FRONT OFFICE

CHUCK STURTEVANT **General Manager**

- 2024 will be Chuck's 37th year working in the Cape League.
- Sturtevant first got involved with the 'Dores in 1986, when he donated \$100 for game baseballs and bats. He then became the president and general manager of the club in 1987. He was the president until 1991.
- From 1991 to 2006, he served as treasurer and general manager for the Commodores. He was an alternate CCBL Executive Board Member from 1988 to 1991 and from 1991-2006 was a representative for Falmouth on the leagues Executive Board.
- Sturtevant then worked as the treasurer of the Bourne Braves for two years, and as the general manager for the club from 2012-2015.
- He was named 11th president of the CCBL before the 2016 season succeeding Cape League hall of famer Judy Walden Scarafile and he was at the helm of the league for 7 seasons until he retired after the 2022 season.
- During his stay as the CCBL President, Chuck coordinated major field renovations for all 10 Cape League teams.
- In 2006 Chuck was last ever chairman of the Cape League's Expansion Committee (now disbanded).
- Sturtevant has worked in various roles in the CCBL during his 36 years, including being the leagues vice president and a member of the executive board, the finance committee and the Hall of Fame committee. He also began his second stint as Commodores' president after the end of the 2019 season.
- As the general manager in Falmouth, Sturtevant helped recruit several future MLB players, including Darin Erstad, the No. 1 overall pick in the 1995 MLB draft; Tino Martinez four-time World Series champion; Kevin Cash, Tampa Bay Rays manager and many others.
- Sturtevant hired three managers for the Commodores during his tenure as general manager – Arthur "Ace" Adams, 2018 CCBL Hall of Fame inductee; Harvey Shapiro, 2020 CCBL Hall of Fame inductee and current Commodores Field Manager Jeff Trundy.
- Along with making a significant impact on the club itself, Sturtevant has been instrumental in helping the organization complete renovations on Arnie Allen Diamond at Guv Fuller Field. He said he helped raise approximately \$500,000 for new lights at the ballpark in 2007.
- Sturtevant also played a key role in the ballpark's upgrades before the 2022 season, which included new dug-outs and a new backstop.
- Sturtevant came out of retirement in November of 2023 and was named the new Commodores General Manager on November 20th, 2023.
- Chuck was inducted into the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame in 2017 for his duties as an executive within the league and the Falmouth organization. Chuck is one of just 16 executive's enshrined in the Cape League Hall of Fame.
- 2024 will be Chuck's third stint as the Commodores General Manager
- Sturtevant, a Mashpee resident graduated from Northeastern University.



FRONT OFFICE

MIKE MURRAY **Assistant General Manager**

- Mike is returning for his 12th year with the Commodores in 2024.
- Mike started with Falmouth in 2013 as a Batboy and served that position for four summers until 2017.
- Mike then became a clubhouse and grounds intern for the 'Dores from 2017 to 2020.
- Starting in May of 2020, Mike moved into General Manager intern positions. First serving as the Lead General Manager Intern to GM Chris Fitzgerald in 2020.
- His duties included, assisted the General Manager with clerical work on roster. Work on field maintenance. General security during games and assisting fans in parking areas around property. Main liaison between umpires and team personnel at home games.
- Last summer, he took on the role as Associate General Manager.
- Was named the 2024 Commodores Assistant General Manager in November of 2023
- Mike is a spring graduate of Suffolk University in Boston where he earned a Bachelors of Science studying Criminal Justice and Sport Management.
- Has worked with the CCBL Commissioner and President on numerous special events including the All-Star Game, Playoffs and the Hall of Fame Induction ceremony.



CULLEN DUNN **Associate General Manager**

- Cullen is returning for his 4th year as an intern with the Cape Cod Baseball League.
- Formerly he was the League Presidents intern under his grandfather Chuck Sturtevant.
- Dunn is a 2023 graduate of Mashpee High School and just finished his freshman year at Merrimack College.
- Cullen has been involved in the CCBL for his whole life with his father and grandfather being the General Manager of the Falmouth Commodores and formerly the Bourne Braves.
- Last summer, Dunn served as one of the General Manager interns under former GM Chris Fitzgerald.
- Was named the 2024 Commodores Associate General Manager in November of 2023,
- Is succeeding now Assistant General Manager Mike Murray in the position of Associate GM.

MANAGERIAL CAREER

- 2024 will be the 30th summer that Jeff Trundy serves coaching on Cape Cod. It will be the 25th season that he suits up as the skipper of Falmouth.

- Trundy has racked up 14 playoff appearances, five championship runner-up seasons, and three Mike Curran Coach of the Year Awards during his time with Falmouth.

- Has coached MLB talent in Alec Bohm '17, Kevin Cash '99, Jacoby Ellsbury '04, A.J. Pollock '08, Adley Rutschman '17, Rhys Hoskins '13 along with many others in Falmouth.

- During the summer of 2004, Trundy led Falmouth to a 25-18-1 record and leading the Commodores to their first playoff birth in seven years and reached the championship but fell to Y-D.

- From 2010-2020, Trundy directed Falmouth to nine Cape League postseasons during that decade and reached the championship series three times.

- Trundy is the Commodores winningest manager with 514 wins entering 2024 and is the longest tenured manager of the team.

- Trundy and the 'Dores have reached the Cape League Playoffs each of the last six full playoffs*. (*Falmouth missed playoffs in 2021 due to smaller field of 6-teams in response to post-COVID-19).

- From 2016-2020, Trundy had Falmouth as the best in the West, winning the West Division regular season crown three out of four seasons, winning 24+ games in each season.

- Entered Cape League in 1995 serving as an assistant coach for two years for Mike Coutts in Cotuit.

- Moved on in 1997 to serve two years as an assistant for Harvey Shapiro in Falmouth.

- Third all-time winningest manager in Cape League history and the third longest tenured manager in Cape League history.

FREDERICK GUNN SCHOOL

- In the off season serves as the head baseball coach at Frederick Gunn School (formerly The Gunnery School) in Washington, CT.

- Joined the Frederick Gunn School faculty in 1997 as a science teacher and just finished his 27th spring coaching the Highlanders.

- Coached MLB talent, including Justin Dunn '13 (Seattle Mariners), P.J. Higgins '12 (Chicago Cubs), and Brooks Belter '07 (Tampa Bay Rays) at the Frederick Gunn School.

BACKGROUND

- Jeff grew up in the small town of West Minot, Maine.
- He was the Captain of the baseball team at the University of New Hampshire before moving on to earn his Master's Degree from the University of Colorado.
- Began coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Colorado.
- He returned to Augusta, Maine to coach at Cony High School for the next twenty years. While there, he coached State Championship teams for the Rams.
- He has three times been selected among Maine public school coaches as Coach of the Year (twice for baseball, once for soccer).
- Jeff enjoyed a five-year stint as the coach of the Auburn team in the Portland Twilight League during the 1980s. Led Auburn to 3 straight league championships from 1981 to 1983.
- Jeff and his wife Patti have three daughters. His extended family has a rich tradition of playing and coaching baseball. From the small towns in Maine to the shores of Cape Cod.
- In addition to coaching he has also served as a part time scout for the Toronto Blue Jays.

- Maine Baseball Hall of Fame Class of 2013.
- Recorded 500th career win on July 9th, 2023 with a 5-2 win over the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox at Guv Fuller Field. A feat matched only by Cape legends John Schiffner (Chatham), Scott Pickler (Yarmouth-Dennis), and Harvey Shapiro (Falmouth, Bourne, and Wareham)

COACHING CAREER

- Mike enters his 12th season with the Commodores as the pitching coach, and brings with him extensive experience in the collegiate and professional ranks.
- Mike began his coaching career at Lewis University in Romeoville, Illinois where he earned a Master's Degree in school counseling while also serving as a graduate assistant baseball coach.
- In 2006 he was offered the opportunity to move up to the major leagues as a batting practice pitcher and bullpen catcher for the White Sox. There he worked closely with big league hitters and pitchers.
- Mike also served as the bullpen coach for the Rockford RiverHawks of the independent Frontier League.
- Most recently Mike served as volunteer assistant coach in 2011 for the Georgetown University Hoyas. At Georgetown Mike coached the catchers and first basemen and worked with the hitters.
- Mike now works in the offseason at Thayer Academy in Braintree, Massachusetts.

PLAYING CAREER

- Landry played seven years of minor league baseball as a catcher from 2001-2008.
- As a professional player, Mike played for independent teams including the Nashua Pride and Brockton Rox before signing an affiliated contract with the Chicago White Sox in 2005.
- Landry played the 2005 season with the Great Falls White Sox, Chicago's rookie ball team.
- Landry earned his bachelor of arts in graphic design in 2001 from Lewis University where he was a four year letter winner, served as a team captain, and was an All-Great Lakes Valley Conference nominee.

