TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 4, 2008: In the bottom of the third, Hideki Matsui (HR), Jose Molina (double), Derek Jeter (triple) and Alex Rodriguez (single) hit for a team cycle vs. Tampa Bay. Jason Giambi adds another double in the 4R inning, but the Yankees lose, 13-4.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 5, 2005: Derek Jeter hits his only career regular season "walk-off" HR, breaking a 3-3 tie vs. Boston with a ninth-inning solo shot off Keith Foulke.

April 5, 1977: The Yankees acquire shortstop Bucky Dent from the Chicago White Sox for Oscar Gamble, LaMarr Hoyt, Bob Polinsky and cash.

April 5, 1913: The Yankees lose to the Brooklyn Dodgers, 3-2 in an exhibition game at Ebbets Field, marking the stadium's first contest.

MONDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 6, 2014: Derek Jeter ties and passes Paul Molitor (3,319) for eighth on the all-time hits list with singles in the 3rd and 4th innings off Blue Jays starter Drew Hutchison.

April 6, 1973: At Fenway Park, the Yankees' Ron Blomberg becomes the Major League's first designated hitter. Batting in the top of the first inning, he walks with the bases loaded off Luis Tiant. He goes 1-for-3 with 1 RBI as the Yankees lose to the Red Sox, 15-5.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the second game of their three-game set vs. Miami tonight (1-0 thus far)...is part of a six-game homestand, also featuring a three-game series against the Athletics (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 5-1 on their season-opening road trip after sweeping San Francisco in a three-game series and going 2-1 at Seattle.

- ▶ **The Yankees are a Major League-best 6-1 to start the season**, matching their second-best start through their first seven *decisions* in franchise history (went 7-0 to start the 1933 season)...marks just the third time in the last 23 years (since 2004), ninth time in the last 68 years (since 1959) and the 14th time in franchise history the Yankees started a season with a record of 6-1 or better through their first seven *decisions* (went 7-0 in 1933 and 6-1 in 1927, '49, '56, '58, '86, '88, '92, '99, 2002, '03, '20 and '24).
- ▶ *With a win tonight*, would match their best start through their first eight *decisions* in franchise history (started 7-1 in nine previous seasons: 1933, '49, '56, '58, '88, '99, 2002, '03 and '20)...would mark just the second time in the last 23 years (since 2004) and the sixth time in the last 68 years (since 1959) the club has started 7-1.
- ▶ Are in a stretch of playing 13-of-16 games at home (4/3-19)...are 1-0 so far.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees played their 124th home opener in franchise history and defeated the Marlins, 8-2...

RHP Will Warren (5.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, OBB, 6K, 2HR) started and earned his first win of the season...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB, 1HP, 1SB) drove in three runs and hit his third home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the first inning...**1B Ben Rice** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI) drove in three runs, hitting a solo HR in the seventh inning and a two-run double in the eighth inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (0-for-2, 1R, 1RBI, 3BB) recorded a career-high-tying 3BB, including a bases-loaded walk in the second inning...**Yankees batters** recorded 11BB...**LHP Tim Hill** (0.1IP), **RHP Jake Bird** (1.0IP, 2K), **LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 2K) and **LHP Ryan Yarbrough** (1.0IP) combined to toss 3.1 scoreless innings of relief.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have allowed only 8R total over their first seven games, matching the fewest runs allowed by any Major League team through their first seven games of a season** (also 8R by the 2002 San Francisco Giants and 1993 Atlanta Braves).

