HISTORY AGAINST VENEZUELA

Since first meeting at the 2000 Pan American Cup, Team USA holds a slight 8-7 advantage. The two sides have met three times at the Premier12, including twice so far in the 2024 iteration. Before the U.S. played Venezuela in this year's Premier12, the last meeting between Team USA and Venezuela came at the 2023 World Baseball Classic, when Trea Turner lifted the stars and stripes to a 9-7 quarterfinal round victory.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

Team USA and Venezuela meet for the third time in the 2024 Premier12, marking the second time that the two nations have faced off three different times in the same tournament. In 2009, the U.S. and Venezuela matched up three times at the World Baseball Classic, with Venezuela taking two of the three games.

RYAN RAKES

With his ninth-inning homer against Venezuela on Saturday, Ryan Ward now has five homers at the Premier12 to lead all players. All five of Ward's home runs have come in Team USA victories, and he joins Trea Turner as the only two U.S. players in the last decade to hit five home runs in a single tournament. 71% of Ward's hits at the Premier12 have landed over the wall.

SIMPSON'S STREAK

Chandler Simpson picked up two hits against Venezuela on Saturday to extend his hitting streak to eight games. The speedy leadoff hitter has at least one hit in all eight tournament games, including four games with multiple knocks, and leads all players in the tournament with 15 hits. In addition, he has stolen nine bases so far in tournament play, the most of any U.S. player in a single tournament in team history.

SHAW-SOME

Matt Shaw drove in two runs in Saturday's win and now has 14 RBIs in the tournament, the most of any player and three ahead of Ryan Ward, who has the second most runs driven in. Shaw has had four games so far in the tournament where he has driven in two runs, including both contests against Venezuela.

STARTING OFF STRONG

With Touki Toussaint's four shutout innings on Saturday, Team USA starters lowered their collective ERA to 1.38. U.S. starters have allowed just four runs in 26 innings and have struck out 31 batters to just six walks. Rich Hill has carried much of the load for the starting rotation, turning in 10.1 scoreless frames.

LAWRENCE RETURNS TO JAPAN

Sunday's start won't be Casey Lawrence's first time ever pitching in Tokyo. The veteran right hander spent the 2019 season as a member of the NPB's Hiroshima Carp and made 22 appearances across two levels.

BACK IN THE RED, WHITE, AND BLUE

Anthony Gose, Termarr Johnson, Chris Okey, and Touki Toussaint all return to play for the stars and stripes after previous stints with Team USA. Gose was a member of the Olympic Team in 2021, when he made four appearances and allowed just one hit and no runs in 5.1 innings. Johnson is a two-time alum who won gold with the 15U National Team in 2019 and led the 18U National Team in batting during a friendship series in 2021. Okey is also a five-time alum, suiting up for the 16U squad in 2010, the 18U National Team in 2011 and 2012-winning gold medals each time--and the Collegiate National Team in 2014 and 2015. Toussaint won gold with the 16U National Team in 2011, pitching three times at the IBAF World Youth Championships in Mexico.

BATTLE FOR BRONZE

Today's game marks the second consecutive Premier12 tournament that Team USA will compete in the bronze medal game. The U.S. played for bronze in 2019, falling on a walk-off single against Mexico. A bronze medal victory today would give Team USA its first-ever Premier12 bronze after it took home silver in the first iteration of the tournament in 2015.

TOP SPECTS

The U.S. roster features four players who rank in the MLB Pipeline Top 100, including two players who are the top-ranked prospect for their respective Club. Carson Williams ranks as the fourth-best prospect in baseball and atop Tampa Bay's Top 30 Prospects, while Matt Shaw leads the way for the Cubs and is the 22nd-ranked prospect in the sport. Additionally, Justin Crawford sits at No. 53 and Termarr Johnson ranks No. 75 in the Top 100.

