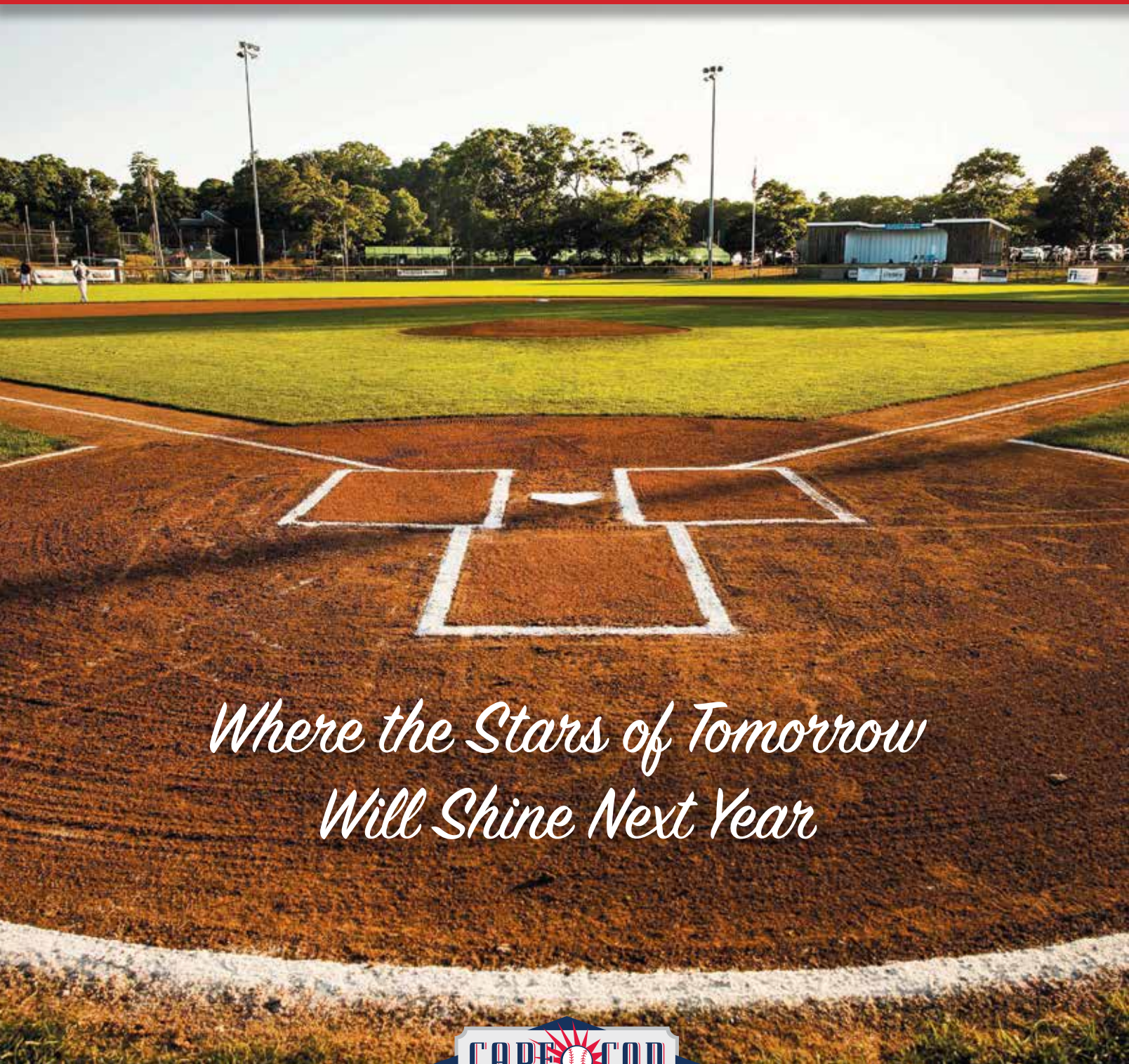

COTUIT KETTLEERS WIN THEIR 17TH TITLE

The Firebirds finished as co-champions in the East with Chatham, but were swept in the first round of the playoffs by Y-D. Harwich eliminated Chatham in two games straight in the first round, and then did the same to Y-D, advancing to the championship round. In the West, regular season champion Falmouth eliminated Bourne in the first round, while Cotuit bested Wareham. Cotuit then swept

Falmouth for the right to face Harwich, and swept the final series as well.

