.

**YOU LOOK FAMILIAR:** Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 149 players who have played for both clubs, including three current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, LHP Joely Rodríguez and RHP Miguel Castro...Rodríguez and Castro were traded for each other on April 3 earlier this year in what marked the 18th trade between the two clubs.

**JUICY J:** Jeff McNeil is batting .313 (35-112) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors... McNeil is second in the majors with a .353 (72-204) road batting average...He is batting .353/.400/.505 with 25 runs, 20 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 18 RBI and 12 walks in 54 games on the road this year...He leads the majors in batting average with a .410 (34-83) mark in the month of August...In 22 games this month, he is batting .410/.438/.627 with 13 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and three walks.

**TRUE AMERICAN:** Jeff McNeil owns a .338 (78-231) batting average with 33 runs, 12 doubles, seven home runs, 33 RBI, 15 walks with a .382 OBP and a .481 SLG in Interleague play...It is the highest career batting average (min. 200 PA) in Interleague play among active hitters...Starling Marte owns a .329 (217-660) average in Interleague play, the second-highest mark...Marte has recorded 113 runs, 44 doubles, 11 triples, 27 home runs, 82 RBI with a .387 OBP and a .552 SLG in Interleague play.

**CONNECT FOUR:** The Mets are 68-6 this season when scoring four or more runs...That is a .919 winning percentage, which is tied for the second-best among teams in the Live Ball era (1920 to present)...Only the 1943 Cardinals, with a .929 winning percentage (78-6), have posted a higher mark since 1920...The 1968 Orioles had the same 67-6 mark as the 2022 Mets...Courtesy of Sportradar.

**ON THE RECORD:** New York has won 79 games this season, second-most in the NL and in the majors...Their .637 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 79-45 record through the team's first 124 games...Only the 1986 (82-42) team posted a better record through the first 124 games of the season.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets are 21-10 in the second-half...The team's 21 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .677 winning percentage ranks third...The team is batting .273/.342/.445 following the All-Star break...They are second in the majors in OBP and are third in bot average and SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 155-114 following the break.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 39-26 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .600 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB...New York is batting .258/.326/.416 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average is the second-best in the NL and fourth in the majors and their .326 OBP on the road ranks fourth in the majors and third in the NL.

**fWAR WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Since the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor has hit .350/.410/.533 with 26 runs, five doubles, a triple, five home runs, 18 RBI, 12 walks, three steals with a .944 OPS...He is third in the NL in RBI with (84) and tied for fourth in runs 8... He ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.5 fWAR.

**M-V-PETE:** Pete Alonso collected his 24th game-winning RBI on Friday night, tying a Mets single-season record also held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 10 of the Mets' 21 second-half wins.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 133 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's the fifth longest-streak in franchise history.

**LIFE IN THE FAST LANE:** Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 97 strikeouts...That is 19 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 49.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings... Courtesy of Elias.

**BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS:** Díaz has struck out 51.3% of batters faced (97/189), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 49 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.70 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 28 saves, a 1.46 ERA (8 ER/49.1 IP), allowing 29 hits and 15 walks...The Mets are 43-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

### WALKER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 2.0 scoreless innings against the Braves at Truist park on August 16th before exiting the game with back spasms.

**ROAD IMPROVEMENT:** In 12 road starts this season, Walker is 6-2 with a 3.27 ERA (23 ER/63.1 IP)...His six road wins are tied for sixth in the NL and tied for 10th in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 ER /68.0 IP) in 14 road starts...His six road wins are one shy of tying his career-high set in 2015 with the Mariners.

**FEW Ks, THAT'S OK:** Through 21 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.81 and an ERA of 3.36...Cole Irvin (3.33 ERA, 5.79 K/9) and Miles Mikolas (3.32 ERA, 6.75 K/9) are the only other pitchers with an ERA under 3.50 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 20 starts)...His six quality starts with five strikeouts or fewer are tied the 11th-most in the National League...Walker's 85 strikeouts through his first 21 outings are tied with Cole Irvin for the fewest through a pitcher's first 21 starts this season with a sub-3.50 ERA (Min. 100.0 IP)...Since 2015, Walker's 85 strikeouts are tied for the seventh-fewest by a pitcher with a sub-3.50 ERA through their first 21 outings of the season (Min. 100.0 IP).

**BATTLES AGAINST THE BOMBERS:** In seven career starts against the Yankees, Walker is 2-3 with a 4.14 ERA (17 earned runs/37.0 innings)...In three career Subway Series starts, Walker is 2-0 with a 5.09 ERA (10 ER/17.2 IP) with 16 strikeouts and 4 walks...Walker made his Subway Series debut on July 3, 2021 at Yankee Stadium...In that start, Walker earned the victory after allowing two runs on two hits five over 5.2 innings with five strikeouts... This season, Waker earned the win over the Yankees on July 26 at Citi Field after allowing three earned runs on seven hits over 6.0 innings with three strikeouts.

**INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** This season, Walker is 2-0 with a 1.86 ERA (4 ER/19.1 IP) in three interleague starts, all quality starts...Walker 'a 1.86 ERA in interleague play ranks seventh among NL pitchers and 12th among all major league pitchers with at least 15.0 innings in interleague play...On June 12, Walker struck out a season-high 10 batters against the Angels in his first interleague start of the season...Was his highest strikeout total in 20 career interleague games...On June 29, Walker tossed 7.1 scoreless innings against the Astros, tied for his longest career start in interleague play (Also: 8/5/15 at COL w/SEA) and tied for his longest outing as a member of the Mets (Also: 9/29/21 vs. MIA).

**FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF:** In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

**SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS:** In 21 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .187 (29-155) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...41 of Walker's 85 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

**LIMITING LEFTIES:** Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .213 (85-400) average, the 17th-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 400 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .232 (352-1517) average, 14th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

**NICE TRY:** Walker is tied for the major-league with Robbie Ray and Merrill Kelly with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall with Max Fried in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

- Ended a 14-game homerless streak with his 30th blast of the season on August 19 at Philadelphia, making him the fifth Met ever with three 30-homer seasons.
- Also reached the 100-RBI mark on August 19...He is the seventh player in Mets history with multiple 30-100 seasons...He is the fourth-fastest Met to reach 100 RBI in a season, getting to the century-mark in 119 games.
- Has six home runs and 16 RBI in 19 career games against the Yankees...Tied for fourth among Mets all-time in homers vs. the Yankees.
- Has 11 go-ahead RBI and 10 game-winning RBI in 31 games since the break...Leads the majors with 24 game-winning RBI and 32 go-ahead RBI this season... He has tied the Mets record for game-winning RBI (also, Keith Hernandez, 1985).