BIG LEAGUERS

The U.S. roster features nine players with MLB playing experience, combining for 57 big-league seasons. Rich Hill leads the way with 20 MLB seasons under his belt, while Dan Altavilla, Anthony Gose, Spencer Patton, and Touki Toussaint bring at least five seasons of big-league time to the roster. Zac Grotz, Casey Lawrence, Chris Okey, and Cam Vieaux have also had stints in the major leagues.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR

Thirteen members of the U.S. team have previously been named MiLB.com Organization All-Stars, including two-time All-Stars Carson Williams, Casey Lawrence, and Anthony Gose. Williams notched the honor in 2022 and 2023 as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays organization, Lawrence won back-to-back All-Star awards in 2021 and 2022, while Gose earned the award in 2011 and 2012 as a position player in the Toronto Blue Jays organization.

FATHERS AND SONS

Thirteen years after Rich Hill was teammates with Carl Crawford on the Boston Red Sox, Hill now teams up with Carl's son, Justin, on the 2024 Premier12 roster. Hill and Carl were also teammates on the 2016 Los Angeles Dodgers.

DEVELOPING THE BEST

A trio of Team USA players have previous experience at USA Baseball's development programs: Justin Crawford, Termarr Johnson, and Touki Toussaint. Crawford and Johnson both participated in the 2018 14U National Team Development Program (NTDP), while Toussaint was a member of the 2012 17U NTDP.

SCIOSCIA AT THE HELM

Nineteen-year MLB veteran manager Mike Scioscia leads Team USA at the Premier12 in 2024, his third stint in the U.S. dugout. Scioscia debuted with the stars and stripes in 2021, first leading the Club to a 4-0 record as it qualified for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. Scioscia then managed the United States at the Olympics and led the team to a silver medal, going 4-2 overall. Before his role with Team USA, Scioscia won three World Series titles in MLB; two as a player for the Los Angeles Dodgers and one as a manager for the Los Angeles Angels.

THE CRAWFORDS

While the Premier12 marks Justin Crawford's debut for Team USA, his father, Carl, also played for the Professional National Team in 2001. Carl was 20 years old—the same age that his son is now—when he helped the United States secure a silver medal at the XXXIV World Cup in Taiwan.

WHAT GOSE AROUND COMES AROUND

U.S. pitcher Anthony Gose has had a two-act career as a baseball player. Gose originally was drafted as a position player and played five seasons as an outfielder, primarily in center field. He hit .240 with 12 homers and 69 RBIs in 372 games as a position player before switching to a pitcher in 2017 and making his return to MLB as a reliever in 2021. Gose has pitched in 31 big league games, including 22 in 2022.

BISCUITVILLE

A group of four players from the Montgomery Biscuits (Tampa Bay Rays AA) appear on the Team USA roster: Antonio Menendez, Chandler Simpson, Austin Vernon, and Carson Williams. In 2024, the Biscuits went 80-57 and scored the most runs in the Southern League (650) with the best run differential in the league (+148).

MVPs!

Justin Crawford and Matt Shaw have each earned a Most Valuable Player honor in the past two seasons. In 2023, Crawford was named the Florida State League MVP after hitting .344 with 16 doubles, 60 RBIs, and 40 stolen bases for the Clearwater Threshers (A). Shaw nabbed Southern League MVP honors in 2024 following a season in which he smacked 14 homers and drove in 50 runs while batting .279 over 86 games with the AA Tennessee Smokies.

THE FUTURE IS NOW

Six players on Team USA's roster have played in the MLB All-Star Futures Game, including five players who competed in the event in 2024. Drake Baldwin, Justin Crawford, Termarr Johnson, Matt Shaw, and Chandler Simpson all played in 2024, while Crawford also earned a spot in the 2023 iteration of the Futures Game and Willie Maclver played in the event in 2019.

SPARTY PARTY

Two U.S. relievers—Sam Benschoter and Cam Vieaux—played collegiately at Michigan State University. Vieaux and Benschoter missed each other by one season; Vieaux graduated in 2016 and Benschoter enrolled in 2017. Vieaux made 42 career appearances for the Spartans, while Benschoter pitched in 45 games. Both pitchers are from the state of Michigan.

USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

MIKE SCIOSCIA

MANAGER

//PRONUNCIATION: SOW-SHUH//

Mike Scioscia was named the manager of the Professional National Team in 2024 and will lead the U.S. in the 2024 Premier12 Tournament. Scioscia previously served as the Team USA manager in 2021. Under his guidance, the U.S. went a perfect 4-0 at the WBSC Tokyo 2020 Olympic Baseball Americas Qualifier to punch its ticket to the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. There, Scioscia led the United States to a 4-2 overall record and a silver medal, its second in Olympic history. Team USA led the tournament in ERA (2.19) and batting average against (.226) while tying for the lead in WHIP (1.11) and home runs (7) with Scioscia at the helm. The stars and stripes scored 28 runs in the tournament, second only to Korea.

Prior to joining Team USA in 2021, Scioscia had a 19-year career as a big-league manager. He spent his entire MLB managerial career in Anaheim, where he led the Halos to a 1650-1428 (.536) overall record from 1999-2018, ranking him 20th all-time in career managerial wins. After breaking a 15-year playoff drought in 2002, Scioscia led the Angels to the only World Series title in their history that postseason to become the 17th person to win a World Series title as both player and manager after also winning two titles as a catcher with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Scioscia was the first manager in MLB history to make the playoffs in six of his first ten seasons, including winning five AL West division titles in six years. He was twice named the AL Manager of the Year by the Baseball Writers Association of America (2002 and 2009) and set the Angels' franchise single season wins record twice with 99 victories in 2002 and then 100 victories in 2008. Scioscia is the current all-time leader in wins, games managed, and division titles won in Angels' history.

Drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers with the 19th overall pick of the 1976 June Amateur Draft, Scioscia spent all 13 of his seasons in the Major Leagues as a catcher for the Los Angeles Dodgers (1980-92) under USA Baseball Olympic gold medal-winning manager Tommy Lasorda. He won two World Series titles (1981 and 1988), was twice named a National League All-Star (1989 and 1990), and caught two no-hitters (Fernando Valenzuela and Kevin Gross) in his playing career. To this day, Scioscia ranks fourth all-time among Major League catchers with 136 shutouts caught.

RON ROENICKE

BENCH COACH

//PRONUNCIATION: REN-IH-KEE //

Ron Roenicke will make his USA Baseball debut as bench coach for the Premier12 squad after a storied MLB career as a player, coach, and manager. A first-round draft pick in 1977 to the Los Angeles Dodgers, Roenicke will bring nearly 50 years of professional experience with him to Team USA's staff. After playing parts of eight seasons for six different Clubs from 1981-1988, Roenicke began his coaching career on the Dodgers' big-league staff in 1992 before becoming a minor-league manager in the Los Angeles organization in 1994. Roenicke was named the third base coach for the Angels in 2000 and helped lead the team to a World Series in 2002 before a promotion to bench coach in 2006. His first managerial gig came with the Milwaukee Brewers, for whom he managed from 2011-2015. He led the Club to its winningest regular season in franchise history (96) in his first season at the helm before spending three more campaigns in Milwaukee. He then spent time as a third base coach for the Dodgers (2015) and Angels (2016-2017) before being named bench coach for the Boston Red Sox ahead of the 2018 season, winning a World Series in that campaign. He spent one season as the manager in Boston in 2020 and now works as a special assistant to the general manager for the Dodgers.