The East and West divisions faced off in the All Star Game on July 21 at Eldredge Park. Despite the scorching heat, fans enjoyed a spirited contest with great defense and exciting offense, with the East winning, 6-5, in a walk-off single by Brewster's Brett Auerbach (Alabama), who was the East Co-MVP with

Brewster teammate Gage Workman (Arizona State). Wareham's Matt McLain (UCLA) was the West MVP, and Brewster's Tyler Hardman (Oklahoma) won the Home Run contest.

Max Troiani (Bentley), Shay Whitcomb (San Diego) and Jared Shuster (Wake Forest) represented Orleans on the final 2019 All-League team. ◊

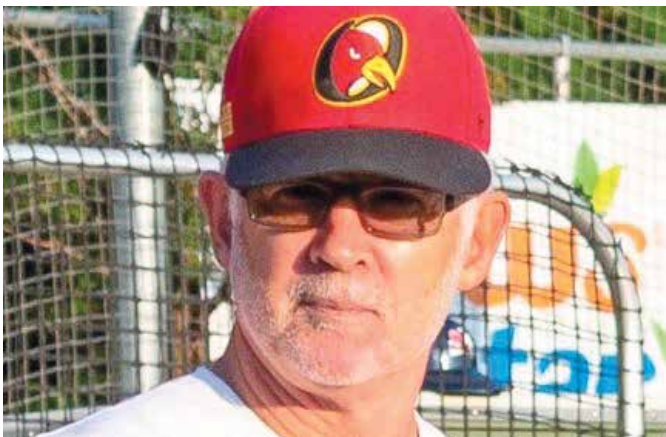

Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome back Coach Nicholson for his 20th summer and 16th as manager, the longest tenured Orleans skipper in the “modern era” (1963-present). Kelly (or “Coach K” as he’s known in the pitching fraternity) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholar-athlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letter winner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University.

After earning his Bachelor’s degree in Business Administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master’s degree in Education from LMU. He was the head coach of the Loyola HS Cubs for 11 seasons, leading the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount’s pitching coach; each year the Lions won the West Coast Conference title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K’s staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37 ERA. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 strikeouts in 401 innings pitched. All told, Kelly’s pitching staffs have led the CCBL in ERA an astounding eight times.

Co-winner of the Hossfeld Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became the field manager in 2005. In his first season, Nicholson was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach K was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2). In 2015, Kelly led the Firebirds to a franchise record of 31-12-1 (.716) and again was named the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year. In 2017, his Birds captured the President’s Trophy once more, and he received his fourth Mike Curran Award. Under his leadership, Orleans has captured five Eastern Division titles and is a perennial playoff contender. Coach K’s overall regular season winning percentage of .544 leads all active CCBL Managers. Last summer, Kelly attained his 350th win in the CCBL. In addition, 24 former players have been selected in the first-round and 77 former Orleans Cardinals/Firebirds have reached MLB since his arrival in 2001.

It’s no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league, and in the wider baseball community. He’s a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they’ll see a first-class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his 20th summer.

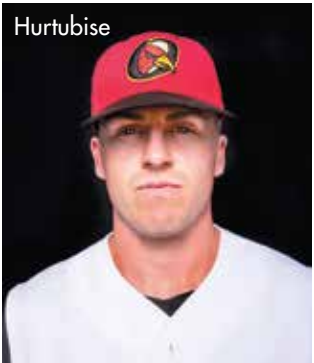
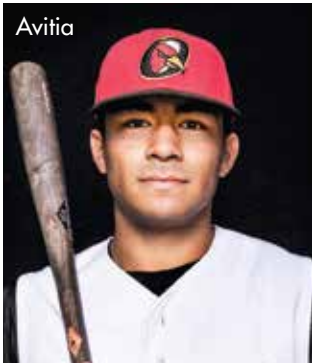

Jamie Quinn enters his fifth season with the Firebirds. He joined the staff in 2016 as the Birds pitching/catching coach, and took over the offense/third base coaching duties in 2019. In 2017, Quinn’s pitching staff led the entire Cape League in ERA, WHIP, Batting Average Against, Shutouts, and Strikeouts. That season he mentored three pitchers that were Major League Baseball First Round Draft Picks (Logan Gilbert to the Seattle Mariners at pick 14, Ryan Rolison to the Colorado Rockies at pick 22, and Daniel Lynch to the Kansas City Royals at Pick 34).

After being named the head coach at Fairleigh Dickinson University in the summer of 2018, Quinn captured 13 wins in his first season at the helm, and his 2020 squad was off to its best start since 2012, with a 7-4 record before the season was cancelled.

He spent three years as the recruiting coordinator role and 17-under development coach at ZONED Baseball Academy, where he started in 2015. That same year, Coach Quinn was named head coach of the Shelter Island Bucks in the Hamptons Collegiate Baseball League. In his only year as Shelter Island’s skipper, the Bucks set a team record in wins with 31 on their way to the team’s first HCBL championship.