- ▶ Yankees pitchers have allowed only 12BB over their first seven games, posting a 1.73 BB/9.0IP ratio...**marks only the third time in the last 116 years (since 1911) and the sixth time in franchise history the Yankees have allowed 12-or-fewer walks over their first seven games of a season** (10BB in 1978, 10BB in 1968, 6BB in 1910, 10BB in 1909 and 9BB in 1903).
- ▶ Yankees pitchers allowed 2HR on Friday, their first home runs of the season...snapped their season-opening six-game streak without a HR...was their longest season-opening streak in 83 years (since 1944)...their 2HR allowed are their fewest in their first seven games of the season in the last 23 years (since 2004)...marks only the third time in the last 45 years (since 1982) the Yankees have allowed 2HR-or-fewer over their first seven games (1HR in 2002 and 2HR in 2003).
- ▶ Lead the Majors in ERA (1.16), opponents' BA (.168), opponents' OBP (.221), opponents' SLG (.223), opponents' OPS (.444), WHIP (0.79), BB/9.0IP (1.73) and K/BB (5.42), and rank second in HR/9.0IP (0.29, second in AL).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have allowed only 4R total through the club's first seven games, matching the fewest runs by any Major League team's starting rotation through their first seven games of a season since 1900 (also the 2018 Boston Red Sox and 1993 Atlanta Braves)**...their 0.92 ERA (39.1IP, 4ER) is also the fifth-lowest by any Major League team through their first seven games since ER became an official stat in 1913...trail only the Atlanta Braves' 0.65 ERA in 1993, Philadelphia Phillies' 0.71 ERA in 1915, Chicago Cubs' 0.79 ERA in 1963 and Boston Red Sox's 0.86 ERA in 2018.

- ▶ **Yankees starters** have allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of the Yankees' seven games...marks only the second time in franchise history the Yankees starting rotation has accomplished the feat (also 1911).
- ▶ Have held opponents to a .153/.200/.219 (21-for-137) slash line...have allowed only 5XBH to 145BF (3 doubles, 2HR), the fewest in the Majors.
- ▶ Lead the Majors in ERA (0.92), opponents' SLG (.219), opponents' OPS (.419), BB/9.0IP (1.37) and WHIP (0.69), rank second in opponents' BA (.153, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.200, second in AL) and K/BB (6.83, second in AL), and third in HR/9.0IP (0.46).

STARTING OFF STRONG: Since 2017, the Yankees have gone a Major League-best 135-90 (.600) in March/April.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge drove in three runs on Friday vs. Miami...hit his third home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the first inning and was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the second inning.

- ▶ His 20 first-inning home runs in 2025 were the most by any player in the first inning in a single season in Major League history...since 2024, 39 of his 114HR have come in the first inning...his 86 career HR in the first inning are the third-most in franchise history, trailing only Babe Ruth (126) and Mickey Mantle (103).
- ▶ Since the start of 2019, 138 of his 288HR have tied the game (21) or given the Yankees the lead (117).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice drove in three runs on Friday vs. Miami, hitting a solo HR in the seventh inning and a two-run double in the eighth inning...**has reached base multiple times in each of his last three games...has reached base safely in 9-of-13PA over that span, going 6-for-10 with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI and 3BB.**

- ▶ Has homered in back-to-back games for the third time in his career (also 2G from 3/30-4/1/25 and 8/25-27/25).
- ▶ Has hit safely in each of his six games this season, batting .409/.500/.864 (9-for-22) with 7R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 8RBI and 4BB.
- ▶ **His 1.364 OPS ranks second in the AL and third in the Majors**...is also tied for first in the Majors in XBH (six, tied for first in AL), tied for fourth in RBI (tied for first in AL), tied for fifth in OBP (third in AL) and runs scored (tied for fourth in AL), sixth in SLG (fourth in AL), tied for sixth in BA (third in AL) and tied for seventh in total bases (sixth in AL).

FAN-TASTIC: Friday's paid attendance of 48,788 marked the second-largest paid attendance in the regular season at the current Yankee Stadium in the last 12 seasons with full attendance (since 2014, excluding 2020), trailing only the club's paid attendance of 49,217 on 8/23/22 vs. the Mets...also marked the fourth-largest paid attendance in the Yankees' Home Opener at the current Yankee Stadium, trailing only the club's paid attendance of 49,514 on Opening Day in 2013 vs. Boston, 49,386 in the Home Opener in 2012 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 49,293 in the Home Opener in 2010 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger reached base twice on Friday vs. Miami...has reached base in six of seven games this season, batting .280/.400/.400 (7-for-25) with 6R, 1 double, 1 triple, 5BB and 2SB.