DAVE WALLACE

PITCHING COACH

Dave Wallace will join the Premier12 staff as the team's pitching coach for the 2024 competition after making his USA Baseball debut with the organization in 2021. Wallace helped Team USA to a silver medal at the Tokyo Games as the pitching coach in 2021, guiding the staff to a 2.19 team ERA and 54 strikeouts in 53.1 innings pitched. In his playing days, Wallace signed with the Philadelphia Phillies in 1970 following his collegiate career at the University of New Haven and racked up 60 saves as a reliever in the minor leagues in both the Phillies and Toronto Blue Jays' farm systems in addition to making 13 appearances in the majors. Once retired from his playing career, Wallace began his coaching career in the Los Angeles Dodgers' farm system in 1981. He then served as the organization's minor league pitching coordinator from 1987-1994 before being named the pitching coach of the big-league club in 1995. Wallace then became the pitching coach for the New York Mets in 1999 and 2000, helping the Club win the National League pennant in his second year in Queens. After a stint as the Dodgers' vice president of baseball operations, Wallace was named pitching coach for the Boston Red Sox in 2003 and helped guide the staff to a World Series title in 2004. Wallace briefly served as pitching coach for the Houston Astros in 2007 before working in the Seattle Mariners and Atlanta Braves organizations. He then spent three seasons in Baltimore as the Orioles' pitching coach, a role he held until 2016.

RICK ECKSTEIN

HITTING COACH

//PRONUNCIATION:ECK-STINE //

Six-time Team USA coach and 2024 18U National Team Manager Rick Eckstein will be the hitting coach for the 2024 Premier12 team. Eckstein most recently led the 18U National Team to a gold medal at the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) U-18 Baseball World Cup Americas Qualifier in early August, guiding the stars and stripes to a perfect 8-0 record. He has also served on the coaching staff for the Professional National Team on five separate occasions from 2005-2008 and helped guide the red, white, and blue to three medals under longtime big-league manager Davey Johnson. Following the 2008 season in which he helped lead the U.S. to a bronze medal at the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games, Eckstein earned USA Baseball's "Doc" Counsilman Science Award for his coaching efforts through scientific data and technology. Eckstein started his coaching career at the University of Florida in 1997 before he joined the Tampa Bay Devil Rays as a bullpen coach and batting practice pitcher in 1999. He took the same role with the Minnesota Twins a year later and got his first hitting coach position shortly after, joining the University of Georgia's coaching staff during the 2002 and 2003 seasons. In the subsequent years, he bounced around multiple minor league teams in that role before he got his first major league coaching role at the end of 2008 with the Washington Nationals, where he served as the hitting coach until the end of the 2013 season. Eckstein joined the Los Angeles Angels as a player information coach in 2014 and then returned to the college ranks as an assistant coach for the University of Kentucky, a position he held for two years. After that, he was brought on by the Minnesota Twins as a minor league hitting coordinator and worked in that role from 2016-2018. Current Los Angeles Dodgers Third Base Coach Dino Ebel will return to Team USA in the same position after serving on staff at the 2023 World Baseball Classic. Ebel returned to the Dodgers organization as third base coach in 2019 and has helped lead them to five NL West titles and the 2020 and 2024 World Series titles. In his playing days, Ebel signed with the Dodgers as a free agent in 1988 after winning the Division II baseball championship with Florida Southern College; he then spent eight years in their farm system, where he began his coaching career as a "player-coach" for Bakersfield from 1991 to 1994 and then with San Bernadino in 1995. Ebel spent eight years as a manager in the Rookie-level, Single-A, and Double-A ranks for the Dodgers before joining the Los Angeles Angels organization in 2005 as the Triple-A Salt Lake Bees manager. The Angels elevated him to the big leagues as the third base coach in 2006, a position he would hold until being named bench coach in 2014. He returned to Angels third base coach duties again in 2018 before re-joining the Dodgers in 2019. Ebel spent 14 seasons working with U.S. skipper Mike Scioscia, who led Team USA to a silver medal in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.

JEMILE WEEKS

FIRST BASE COACH

USA Baseball alum Jemile Weeks joins the 2024 Premier12 team staff as first base coach after previously playing for Team USA. Weeks competed with the gold-medal-winning 2006 Collegiate National Team in Havana, Cuba, helping his country win gold at the international level with his bat. The alum recorded 37 hits, four home runs, and 21 RBIs in the summer of 2006 and helped the U.S. win a gold medal at the International University Sports Federation (FISU) World Championships. Weeks played at the University of Miami (FL) and was named an All-American after a stellar freshman season. Selected by the Oakland Athletics with the 12th overall pick in the 2008 MLB Draft, Weeks went on to play with several major league clubs including the Athletics, Baltimore Orioles, Boston Red Sox, and San Diego Padres. Weeks has remained involved in baseball since retiring from his playing career and has coached at several MLB/USA Baseball diversity-focused amateur development events, including serving as a manager at the 2024 Hank Aaron Invitational.