John **SCHIFFNER** BENCH COACH

COACHING CAREER

- John Schiffner enters his first season with the Falmouth Commodores as bench coach.
- He coached the Chatham A's/Anglers for 25 years, guiding Chatham to two CCBL championships, six East Division titles, 16 playoff appearances, 541 regular season wins, and two Manager of the Year awards.
- At the time of his retirement Schiffner was the winningest manager in the Cape League's history. He was inducted into the Cape Cod League's Hall of Fame in 2018.
- From 1978-82 and 1990-92 Schiffner served as an assistant for the A's/Anglers. From 1983-1988, Schiff was a bird dog scout for the Montreal Expos and in 1989 he was the manager of the New Jersey A's in the Atlantic Collegiate Baseball League.
- Schiffner has coached or managed 41 first round draft picks and more than 160 of his former players have reached the major leagues, including Kris Bryant, Evan Longoria, Andrew Miller, Mike Lowell, Kyle Seager, and Todd Frazier to name a few.
- Schiff also served as head coach of Plainfield High School, Plainfield Conn. from 1979-2011, guiding the Panthers to state tournament appearances in 31 of his 33 years at the helm.
- In 2001, Schiffner was named American Baseball Coaches Association, District I, Division III National High School Coach of the Year and in 2000, he was honored as the Connecticut High School Baseball Coach of the Year.
- Schiffner was inducted in the Connecticut High School Coaches Hall of Fame on November 16, 2017.

PLAYING CAREER

- Schiffner graduated from Providence College in 1977 with a BA in Social Studies-Education before achieving his MS in Human Relations at Eastern Connecticut State University in 1986.
- While at Providence College, Schiffner captained the baseball team, and was named All-East and All-ECAC during his career.
- He also played for the Harwich Mariners in the CCBL from 1974-76.

COACHING CAREER

- Brett enters his 7th summer with the Commodores as the Hitting Coach.
- As a Coach, Brett's coaching career has taken him to all levels of college baseball. Serving as the Hitting Coach/Offensive Coordinator at 2 different schools.
- In 2016, he led a Colby Community College team to their first ever Jayhawk West Championship after finishing in last place in 2015.
- Brett's journey as a coach has taken him across the state of Kansas.
- Brett has spent time at Barton County, Emporia State, Fort Hays State and Colby Community College which his role mainly revolved around hitting and offense at each school.
- Has coached over 90 players in Falmouth who've been drafted by Major League Baseball.

PLAYING CAREER

- Brett played collegiately at Cowley College and Fort Hays State earning his bachelor's degree in Health and Human Performance in 2009 and his Master's degree in 2014.
- During his playing career he was a 4 year letter winner in college.
- After transferring to Fort Hays State, he earned First Team All-MIAA and All-Region accolades as a utility player.

- Brett currently works as an Special Education teacher during the off season. He also runs Brett Becker Baseball located in Topeka, Kansas working with athletes of all age levels.
- He is married to his wife Tiernan. They have two daughters Reece and Rigley.
- Brent and his older brother Kent are buisness partners on a Topeka-based startup company founded on their idea for designing a batting grip to ratchet up a player's hitting prowess called Pivot Point™.

THE STORY OF 2023

The story of the 2023 Falmouth Commodores was a roller coaster of emotions. It was the Centennial Season of the Cape Cod Baseball League, and the Falmouth Commodores were celebrating their 100th year of baseball.

Founded in 1923, Falmouth was one of the league's original teams along with Osterville, Hyannis, and Chatham. At the time, teams were made up of players from local colleges and prep schools, along with some semi-pro players and other locals. It's safe to say the Cape League has come a long way since its inception in 1923.

In 2023, skipper Jeff Trundy returned to Falmouth to manage the team for his 24th season as the Field Manager.



The roster consisted of top-tier college baseball talent, including infielder Travis Bazzana from Oregon State, infielder Tyler MacGregor from Northeastern, RHP Michael Barnett from UCLA, and many more.

The 'Dores opened on June 10th, 2023, at the Guv against their divisional rivals, the Wareham Gatemen. Sophomore right-hander Michael Forret out of the State College of Florida Manatee-Sarasota got the nod from Coach Trundy to start the season on the bump. The Gatemen put up five early runs entering the bottom of the third before the Falmouth bats came to play. Infielder Gavin Kilen out of Louisville roped a double in the gap, scoring Tab Tracy for the Commodores' first run of the Centennial Season. Then, a walk to Christian Martin (Virginia Tech) and a double by Charlie Condon (Georgia) cut the lead down to 5-3. The Georgetown Hoya Michael Eze would add a sac fly to score Condon and leave the frame at 5-4. The Wareham bats continued to boom on opening night as the Gatemen entered the bottom of the 9th with an 11-5 lead. The never-say-die Commodores embraced that mindset and started the final frame with some vengeance. Scott Bandura (Princeton) and Eze lined singles to start the inning. Outfielder Mike Handal (Fairfield) grounded out but advanced both runners, making it an 11-6 ballgame. Back-to-back walks of Harrison Povey (Florida Gulf Coast) and Tracey (Texas A&M) saw Wareham walk in a run and make it 11-7 with the bases loaded. The Gatemen turned to Brian Yetter to relieve Isaac Fix in hopes of getting the final two outs. Faced with one out and bases loaded, Yetter immediately walked Kilen before giving up a 2 RBI single to Christian Martin, making it an 11-10 ballgame with runners on first and second and only one away. Yetter would get the final two outs, but opening day showed the pure grit and resilience that the 2023 edition of the Falmouth Commodores would bring to the table.

Falmouth followed up this opening day loss with a 3-3 tie to Bourne the following day and picked up win number 1 against the Harwich Mariners at Whitehouse Field by the final score of 2-1. The bullpen outings from Antoine Jean (Alabama) and KC Hunt (Mississippi State) combined for 5 innings of shutout



baseball, only allowing 3 hits with 7 strikeouts en route to a win and save, respectively.

The next 12 games would see a rough patch for Falmouth. Going a combined 2-9-1 during that two-week stretch would see a digression from the level of intensity the team brought to

to start the season.

The 'Dores traveled to Orleans and Eldredge Park to take on the flaming hot Firebirds squad in hopes of getting back in the win column and ending a five-game losing skid. Falmouth struck first with a 1st inning Tyler MacGregor hit to the outfield, bringing home John Spikerman to give Falmouth an early 1-0 lead. Orleans would tie the game up at one a piece in the bottom of the third before the Commodore bats slugged three more home to put the squad up 4-1 after four innings of play. An overall solid pitching performance from the staff with AJ Causey throwing a four-inning start and bullpen efforts from Parker Coil, Rio Britton, and KC Hunt would combine to limit the Orleans offense to just three runs and five K's. Britton earned the win and Hunt the save as Falmouth would exit Eldredge with a 4-3 win and their first win in exactly a week.



This win in Orleans sparked a Moneyball-like rally from the Commodores as Jeff Trundy's crew would win the next three over Chatham, Brewster, and Wareham, drop a heartbreaker to Bourne at home 7-6 but would rebound with a demolishing 12-2 win over the first-place Cotuit Kettleers at home on the 4th of July. The annual 4th of July rivalry shifted to Lowell Park on July 5th and saw Cotuit get their revenge by the final score of 3-2 in the village of Cotuit.

Falmouth answered the loss with five consecutive wins over Orleans, Y-D, Wareham, Brewster, and Bourne to make Falmouth the hottest team in the Cape League with a 10-2 record over their last 12 games.

A once 3-10-2 team now stood at 13-12-2 and went from last place in the West to third place.

Hot in a playoff race, the team took a trip to Commodore Hendy Field on the campus of the Massachusetts Maritime Academy for a neutral site game against the Wareham Gatemen. Luke Heyman (Florida) crushed a two-run home run to give the Commodores an early lead, but the Gatemen once again got the best of the 'Dores in a 5-2 Wareham win in Buzzards Bay.

After this game, the Commodores had just ten games remaining and got hot at the right time. Falmouth went an impressive 8-2 down the stretch to finish the regular season at 24-18-2. Their 50 points were good enough to clinch the Commodores the three-spot in the Western Divisional playoffs.

Falmouth would go up against the 2nd seeded Hyannis Harbor Hawks in the first round of the 2023 Cape League Playoffs.

Game one was set at McKeon Park in Hyannis, the only ballpark that Falmouth failed to win a game at in 2023, going 0-3 on the road vs. the Harbor Hawks in the regular season. Regular season ace Braden Davis out of Sam Houston State would earn the start in game one of the playoffs. It would be a rough start for Davis as he surrendered 7 earned runs in just 2.1 innings pitched, leaving the Commodores down 7-2 after three innings. The Harbor Hawks' offense just overpowered the 'Dores en route to a 13-6 victory in game one of the playoff series.