Dating back to 2013, Quinn was the top assistant coach at the United States Merchant Marine Academy. In addition, “Q” worked with the Hillsboro Hops, a Single-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, as the team’s video coordinator and catching instructor for the 2013 and 2014 seasons. In this role, he instructed the catchers while helping break down hitting and pitching video, working alongside former Major Leaguers Mark Grace, Doug Drabek, and J.R. House. In 2014, the Hops were crowned Northwest League champions.

In 2012 he worked as an assistant, catching specialist, and bullpen coach at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY. Prior to Hofstra, he coached at Queens College in 2009-2010 and LIU Brooklyn in 2011. From 2011-2012, Quinn was with the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League as their bullpen coach. Coach Quinn was mentored under 1986 World Series champion and Hall of Famer, Gary Carter. Q’s pen led the league in saves in 2011, before the Ducks won the Atlantic League title in 2012.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Science in 2008 from Queens College, he earned a master’s Degree in Coaching Education and Athletic Development from Xavier University in 2017.

Mathew Troupe is returning to the Firebirds for his second summer as their pitching coach, but his fourth summer overall in Orleans, as he was a member of the 2012 and 2013 squads.

In 2019, Coach Troupe got his Cape League coaching career off to a great start, as the Orleans pitching staff led the league in ERA and had two members on the East All-Star team. In 2013, as a member of the Orleans pitching staff, he earned himself an all-star selection and the Firebirds Tom Yankus Award for being the team’s top pitcher. In his role as a closer that summer, Troupe had a 1.35 ERA, 11 saves, and 32 strikeouts in 20 IP. He helped lead Orleans to the championship series vs. Cotuit, the eventual CCBL champions.

Troupe was a four-year member of the University of Arizona baseball program, serving as their team captain for four years. Troupe finished his career with 15 saves, tied for third-most in program history. He emerged as the team’s closer midway through his freshman season, finishing the year with a 6-1 record and a team-high six saves. He posted a 3.47 ERA with 44 strikeouts in 24 appearances, spanning 36.1 innings. Troupe recorded the final four outs in Game Two of the National Championship Series against South Carolina, helping the Wildcats capture the 2012 National Title.

After graduating from Arizona in 2015, Troupe transferred to California State University Northridge where he took on a player-coach role. Two years later he joined Emory University’s coaching staff, and in his first season, helped the Eagles clinch a berth in the conference tournament. In 2019, Troupe was the Director of Baseball Operations at the University of San Diego, and currently he serves as the pitching coach for the Great Britain Senior National Team.

Troupe has also coached with the Arroyo Seco Saints of the California Collegiate Summer League in 2018 and the Walla Walla Sweets of the West Coast Collegiate League in 2016.

Erickson graduated from LMU in 2016 with a degree in English and is currently pursuing a master’s degree in Educational Studies from LMU. He is also president of his own baseball club, the Silicon Beach Baseball Academy.

In 2010 the Firebirds found themselves in a difficult financial position. The national financial crisis plus escalating costs to run the team, and additional expenditures involved with the name change from Cardinals to Firebirds caused the team to run a large deficit. The income from passing the hat, yearbook ad revenue and souvenir sales were just not covering team expenditures and as a result the team went into debt. For the 2011 season, the incoming team President, Don LeSieur, knew the team had to address the problem and initiated the Firebirds Fan

Club. The team owes a lot to Don for his tireless efforts in founding the Fan Club and raising money to stop the red ink. Thanks to the Fan Club we paid off the last of our loans in 2016.

The donor base has steadily increased to over 500 fans annually, and the average donation has increased as well. It's a healthy mix, locals, summer folks, big donors, small donors. Cape residents comprise 44% of the club membership, while off-Cape Massachusetts residents make up another 20%. The remainder comes from 25 other states including a grandmother of a 2015-16

player from Montana. We appreciate the steadfast loyalty of the club members – 90% of the people who gave in 2019 were previous members. In particular, we want to thank the one-third of our contributors who have been with us from 2011, contributing year after year. Many members love the annual Fan Club stickers and proudly display them on their cars.

In addition to providing operating funds to keep our financial situation healthy, the donations have funded a number of capital improvements. Recent projects at Eldredge Park include the new score-

board; taller and additional netting for fan and player safety; and storage space for our equipment and Home Plate Shop inventory.

As proven by this year's COVID-19 pandemic, we know that there will be some periods that are difficult for the team. In 2017 we established a rainy-day fund for seasons like 2020 where our revenue is constrained and we still have expenses.