LATROY HAWKINS

BULLPEN COACH

After serving as the 18U National Team's pitching coach in 2023, LaTroy Hawkins is bringing back his pitching expertise to USA Baseball as the Premier12 team's bullpen coach. Drafted in the seventh round of the 1991 MLB Draft by the Minnesota Twins, Hawkins made his big-league debut with the Club in 1995 to kick off his 21-year career that included stretches with 11 different teams. After nine years in Minnesota, Hawkins would play for 10 different Clubs over the next 12 seasons. Hawkins is one of 13 relievers in baseball history to record at least one save against all 30 teams and currently ranks 10th on baseball's all-time games played list for a reliever with 1,042. In addition to his MLB career, Hawkins also played for Team USA in the 2009 World Baseball Classic. He appeared in four games for the stars and stripes in the tournament, going 1-0 out of the bullpen. Since retirement, Hawkins has remained involved with baseball, specifically with diversity-focused amateur development events. He has been a long-time coach at several events hosted by MLB and USA Baseball, including the Breakthrough Series, DREAM Series, and the Hank Aaron Invitational. Hawkins also served as a pitching coach at the 2022 Prospect Development Pipeline (PDP) League and hosts the USA Baseball Introduction to Pitch Smart course. Hawkins was inducted into the Indiana High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in January 2018 and currently works as a special assistant in the baseball operations department for the Twins. Additionally, Hawkins occasionally serves as an analyst for Twins television broadcasts on Bally Sports North.

UNITED STATES VS. PUERTO RICO

Team USA dropped its opening game of the Premier12 tournament on Saturday evening, falling 1-0 to Puerto Rico. Rich Hill started and pitched the first three innings in shutout fashion before Darrell Thompson got the U.S. to the sixth inning in a tie ballgame. Puerto Rico's Sabin Ceballos broke the scoreless tie with a solo homer in the sixth and that was all of the scoring in the contest, giving Puerto Rico a 1-0 win. Team USA stranded eight runners on base in the final four innings of the game, knocking on the door consistently but never scratching a run across.

UNITED STATES VS. NETHERLANDS

Matt Shaw went 4-for-5 with seven RBIs to propel Team USA to a 12-2 win in a run-rule-shortened contest on Sunday night. Shaw drove in the go-ahead run with a single in the third inning before tacking on late, driving a bases-clearing double and a three-run homer to right field. Luke Ritter and Ryan Ward each also homered in the victory, hitting back-to-back blasts in the bottom of the first. Justin Crawford chipped in a pair of doubles at the plate. On the mound, Casey Lawrence started and pitched 3.1 innings and allowed two runs before handing the ball to winning pitcher Antonio Menendez, who shovled for 2.2 shutout frames. Spencer Patton and Austin Vernon finished it off with two perfect frames.

Team USA dropped a 5-3 contest to Venezuela on Monday night. The U.S. put together a pair of rallies in the last two innings of the game, getting the tying run to the plate in the eighth and the tying run in scoring position in the ninth but coming up just short. Matt Shaw continued his torrid start to the Premier12 with a fourth-inning home run to tie the score at one, and later added a game-tying sac fly to equalize the game at two. But Venezuela took advantage of walks and defensive miscues to plate three runs in the sixth and was able to hold off the two late U.S. rallies to pick up the win. Shaw was one of five Team USA players to pick up a hit, but the United States struck out 16 times. On the mound, Zac Grotz started and threw 3.2 innings. Eric Adler suffered the loss as he was on the mound for the three-run outburst.

