IN MEMORIAM




JEFF TRUNDY May 6, 1950 - December 20, 2024

A true baseball lifer, Jeff Trundy had baseball running through his veins. Originally from Maine, Jeff played baseball at the University of New Hampshire, and his coaching in the Cape Cod Baseball League (CCBL) is legendary. In 2013, he was inducted into the Maine Baseball Hall of Fame. Following a brief period of college coaching and MLB scouting, he started his CCBL career in 1997 as an assistant coach for the Cotuit Kettleers. Two years later, in 1999, he was named head coach of the Falmouth Commodores. Jeff was one of the most respected coaches in CCBL history according to former players and fans. His "real" job was teaching science at the prestigious Frederick Gunn School in Connecticut, where he was the head baseball coach. Amidst all the success and respect that Jeff earned, he remained extremely humble. In his words, "it's all about the kids". His efforts as a coach were to let these young players develop and mature at their own pace. He felt that all players recruited to play in the CCBL have talent, and it was not his role to change the manner in which they had been able to achieve their success. He was frequently quoted as saying how "blessed" he was by all the friendships he had made and his involvement in such a great organization as the Commodores. Jeff achieved his 500th CCBL win in 2022. In 2024, he was voted the Coach of the Year and was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame. Following a long illness, sadly Jeff succumbed in December 2024. His uniform number, 19, will be retired along with that of only one other Commodore, Arnie Allen.

The Falmouth Commodores welcome new head coach, Jarrod (Salty) Saltalamacchia. Salty is well known to Boston area baseball fans, as he played for the Red Sox for 4 years, including the 2013 World Series champion team.

Salty is a lifelong baseball guy. He grew up in Florida where he was drafted by the Atlanta Braves out of high school in 2003. He spent 3 years in the minor leagues before breaking into the major leagues in 2007. After a brief stint with the Texas Rangers during their 2010 World Series win, he was traded to the Red Sox. As a catcher, Salty was initially mentored by Jason Varitek where he learned "The Art of The Game". Following the Red Sox World Series win in 2013, Salty played for a few Major League Baseball (MLB) teams before retiring in 2018. His MLB career average was 232, with 110 home runs and 381 RBIs. Salty's next career move took him to The Kings Academy in West Palm Beach, FL, where he is currently coaching. He also served as Head Coach of the MLB Draft Combine in 2021 and 2022. From 2022 through 2024, he was an assistant coach with the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod Baseball League, during which the team won two League championships, in 2022 and 2023. Salty, who earned a BS degree in Business and Leadership from Northeastern University, has a long-term goal of becoming a fulltime college baseball coach. Salty has a passion for the game and inspires his players to play at a higher level, and manifest success. Earning players trust by creating an "in the moment' culture and allowing their abilities to take shape throughout the summer. His hands on approach and delegation of his great coaching staff gives players a greater appreciation for the game and a different voice to help them (players) understand and develop their skills further. Salty and his wife, Ashley, have four daughters, and two (girl) dogs.

FALMOUTH COMMODORES' 2024 SEASON IN REVIEW

Mountains and valleys painted the landscape of the 2024 season for the Falmouth Commodores.

Win drought troubles plagued the Commodores for much of the season. The season opened at McKeon Park on June 15 unfavorably. The Hyannis Harbor Hawks mercied the Commodores 10-0 per the new Cape League 10-runs after seven innings mercy rule that was added this summer.

"Games like that

happen, we just got to flush it out early," Christian Martin (Virginia Tech) said on June 15.

Three days later Falmouth clenched its first win at Guv Fuller Filed over the Brewster Whitecaps to sit at 1-3. They didn't see another win for another eight days over the Orleans Firebirds, again at home to be 2-8.

"It was sticking to our game plan," Luke Gaffney (Purdue) said on June 18. "We've been in those close situations, we just needed to execute the past few days and today we hit some balls."

