



The Cotuit Athletic Association (CAA), organized in 1947 to sponsor the Cotuit Kettleers baseball team, was chartered in 1963 as a Massachusetts 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. The CAA maintains the historic Lowell Park Baseball Field entirely from private funds.

The CAA provides coast-to-coast transportation, housing and employment for every one of the outstanding college ballplayers who make the pilgrimage to the legendary Cape Cod Baseball League. The CAA also pays for salaries, travel and housing for the coaches, supplies, uniforms and equipment for the entire team's rugged, intense 40-game schedule.

The CAA operates baseball clinics for youngsters, gives scholarships to local high school seniors, MVP trophies to local athletes, and sponsors many youth league teams. All CAA directors and members work voluntarily year-round to raise funds and run the program, which was recently voted Best Amateur College Program of the Decade by Baseball America.



The Cotuit Athletic Association continues to raise funds to complete our renovation of beloved and historic Lowell Park. 2024 COACHING STAFF



BRUCE G. MURPHY, GENERAL MANAGER

Bruce joined the CAA Board in 1989 and served as first vice president until 1996. In 1996 Bruce was elected president and served three years. Bruce was then elected General Manager in 1999. During this time his family housed players for 13 years. Bruce's wife Gloria worked in the Kettleers store and their two children were batboys. During Bruce's current tenure as General Manager he is second in numbers of years served in the position, behind Legendary Kettleer and CCBL Hall of Famer Arnold Mycock's 45 years of service. Bruce's teams have won the Arnold Mycock CCBL Championship Trophy 4 times; 1999, 2010, 2013, 2019. His teams have been West Division Champions 4 times; 1999, 2003, 2008, 2012. During this time, Bruce has seen over 120 Kettleers move on to play in the Majors. Bruce is Cotuit representative on the CCBL Executive Committee and also serves on the CCBL Hall of Fame committee. 
PADYN KESSELRING, ASSISTANT COACH

In his lone year at DBU, Kolden was named a Second Team All-Conference USA selection after hitting a team-high .353 with six home runs, 35 RBI, 10 doubles, and two triples. He was also second on the team in stolen bases, successfully swiping 21-of-23 bases, a mark that ranks as the eighth-most in a single-season in the program's Division I era dating back to 2004. Defensively, Kolden was one of the top defensive third basemen in the country, committing just five errors in 108 chances on the hot corner. Kolden capped off his collegiate career in the NCAA postseason where he led the Patriots to the finals of the Stillwater Regional. In four games, Kolden hit .470 (8-for-17) with two home runs and three RBI to be named to the Stillwater Regional All-Tournament Team. Kolden earned his Bachelor's degree in Sports Science from Washington State and is currently pursuing a Masters in Sports Management.

MIKE ROBERTS, FIELD MANAGER



Weiss, who played for Coach Roberts at UNC-CH and in the Cape League, went on to become American League Rookie of the Year in 1988. Walt managed the Colorado Rockies for five seasons and is now the bench coach for the 2021 World Champion Atlanta Braves.

Five of Coach Roberts' former players are now collegiate head coaches, many are assistants, and several others work in professional baseball or are professional baseball athlete's advisors. "I am pleased many of the student athletes I recruited through the years continue to enjoy a career helping young men reach their academic, athletic, and career goals."

"Each summer in Cotuit, the goal is to win a Cape League Championship. We strive to accomplish this goal with mature college student athletes from around the nation who embrace practicing and playing at picturesque Elizabeth Lowell Park. Many of the Kettleers players become involved in our lovely Village with the July 4th parade and festivities, Willowbend Country Club, and the ever-popular Kettleers baseball clinics. The athletes provide guidance & set examples of leadership for the young fans. An example being some players go with Coach every Tuesday morning to read to children at Cotuit Library. The athletes are encouraged to build close relationships, many which last a lifetime, with the community & their host families." explained Roberts.

Prior to managing Wareham to the Western Division regular season title in 2000, Roberts led Wareham to the same title in 1984. Each of those two seasons, Roberts' Cape League teams led the entire League in stolen bases and continue this tradition with the Kettleers. In 2000, Roberts' Wareham team tied the Cape League all-time single season stolen base record with 134 stolen bases.

In the off-season, Coach Roberts has studied for his Doctorate in Sports Administration at the University of New Mexico, does base stealing clinics and recently spoke at the 2022 ABCA National Coaches Convention in Chicago on base stealing before 4,500 coaches and 2000 coaches on line and lead the base stealing seminar at the 2024 ABCA clinics. He has two books on base stealing. The first titled "You Can't Steal Second Base

and Keep Your Foot on First!" published in Dec. 2008 and the 2nd book titled "Baserunning" was published in Dec. 2013.

When not in Cotuit coaching the Kettleers, He is full time working in player development for the Pittsburgh Pirates. His areas of emphasis are base stealing and mentoring coaches. Coach Roberts has also worked for the Chicago Cubs and Baltimore Orioles.