UNITED STATES VS. PANAMA

Team USA scored seven runs in the first two innings and got seven strong frames out of its bullpen to beat Panama, 9-3, on Tuesday night. With two outs and nobody on for Panama (2-2) in the first, Ruben Tejada socked a home run to left field to immediately put the stars and stripes behind the eight ball. But as it did in Sunday's win over the Netherlands, Team USA responded immediately with four runs in the bottom half, followed by three more in the second, to take a commanding six-run lead. Starting pitcher Touki Toussaint fanned five batters over two innings of work in his Premier 12 debut, then gave way to the U.S. bullpen which surrendered solo shots in the fifth and sixth innings and ultimately keep Panama at bay. The top of the U.S. order - Chandler Simpson, Matt Shaw, Luke Ritter, and Ryan Ward - combined for nine of the team's 12 hits in the contest and helped to provide late insurance with a pair of runs in the seventh. Simpson led all players at the plate with a 4-for-5 outing, while Sam Benschoter collected his first win of the tournament after tossing two scoreless frames out of the bullpen.

UNITED STATES VS. MEXICO

The U.S. secured its spot in the Premier12 Super Round with a 12-2, run-rule victory over Mexico on Thursday night. After falling behind 1-0 in the first inning, Team USA scored two runs over each of the next three innings before a five-run explosion put the game away. Termarr Johnson put Team USA in front with a two-run blast in the top of the second before an opposite-field shot by Justin Crawford extended the lead to 3-1. Chris Okey and Chandler Simpson added RBI singles before Ryan Ward hit homers in the fifth and sixth innings en route to the run-rule win. On the mound, Rich Hill turned in 3.1 innings of solid work, yielding just one unearned run. Antonio Menendez earned the win

with 1.2 innings of crucial relief before handing the ball to Anthony Gose and Dan Altavilla, who got the final six outs.

UNITED STATES VS. JAPAN

After Colby Thomas opened the scoring with a home run in the fifth, Japan responded with nine unanswered runs to beat Team USA, 9-1, in the Super Round opener on Thursday. Rich Hill started for the U.S. and continued his dominant stretch with four shutout innings, giving him 10.1 innings with zero earned runs allowed through three starts. But once Hill was pulled from the game, Japan got to the U.S. bullpen. Kaito Kozono drove in a Premier12-record-tying seven runs in Japan's win, homering twice.. Termarr Johnson collected two hits in the six-hit effort for Team USA, which got extra-base hits from Thomas and Carson Williams.

UNITED STATES VS. CHINESE TAIPEI

Chinese Taipei was leading 3-2 in the seventh when it rattled off five more runs to pull away from Team USA and eventually win, 8-2, on Friday afternoon at the Tokyo Dome. Zac Grotz started for the U.S. and danced around trouble in each of his three innings, finishing the game with 2.2 innings pitched and five hits allowed but yielding zero runs. Sam Benschoter allowed two runs in the fourth, but the U.S. responded with one of its own in the bottom of the inning, and the two sides exchanged homers with Colby Thomas smoking his second in as many days to pull Team USA within 3-2 after five. But for the first time all tournament, Spencer Patton struggled, not retiring a batter and allowing five runs in the seventh. The five-run frame was all Taipei needed as the visiting team polished off its first Super Round win.

UNITED STATES VS. VENEZUELA

Ryan Ward delivered a go-ahead home run in the top of the ninth inning to lead Team USA to a 6-5 win in a Super Round thriller against Venezuela. The U.S. had a 5-0 lead in the contest thanks to two RBIs apiece from Matt Shaw and Chandler Simpson as well as an RBI double by Carson Williams, but Venezuela fought back and capped a comeback with a three-run homer in the eighth to tie the game. Ward's game-winning homer was his fifth of the tournament to lead all players at the Premier12; he joined Trea Turner as the only two U.S. players in the last decade to hit five home runs in a single tournament. Touki Toussaint started the contest and was brilliant through four shutout innings, allowing just two hits and striking out four. Antonio Menendez provided solid relief and Zane Mills got the win, registering the final four outs of the contest.
