



NOVEMBER 16

Six USA Baseball alumni faced off on November 16 as members of both the Salt River Rafters and the Surprise Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League Championship, which ultimately resulted in a 3-2 win for the Rafters. Robert Hassell III, of the Salt River Rafters, made his mark early in the contest, smacking a triple to right center field in the top of the second frame. The 2019 18U National Team alum scored shortly after thanks to a sacrifice fly, which tied the game at one run each.

Opposite of Hassell, 2023 Collegiate National Team member Jac Caglianone had a huge day at the plate for the opposing Saguaros. Prior to Hassell's run, Caglianone smoked an infield single to first base before making his way around the base path to put his side up by one. Throughout the rest of the game, Caglianone nabbed two more singles, but was unable to score again. His three hits were the best amongst all batters, accounting for 50 percent of his crew's total hits.

NOVEMBER 13

Milan Tolentino and the Surprise Saguaros improved to 16-13 in the Arizona Fall League after topping the Salt River Rafters, 8-5, on Wednesday. Stout on defense at third base, Tolentino made the most impact in his time at the plate. With the contest sitting tight at 5-3, Tolentino put his side up by four runs when he slashed a two-RBI triple to right field. The triple was Tolentino's first in the Arizona Fall League, which led to him pushing his RBI total to nine.

NOVEMBER II

2019 18U National Team alum Robert Hassell III carried over his hot performance from the Arizona Fall League's Fall Stars Game to help the Salt River Rafters top the Peoria Javelinas 7-1 on Monday. Hassell started the contest early, slapping an RBI single to right field to put his side up 1-0 in the bottom of the first inning. In his next at-bat in the third frame, Hassell doubled and later scored on a wild pitch, marking the second time he crossed the plate. The former eighth overall pick in the 2020 MLB June Amateur Draft was also a centerpiece on defense, forcing four fly outs throughout the game. In the Arizona Fall League, Hassell owns a .296 batting average and 19 RBIs. His RBI count is tied for third in the 2024 AFL season.

NOVEMBER 9

2023 Collegiate National Team Jac Caglianone reached base in all three of his plate appearances in the Arizona Fall League's Fall Stars Game in the AL Fall Stars 6-5 loss to the NL Fall Stars. Caglianone's night at the plate was highlighted by a hard-hit double to left field that came in the third frame. After he reached second base, the former Florida Gator stole third base. Along with Caglianone and the AL Stars, 2022 Collegiate National Team alum Tre' Morgan played a crucial role in the game. Morgan started and played the entire game in left field. Like Caglianone, Morgan reached base on three different occasions, tied for most in the 2024 Fall Stars Game. The outfielder smacked a double, drew two walks, stole a base and scored a run in the contest. Defensively, Grant Taylor held it down for the AL squad. Taylor, a 2017 15U National Team member, hurled a scoreless frame, yielding a single hit while nabbing a strikeout in his lone inning of action.

On the opposite side of the pitch, the NL Fall Stars worked efficiently to top the AL 6-5. Performances from fellow USA Baseball alums Andrew Pintar and Robert Hassell III sparked the offense, allowing their side to walk away with the tight win. Pintar, a 2013 12U National Team participant, entered the contest as a defensive replacement in the sixth frame, but instantly made his presence felt by going 2-for-2 at the plate with a double. On the other hand, Hassell, a 2019 18U National Team alum, put his crew on the board with an RBI double in the bottom of the third inning. Giants' prospect and 2018 15U National Team member Cale

NOVEMBER 6

2023 Collegiate National Team alum Jac Caglianone continued his impressive campaign in the Arizona Fall League after guiding the Surprise Saguaros to a 5-0 win over the Glendale Desert Dogs on Wednesday. In the first inning and in his opening at-bat, Caglianone blasted a ball 418 feet to right center field to put the Saguaros up by one run early and marking his fourth home run in the fall season. The Kansas City Royals prospect put Surprise up by two after he was granted a free RBI due to being hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the top of the fifth frame. Caglianone made the most of the free trip to first and scored for the second time of the match to put the finishing touches on the game. In the Arizona Fall League, Caglianone owns a .260 batting average with 16 RBIs.
