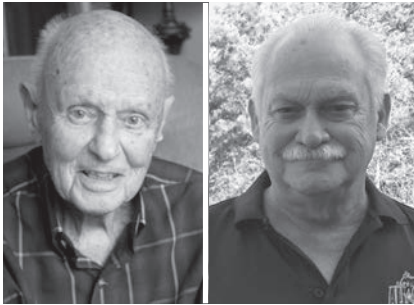

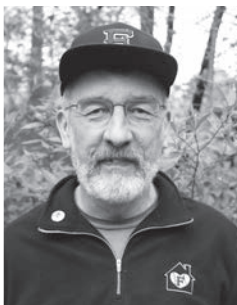

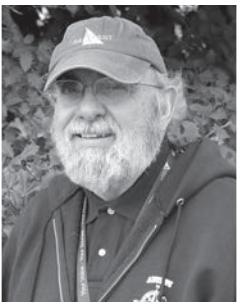

FROM THE PRESIDENT



In 2018, the Commodores had another great season, made possible by the support of our fans. We finished second in the Western Division, advancing into the second round until eliminated by the Wareham Gateman, the eventual winner. We had the good fortune of having Coach Jeff Trundy back for his 20th year as head coach and managed to keep his celebration a secret. At the end of the regular season, we learned the Commodores were selected by the Cape Cod Baseball League to receive the Commissioner's Cup – the third time in four years. And we were sad to see our GM Eric Zmuda depart, but happy he became the League's new Commissioner.

The Commodores' season starts on June 10th. Most of the planning and preparations took place during the fall, winter, and spring. Now it's crunch time. We are ready, but as is typically the case, we still need additional host families to fill out the season. The most difficult task of most teams in the League is finding places for temporary players (about 2 weeks) or contract players (about 8 weeks) to live. If you or a friend would like to know what this is really all about to host a player, please contact us anytime. We will fill you in and put you in touch with host families to share their memories and experiences.

Over the past months the Commodores' Board has been hard at work writing up the bid proposal with the Town for use of Community Preservation Act monies to build new dugouts, a brick backstop, safety netting and poles, handicap accessibility around the field, and new visitors bleachers. We began these improvements two years ago with the Press Box renovations, followed by the installation of a handicap vertical lift last June. Our plan is for the remaining work to be funded and completed by this December. You can follow the latest news on our website.

When you arrive at Fuller field this season, don't be intimidated by the new Senior Center being built next to the Recreation Department. We are working with the Town to identify alternate parking locations and to install signage to guide you to the seating area. The Commodores also hope to establish a new concession stand, which we will undoubtedly be discussing at this time next year.

Our goal is simple: we want to make Fuller Field one of the best baseball parks in the League. Come join the Commodores community for some great entertainment and the baseball experience.

2018 SEASON RECAP

Nearly 50 players suited up for the Falmouth Commodores across 44 regular season contests, and for a team that began the summer in the depths of the Cape League standings, the 2018 Falmouth Commodores are certainly a team to remember.

Head coach Jeff Trundy completed his 20th year at the helm and guided the Commodores to the West Division finals. Seven Commodores participated in the All-Star Game in which Trundy and his staff coached. Two players earned individual postseason awards, and one franchise earned the coveted Commissioner's Cup.

The Falmouth Commodores were recognized as the league's top franchise for the second straight summer.

It's not hard to understand why.

From General Manager Eric Zmuda to Coach Trundy and his staff, to the players, the interns, and all involved – what an amazing team.

"I thought it was just a great summer," Trundy said. "We had a special group of kids and a special group of people that made this possible.

"Everyone invested their hearts and souls in providing an opportunity for our players; it's a special place and it was a special summer."

The Commodores started 2-8-0 and sat in the basement of the 10-team Cape League. Instead of wilting, they soared. They finished with a 26-21-1 overall mark, including a 24-

13-1 mark over the last 38 contests and made it to the final four teams left in the playoffs.

For over 75 percent of the season, the Falmouth Commodores, from top to bottom, served as the league's model franchise in so many ways.

A two-year Commodore, Mitchell Miller (West Texas A&M) exemplified the spirit of the Falmouth Commodores. He was brilliant in his final outing, pitching 4.2 innings of one-run baseball.

For a player who spent his summer in limbo, unsure whether he'd transfer schools or sign a professional contract, Miller said his two summers with the Commodores served as "the best" summers of his life.