Several base stealing videos were filmed at beautiful Lowell Park in Cotuit in 2011, and a hitting video was filmed at Lowell Park in 2012. His son Brian, who led the American League in stolen bases in 2007, contributed to the first book and the DVD which shows clips of Brian stealing bases for the Orioles.

Mike is a former full-time professor for Asbury University, outside of Lexington, Kentucky, and Director of the Dept. of Sports Management. Several of his former students have interned for the Kettleers in recent summers. He is currently teaching on-line Sports Management courses for Spring Arbor University, Spring Arbor, Michigan

In January 2015, Coach Roberts was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

He has a daughter, Angie R. Stroman, in Dallas, TX and she and her husband David have two boys; Tyler and Brock. His son Brian lives in Sarasota, FL with wife Diana and their three boys; Jax, Nash, and Cru.

Coach Roberts is engaged to Mary W. Britt. Mary is a retired teacher from Atlanta but grew up in North Carolina. She has two sons, Steve & Brandon who both live in Nashville, Tn. with their families. Mary has four grandchildren.

Coach Roberts returns for his 20th season in 2024. During his coaching tenure in the Cape League, which includes 2 seasons in Wareham in 1984 and 2000 where both teams made the playoffs, Coach Roberts has led his team to the playoffs in 15 of the 19 seasons in Cotuit. The Kettleers have brought home the Arnold Mycock Championship Trophy to Cotuit in 2010 and 2013, and 2019. In 2012, the team won the President's Trophy for the best regular season record in the league at 30-14. This was the first time the Kettleers had reached 30 wins under Coach Roberts' leadership. Again, in 2023 the Kettleers won the President's Trophy with 28 wins to lead the league.

From 1978 through 1998, Roberts was the head coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He then went on to UNC-Asheville, where he coached in the spring of 2000. All totaled, Roberts' UNC teams made nine NCAA post-season and two College World Series appearances. Five times his teams captured the ACC Regular Season Championship and four times the ACC Tournament Championship. Eight of Roberts' former North Carolina players were first round draft picks. Sixteen of his former players at UNC have played in Major League Baseball. His greatest individual coaching success is his own son, Brian Roberts, who played 14 seasons in the Major Leagues, was a two time all-star 2nd baseman for the Baltimore Orioles and New York Yankees.

Bobby Evans, former student manager at UNC for Coach Roberts, is a former General Manager of the San Francisco Giants. Walt







In Memory of Don LeSieur



Host Families and Players: A Lifelong Bond Formed in a Summer's Time

The players of the Cape Cod Baseball League come from all over the country for the opportunity to enhance their skills as collegiate baseball players, using the competition as a supplement to one day become a professional in the near future.

But for Cotuit and all the teams of the CCBL, how can they keep these players around?

The only solution is host families—the backbone of the Cape League and the Kettleers. These families throughout Cotuit and the surrounding communities selflessly open their homes to make the entire operation possible.

“It’s like when your own child is looking for a job. You want them to be successful,” said Scott Hill, who hosted 17 players for the Kettleers starting in 2009. “So you try to provide all the comforts of home and treat them like one of your own so when they come home from a late game or from BP or something they get rested up and they can put in a full effort.”

Hill along with his wife Trish first began hosting players to provide an older sibling figure to their only child, Jason, who was eight when the first Kettleer stayed with them. It took the Hills a year stuck on a waiting list to be granted the chance to enjoy what can be a rewarding experience.

What both parties embark on in their roles of being a part of a host family can be a scary thing to think about. For a player, after a long college season, they come to a part of the country they’ve likely never been before and step

into a stranger’s house. They must quickly make it a home before practicing and playing every day with even more unfamiliar faces around the diamond. As for the host family, there’s a fine line between not attempting to parent a 19 to 21-year-old adult but still providing the assurance of a family environment that the college athletes would find back in their hometowns.

“We did it for the big brother thing but we also wanted to make sure they were comfortable. [Provide] a home away from home,” said Scott Hill. “When you’re a parent out in California and you’re sending your son across the country to a place they’ve never been before, you’re hoping somebody is on the other end of it that’s going to treat them like you would treat them at their own home.”

All the players that called the Hill residence home for a summer enjoyed home cooking and family activities in the backyard, along with beach trips and fishing outings. Each year and situation is unique, but ultimately what both parties can get out of the arrangement depends on how receptive they are.

But none may have been as close as what Ian Rice found.

Living together with the Hills in 2014, Rice ate almost every meal at his newfound dining table while often playing darts and horseshoes in the backyard with the Hills. A lifetime bond was solidified that summer.

“They’re just some of the best people you’ll ever meet and I got super lucky being able to stay with them,” said Rice. “So it was a very special summer being with them.”

The Hills would travel all over the country to watch their new family members play in both their college and professional games. The Hills have gone as far south as Florida and as far west as San Diego in the name of supporting the family they elected to bring into their home and even attended Rice’s wedding. The journey that resulted from being a host family was not something the Hills could have ever expected before they became host families.

