HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs are facing the Padres in the season-opening series for the fourth time, having won 2 of the 4 series (2002: 2-1 at home...2010: 2-1 at home...2020: 1-3 on the road).

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 12 of his last 16 road games since last Aug. 10 at a .409 clip (27-for-66)/1.133 OPS with 9 doubles, 3 homers and 10 RBI.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** has hit in 5 straight games vs. Padres, since Aug. 15, 2020, at a .545 clip (12-for-22)/1.455 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 4 RBI.

PERDOMO DEBUTS: Geraldo Perdomo made his Major League debut last night...entered the game at shortstop in the eighth inning...in the ninth, struck out in his first at-bat.

- ◆ At 21 years-163 days, tied for the sixth youngest D-back at the time of their Major League debut [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

THE SCOOP ON PERDOMO: The 21-year-old infielder entered 2021 rated as the D-backs’ No. 3 prospect by MLB.com and *Baseball America* and the D-backs’ Best Defensive Infielder for the third consecutive year (2019-21) by *Baseball America*.

- ◆ As a child, looked up to Cal Ripken Jr...his favorite more recent shortstops are Nick Ahmed and Brandon Crawford, for their defensive prowess.
- ◆ Credits his big league aspirations in large part to his late relative, Yewri Guillen, who passed away at 18 years of age just months after signing a professional baseball contract with the Nationals...as told to The Athletic:
 - "I want to make it there for him. To make his dream come true, to represent him our there on the diamond. I have no doubt that I can make it.
- ◆ Guillen also suggested Perdomo play shortstop after primarily pitching:
 - "I loved being a pitcher. I'm a shortstop because of him."

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs, fourth in the organization.

- In 2019, D-backs No. 3 prospect by MLB.com and No. 7 by *Baseball America*...in 2018, No. 4 prospect for both.
- Acquired from the Yankees on Feb. 20, 2018, as part of a 3-team deal with the Rays.
- Yankees' 12th-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of South Carolina (2014-16).

MEDIA GUIDE NOTES: His hometown of Aiken, S.C. also produced William "Refrigerator" Perry and professional wrestler Big Show.

- Spent the last 2 offseasons - 2019/20 and '20/21 - working on the grounds crew at a Scottsdale golf course.
- As a kid, did lawn maintenance around his neighborhood.
- His favorite player was Chipper Jones.

FIRST STARTING NOD: Making his first career start.

- Made 12 relief appearances last year in his debut season.
- Made his Major League debut on July 25, 2020, @ Padres and tossed 1.2 scoreless frames (1 BB, 1 K).
- From 2018-19, went 11-15 with a 5.01 ERA (132 ER in 237.1 IP) in a combined 49 games (48 starts) between Triple-A Reno (2019) and Double-A Jackson (2018).

VS. PADRES: First career start, fourth career game.

- Third career game @ Padres...debuted on July 25, 2020.
- Had 3 relief outings (5 ER in 5.1 IP) last season with an .167 opponent average (3-for-18), 6 walks and 8 strikeouts.

SPRING TRAINING: In 4 Cactus League games (2 starts), went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER in 14.2 IP), .218 opponent average, 3 walks and 19 strikeouts.

2020 RECAP: In 12 relief appearances, went 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (10 ER in 20.0 IP), .192 opponent average and 22 strikeouts.

- Opponents hit .191 (9-for-47) off his 4-seam fastball and .167 (2-for-12) off his slider.
- Had 6 strikeouts on Aug. 9 @ Padres (3.0 IP) and Aug. 18 vs. A's (3.0 IP), 1 shy of the club record for a reliever in 3.0 innings or fewer.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

D-BACKS ADDITIONAL HOME OPENER TICKETS ON SALE: The D-backs expanded the capacity at Chase Field to approximately 20,000 fans per game beginning with the home opener on April 9 vs. Reds and those additional seats went on sale today at 9:00 a.m.

KETEL & THE FRIARS: Ketel Marte, since Sept. 4, 2018, has hit safely in 23 of 29 games vs. Padres at a .383 clip (46-for-120)/1.056 OPS with 11 doubles, 1 triple, 7 homers, 20 RBI and 3 walks.

- ◆ Has hit safely in 15 of 19 road game during that span at a .363 clip (29-for-80)/.993 OPS with 8 doubles, 4 homers and 7 RBI.

KETEL FROM THE LEFT SIDE: Ketel Marte, when batting left-handed, is hitting .778 (7-for-9) with 1 double, 2 home runs and 3 RBI.

- In 2020, hit .233 with 7 doubles, 1 homer, 14 RBI and 6 walks.
- In 2019, hit .328 with 25 doubles, 8 triples, 20 homers, 61 RBI and 46 walks.

KETEL AT HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Ketel Marte, in 102 road games since 2019, is hitting .321 (132-for-411)/.948 OPS with 29 doubles, 3 triples, 22 homers, 65 RBI and 37 walks.

- ◆ Among all players on the road since 2019 (min. 400 PA), ranks third with a .321 average, tied for third with 132 hits, tied for fifth with 54 extra-base hits, sixth with 233 total bases and seventh with a .948 OPS.

LOCASTRO TIES A RECORD (SINCE 1951): **Tim Locastro's** steal of second base in the seventh inning on April 2 @ Padres was his 27th straight stolen base to start his career, matching Tim Raines (1979-81) for the longest streak to start a career since 1951.

PINCH HITTERS: D-backs pinch hitters are batting .500 (4-for-8) with 1 run scored, 1 homer and 2 RBI.

- ◆ The other 12 NL teams with pinch plate appearances have a combined 7 pinch-hits (1 double, 3 homers).

ASDRÚBAL ON A ROLL: **Asdrúbal Cabrera** has hit safely in 12 of his last 16 games, since Sept. 10, 2020, batting .321 (18-for-56) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers and 13 RBI.