Game two the following night shifted back to Guv Fuller Field as Michael Barnett out of UCLA would look to pitch the 'Dores to a game three. Barnett turned in one of his best starts of the season, going 5 innings and allowing just one earned run, giving time for the offense to score in each of the first five frames. Falmouth led 6-2 after six and was looking like they would force a game three the following night. This was when Hyannis's dynamic offense fought back and put up crooked numbers in the 7th and 8th innings. Hyannis had secured a 7-6 lead heading into the bottom of the ninth as they stood just three outs away from advancing to the Cape League semifinals.

With their backs up against the wall, MacGregor opened the bottom of the ninth with a strikeout swinging before Barry Walsh (Boston College) would line a single and advance to second on a wild pitch. Behind in the count, Luke Heyman chopped a single to the third basemen that was misplayed and watched as Walsh scored, tying the game up after nine innings.

Falmouth would play in their very first extra inning ballgame in game 46 in a win-or-go-home situation. Stephen Quigley toed the rubber and walked three Harbor Hawks to load the bases with only one away. Hyannis would double in two runs and take a 9-7 lead with them into the bottom of the tenth and despite getting two runners aboard the Commodores failed to bring them home and fell 9-7 and got swept in the series.

A heartbreaking end to the 2023 Commodores' season.

In 2023, five 'Dores represented the team in Harwich at the All-Star Game: Bazzana, Kilen, Garrett Coe (UConn), Joey Ryan (Boston College), and Kade Snell (Oregon State).

Travis Bazzana would win the Thurman Munson Batting Title while hitting a league-best .375. Bazzana's 6 home runs, 31 RBI's, 14 SB's, and 1 cycle he hit was good enough to win him the Cape Cod Baseball League Pat Sorrenti Most Valuable Player Award. The first time a Commodore won it since Kevin Newman (Wichita State) did so back in 2014.

Tyler MacGregor also won some hardware of his own being named The John J. Claffey Outstanding New England Player Award. The Northeastern product slugged 34 hits, a .318 average, and 23 RBI's making him just the third Commodore to win this award.

26 Commodores were selected in the 2023 MLB including 2023 players in Izack Tiger (Butler County CC), Scott Bandura (Princeton), Logan Van Treeck (Lipscomb), Carson Montgomery (Florida State), Paul Bonzagni (Southern Illinois), Michael Forret, and Rio Britton (NC State).

It was a good Centennial Celebration Season for the Falmouth Commodores as season 100 was in the books and season 101 in 2024 is next on the horizon.

CCBL ORIGIN OF THE NAMES



FALMOUTH COMMODORES

A "Commodore" is a highly ranked naval officer. The team's name came out of the fact that it was run by a commodore in its early days. Central Park at the Falmouth Heights was Falmouth's home field for over sixty years which also played a tiny influence on the name of the team given the Falmouth Heights beach was across the street.



BOURNE BRAVES

The Bourne Braves were formally the Bourne Canalmen and didn't adopt their current name until 1988. Bourne merged with the than Sagamore Canalmen team which played home games at Keith Field and used the Cape Cod Canal as the backdrop of the field. The team folded after the 1972 season and would return Prior to the 1988 season as part of a two team expansion with Brewster bringing the current total to ten teams. The name Braves was selected to honor the second major league baseball team to call nearby Boston home.



COTUIT KETTLEERS

According to Cotuit's official website, "more than 300 years ago...the Indians bartered with the early settlers for the land on which the villages of Cotuit and Santuit now stand. The terms of the sale were a brass kettle with a hoe thrown in for good measure. Thus, the Cotuit baseball team's nickname, Kettleers, was derived from that early real estate transaction."



HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS

The Hyannis Harbor Hawks or formally the Hyannis Mets were forced to change their name when a trademark lawsuit with Major League Baseball arose in 2008. The Mets changed their name to the Harbor Hawks due to McKeon Park hosting an Osprey nest on the light poles. The Osprey was always the unofficial mascot of the team. The team held a fan vote for the new name and the Osprey won, but a single-A team at the time already trademarked that nickname so Hyannis had

to go to plan C. The Osprey idea made the most sense and due to McKeon Park being on the harbor, the team transformed the Osprey into the Hawk and thus the Harbor Hawks was born.

CCBL ORIGIN OF THE NAMES



WAREHAM GATEMEN

Gatemmen is plural for a gatekeeper. This name made sense given Wareham is the gateway to the Cape. Before Rt. 495 and Rt. 25 were built, the only way to the bridges was on Rt. 28 which ran through Wareham. Rt. 28 still runs through Wareham today there is a Gate with Light Houses on each side and a sign reading "Welcome to Cape Cod." In 2020 that slogan was changed to the "Gateway to Cape Cod".



BREWSTER WHITECAPS

Brewster joined the Cape league in 1987 as the leagues most recent expansion team. A whitecap is the seafoam crest over the waves as they come crashing in. Brewster which is located on the Cape Cod Bay gives a natural outlet for the name. A fan contest was held to determine the name of Brewster's team and among the hundreds of different names given, "Whitecaps" came out as the clear favorite. During the teams first couple of years the Whitecaps actually wore white caps.



CHATHAM ANGLERS

The Chatham Anglers, formerly the Athletics changed their name in 2008 during the MLB Trademark lawsuit. Chatham re-brand to the Anglers to resonate with the Cape Cod community and their rich history of fishermen. Chatham paid homage to this with the name and by creating a logo with a fishing rod and hook establishing the "S" in "A's." The use of the "A's" nickname was kept and the team also retained its uniform colors and pinstripe pattern.



HARWICH MARINERS

The Harwich Mariners were established in 1930 and took their name from the the waters that surrounded the cape and the people who worked on them. In 2008 MLB could not enforce the "Mariners" trademark against Harwich because the use of the nickname by Harwich predated the entry of the Seattle Mariners into the MLB as an expansion team in 1977.

CCBL ORIGIN OF THE NAMES

ORLEANS FIREBIRDS



A Firebird is said to have magical powers such as invisibility and regeneration. According to a Cape League press release written in 2009: "Baseball is replete with allusions to other 'fire' concepts, such as a team or player 'catching fire' or being 'fired up,' 'firing the ball' and describing hard-throwing pitchers as 'fireballers,'" the article said. The team was originally the Orleans Cardinals but changed that due to the MLB lawsuit in 2008. The front office asked the player for suggestions and "Firebirds" was the suggestion of pitcher Brad Stillings (Kent State) and it became the popular choice among the organization. The new name is also a tip of the cap to the Orleans Fire Department which stands out in left field of Eldredge Park.

YARMOUTH-DENNIS RED SOX



The Yarmouth-Dennis ball club joined the league as the Yarmouth Indians in 1946. In 1961 the nearby Dennis Clippers disbanded and saw a re-brand of Yarmouth in 1968 to add Dennis to their title. In the early 1960s, the Yarmouth Chamber of Commerce had annually invited Boston Red Sox players, officials, and their families to take an all-expenses-paid getaway to Yarmouth during the MLB All-Star break, this was known as the "Yarmouth Red Sox Day". The 1967 the

Boston Red Sox took the hearts of their fans and became known as the "Impossible Dream" team and Yarmouth-Dennis capitalized on local excitement surrounding the team and re-branded to the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox.

Falmouth has hosted the Cape League All-Star Game in 1966, 1972, 1974, 1991, 1995, 2001, 2003 and now can add 2024 to that list.

It was only the 4th All-Star Game in league history and the first ever victory for the Lower Cape Division.

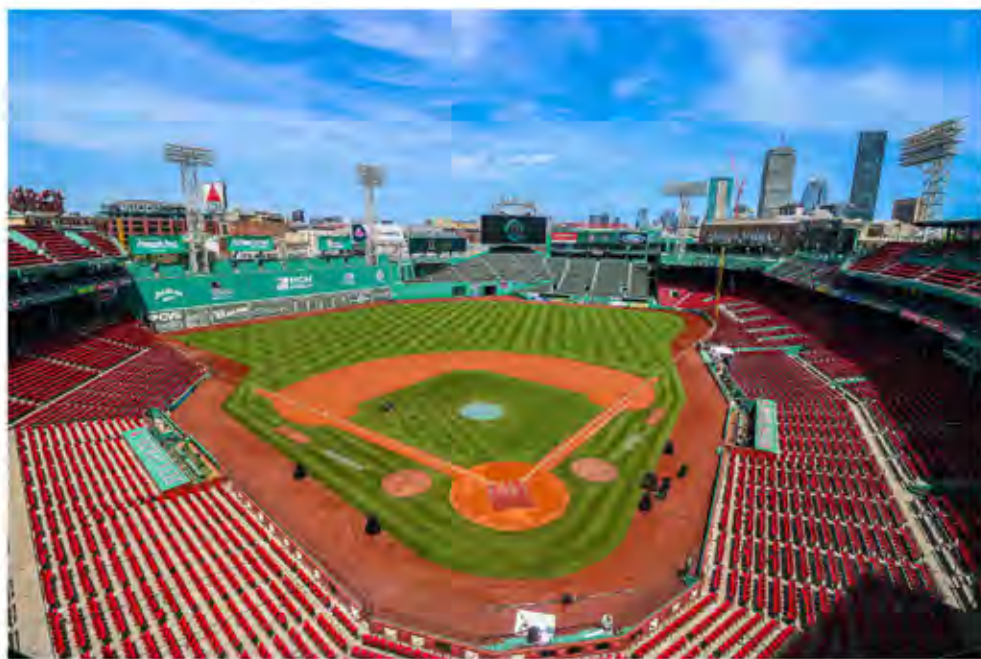

JIM RIGGLEMAN (1973)

The Falmouth right fielder was the hero of the 13-7 win over the Atlantic Collegiate Stars at Yankee Stadium. Riggleman became the first player to hit an all-star game grand slam as his timely blast broke open a close game and led to a 7-1 lead. Riggleman hit several deep foul balls to left before lining one off the left field screen attached to the foul pole. Riggleman made his major league managerial debut with the San Diego Padres late in the 1992 season and would manage in the MLB until 2018.