WALK IT OUT: Yankees batters recorded 11BB on Friday vs. Miami after recording only 16BB over their first six games of the season...marked only the third time in the last three seasons (since 2024) the Yankees recorded as many walks in a game (also 11BB on 8/12/25 vs. Minnesota and 8/12/24 at Chicago-AL).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners recorded 5SB on Friday vs. Miami...**have recorded 115B through their first seven games, marking only the fourth time in the last 111 years (since 1916) they have recorded as many stolen bases through their first seven games of a season** (115B in 2023, 115B in 1989, 125B in 1969)...marks only the ninth time in franchise history the Yankees have accomplished the feat...their 115B are the second-most in the Majors this season, trailing only Milwaukee (15).

- ▶ With **INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** and **INF José Caballero** each stealing two bases on Friday vs. Miami, it marked only the second time in the last nine years (since 2018) the Yankees had multiple players steal multiple bases in the same game (also Jasson Dominguez and Anthony Volpe each stole two bases on 8/1/25 at Miami).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers tossed 3.1 scoreless innings of relief on Friday vs. Miami...have allowed only 4R in 23.0 innings this year, posting a 1.57 ERA...are one of three bullpens in the Majors to not allow a HR this year (also Los Angeles-AL and St. Louis)...rank second in the Majors in opponents' SLG (.229, first in AL), third in ERA (first in AL), opponents' OBP (.256, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.484, first in AL), fourth in WHIP (0.96, first in AL), tied for fourth in K/BB (4.00, third in AL) and fifth in opponents' BA (.193, first in AL).

- ▶ **LHP Tim Hill** retired his only batter faced on Friday vs. Miami...has retired 10-of-11BF this year over 3.2 scoreless innings (1H, 3K).
- ▶ **RHP Jake Bird** tossed a scoreless seventh inning on Friday vs. Miami (2K)...has retired 13-of-14BF and gone 1-0 over 4.1 scoreless innings this year (1H, 5K).
- ▶ **LHP Brent Headrick** tossed a scoreless eighth inning on Friday vs. Miami (2K)...has struck out 7-of-19BF over 4.1 scoreless innings this year.
- ▶ **RHP Fernando Cruz** has retired 6-of-7BF in three games this year (1BB, 3K).
- ▶ **RHP David Bednar** has gone 3-for-3 in save opportunities.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP RYAN WEATHERS (0-0, 2.08 ERA)

LHP Ryan Weathers will make his second start of the season tonight vs. Miami...the 26-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest...made his Yankees debut on Monday at Seattle, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR)...in five spring training appearances (four starts), went 1-3 with a 8.83 ERA (17.1IP, 27H, 18R/17ER, 4BB, 21K, 4HR)...went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Miami Marlins in 2025...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 7-8 with a 3.69 ERA (129.1IP, 119H, 60R/53ER, 38BB, 124K, 18HR) in 25 starts during that stretch, allowing 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of those starts...since 2021, his 17 pickoffs are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors...has pitched in over parts of six Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2021-23), Miami Marlins (2023-25) and the Yankees (2026)...has made four career Opening Day rosters (2021 and '23 with San Diego, '24 with Miami and '26 with the Yankees)...began the 2025 season on the injured list...is the son of David Weathers, who pitched in parts of 19 seasons in the Majors (1991-2009), including two seasons with the Yankees from 1996-97, where he won the World Series with the club in '96...became the fifth father/son duo in Yankees history to both play for the club, joining Clay Bellinger and Cody Bellinger, Mark Leiter and Mark Leiter Jr., Ron Davis and Ike Davis, and Yogi Berra and Dale Berra...was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Miami from San Diego in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper, RHP Sean Reynolds and cash considerations on 8/1/23...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami in exchange for OF Dillon Lewis, OF Brendan Jones, INF Dylan Jasso and INF Juan Matheus on 1/13/26.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his Yankees debut on Monday at Seattle, allowing only 1R/ER over 4.1IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR).