“We never watched baseball and knew nothing about it before housing,” said Trish Hill. “You don’t have to be a baseball fan to appreciate what it has to offer.”

Directions to the Cape Cod Baseball League Fields

BOURNE BRAVES – Doran Park - Upper Cape Tech School - Route 6 - Bourne

Route 28 to Mashpee rotary, take second right on Rte. 151 and go 6.6 miles to Route 28N, then 6.8 miles to the Bourne Rotary. Take first right out of rotary on Rt. 6 towards the Sagamore Bridge for .3 mile. Turn right uphill to Upper Cape Regional Technical School. At top of the hill bear left to the parking lot on the left side of the school. Baseball diamond is behind the school.

BREWSTER WHITECAPS – Stonybrook Elementary School Field - Underpass Road - Brewster

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 85 (Rte 137) - Brewster, and turn right off exit ramp. Cross the Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) and after 3.0 miles turn right on Underpass Road. Go .2 and turn left into the Stonybrook Elementary School. Baseball diamond is behind the school.

CHATHAM ANGLERS – Veterans Field - Depot Station - Chatham Center

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 85 Chatham, and turn left off ramp onto Route 137 S. Follow Rt. 137 S thru lights (Rt. 39) 1.7 miles to a four way stop. Turn left onto Old Queen Ann Rd. and after 1 mile, bear right at "Business District" sign. After stop sign, continue on Old Queen Ann Rd. for 1.2 miles to Rt. 28. Turn left and after .3 mile, (Cumberland Farms convenience store - Gulf Station) on the right, proceed through lights .2 mile and turn left on Veterans Field Rd. Veterans Field is at end of the street.

FALMOUTH COMMODORES – Guv Fuller Field - Main St. - Falmouth Center

Route 28 to Mashpee Rotary. Go around rotary to the third right keeping the Mashpee Commons Mall on your right and follow Route 28 sign to Falmouth for 8.6 miles. Turn right at the Falmouth Police Station which is just past the Falmouth Plaza on your left (look for sign saying "Guv Fuller Field, Home of the Falmouth Commodores"). Be careful about where you park. **DO NOT PARK IN POLICE AREAS BEHIND THE FIELD WHICH ARE CLEARLY MARKED.** Field is behind the recreation building to the left of the police station.

HARWICH MARINERS – Whitehouse Field - Oak St. - Harwich Center

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 82 (Route 124) to Harwich, and turn right off ramp. At first intersection (4-way stop), turn left onto Queen Anne Rd. for .3 mile. Turn right onto Oak St. for .8 mile (marker Whitehouse Field with an arrow) and proceed past Cranberry Valley Golf Course to Harwich High School on the left. Turn left into the parking lot just before the school – Whitehouse Field is behind the trees lining the parking lot on the left.

HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS – McKeon Park - High School Rd. - Hyannis

Route 28 to Hyannis. Go pass the Centerville Bell Tower Mall and .2 mile after the lights, bear right at sign to Hyannis on West Main Street (Rockland Trust Bank on left). Continue on West Main Street 2 miles to rotary. Go halfway around and continue on West Main Street. Bear right at fork onto South Street and follow through one set of lights. Turn right .2 mile after St. Francis Xavier Church onto High School Rd. McKeon Field is behind school.

ORLEANS FIREBIRDS – Eldridge Park - Route 28 - Orleans

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 89 Rt. 6A - Orleans, and turn right off exit ramp. At the traffic light, turn right onto Eldridge Parkway and continue for .6 mile. Watch for tennis courts on the left and a funeral home on the right. Turn left into parking area just before tennis courts. Field is behind the parking lot.

WAREHAM GATEMEN – Clem Spillane Field - Route 6 (Marion Road) - near Wareham Center

Route 28 to Mashpee rotary, take Route 151 which is second exit and go 6.6 miles, then take Route 28 N for 6.8 miles to the Bourne Rotary. Go over the bridge and continue on Route 25 towards I-495 for 6.7 miles and take Exit 1 for Wareham and turn right off exit ramp. Go .2 mile towards lights and bear right on Rt. 6 & 28. Go .1 mile and at the fork in the road and bear left on Route 6 toward Wareham and Marion for 2.4 miles. Just after Wareham center, turn left on Rt. 6 (Chapel St.) and .2 mile on the left is Clem Spillane Field directly behind the Town Hall parking lot. If full, continue to Veterans Dr. behind the field.

YARMOUTH-DENNIS RED SOX – Red Wilson Field - D/Y Regional High School - Station Ave. - So. Yarmouth

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 75 and turn right off the exit ramp onto Union Street. Proceed 1.4 miles - Dennis Yarmouth School is on the left, and there is usually a sandwich board indicating that there is a game. Take that left into parking lot. Field is behind the parking lot.