JASON EDGAR (1997)

While the Falmouth second baseman was not a starter, he was named game MVP with two hits, two runs and an RBI on a solo home run as the West won 5-4. His home run in the last of the eighth pulled the West stars even, and the team went on to win the game on a one-out walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth by Cotuit's Robb Quinlan.

DALLAS BUCK (2004)

Not much to cheer about for the West All-Stars as they had only two hits and the East won in a rout, 13-0. The two hits tied the record for the fewest hits in an All-Star game. Oregon State's Dallas Buck, representing Falmouth, pitched well in his inning of work to be named the West All-Star MVP.

Falmouth's Brad Chalk had two hits for the West in their 7-2 loss to the East and was named MVP. Future Red Sox star Mitch Moreland had three RBI to capture East MVP honors.

In 2 2/3 innings of shutout pitching, Knittle allowed one hit and struck out two. He also helped his cause with a pair of hits, including a double in posting the 4-2 win by the Upper Cape All-Stars.

STEVE KADISON (1965)

While Kadison made the team as an infielder, he was called upon in late innings to pitch and collected the win, 10-9 win by the Upper Cape All-Stars. With the bullpen spent, Kadison came on in the eighth inning and allowed four runs on three hits. However, the Upper Cape Stars rallied for three runs in the last of the eighth before darkness set in giving Kadison the unexpected victory.

DAVE STONE (1968)

Stone got the win and helped his cause with a run-scoring double in the top of the ninth leading the Upper Cape to a 3-0 win over the Lower Cape. Stone pitched two-hit ball over the last two scoreless innings.

PAUL MITCHELL (1970)

Mitchell pitched two scoreless innings in the Cape League's 6-3 victory over the Atlantic Collegiate Stars at Yankee Stadium.

PAUL MITCHELL (1971)

The future Baltimore Oriole won for the second straight year as the Cape League All-Stars topped the Atlantic Collegiate Stars 6-3 at Veteran's Field in Chatham. Mitchell went three innings allowing no runs, scattering two hits and striking out three to earn the victory.

MIKE FLANAGAN (1972)

Flanagan, another future Baltimore Oriole, picked up the victory when his Falmouth teammate Jim Riggelman hit two home runs leading to the win. With the Atlantic Collegiate All Stars opting not to take part in this year's game, defending playoff champ Falmouth played the All-Stars and posted an 8-1 victory.

GEORGE TSAMIS (1988)

This year the league returned to an intra league game which featured the best of the West against the best of the East. Orleans hosted the game and Tsamis pitched the second and third innings for the win leading the West to a 4-3 victory. Future major league stars Jeff Bagwell (Chatham) and Mo Vaughn (Wareham) each hit home runs.

KRIS WILSON (1995)

The right hander out of Georgia Tech struck out two over two innings pitched for the 4-0 victory for the West over the East.

JEFFREY PASSATINO (2016)

Passatino retired all three batters in the top of the first to become the pitcher of record as the West blanked the East, 8-0.

MATTHEW CANTERINO (2018)

As the West starter, Canterino was staked to an early 2-0 lead and was awarded the 4-3 victory. Falmouth's Kyle Stavers had an RBI single in the first to give the West team a lead they would not lose.

HISTORY



TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

1923

- According to baseball historians, the first organized Cape Cod Baseball League began in 1923 when teams from Chatham, Falmouth, Hyannis and Osterville joined to form the first such organization.
- In 1923, the four teams played a total of 12 games throughout the months of July and August, with the season ending with a round-robin tournament at the end of August.
- Every playoff game that year was decided by one run and Falmouth was knocked off by the eventual champion Hyannis 14-13.
- The 1923 playoffs were played at the annual Barnstable Fair and the games were played at the Fairgrounds.
- Brown University pitcher Hal Neubauer was the ace in the Falmouth rotation and would pitch for the Boston Red Sox two years later.
- His battery-mate at was catcher Bill Cronin, who hit a whopping .420 that summer. Cronin went on to play several seasons in the majors with the Boston Braves.

1924

- Osterville and future major leaguers Frank "Shanty" Hogan and "Deacon" Danny McFadden beat Falmouth in a playoff game, knocking the Commodores out of the playoffs.
- 1924 would be the last time playoffs were held for several seasons.

1925

- CCBL Hall of Famer Danny "Deacon" MacFayden would lead Falmouth this summer and the season was highlighted by MacFayden's one-hitter against Hyannis.

1927

- Finished in 2nd place at 20-17 behind a Hyannis team that ended the season with a 28-10 record come Labor Day 1927.
- Former NFL running back Curly Oden spent his off-season as Falmouth's player-manager. Oden used his speed to steal many bases including several steals of home.

1929

- On August 26 the Falmouth team traveled to Rockland, Massachusetts to play a charity exhibition contest against the major league Boston Braves. In front of a crowd of about four thousand, the Braves won the game, 8-7 despite being out-hit by Falmouth 13-11.
- Braves future Hall of Famer George Sisler went 0-for-3 in the game.
- Falmouth closed out the decade finishing two games ahead of Chatham-Harwich to win the pennant and claim the Cape League championship for the first time.
- Field Manager Lynn Wells in his first season lead the team to a 25-19 record.

1930

- The exhibition contest with the Boston Braves became an annual event into the mid-1930s, with Falmouth defeating the major leaguers on multiple occasions.
- Holy Cross catcher Jack Walsh joined Falmouth and batted .360 for the season.

1931

- Jack Walsh took over as the player-manager following the departure of Lynn Wells
- Walsh lead the team to the 1931 title after posting a 34-16 record.
- Another Holy Cross Crusader on the team was third baseman Al Niemiec. Niemiec went on to play for the Boston Red Sox, and in 1937 was traded by the Red Sox with one other player to San Diego in exchange for a promising young kid named Ted Williams.



TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

1932

- Walsh skippered the team to a 23-11 record and watched as Falmouth would repeat the first place finish and earn their third title.

1933

- The second-half winners in Harwich swept Falmouth in three straight playoff games for the championship and Falmouth finished as runner ups.

-Hurler Emil "Bud" Roy began the summer with Barnstable, finished it with Falmouth, and was playing with the Philadelphia Athletics in September.

1934

- Joe Mulligan and Red Flaherty played for Falmouth in 1936. Mulligan had pitched for the Boston Red Sox in 1934, and Flaherty went on to enjoy a long major league umpiring career, officiating for over 20 years in the American League, including four World Series assignments.

1935

- Barnstable had its sights on a second straight title, but in 1935 neighboring Falmouth won a well-contested five-game series for the title.



1936

-Future Red Sox hurler Wilfred "Lefty" Lefebvre's outdueled Barnstable's Ted Olsen, 8-3 for the game 1 win.

-Jake Edwards hit one of the longest home runs at the Falmouth Heights park, the ball landing in the attic of a house in right field.

-In game two, with Barnstable leading 2-0 in the seventh inning, Falmouth scored a run in the seventh and two in the ninth for a 3-2 win.

-Needing one more win to secure the trophy, Barnstable would earn a sweep of Labor Day double-header, 9-1 and 11-5.

-In a game five, winner take all situation, Falmouth plated a run in the last of the ninth to win the series 3-2 as Lefebvre outdueled Olsen for the championship.

-Falmouth finished with a 30-9 record and won its five title in league history.

1936

- Was the 6th and final summer for manager Jack Walsh. Walsh would finish his managerial career with 3 titles and posted a 170-109 won-loss record as manager and did not have a losing season.

1937

- Bill Boehuer took over as the manager of the Falmouth team and would coach the squad for the next three years.

1938

- Falmouth, which had finished in a distant fourth in 1937, rebuilt and rebounded to capture the championships in 1938.