"This coaching staff is second to none and made it fun again," Miller said. "I've had some roller coaster rides the last two years of my career, but every time I came up here, it was like I was part of a family.

"Going out tonight I gave everything I had to the coaches and my brothers."

Commodores fans were treated to four walk-off victories on their home diamond at Guv Fuller Field, and watched their beloved Commodores succeed in so many ways, as a team and individually.

Adam Laskey (Duke) established himself as the Cape

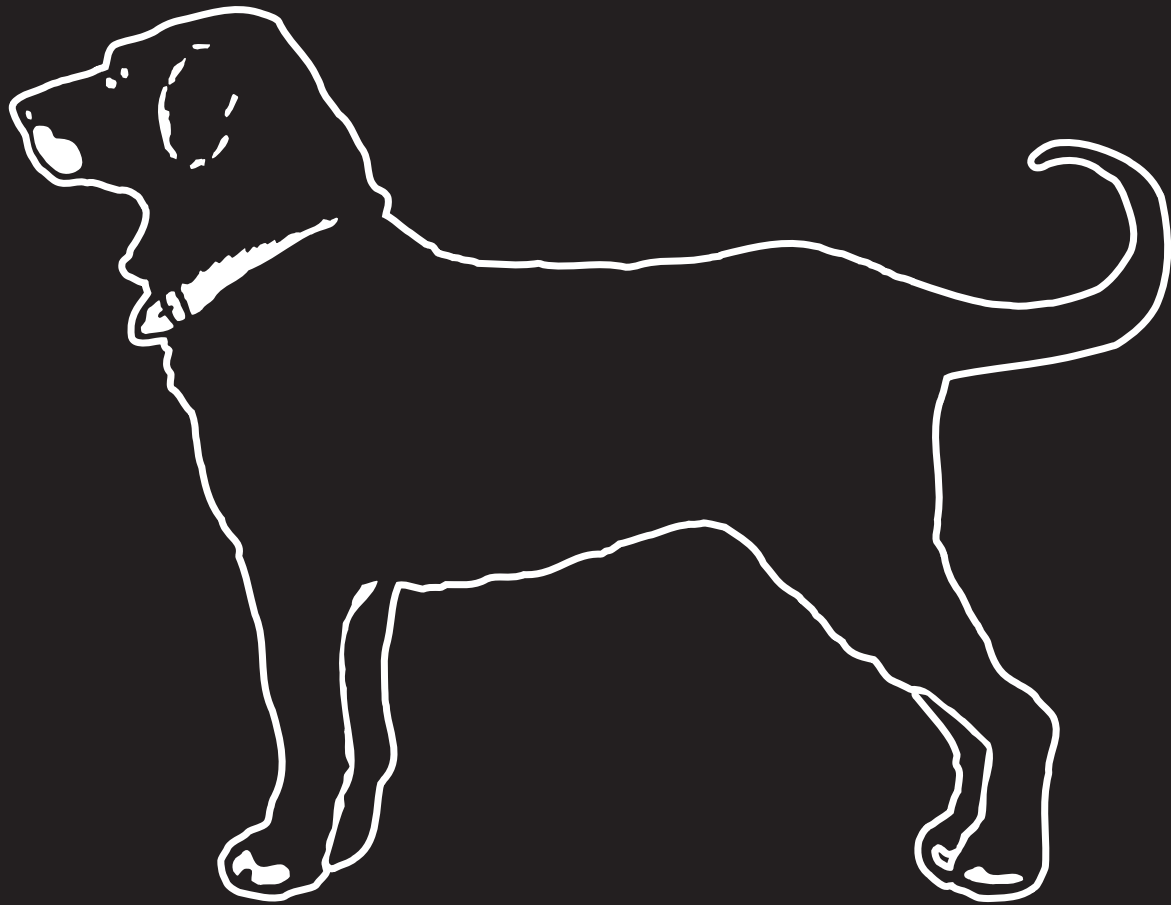
Seeded third in the four-team West Division, the Commodores swept second-seeded Hyannis in the division semifinals.

"They never gave up," Trundy said. "That characteristic, that part of their personality will serve them well for the rest of their lives."

The 2018 campaign came to a close just under two months after it began, and no one could've asked for a better team.

"I was struggling a little bit, and I came up here and it was immediately like I was a kid again," Miller said. "It was awesome."