The Commodores didn't see an away win for 27 days until a rainmakeup game at Spillane Field against the Wareham Gateman to become 8-14. 24 days later the season closed in Wareham for the 40th game with the Gateman taking it 9-5 on August 4 to give Falmouth a 16-23-1 finish.

The Commodores defended their home diamond through and through. They went 12-8 when at the Guv and home win streaks went as long as four games. Wins always felt sweeter for this team after all the struggling and clawing at proving themselves.

Falmouth pulled a handful of upsets. Two extra sweet ones were versus the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox at the Guv and versus the

Chatham Anglers at Veterans Field.

Riley Stanford (Georgia Tech) pulled the save for Falmouth when Y-D was in town on July 29. The Commodores pulled to a 4-2 lead with an RBI single from Gavin Turley (Oregon State) and a balk from Dylan Delvecchio (St. Mary's) to hand the reigns off to Stanford to close it out with a 1-2-3 inning.

Veterans Field wasn't forgiving to Falmouth the first time it visited, but the second time was a more favorable story. The Commodores won 9-2 on July 23 after accumulating nine hits, two home runs and nine runs.

"Not trying to put too much pressure on each other is the biggest thing for us," Dylan Carey (Nebraska) said on July 23. "Having that trust in each other and the will to win is what has helped us hop on this little bit of a winning streak."

Regardless of the outcomes, this Falmouth team had each other's backs and never had a dull moment. Comradery and charisma were a big part of the 2024 Commodores.

"We battle, we love each other, that's for sure," Isaiah Barkett (Stetson) said on July 19. "That's what's the most fun about this group is how tight we are."

2024 CCBL HALL OF FAME

To become a hall of famer, regardless of profession or occupation, is something special. If you took every player who wore an MLB jersey during its 150-year lifetime, the

group still wouldn't fill the league's smallest stadium to capacity. Now head over to Cooperstown, and you will find out that less than two percent of those players ever make it to the hall of fame.

The Cape Cod Hall is not Cooperstown, but there isn't a soul on earth that underestimates the talent that finds itself scattered among

America's premiere collegiate summer league haven every season. Since its inception, the CCBL has produced more than 1,600 major leaguers, multiple MLB award winners, and 6 of the 351 players with a plaque in Cooperstown. However, what gives the Cape's Hall of Fame its charm is the inductees that never threw a pitch, swung a bat, or came sliding headfirst into home plate, it's the inductees that have made Cape Cod as much a destination for players as it is summer tourists. But, if you're a Commodore, last year you got the best of both worlds, as we saw one of the greatest hitters in CCBL history inducted alongside his manager, who in his own right is on the Mt. Rushmore of Cape Cod baseball coaching.

Todd Cunningham was inducted as a part of the 2024 class, and looking back on his career in Falmouth, it's clear only one question has gone unanswered: what took so long? In 2009, the Jacksonville State alumni was an everyday hit machine, taking home the Thurman Munson batting title (.392 batting average) while also leading the league in hits and on-base percentage. These numbers achieved him a first team All-league selection

and the Pro prospect of the year award. Stats like these are what led to him becoming a second-round choice of the Atlanta Braves where he enjoyed Major League action in three different seasons.

What made this such a special ceremony for Commodore fans everywhere, was not that a former player was inducted, not even that a player and

a manager were getting in, but that they donned the burgundy and black at the same time. Cunningham was joined by not only his manager, but a man who many would consider a cornerstone of the league for nearly a quarter century. Coach Trundy needs no introduction. You can count on one hand the number of Cape Cod coaches to amass 500 wins, and to nobody's surprise, Trundy is one of them. "Gentleman Jeff" was known throughout the league as a pioneer for amateur baseball, as his output extends far beyond the Cape. In 2013, he was inducted into the Maine Baseball Hall of Fame after a 20-year coaching career at Cony High School. Although Coach Trundy is no longer with us, his thumbprint on Cape Cod baseball will never be forgotten.

In 2024, these two joined 24 other distinguished Commodore individuals, all of whom have left lasting impressions on our league as players, coaches, or league officers.