- They snuck past Harwich on the final day of the season with a 32-22 record, beating the second-place team by one game.

- Falmouth's 1938 championship team featured slugger John Spirida, who went on to play pro football with the Washington Redskins the following year.

1939

- Falmouth won both the first and second halves of the season to emerge as repeating champion.

- Falmouth hosted the first-ever night game at its Central Park field in Falmouth Heights on July 19 against Barnstable.

- First year manager Buzz Harvey would become the third manager in team history to win the title in his first season.

TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

1940-1945

- No season was held due to World War II.

1946

- The Cape League returned and saw 11 teams comprising two divisions (the Upper Cape Division and the Lower Cape Division).
- Falmouth's entry in the Upper Cape Division was known as the Falmouth All-Stars, as the players were a collection of young residents from Falmouth's town league.
- Led by manager John DeMello, the All-Stars won the inaugural championship of the new Cape League in 1946.
- The team featured CCBL Hall of Famers Roche Pires and Manny Pena, both of whom became regular fixtures for the All-Stars.
- Falmouth defeated Sagamore in a one-game playoff for the Upper Cape Division title, then met Lower Cape champion Harwich in the best-of-three championship series.
- Harwich took Game 1 at Brooks Park, 6-1, holding the All-Stars to just three hits.
- Game 2 was played on Labor Day at Falmouth Heights before a reported crowd of 3,000. Pires struck out seven as Falmouth capitalized on four Harwich errors to build an 8-0 lead and would go on to win 10-6.
- After Game 2, a coin flip determined Falmouth would host Game 3 the following weekend, and the All-Stars sent Pires to the mound in the finale. The game was even at 3-3 through five frames, but again Harwich's errors were its downfall, leading to Falmouth rallies in the late innings that gave the All-Stars the 8-4 victory and the league crown.

1949

- Roche Pires and Manny Pena led Falmouth back to the championship series in 1949, but the club was downed by Lower Cape champ Orleans.

1951

- Falmouth entered a second franchise in the Cape League. The Falmouth Falcons were composed mainly of players in their late teens and early twenties. The team played for three years in the Cape League, sharing the Falmouth Heights field with the All-Stars.
- The 1951 Falcons were skippered by player/manager Charlie "Wig" Robb, and after opening their inaugural campaign finishing the season's first half in second place in the Upper Cape Division.
- Falcons' hurler Charlie Eastman was the winning pitcher for the Upper Cape in its 5-3 victory over the Lower Cape in the 1951 CCBL All-Star Game, and was joined on the Upper Cape squad by fellow Falcons Joe Parent at shortstop and Robb at third base.

1952

- Falmouth native Charlie Borden, who had spent time as a minor leaguer in the Chicago Cubs farm system, took over managerial duties and pitched for the Falcons in 1952.
- After disappointing seasons by both Falmouth teams in 1952, a merger for the following season was discussed, but the Falcons were not keen to the idea.

1953

- Town funds were appropriated for only one team in 1953, but the Falcons remained in the league through independent financial support, led by new skipper Phil White. This season was the final one for the Falcons.

1957

- Future Boston Red Sox catcher Russ Gibson joined Falmouth in 1957 when he was signed by Boston. In his only game with Falmouth, he hit two home runs.

TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS



1963

- The CCBL was reorganized and became officially sanctioned by the NCAA. The league would no longer be characterized by "town teams" who fielded mainly Cape Cod residents, but would now be a formal collegiate league. Teams began to recruit college players and coaches from an increasingly wide geographic radius.

1964

- The Falmouth All-Stars moved from the Falmouth Heights field and began playing home games at Guv Fuller Field.

1965

- The Falmouth All-Stars change their name to the Falmouth Commodores.
- CCBL Hall of Fame manager Bill Livesey took over for his first season and lead the Commodores to a 17-15 record in their inaugural season

with the new name.

1966

- Guv Fuller Field hosted its first All-Star Game and watched as the Lower Cape took down the Upper Cape 5-1.
- Livesey's 1966 title team featured CCBL Hall of Fame pitcher Noel Kinski, a three-time all-star. Kinski went 7-3 with a 3.15 ERA and was the Upper Cape Division's starting All-Star Game pitcher.
- The Commodores faced Lower Cape champ Chatham in the best-of-five 1966 title series. Falmouth dropped Game 1 at Veteran's Field, but rebounded in Game 2 at home behind a 1-0 complete game shutout by Kinski.
- Game 3 was a 7-3 win on the road for Falmouth, setting up a classic series clincher at Guv Fuller Field in Game 4.
- With the Commodores down, 4-3 in the seventh inning, Bugbee, who had so far gone hitless in the series, blasted a two-run homer to put Falmouth up, 5-4. Clinging to a one-run lead with no outs and a runner on first in the top of the ninth, Livesey called to the bullpen for Kinski. The ace lefty proceeded to pick off the runner, then struck out Chatham all-stars Steve Saradnik and George Greer to give the Commodores the championship.
- This title was the 7th in team history and first in 20 years.

1967

- Set a league record starting the season at 11-0. This record would hold until Cotuit broke it in 2002.
- Chatham and Falmouth rematched for the title in 1967, with Chatham coming out on top.
- Falmouth finished the summer with an impressive 28-12 record.

1968

- The 1968 team included Worcester native Pat Bourque, who went on to win a World Series with the 1973 Oakland A's.
- The Commodores met Harwich in the best-of-five 1968 championship series, and dropped Game 1 at Whitehouse Field.
- Falmouth stormed back with a 6-1 win in Game 2 at home, powered by slugger Mike Finnell, who launched a two-run homer and scored four of the team's six runs.
- Finnell was at it again in Game 3 on the road, blasting another four-bagger as the Commodores took a two-games-to-one series lead.
- The Game 4 finale at Guv Fuller Field found the score tied at 10-10 and the bases loaded for Falmouth in the bottom of the tenth. The Commodores walked off with the championship as Steve Greenberg, son of Baseball Hall of Famer Hank Greenberg, drew a base on balls off Harwich's CCBL Hall of Fame hurler Pete Ford to force in the series-winning run.
- 1968 was the 8th CCBL title in team history and 2nd for skipper Bill Livesey

1969

- Ace pitcher and CCBL Hall of Famer Paul Mitchell was named the league's Outstanding Pitcher in the league. Mitchell won 25 games for the Commodores, posting a 1.53 ERA with 317 strikeouts and 28 complete games.

TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

- In the 1969 title series against Chatham, Falmouth dropped Game 1 in Chatham, being no-hit into the sixth inning, and ending up with only two hits in Chatham's 4-0 victory.
- The Commodores stormed back in Game 2 at Guv Fuller Field as Paul Mitchell was the hero on the mound and contributed a home run in a 9-4 victory that set up the decisive third game.
- Falmouth's Mickey Karkut twirled a complete game gem and the Commodores came out on top, 5-2, to secure their second consecutive league title and 9th all-time.

1970

- June 28th -- Jim Jachym struck out 21 batters, including the first five of the game, in a 1-0 win over Harwich.
- Paul Mitchell was the winning pitcher at the 1970 All-Star Game at Yankee Stadium. The Cape Cod All-Stars beat the Atlantic Coast All-Stars 6-3.
- The Commodores returned to the championship series in 1970 and faced the Orleans Cardinals.
- Jachym shut out the Cards in Game 1, 2-0.
- The Commodores sent ace Paul Mitchell to the mound with ideas of a sweep in Game 2 at Eldredge Park. Falmouth jumped out to an early 3-0 lead in the top of the first, but Orleans answered in the bottom half to go ahead 4-3. The Cardinals took a 7-5 lead into the top of the ninth, but the Commodores rallied to go ahead 8-7, and Mitchell nailed down the series-clinching victory by striking out the side in the bottom of the ninth.
- This win capped off a 25-16-1 summer and the third consecutive league title for Falmouth.

1971

- The Cape League beats the Atlantic College All-Stars, 6-3 in Chatham with Paul Mitchell as the winning pitcher for the second year in a row.
- Russ Peach threw a no-hitter vs. Yarmouth on July 21st in a 3-0 win.
- Jim Jachym threw the second no-hitter of the season as Falmouth took down Cotuit 3-0 on August 12th.
- The 1971 title series was a best-of-five series, and was a rematch of the prior year, with the Commodores facing Orleans. The Cardinals took the Game 1 pitcher's duel at Guv Fuller Field, 1-0, on a homer by Brad Linden.
- Game 2 in Orleans also ended with a 1-0 tally, but this time the Commodores were on top to tie the series.
- Falmouth sent Paul Mitchell to the hill for Game 3 at home, and the ace came through with a 3-1 victory behind a three-run dinger by Kevin Bryant.
- An ugly sixth-inning brawl involving players, umpires and fans marred Game 4 at Eldredge Park. Skipper Livesey was tossed in the eighth, and Orleans went on to win, 7-5, to tie the series at two games apiece.
- Like Games 1 and 2, Game 5 at Guv Fuller Field was a pitcher's duel that ended with just a single run being scored. Commodores hurler Bob Lukas was dominating, allowing just five hits while striking out 16. The decisive run came in the bottom of the seventh, as Dave Creighton walked and stole second, then scored the series-winning run on a Ray O'Brien single to left. The win gave Falmouth its fourth consecutive championship, and fifth in six years.