His family vacationed each summer on Cape Cod in Brewster, and would attend either an Orleans Cardinals (he still thinks of them as the Cardinals!) or Brewster Whitecaps game. In fact, his father had a Cardinals hat that hung in their back hallway year-round in his family's New York home. So Mike was familiar with the history of the Cape League and the fact that at least a few teams were doing broadcasts. That winter of 2007-2008, he reached out to every team, and the late Pat Loftus, a former Commodores Board Member and Head of Broadcasting and Media, was one of the few people who responded. Mike had no play-by-play experience to speak of at that point, and Syracuse no longer had a baseball team. But timing was on his side, and Pat knew a Syracuse student who had done broadcasting for the Chatham As. Pat reached out to Dan for broadcasting recommendations from Syracuse, and Mike happened to apply the next day. That was enough to get Mike's foot in the door.

Mike's intern responsibilities included the play-by-play broadcaster or analyst, as well as the PA announcer for Guv Fuller Field. He and the other two broadcast interns also went on the road to broadcast games at the other ballparks. Their intern duties were shared evenly among the three of them, both at home and away games.

In the summer of 2010, Mike worked as the broadcasting assistant for the then-Syracuse (NY) Chiefs (now Syracuse Mets), the Triple-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. He was hired by Jason Benetti, who now is the television voice of the Chicago White Sox, as well as Mike's colleague at ESPN. They both called every game of the season together, and it was a great experience for Mike



to learn from Jason and to interact with a clubhouse full of players on a daily basis. After graduating in December 2010, Mike's first job in broadcasting started in March of 2011 with the Dayton Dragons, the Cincinnati Reds Class-A affiliate. He was the broadcasting and media relations assistant there, where he would call three innings of play-by-play per game for home games, as well as produce feature stories for the game program and the radio broadcast. He also met his fiancé, Erin, there, who worked for the team in the marketing department. After Dayton, Mike moved to Burlington, Vermont, where he was the radio broadcaster for the University of Vermont women's basketball team. After Burlington, he took a job as the lead television/radio broadcaster for the Fort Wayne TinCaps, the Class-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, where he broadcast all 70 home games on television and all 70 road games on the

radio. He also produced the team's game notes, helped to run the website, and facilitated all baseball-related media requests. During the off-season, he created a speaker's bureau to connect with local groups (Kiwanis, Lions, etc.) to create more interest in the team. While there, Mike began doing freelance work for both the Big Ten Network and ESPN. In August 2014, ESPN hired him full time.

In his current role as a play-by-play broadcaster for ESPN, Mike has called college football, basketball, baseball, softball, wrestling, and ultimate frisbee. He also has broadcast a handful of MLB games on the radio over the last two seasons.

The internship with the Commodores was the cornerstone for everything that came afterward. It not only provided Mike with the baseball experience that he was unable to get in college, but also provided the confidence for him to pursue his passion beyond the confines of his college campus. Without those two years in Falmouth, he feels he would not have been polished enough as a broadcaster to work at the Triple-A level that next season.

Having been at ESPN for five years this August, Mike's hope is to continue to grow within his current role. His two primary sports are college football and college basketball, and he loves his involvement with both of these sports. He started calling softball this year for the first time, and has found it to be exceptionally exciting, too. According to Mike, "Getting to do a few MLB games has also been really cool, as in 2009 we visited Fenway for the CCBL All-Star game, and less than 10 years later I was in the booth there calling a game. I couldn't have predicted five years ago that I'd be where I am today, so I have no idea what the next five years will bring; but I hope to be an even better broadcaster and teammate then and will accept any games that come my way."

CHRIS CURTIS

AREA SCOUT TORONTO BLUE JAYS

Chris Curtis grew up in Mashpee, MA, on Cape Cod. As a young boy who was passionate about baseball, he enjoyed attending Cape Cod Baseball League (CCBL) games in the summer, as well as the youth baseball clinics. He showed his analytical side early on, when he would study the stat sheets provided at each game and then watch certain players. If a player caught his analytical eye, he would try and get that player's autograph at a subsequent game.

Chris has a long history with the Falmouth Commodores



and CCBL. During the summer of 2010, he served as the General Manager Intern of the Commodores. In the fall of 2010, he entered Fordham University where he majored in economics. While at Fordham, he was an a student manager for the baseball team. During the following summer, Chris was a Communications Intern for the CCBL. His responsibilities included covering the Falmouth Commodores and Cotuit Kettleers, and publishing relevant stories on the CCBL website.