FALMOUTH COMMODORES 2024 MLB DRAFTEES

Falmouth's 2024 draft class was headlined by two of the best players on the board – Travis Bazzana and Charlie Condon.

Bazzana was drafted No. 1 overall by the Cleveland Guardians. In three years at Oregon State, his numbers jumped off the charts. Starting over 60 games each season, the Australian native finished with a .360 average, 45 home runs and 165 RBIs. He also posted a whopping .660 slugging and .497 on base percentage. The second baseman heightened his skills with the Commodores in 2023, hitting .371 and finishing with the same amount of strikeouts as walks (18). Condon was just as impressive with Georgia, leading to his selection at No. 3 overall to the Colorado Rockies. With the Bulldogs, Condon developed into one of the best power hitters in the country. In his redshirt sophomore season last year, he hit .433 while blasting 37 home runs, finishing with a 1.009 slugging percentage. The Marietta, Georgia, native played just 11 games with Falmouth in 2023, but still drove in 10 runs and produced 12 hits.

At the 2024 MLB Draft, Falmouth was well represented. Of the 615 players drafted, 24 were Falmouth Commodores, with 5 in the first round. 197, or 32%, of all the draftees were from the CCBL.



JARROD SALTALAMACCHIA FIELD MANAGER



Coach Saltalamacchia, also known as "Salty," spent more than 12 seasons in Major League Baseball and has extensive coaching experience as well as Cape Cod Baseball League experience. Saltalamacchia was drafted straight out of high school in the first round of the 2003 MLB Draft by the Atlanta

Braves. While with the Braves, he won the 2005 Minor League Player of the Year and was a Minor League All-Star. During those years, he also competed and won three gold medals with Team USA in 2001, 2002 and 2005.

From 2007-2010, Saltalamacchia played for the Texas Rangers before being traded to the Boston Red Sox. He helped the Red Sox win the 2013 World Series. That same year, he was named the Palm Beach County Professional Player of the Year. Saltalamacchia also had stints with the Miami Marlins, Arizona Diamondbacks, Detroit Tigers and Toronto Blue Jays before retiring in 2019.

For the past three years, coach Saltalamacchia had served as an assistant coach with the Bourne Braves. He has also served as the head varsity coach for The King's Academy over the past five years after joining them as the varsity baseball assistant coach in the 2018-19 season.

Saltalamacchia was just recently named an inductee in the 2020 Palm Beach County Sports Hall of Fame.

BEAU MCMILLAN ASSISTANT HEAD COACH



Beau McMillan is in his fourth season as associate head coach at Palm Beach Atlantic University and his sixth year as head coach for the Delray Beach Lightning. McMillan spent a total of six seasons on the coaching staff at his alma mater, Lynn University, in Boca Raton, Fla., which

included being a part of the staff for the Fighting Knights' NCAA Division II National Championship team in 2009. In his first year coaching LU, he oversaw eight team offensive records shattered as LU won its first national title. The Knights broke marks for at-bats, hits, runs batted in, total bases, runs, walks, on-base percentage and sacrifice flies while also finishing in the top three for doubles, slugging percentage, sacrifice hits, batting average and home runs.

The only player in program history to garner First Team All-Sunshine State Conference accolades twice, McMillan left LU with program records for doubles (49), total bases (394), runs scored (200) and stolen bases (77). He also finished in the top five for games played (196) and started (194), hits (251), at-bats (758), triples (8), home runs (26) and runs batted in (119).

McMillan began his professional career with the Gulf Coast League Marlins before being twice promoted to the Jamestown Jammers of the New York Penn League and the Greensboro Grasshoppers of the South Atlantic League. He later advanced to the Marlins' Triple-A affiliate, the Albuquerque Isotopes.

Following his playing career, he worked with Perfect Competition, a company that promotes performance enhancement, skill and professional development, and sports nutrition.