1972

- June 16th -- Brian Herosian strikes out 15 against Orleans in a 4-1 win.
- The annual Cape League All-Star game pinned a team of all-stars against defending champs Falmouth, and the Commodores won in a rout 8-1 as pitcher Mike Flanagan picked up the win.
- Falmouth's 1972 team featured CCBL batting champ Ed Orrizzi (.372) and future major leaguers Billy Almon and Mike Flanagan. Flanagan went 7-1 for the season with a 2.18 ERA while also belting seven home runs; he went on to win a World Series and Cy Young Award with the Baltimore Orioles, and was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2000.
- Falmouth finished the summer with a 26-15-1 record and lost to Cotuit in the Cape semifinals.

1973

- Bill Livesey departed after managing the squad for eight seasons and leaving as the teams all-time win leader with a 198-116-1 record.
- Falmouth hired Andy Baylock to be the teams 19th manager in history.
- Jim Riggelman was named the MVP of the Cape League All Star Game at Yankee Stadium.

TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

- The longest scoreless tie to date ended after nine innings with Orleans and Falmouth compiling the goose eggs for a 0-0 final on August 9th.

- Falmouth finished 1973 with a 16-24-2 which was the team's first losing season in nine years.

1974

- Guv Fuller Field hosted the Cape League All-Star Game for third time and saw the Atlantic All Stars upset the Cape Cod Baseball All-Stars, 4-2.

- Falmouth struggled again in 1974 posting a 17-22-3 and having its second consecutive losing season for the first time in ten years

1975

- 1975 saw a glimmer of hope as Falmouth finished with a 26-16 record and reached the Championship Series to face Cotuit.

- The Kettleers would best Falmouth for the 1975 title

1977

- 1977 could be tabbed as one of the ugliest seasons in Falmouth history.

- First year skipper Dan Gooley lead the team to their lowest win total only winning five games and finishing the year with a 5-16-1 record.

- The team was forced to withdraw from the league mid-season, "plagued by injuries and lack of employment for its players."

1979

- Manager Andy Baylock would return to manage the 1979 team and lead Falmouth to a 18-23 final record and the teams fourth consecutive losing season.

- CCBL Hall of Famer Billy Best hit .398 for the Commodores, and set league records with a 32-game hitting streak and at least one base hit in 39 of his 41 games played.

1980

- Alan LaBoeuf had seven RBIs leading Falmouth to a 22-11 win over Harwich on July 17th.

- The Commodores welcomed the new decade by returning to the league championship series to Falmouth. Led by manager Al Worthington, the 1980 team featured future major leaguers Sid Bream and Steve Lombardozzi.

- After disposing of Cotuit in the semi-finals, the Commodores met the first place Chatham Athletics in the best-of-five title series. Falmouth took the first two games, but dropped the next two, setting up the pivotal Game 5 in Chatham.

- In the finale, Falmouth took the lead early when Bruce Helser drove in Tom "Bat" Masterson in the second inning. The run was the only one the Commodores needed. Falmouth starter Mark Winters, a 6-foot-6 southpaw, took advantage of swirling Veteran's Field winds to keep Chatham hitters at bay, tossing a four-hit shutout en route to Falmouth's decisive 5-0 victory. The championship was Falmouth's sixth of the modern era, and 13th overall.

1981

- Falmouth beat Y-D 21-13 on July 11th.

- CCBL Hall of Famer Sam Nattile led the league batting .443 with 70 hits and eight home runs. Nattile also belted a game-tying home run at the league's all-star game at Fenway Park, a game that ended in a 4-4 tie.

1982

- July 7th - At the time the longest game in Cape Cod Baseball history, Falmouth beat Chatham 7-6 in a game that went 17 innings. The record has since been broken.

1983

- Hometown star Bob Allietta took the reins as the Commodores field manager. A graduate of Falmouth's Lawrence High School,



TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

1984

- Dave Nash hit for the cycle in 16-2 Falmouth win over Harwich on June 14th.
- Manager Ed Lyons picks up his 300th win in a 16-9 victory over Yarmouth-Dennis on July 12th.
- Posted a 20-19-3 record skippered by CCBL Hall of Fame manager Ed Lyons, and featured CCBL Hall of Famers Jim McCollom, who batted .413 and slugged a league-high 15 home runs, and Doug Fisher, who tied the league's single-season RBI record with 54, and finished just behind McCollom with 14 homers.

1985

- Jim Frye took over to manage the team for his first and only season and lead Falmouth to a 13-29 record.

1991

- Was led by skipper Dan O'Brien, a former Cape Leaguer with Chatham who had gone on to play for the St. Louis Cardinals.
- O'Brien had his Commodores finishing the summer with a 19-25 record and he departed after the season.

1992

- CCBL Hall of Famer Arthur "Ace" Adams was hired as the manager of the 1991 team. Adams had played for the team in the early 1970s and was a league all-star in 1973.
- Guv Fuller Field hosted the Cape League All-Star Game for the 4th team and watched as the East tops the West, 7-4.
- Scott Gentile earned his record tenth save of the season in a 7-6 win over Yarmouth-Dennis on July 28th.
- Scott Gentile set a league record for saves with his 12th of the season in a 4-3 win over Wareham on August 8th.

1993

- On June 14th, Falmouth and Orleans played the longest tied game in league history when their 3-3 tie called after 17 innings. The longest game in league history also went 17 innings in 1982 as Falmouth beat Chatham, 7-6 in 17 innings.

1994

- CCBL Hall of Fame manager Harvey Shapiro took the Falmouth helm in 1994, and led the team through 1998.
- The 1994 Commodores team featured several outstanding players. CCBL Hall of Famer and future major league all-star Darin Erstad was the Cape League's MVP. Joining him were the league's Outstanding Pitcher and fellow CCBL Hall of Famer, Bob St. Pierre, as well as the league's Outstanding Relief Pitcher, Scott Winchester.
- St. Pierre went 9-1 with a 1.44 ERA and 72 strikeouts in 75 innings.
- Scott Winchester earns his Cape League record 13th save in an 8-1 win over Cotuit on August 1st. Broke a record previously held by Falmouth closer Scott Gentile.
- Darrin Erstad was named the Cape Cod Baseball League MVP

FALMOUTH COMMODORES

- Falmouth finished the summer with a 26-16-1 and had made the postseason for the first time in 14 years.
- Fell to Wareham in the semifinals.

1995

- Guv Fuller Field hosted the All-Star Game for the fifth time in history.

1996

- Harvey Shapiro lead Falmouth to a 26-17 record and made the Cape League Championship for the first time in 16 years.
- Fell to Chatham in the 1996 championship game.
- The 1996 Commodores were carried by CCBL Hall of Fame pitcher Eric Milton's microscopic 0.21 ERA, but lost to Chatham in the title series.
- Milton's season was highlighted by his no-hitter against Orleans in which he came within one walk of a perfect game.

TEAM HISTORY/HIGHLIGHTS

1997

- The Commodores took home individual honors in 1997 as Jason Edgar was named MVP of the CCBL All-Star Game.[162]

1998

- Falmouth finished with a 20-24 record and saw Harvey Shapiro leave after the season ended.

1999

- A young Jeff Trundy was hired to be the next field manager of the Falmouth Commodores.
- Trundy took his Falmouth team to a 12-31 record and finished dead last in his first season in Falmouth.
- Doc Brooks became the first Commodore to win the CCBL All-Star Game Home Run Derby.

2000

- Catcher Phillip Ghuzman reached base seven times going 3-for-3 with four walks in a 5-4 win over Hyannis in 12 innings on July 15th.

2001

- Ray Clark struck out four batters in one inning against Cotuit on August 4th.

2002

- Falmouth blanks Cotuit for the record-tying 48th league shutout of the season, which equaled the same total from 1997.
- Longtime Commodore volunteer Arnie Allen received the league's inaugural Lifetime Achievement Award in 2002

2004

- The diamond at Guv Fuller Field was named Arnie Allen Diamond in the memory of longtime Commodore volunteer Arnie Allen.
- Reached the CCBL Championship for the first time in eight years but were swept by Y-D.
- The 2004 Falmouth team featured CCBL Hall of Fame shortstop Cliff Pennington and future Boston Red Sox star Jacoby Ellsbury.
- The Cape League MVP was CCBL Hall of Famer Daniel Carte. Carte began the 2004 season in an 0-for-19 slump, but busted out of it with his first three hits, all home runs. He led the league with 11 homers and 38 RBI, and his .308 average left him just 19 points shy of the triple crown.