In the summer of 2012, Chris served as a Scouting Intern for the New York Yankees (NYY), covering the CCBL under the direction of Matt Hyde, Regional Scout for the NYY. During his junior and senior years at Fordham, located in the Bronx, he served as a Baseball Operations Intern with the NYY at Yankee Stadium. Following graduation in 2014, he did a summer internship with the Red Sox, and then became a Baseball Operations Intern with the Sox at Fenway Park. A highlight of this internship was his assignment to pick up a recent draftee at the airport – Andrew Benintendi (who was on the Falmouth Commodores 2015 roster, but was drafted and immediately went to the Red Sox). Chris was the first person to introduce Benintendi to Fenway Park and give him the grand tour. After his experience with the Red Sox, Chris moved to California to serve

as a Baseball Operations Assistant with the San Francisco Giants at Oracle Park. In 2017, he moved south to join the Toronto Blue Jays as West Coast Amateur Video Coordinator, based in Long Beach, CA. In 2018, he was promoted to Area Scout, covering amateur college and high school players in southern Texas and southern Louisiana.

Chris credits his early involvement with the Commodores for giving him exposure to high-quality amateur baseball play, and the mentoring he received from Matt Hyde for his exposure to major league scouting. As the General Manager intern he had a wide variety of responsibilities, including working closely with the team's leadership to coordinate player contracts and arrivals at Falmouth, and assuring that the game day statistics sheet was up to date and printed for each home game. During this period and the subsequent year as a CCBL Communications Intern, he met a number of scouts and management personnel from various MLB teams. While his early experience with MLB internships was in baseball operations that focused on the video analysis of player performance, or the analytical approach, he always had a desire to also be out in the ballpark identifying and evaluating amateur talent. Joining the Toronto Blue Jays has fulfilled this wish, and now located in Houston, TX, he is based in one of the hot spots for scouting high school and college talent. Chris aims to grow in his role in scouting and eventually move up into scouting management.

TAYLOR SNOW

TEAM WRITER BOSTON CELTICS

Taylor Snow was born and raised in Concord, MA, and spent the summer months in Falmouth. He now lives in Newton, located outside of Boston. He graduated from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 2014, where he majored in journalism, and is currently working for the Boston Celtics.

Taylor began thinking about applying to the Commodores internship program while in high school. He had been attending Commodores games every summer since he was eight years old, and thought an internship would be the perfect way to gain work experience while continuing his tradition of being a dedicated fan. He joined the internship crew during the summer of 2012, between his sophomore and junior years of college.

As the team videographer intern that summer, he attended all games – both home and away – and he filmed every



second of game action. Following each game, he conducted on-camera interviews with Coach Jeff Trundy and the star Commodore of the game. After leaving the game, he would head home to edit his video content to produce a highlight package that would be uploaded to the Commodore's website.

During the fall semester of his senior year, Taylor had a fulltime writing internship with the Boston Globe Sports department that eventually led to a job opportunity after graduation from college. He covered high school and college sports for one year before landing his current job, in the spring of 2015, with the Boston Celtics.

As the team writer for the Celtics, Taylor is responsible for covering the day-to-day actions of the team. He attends all home games and travels with the team for many of the away games. On game days, he typically writes three to four stories over the course of the day, and on off days, he works on feature stories or other written projects. All of Taylor's work can be found at Celtics.com.

The transition from baseball to basketball was not all that challenging for Taylor in terms of understanding the

nuances of the game, as he grew up both an avid baseball and basketball fan. The only notable difference is the active season—now during the fall, winter, and spring months as opposed to during the spring, summer, and fall months. Although Taylor's current job has different responsibilities than the ones he had during his Commodores internship, the experience he gained with the Commodores played a substantial role in helping him to carve out his career path. His goal was always to be a writer, but he learned in college that having a multimedia background would help enhance his resume when sending applications to potential employers. Sure enough, having that video experience is what helped him land his next internship at the Boston Globe, as the Globe's recruiters were looking for well-rounded prospects.

As Taylor is thoroughly enjoying the role he has held over the past four-plus years with the Celtics, and would not trade it for anything, he has not looked too far ahead into the future. For now, he is "just riding the wave like a Commodore."