Thanks to the generosity of our many Fan Club members the team will continue to be an asset to Orleans and the Lower Cape community. ○

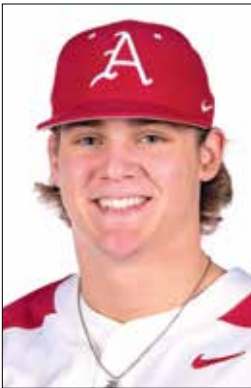

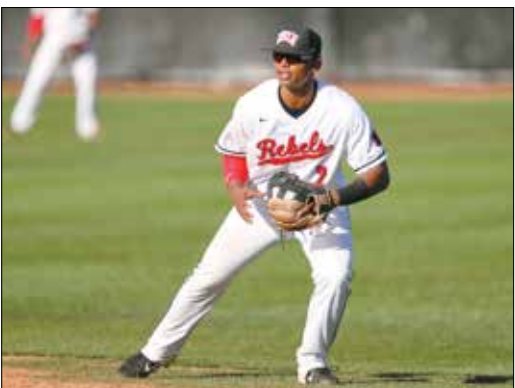

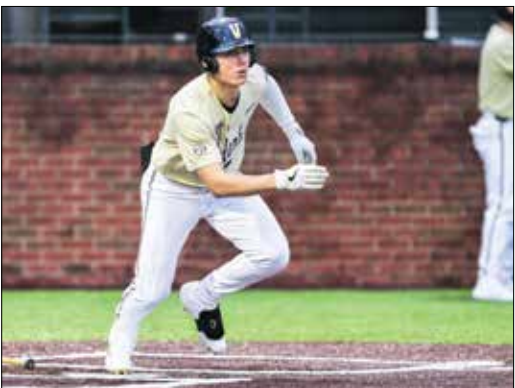

Robert E. "Bob" Stead

1947-2019



Bob Stead, who served as the CCBL Commissioner from 1999 to 2003, passed

away on October 7, 2019, due to injuries suffered in a terrible fall. He was 72.

Born in Brooklyn, Bob spent his early years on Long Island, until his family moved to Dennisport when he was 13. He graduated from Dennis-Yarmouth HS, where he won athletic honors, attended UMass, and graduated from Doane College in Nebraska. His wish to become a coach led him first to the Pike School in Andover, and then back to DY in 1993, where he became a teacher, coach and then a guidance counselor. Over the years, he served as assistant football coach, JV boys basketball coach, assistant and head baseball coach, and head volleyball coach; he was probably best known as the head coach of Lady Dolphin basketball, treating his players as athletes, not just

girl athletes, and bringing unprecedented success to the program. He is still the all-time winningest basketball coach in DY history.

Coach Stead's CCBL career began with Y-D in 1971 as an assistant coach and then the manager. He later managed the Bourne Braves from 1994-1996. An astute judge of talent, he also scouted for the Yankees, and later the Mets.

He became commissioner in 1999, leading with passion, fairness, common sense, and humor. He committed himself to the creation of the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame, which became a reality in 2001.

Coach Stead leaves innumerable friendships behind, and a lasting imprint on high school athletics and the Cape League. His positive impact on the lives of thousands of students and athletes is his most important legacy. ○

A native of Stretor, Illinois, Sharon earned her Master of Education degree from the

University of Illinois Champaign-Urbana, and became an elementary school teacher in East Hartford, Connecticut. After many years of devoted service to children, Sharon and her husband Peter retired to Orleans, enthusiastically joining in the community life. They were members of the Harwich Town Band, with Sharon playing percussion and Peter conducting, and they also spent many a summer evening volunteering for the Birds in the Home Plate Shop, greeting and assisting fans. Together with two of her sisters, Sharon wrote a memoir of her childhood and youth in Stretor. Sharon passed away quite suddenly last November, and we will truly miss her cheerful presence at the ballyard. ○

Angel Echevarria

A native of Bridgeport, Connecticut, Angel Echevarria starred in baseball, football and basketball for Bassick High School and excelled in the classroom as

well. He knew from a young age that he wanted a baseball career, and attended Rutgers University, playing outfield and becoming the school's all-time leader in home runs and RBI by his junior year. In 1991, the summer after his sophomore year, he came to Orleans and played for the Cardinals. He was a member of the East All Star Team. Selected by the Colorado Rockies in the 17th round of the 1992 draft, he worked his way up through the organization, making his MLB debut on July 15, 1996. Over his seven-year career in the majors, he also played for the Brewers and the Cubs. In 2003, he began a two-year stint with the Nippon Ham Fighters of the Japan Pacific League. Returning to the US in 2005, he played for the Cubs' AAA team in Iowa, then went to Monclova of the Mexican League. His final year as a professional player, 2006, was spent with the Bridgeport Bluefish, a team in the independent Atlantic League. Echevarria became a hitting coach with the Milwaukee Brewers, and then in 2013, he started his own training facility in Bridgeport, Simply Baseball, where he taught and mentored local children. Tragically and unexpectedly, he passed away in early February following a short illness. He was only 48 years old. ○