2005

- 2005 Commodore Tim Norton was co-recipient of the league's Outstanding Pitcher Award, posting a 5-1 record with a 1.77 ERA and 77 strikeouts against only 15 walks in 61 innings.

2006

- The 2006 season featured a combined no-hitter tossed by Commodore hurlers Kris Dobrowiecki, Sean Morgan, Brandon Copp and Sam Demel against Bourne.

2007

- Falmouth once again dawned the CCBL MVP with CCBL Hall of Famer Conor Gillaspie. Gillaspie finished the 2007 season tops in the league in batting with a .345 mark, and also led the league in slugging and extra-base hits.
- Future major league all-star pitcher Aaron Crow was the CCBL's Outstanding Pro Prospect.
- Skipper Jeff Trundy surpassed Bill Livesey as the longest-tenured manager in Falmouth history with a win his 199th win during the 2007 season.
- Would return to the CCBL Championship series in 2007 but get swept by Y-D.

2008

- Another future MLB all-star, A.J. Pollock, took home the league's MVP Award in a Falmouth jersey, batting .377 with 61 hits.
- Jimmy Cesario led the Cape League with a .387 batting average.
- Trundy lead Falmouth to a 24-20-1 and back to the Cape League Playoffs marking the first time in 36 years Falmouth made back to back playoff appearances.
- Fell to Cotuit in the semifinal round.

2009

- Todd Cunningham won the leagues batting title hitting .378 on the way to being named the league's Outstanding Pro Prospect.

Falmouth hosted the first-ever night game in Cape League history at Central Park Field in Falmouth Heights on July 19, 1939.

CENTRAL PARK FIELD AT THE FALMOUTH HEIGHTS

Baseball has been played in Falmouth since the pre-Civil War days. The first dated baseball game at the Falmouth Heights can be dated back to July 7, 1857 as a celebration to the 4th of July.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, teams representing Cape Cod towns started competing against each other. One of the strong teams on the Cape was the Falmouth Heights Cottage Club team, whose name derived from the Falmouth Heights cottages where the players resided. The team played their games at the Central Park Field in Falmouth Heights.

This unofficial team increased the town of Falmouth's interest in baseball, an interest that was would spark the creation of the Cape League in 1923.

Spectators enjoyed an ocean view and a cool breeze as they took in the action. Long hit balls would occasionally bounce off houses across the street and would be ruled a double.

Central Park Field in the Falmouth Heights would host some of the Commodores' earliest memories including hosting 7 championships won by Falmouth and more than 100 years of Falmouth baseball history.

In 1964 the Falmouth All-Stars (at the time) moved from the Falmouth Heights and began playing home games at Guv Fuller Field. The following year, the team's name was changed to the Falmouth Commodores and stuck for the years to come.

Central Park and the Falmouth Heights Fields still stand today sandwiched between Central Park Ave, Grand Ave, and Crescent Ave. The field lays parallel to the Falmouth Heights Beach and still hosts community events, youth sporting games and serves as a landmark for the earliest history of baseball in the town of Falmouth.

Built in 1939, Arnie Allen Diamond at Guv Fuller Field will host its 60th season of Commodore baseball in 2024. The field was dedicated to Elmer E. "Guv" Fuller, longtime coach and athletic director at Falmouth's Lawrence High School, in 1952. Fuller, whose nickname referenced 1920s Massachusetts Governor Alvan T. Fuller, had quarterbacked Falmouth's high school football team in 1905 and 1906. He returned to his alma mater in 1926 and remained a central figure in the town's athletic programs until his retirement in 1952.

The diamond was named for Commodores' volunteer Arnie Allen during the 2004 season. Allen has been associated with the 'Dores since he was a bat boy at just seven years old. He spent 46 seasons with the team, serving primarily as an equipment manager, and earned the CCBL's inaugural Lifetime Achievement Award in 2004.

Since the 1964 season, "The 'Guv" has seen Falmouth claim six Cape League championships, including four in a row from 1968 to 1971. The ballpark has been the summertime home of dozens of future major leaguers, such as Tino Martinez ('86), Darin Erstad ('93-'94), and Jacoby Ellsbury ('04).

Prior to the 2022 season, the Commodores revamped several aspects of the field, including the dugouts, visitor's bullpen, bleachers, backstop, and outfield wall. The total cost of the renovations was approximately \$1.05 million and was showcased for the first time when the Commodores hosted the Harwich Mariners on Opening Night of the 2022 regular season. Funding for the renovations was courtesy of the Commodores, the Cape Cod Baseball League (CCBL), and the Community Preservation Committee (CPC).

Guv Fuller Field has been host to the CCBL All-Star Game multiple times, first in 1966 and most recently in 2003. Falmouth will once again host the game this summer, marking the first time in 21 years that the Commodores will welcome the league for the event.

Due to a split regular season, the 1935 CCBL championship was decided by a best-of-five playoff between Falmouth and Barnstable.

Falmouth sent Wilfred "Lefty" Lefebvre to the mound in Game 1 at Hallet's Field, and took an 8-3 victory over Barnstable's ace Ted Olson in a pitching duel between future teammates for the 1938 Boston Red Sox.

In Game 2 at home, Falmouth scratched out two runs in the bottom of the ninth to win, 3-2, and take a commanding series lead.

Games 3 and 4 were played as a doubleheader, and Barnstable came out on top in both halves of the twinbill, 9-1 and 11-5, to even up the series. In Game 3 at Central Park Field, Barnstable slugger Jake Edwards hit a ball that crashed through the third-story window of a house just beyond the park's cozy right field, a blast that many Falmouth fans estimated was the longest seen at the field.

The decisive Game 5 finale at Falmouth Heights was a rematch of moundsmen Lefebvre and Olson. With both hurlers pitching effectively, the game was tied, 2-2, with two out in the bottom of the ninth. Falmouth walked it off and took the title in exciting fashion when Jerry Shanahan scored on a hard line drive by Myron Ruckstull that resulted in an error off the usually reliable infielding glove of Barnstable's 18-year-old future major leaguer and CCBL Hall of Famer Lennie Merullo.

Falmouth had captured the 1935 title and their fourth all-time and first in a playoff series.

1946 Cape League Championship Falmouth vs. Harwich Best-of-5 series



The Falmouth All-Stars won the inaugural championship of the new Cape League in 1946. The team featured CCBL Hall of Famers Roche Pires and Manny Pena, both of whom became regular fixtures for the All-Stars during this period.

Falmouth defeated Sagamore in a one-game playoff for the Upper Cape Division title, then met Lower Cape champion Harwich in the best-of-three championship series.

Harwich took Game 1 at Brooks Park, 6–1, holding the All-Stars to just three hits.

Game 2 was played on Labor Day at Falmouth Heights before a reported crowd of 3,000. Pires struck out seven, and was "seldom in trouble," as Falmouth capitalized on four Harwich errors to build an 8–0 lead before Harwich finally got on the board with a pair of homers in the seventh. The Harwichers rallied again in each of the final two frames, but Pires held them off and went the distance in a 10–6 win that knotted the series at one game apiece.

After Game 2, a coin flip determined Falmouth would host Game 3 the following weekend, and the All-Stars sent Pires to the mound in the finale. The game was even at 3–3 through five frames, but again Harwich's errors were its downfall, leading to Falmouth rallies in the late innings that gave the All-Stars the 8–4 victory and the league crown.

Falmouth had won the first Cape title since post-WWII and the teams seventh title all-time.

This was also the first title under first year manager John DeMello.

After finishing the regular season atop the Upper Cape division, the Commodores faced Lower Cape champ Chatham in the best-of-five 1966 title series.

Falmouth dropped Game 1 at Veteran's Field, but rebounded in Game 2 at home behind a 1-0 complete game shutout by Kinski.

Game 3 was a 7-3 win on the road for Falmouth, setting up a classic series clincher at Guv Fuller Field in Game 4.

With the Commodores down, 4-3 in the seventh inning, Bugbee, who had so far gone hitless in the series, blasted a two-run homer to put Falmouth up, 5-4. Clinging to a one-run lead with no outs and a runner on first in the top of the ninth, Livesey called to the bullpen for Kinski. The ace lefty proceeded to pick off the runner, then struck out Chatham all-stars Steve Saradnik and George Greer to give the Commodores the championship.

1966 was the teams eighth title and first since 1946.

The 1968 Commodores championship team included Worcester, Massachusetts native Pat Bourque who went on to win a World Series with the 1973 Oakland A's.

The Commodores met Harwich in the best-of-five 1968 championship series, and dropped Game 1 at Brooks Field.