HOME SWEET HOME: Made three starts at home with the Marlins in 2025, going 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA (16.0IP, 15H, 5R/ER, 3BB, 15K, 2HR)...tossed at least 5.0 innings in all three starts...allowed 1R-or-fewer in two of his three starts.

VS. MIAMI: Has made three career starts vs. Miami (all with San Diego), going 0-1 with a 6.39 ERA (12.2IP, 16H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 15K, 4HR).

- ✦ Spent parts of three seasons with the Marlins (2023-25), going 7-10 with a 4.11 ERA (138.0IP, 128H, 70R/63ER, 48BB, 131K, 21HR) in 27 games (26 starts) with his former club...was acquired by Miami from San Diego in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper, RHP Sean Reynolds and cash considerations on 8/1/23.

GRAPEFRUIT JUICE: In five spring training appearances (four starts), went 1-3 with a 8.83 ERA (17.1IP, 27H, 18R/17ER, 4BB, 21K, 4HR).

2025: Went 2-2 with a 3.99 ERA (38.1IP, 37H, 20R/17ER, 12BB, 37K, 7HR) in eight starts with the Marlins...missed the majority of the season due to two injured list stints (3/24-5/14, 6/9-9/11)...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 1ER-or-fewer in four of his starts.

- ✦ Missed the first 41 games of the season on the injured list...was placed on the 15-day I.L. on 3/27 (retroactive to 3/24) with a left flexor muscle strain...combined to make three rehab starts with Single-A Jupiter and Triple-A Jacksonville, going 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 4BB, 13K, 0HR)...was reinstated from the I.L. on 5/14.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 5/14 at Chicago-NL and earned the win (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR).
- ✦ Went 1-0 with a 1.15 ERA (15.0IP, 2ER) and 15K over his first three starts (5/14-26).
- ✦ Was placed on the 60-day I.L. on 6/9 (left lat strain), missing 83 team games...made two rehab starts with Triple-A Jacksonville, posting a 2.45 ERA (7.1IP, 9H, 2R/ER, 3BB, 9K, 1HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated on 9/11.

WEATHERS REPORT: Over the last three seasons (2024-26), has gone 7-8 with a 3.69 ERA (129.1IP, 119H, 60R/53ER, 38BB, 124K, 18HR) in 25 starts...during that stretch, has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of those 25 starts.

- ✦ Has limited left-handed batters to a .225/.307/.363 (23-for-102) slash line with 5 doubles, 3HR and 10BB over that stretch.
- ✦ Has posted a 46.0% groundball percentage over the last three seasons (2024-26).

CAREER NOTES: Has pitched in parts of six Major League seasons with the San Diego Padres (2021-23), Miami Marlins (2023-25) and Yankees (2026), going 12-23 with one save and a 4.89 ERA (285.1IP, 294H, 165R/155ER, 101BB, 242K, 50HR) in 71 career appearances (56 starts)...made his MLB debut in the postseason in 2020 NLDS Game 1 at Los Angeles-NL.

- ✦ Since 2021, his 17 pickoffs are tied for the fourth-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Is the son of David Weathers, who pitched in parts of 19 seasons in the Majors (1991-2009), including two seasons with the Yankees from 1996-97, where he won the World Series with the club in '96 after going 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) in seven postseason games that year...became the fifth father/son duo in Yankees history to both play for the club, joining Clay Bellinger and Cody Bellinger, Mark Leiter and Mark Leiter Jr., Ron Davis and Ike Davis, and Yogi Berra and Dale Berra.
- ✦ Has made the postseason once with San Diego (2020)...at 20 years, 294 days old, made his Major League debut in 2020 NLDS Game 1 at Los Angeles-NL...is one of six players in Major League history to debut in the postseason and was the second-youngest to ever debut in the playoffs (Kansas City's Adalberto Mondesi did so at 20 years, 95 days in 2015).
- ✦ Was originally selected by the San Diego Padres in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...had committed to Vanderbilt University before signing with San Diego.

WEATHERS' CAREER STARTS VS. MIAMI