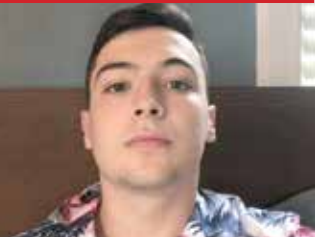

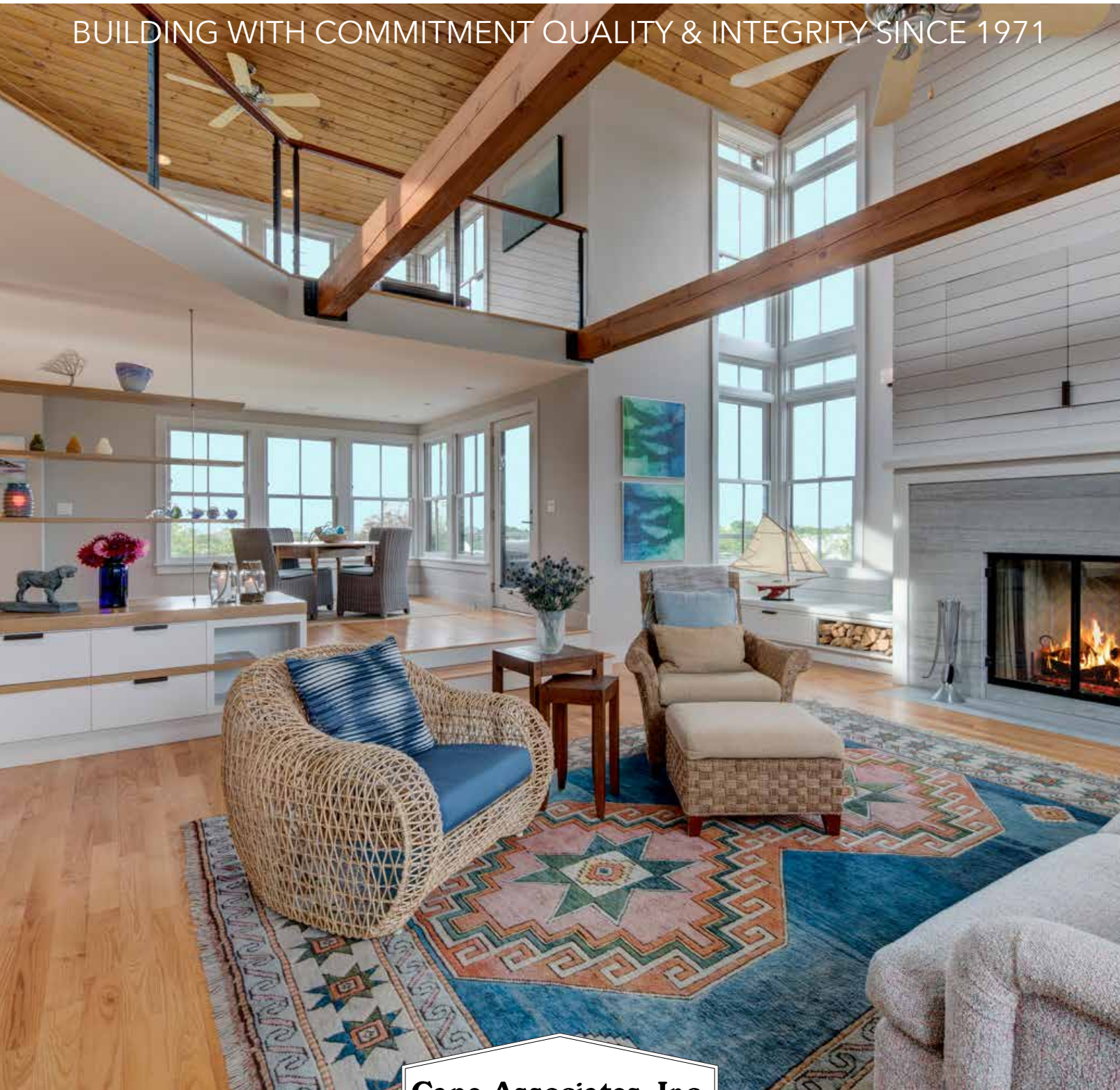