Falmouth stormed back with a 6-1 win in Game 2 at home, powered by slugger Mike Finnell, who launched a two-run homer and scored four of the team's six runs.

Finnell was at it again in Game 3 on the road, blasting another four-bagger as the Commodores took a two-games-to-one series lead. Falmouth secured the 7-4 victory in Harwich.

The exciting Game 4 finale at Guv Fuller Field found the score tied at 10-10 and the bases loaded for Falmouth in the bottom of the tenth. The Commodores walked off with the championship as Steve Greenberg, son of Baseball Hall of Famer Hank Greenberg, drew a base on balls off Harwich's CCBL Hall of Fame hurler Pete Ford to force in the series winning run.

This title was the second in three years for the Commodores.

The Commodores stormed back in Game 2 at Guv Fuller Field as ODU pitcher Paul Mitchell was the hero on the mound and contributed a home run in a 9-4 victory that set up the decisive third game.

Falmouth's Mickey Karkut twirled a complete game gem and the Commodores came out on top, 5-2.

The game was tied 2-2 entering the ninth inning but by stringing along sac hits and base hits Falmouth was able to put a crooked number in the top half and gave the ball to Notre Dame pitcher Mickey Karkut to shut things down.

Chatham had some live late into the ninth but a 4-6-3 double play was end it and secure the Cape League title with Falmouth.

1969 was the second consecutive title won by Bill Livesey's bunch and the third in four years.

1970 Cape League Championship Falmouth vs. Orleans Best-of-3 series



The Commodores returned to the championship series in 1970, the Commodores faced the Orleans Cardinals.

A tie in the regular season standings forced Commissioner Kilroy to flip a coin between Wareham and Falmouth to determine the top seed. Falmouth won the toss and took down Cotuit in two easy games in the semis by the final of 10-0 and 8-5.

For the third year in a row Falmouth returned to the Cape League Championship and this time faced Orleans.

Falmouth lefty Jim Jachym shut out the Cards in Game 1, 2-0. Charlie Janes was on the losing side for Orleans.

The Commodores sent ace Paul Mitchell to the mound with ideas of a sweep in Game 2 at Eldredge Park in front of a record crowd. Falmouth jumped out to an early 3-0 lead in the top of the first behind two Orleans errors and a balk by Orleans pitcher Willie Boynton and key hits from Terry Wedgewood and Ray Huard. Orleans answered in the bottom half to go ahead 4-3. The Cardinals took a 7-5 lead into the top of the ninth. A young Jeff Beedy came on to try and close the game out and force a game three. Wedgewood lead off with a single, Huard doubled and Herosian reached on an error to load the bases. Pitcher Paul Mitchell nailed down the series-clinching victory by striking out the side in the bottom of the ninth.

A triumph victory for Falmouth and heartbreaking loss for Orleans gave the Commodores their third consecutive title.

The 1971 title series was a best-of-five series, and was a rematch of the 1970 series won by Falmouth.

Falmouth took care of Cotuit in the semis and Orleans bested Wareham to set up the title match.

The Cardinals took the Game 1 pitcher's duel at Guv Fuller, 1-0, on a homer by Brad Linden. Two lefties got the nod as Russ Peach outlasted Tom White for the winning effort on the bump.

Game 2 in Orleans also ended with a 1-0 tally, but this time the Commodores were on top to tie the series. George Schneider was the starter for Orleans and went against Brian Herosin for Falmouth.

Falmouth sent the Old Dominion Monarch Paul Mitchell to the hill for Game 3 at home, and the ace came through with a 3-1 victory behind a three-run dinger by Kevin Bryant.

An ugly sixth-inning brawl involving players, umpires and fans marred Game 4 at Eldredge Park. Skipper Bill Livesey was tossed in the eighth, and Orleans went on to win, 7-5, to tie the series at two games apiece.

Like Games 1 and 2, Game 5 at Guv Fuller Field was a pitcher's duel that ended with just a single run being scored. Commodores hurler Bob Lukas was dominating, allowing just five hits while striking out 16. The decisive run came in the bottom of the seventh, as Dave Creighton walked and stole second, then scored the series-winning run on a Ray O'Brien single to left. The final was 1-0 for the third time in the series.

The title gave Falmouth its fourth consecutive championship, and fifth in six years.

Led by manager Al Worthington, the 1980 Falmouth Commodores team featured future major leaguers Sid Bream and Steve Lombardozzi. After disposing of Cotuit in the semi-finals, the Commodores met the first place Chatham Athletics in the best-of-five title series.

Falmouth took the first two games, but dropped the next two, setting up the pivotal Game 5 in Chatham.

In game 3, the A's were down to two outs in the eighth and still trailing, 4-3, when Dave Stenhouse started things with a single. A wild pitch and a walk to Tom Mohl brought up Steve Urbanski, who got a lucky checked-swing single. Stenhouse was beaten to the plate by another McPhail throw, but the catcher dropped it, and the game was tied. Chatham had come back and stunned Falmouth for their first win in the series.

Game 4 shifted back to Guv Fuller Field. Chatham put up a three spot in the top of the first and lead 4-0 after two innings. Peyton Mosher kept all nine Commodore hits well scattered after two runs were scored in the third. Falmouth got a sensational relief pitching from Kaye Pinhey, who retired 16 A's in a row, but thanks to Mosher's effectiveness and some solid play in the field behind him, the A's survived a ninth inning bases loaded rally and evened the series at two a piece.

In the finale, Falmouth took the lead early when Bruce Helser drove in Tom "Bat" Masterson in the second inning. The run was the only one the Commodores needed. Falmouth starter Mark Winters, a 6-foot-6 southpaw from UConn, took advantage of the swirling Veteran's Field winds to keep Chatham hitters at bay, tossing a four-hit shutout en route to Falmouth's decisive 5-0 victory. A crowd of 3,000 was on hand to witness this winner take all contest.

The 1980 championship was Falmouth's sixth of the modern era, and 13th overall.

2024 CAPE LEAGUE *Hall of Fame Inductees*

Two members of the Commodores family are set to be inducted into the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame in November.

'Dores head coach Jeff Trundy, who enters his 25th season at the helm in Falmouth in 2024, and Todd Cunningham, a 2009 Cape League All-Star selection, were announced as part of the 2024 class at the league's annual First Pitch Brunch this spring.

Trundy has made a splash at every stop in his career, including as a player at New Hampshire. After his playing career finished, Trundy went on to serve as a graduate assistant at Colorado and coached in his home state of Maine at Cony High School for two decades, capturing two state titles during his reign.

A 2013 Maine Baseball Hall of Fame inductee, Trundy stepped into his leading role in Falmouth in 1999 following a short stint in nearby Cotuit. Success has followed Trundy into Guv Fuller Field, as he has racked up three Cape League Manager of the Year Awards. (2004, 2006, 2019) In addition to that, Trundy passed 500 wins last season and is third among all coaches in Cape League history with 513 wins prior to this season. While he still has no title to his name with the 'Dores, Trundy has led Falmouth to the championship series on five occasions.

Todd Cunningham lit up the Cape in his one season in 2009, proving himself as one of the best hitters in the league. The switch-hitter from Jacksonville State led the league in three different categories that year, topping the charts in batting average (.378), hits (59), and on-base percentage (.458), while being near the top in other categories like slugging percentage and total runs.

The outfielder stood out at Jacksonville State and was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the second round of the 2008 MLB Draft. Cunningham made his major league debut in 2013 and made 67 total appearances in the majors between then and 2016 with the Braves and the Los Angeles Angels.

Following his playing career, Cunningham served in multiple coaching roles, including as a defensive coach for the Single-A Inland Empire 66ers. He currently is pursuing an MBA at North Carolina.

The Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame induction ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, Nov. 17, at the Wequassett Resort in Harwich.

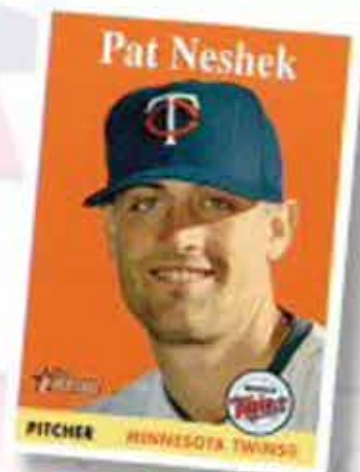

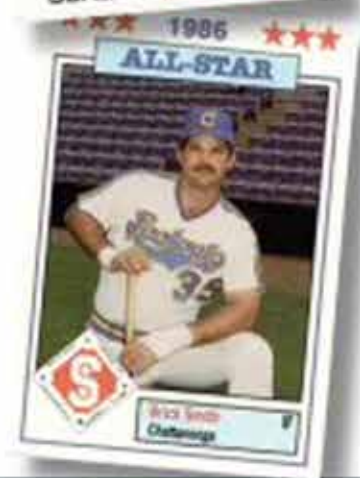