A 2004 graduate with a degree in business administration, McMillan resides in Delray Beach.



QUINN STROMBERG



A four-year starter at Villanova, O'Reilly had 746 career at-bats while playing in every game during his tenure as a Wildcat.


Showing his versatility playing both infield and outfield, O'Reilly's leadership as a twotime captain puts him in a strong position to mentor the 2024-25 players.

Jack received a B.S. in finance from the Villanova School of Business and is currently completing his Master of Education.


TODD CARROLL PITCHING COACH


ANTHONY DEFABBIA PITCHING COACH

PAUL ARIES GENERAL MANAGER



NICK CARLSON ASSIST. GENERAL MANAGER





A LOOK BACK AT THE 2024 ALL STAR GAME

On July 27th, 2024, the epicenter of collegiate baseball wasn't in Omaha, Nebraska. It wasn't an SEC conference championship game featuring two top-

three teams. It was our own Falmouth, Massachusetts. I'm talking of course about the 2024 Cape Cod league all-star game, a day on which 28 of the best college baseball players on the planet all found themselves in a town of just over 30 thousand people. The Cape's version of the 'summer classic' is a true example of what this sport and this league mean to those familiar with them. It was a time for fans from all over Cape Cod and beyond (over 6,000 in total) to come and watch the best from all over the country. Sure, everyone at Guv Fuller Field, both inside and outside of the fence, had different names, different backgrounds, and different ways of getting there, but two things tied them all together: community and baseball.

For six Commodores, last year's game was extra special, as they got to play host to the best competition, as well as

for his teammates, pitchers Edward Hart of Duke and Parker Coil of Arkansas. Both pitchers, much like Bowen and Jones, did nothing more than exactly what was asked of any ball player: do your job. They were both given an inning, and they were both shutdown, allowing zero runs between the two.

You thought we were done? This is the Commodores we're talking about, there's always more where that came from. Perhaps



the most important Commodore contributions came from the



teammates they had ever experienced. Karson Bowen of TCU and Jayson Jones of Oklahoma State earned starting nods both behind the plate and in right field. Both players were able to leave their mark as they each provided runs for the West. Caraway recorded two singles and an RBI, while Willits was able to draw a ninth-inning walk, which proved to be crucial after a stolen base that turned into the game-winning run in a 9-8 victory for the West.

But even after all that, or should I say before all that, Guv Fuller was the place to be. Fans received autographs and were treated to an action-packed home run derby, yet again featuring the Oregon State Beaver Trent Caraway. Cape Cod baseball icon and Falmouth's own Jeff Trundy was also honored with a gift from the league, as well as the league's nine other managers. The three-time manager of the year award coached 30 seasons of

Cape League baseball, all but four of them as the Commodores' head man.




EASTON BARRETT ARIZONA STATE

JACKSON BURNS Texas Tech




MATTHEW DALLAS Wake Forest


CARSON ESTRIDGE West Virginia Univ

DAVID MCCANN Virginia Tech




COLEMAN MIZELL UNIV OF ALABAMA

JUSTIN OSTERHOUSE PURDUE FORT WAYNE




JAXON SHINEFLEW Univ of South Alabama


ASHTON WILSON Univ of Florida



As a freshman in 2023, he was named to Collegiate Baseball's Freshman All-America Team, ASUN Third Team, and ASUN

All-Freshman Team. He made nine starts for the Gamecocks – primarily as the Sunday starter – and posted a perfect 6-0 record with a 2.93 ERA over 46.0 innings. He struck out 56 batters (10.9 K/9) and held opponents to a 1.34 WHIP, capping the season with a career-high 11 strikeouts across 6.2 innings against Jacksonville. Prior to college, Zielinski led the Daphne High School Trojans to an AHSAA 7A Area 2 Championship and an Elite 8 state playoff appearance. He earned back-toback All-State honors in 2021 and 2022 and was a two-time Perfect Game Preseason Underclass All-American, making nine different PG All-Tournament teams.
